Entering his fifth season at the helm of the Indiana baseball program, head coach Jeff Mercer continues to build the program through high school talent and deliberate evaluation of the transfer portal. The player development within the program has also shown in his first four seasons with a Big Ten-best 19 student-athletes drafted over that span.

Mercer start this his IU coaching career has seen him join IU coaching legend Everett Dean as the only IU coaches to win a Big Ten title in their first year as a head coach, a trip to the NCAA Louisville Regional, a season cut short due to a global pandemic and the first-ever conference-only slate in Big Ten history.

Mercer brought a winning background to Indiana. In his time as a head coach (2017-18) and an assistant coach (2014-16) at Wright State, he was a part of three Horizon League regular season and conference tournament titles, three NCAA appearances, and a combined record of 199-92 (.684). The Raiders won four NCAA tournament games over that span, having reached the regional finals twice.

Indiana Era (2019-present)

In 2022, