- Purdue is 19-6 overall after a 1-1 showing in the midweek with a win over Northern Illinois and a loss to Indiana State.
- In Big Ten play, Purdue is 1-3 with two games against Ohio State postponed due to weather the first weekend of conference play.
- Cam Thompson leads the Boilermakers in extra base hits (18), home runs (9), runs batted in (39), and slugging percentage (.756).
- Evan Albrecht owns a team best .412 batting average and has a team high 35 hits.
- Purdue leads the Big Ten and is No. 4 in college baseball in stolen bases per game (2.48).
- On the mound, the Boilermakers own a 4.43 ERA, with all three weekend starters sitting at 4.30 ERA or lower on the year.

Series Notes

- The most-played rivalry in Indiana history is with intrastate rival Purdue. The two programs have met 285 times since the first showdown in 1895.
- Overall, Indiana leads the all-time series, 151-134-2.
- Of the 285 meetings, 43 percent of them have been decided by two runs or fewer, including 10 of the last 20 meetings.
- Over the last 20 meetings, IU owns a 13-7 edge in the series. In the 20 meetings prior, Purdue held a 13-7 edge in the matchup.
- This will be the seventh straight season the two teams will meet. Prior to not playing in 2015, Indiana and Purdue had played one another in 40 straight seasons (1973-2012).
- Indiana has won four of the last five games, including a series win in 2020 in Bloomington.

The first three seasons of Jeff Mercer's tenure have been unprecedented for various reasons. The Indiana native is prepared to get the Hoosiers back into the NCAA Tournament for a second time during his tenure.

Mercer joined IU coaching legend Everett Dean as the only IU coaches to win a Big Ten title in their first year as a head coach in 2019 and headed to the NCAA Louisville Regional. The 2020 season was then cut short due to a global pandemic and 2021 featured the first conference-only slate in Big Ten history.

Mercer brought a winning background to Indiana. In his time as a head coach (2017-18) and an assistant coach (2014-16) at Wright State, he has been a part of three Horizon League regular season and conference tournament titles, three NCAA appearances, and a combined record of 199-92 (.684). The Raiders won four NCAA tournament games over those three appearances, having reached the regional finals twice.

The conference-only slate of 2021 produced just the second 20-plus win Big Ten effort in program history (2014) and a school-record 26 wins against B1G opponents. Twice during the season the Hoosiers won eight of nine games, including eight straight games after dropping the season opener. Grant Richardson was a first-team All-Big Ten pick, while Gabe Bierman (second team), McCade Brown (second team) and Cole Barr (third team) also earned all-conference honors.

In the Major League Baseball Draft, the Hoosiers saw its three weekend starting pitchers, closer and top two RBI producers selected. With four picks in the first 10 rounds, the 2021 edition marked the second time in program history that four Hoosiers were taken in the top 10 rounds (2009).

In the shortened 2020 season, Mercer led the Hoosiers to a 9-6 record overall. Indiana recorded three road victories over ranked teams, beating No. 11 LSU, No. 30 South Alabama and No. 17 East Carolina. IU also defeated in-state rival Purdue, 17-2.

Individually, Richardson posted a .424 batting average with three doubles, two triples, five home runs, 17 RBI and 21 runs scored over 15 games. The sophomore led the Big Ten in runs scored, home runs, slugging percentage and total bases. He finished among the top 20 nationally in runs per game (No. 5), total bases (No. 11), slugging percentage (No. 12) and RBIs (No. 19).

In his first season as head coach, Mercer led the Hoosiers to the 2019 Big Ten regular season title and earned Big Ten Coach of the Year. The conference title was the seventh in program history for IU and the first since 2014.

The Bargersville, Indiana, native became the first Big Ten head coach since 1982 (John Anderson, Minnesota) to win a regular season conference title in their first season as the skipper. He became just the second coach in IU history — any sport, men's or women's — to win an outright Big Ten championship in his or her first year. Everett Dean (1924-25) did it in baseball in his first year at the helm.

Indiana earned the No. 2 seed in the NCAA Louisville Regional and finished the season with an overall record of 37-23 and a Big Ten mark of 17-7. A school-record 10 Hoosiers were selected in the 2019 MLB Draft, led by outfield Matt Gorski. The highest drafted Hoosier since Kyle Schwarber (No. 4 overall) in 2014, Gorski was picked in the second round (57th overall) by the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Pitcher Andrew Saalfrank was named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and earned a spot on the All-Big Ten first team along with utility player Matt Lloyd. Scotty Bradley, Cole Barr and Gorski each made the second team. Elijah Dunham rounded out the all-conference honors with a third-team selection.

The first former student-athlete to be named head coach of the baseball program, Mercer led Wright State for two seasons and amassed 77 victories. In his two seasons at the helm, WSU won nearly 70 percent of its games and averaged 38.5 wins per season. The 2018 Horizon League Coach of the Year, the Raiders won the regular season and conference tournament title in the 2018 to earn a spot in the NCAA Stanford Regional. In 2017, Mercer's squad earned the programs first-ever national ranking.

The 2018 Horizon League champions, Wright State won eight of its last 10 games and 15 of its last 19 to close the season. The Raiders grabbed the tournament title with three-straight wins and outscored opponents 32-11 during the run. With a 39-17 overall record and a 22-6 league mark, WSU ranked No. 8 in the country in scoring (7.8 rpg) and stolen bases (110) and was No. 21 in on-base percentage (.394). The Raiders' .979 fielding percentage was No. 10 nationally.

Wright State was led by Horizon League Player of the Year Gabe Snyder, who paced the conference in home runs (15) and RBI (73), and was second in batting average (.359), missing the league's Triple Crown by one batting average point. Snyder was one of 11 Raiders who earned all-league honors, including five first team honorees (Snyder, Matt Morrow, Chase Slone, Peyton Burdick and Ryan Weiss), four second teamers (Seth Gray, JD Orr, Zane Harris and Derek Hendrixson) and two named to the freshman team (Harris and Quincy Hamilton).

Wright State saw three players drafted in the 2018 MLB Draft, each taken in the first 21 rounds, led by Weiss in the fourth round by the Arizona Diamondbacks (129th overall). Caleb Samper (20th round) was picked by the Los Angeles Dodgers and Snyder (21st round) went to the Minnesota Twins.

Known for his strength as a recruiter, Mercer and his staff helped Wright State compile its first-ever top 100 ranked recruiting class. The 2018 signing class was ranked 87th nationally.

WSU received its first-ever top 25 ranking in 2017 and finished the year at 38-21 and 21-9 in league action. Mercer's aggressiveness in the run game resulted in Wright State ranking No. 2 nationally with 130 stolen bases.

Weiss was selected as the 2017 Horizon League Freshman of the Year and first-team all-league along with Morrow. Pitcher Danny Sexton was named a second-team All-Horizon League along with Hendrixson and Gray. Both Weiss earned Freshman All-American and second-team ABCA All-Midwest selection.

Mercer, who was a two-time All-Horizon League honoree in 2008 and 2009, returned to the Raiders as an assistant coach in 2013 and promptly helped WSU set a then-school record for wins (43) in 2015. The Raiders followed that up with a program-record 46 victories.

He assisted then-head coach Greg Lovelady, who is now the head coach at UCF, and coached six players that were taken in the MLB Draft, including five in 2016. During Mercer's three years as an assistant, the Raiders had 30 All-Horizon League honorees, two Horizon League regular season and tournament titles and two NCAA appearances.

The program's recruiting coordinator, Mercer brought in a wealth of talent to one of the premier mid-major programs in the country. He also excelled in his role as hitting coach, with 47 home runs in 2016, its most in a season since 2009.

Prior to the return to his alma mater, Mercer spent two seasons as a volunteer assistant coach at Western Kentucky University (2012-13). While with the Hilltoppers, he worked with pitchers and outfielders, and was also instrumental in the development and organization of the programs camps.

His first Division I experience came at the University of Michigan as the volunteer assistant coach in 2011. During his time with the Wolverines, he worked with the catchers and outfielders.

Before his arrival in Ann Arbor, Mercer spent the 2010 season as the graduate assistant coach at Ohio Northern University where he was in charge of the infielders and hitters and was the recruiting coordinator.

As a student-athlete, Mercer began his career at the University of Dayton before transferring to Wright State. He was a two-time first team All-Horizon League honoree at first base and was named to third-team All-America in 2009 after hitting .357 with 26 doubles and 74 RBI. The Horizon League Player of the Year in 2009, he tied the WSU single-season record for RBIs, doubles, games played and games started to help the Raiders to the NCAA Fort Worth Regional.

Pyne Planting Roots

- **Josh Pyne** saw his 15-game hitting streak come to an end on Sunday, April 3 versus Northwestern. That streak is the longest for an IU hitter since 2014.
- Since 2005, Pyne's streak is tied for the ninth longest and just behind 16-game streaks from Dustin DeMuth and Brad Hartong in 2014.
- During the streak, the right-handed hitter batted .397 with 13 runs scored and 20 RBIs. He hit his first three career home runs and added six doubles.

Ellis Providing the Power

- Redshirt-junior **Matthew Ellis** came from Walters State Community College where he hit 17 home runs with 4 multi-home run games as a sophomore.
- Ellis has brought that power with him to Bloomington, as he leads the Big Ten in home runs (12) and is second in total bases (71) and RBIs (35).
- The left-handed hitting catcher has three multi-homer games on his resume, in 2022 (at Missouri State and versus Purdue Fort Wayne and Kentucky).
- From March 1-6, Ellis hit .438 with 12 RBIs, six runs scored and seven hits over four games. He had five extra base hit, walked twice and was hit-by-pitch once.

Doanes Doing Work

- On the surface, **Tyler Doanes'** batting average is not what you would expect out of a leadoff hitter, but dig deeper and he has been a catalyst for IU this season.
- He has reached base in 22 of 26 games, and has been on base multiple times in 19 of those contests.
- His .257 average (26-of-101) is bolstered by a Big Ten-best 25 walks and one hit-by-pitch for a .409 on-base percentage.
- Assuming a 56-game season, Doanes is on pace for nearly 60 runs scored, 60 hits and 60 walks.

Tibbitts Takes Two Out

- In the season-opening win over Miami (Ohio), freshman **Brock Tibbitts** hit the first two home runs of his career.
- In all, Tibbitts drove in five RBIs and was on base three times in a start at first base.
- He is the first freshman since **Grant Richardson** in 2019 to hit multiple home runs in a game. Richardson hit three home runs at Maryland on March 30, 2019.

Perkins a Steady Hand

- Redshirt-sophomore **Jack Perkins** has made six starts in 2022 and seems to have built off each.
- After a season-opening start at Clemson (2/19) went just 3 2/3 innings, Perkins has given the Cream and Crimson at least five innings in his last four starts.
- The right-handed pitcher won two of his next four starts and posted three straight quality starts.
- Perkins has went six innings in four straight starts and has allow more than four hits in a game just once on the season.
- He has fanned at least six batters in five of his seven starts and allowed three-or-fewer runs in six outings.

BIG Leaders

- Through seven weekends of the 2022 season, Indiana has a pair of student-athletes leading the Big Ten in a statistical category.

Schedule Notes

- Indiana added three new opponents to the all-time ledger in each of the first three weekends of 2022. IU meet Clemson, Louisiana-Lafayette and Missouri State for its initial contest.
- Getting back into non-conference play after a conference-only slate in 2021, Indiana will have one lengthy home stand (12 straight) and one long stretch of consecutive road games (nine straight).
- Moreover, the two stretches come back-to-back as IU hosts 12 straight games from March 15-April 3 and then hits the road for nine straight from April 5-20.
- In the last seven Big Ten seasons, Indiana has opened on the road five times (2015-18, 21), with the 2019 and 2022 conference seasons starting at home.

MLB Opening Day

- Three former Indiana student-athletes are among MLB active rosters as Opening Day kicked off the 2022 season on April 7.
- **Alex Dickerson** (Atlanta Braves), **Scott Effross** (Chicago Cubs) and **Kyle Schwarber** (Philadelphia Phillies) are all on big league rosters.
- Minor League Baseball (MiLB) will also be full of Hoosiers once rosters are finalized, including a fresh crop from the 2021 draft.
- Of the six drafted IU student-athletes in 2021, four were taken in the first 10 rounds. It marked the second time in program history IU saw four players go in before the start of the 11th round.
- All three weekend starters - **McCade Brown** (3rd round), **Gabe Bierman** (7th round) and **Tommy Sommer** (10th round) were taken, while closer **Matt Litwicky** (10th round) was also selected.
- Positionally, third baseman **Cole Barr** (15th round) and center fielder **Grant Richardson** (17th round) were also picked up.
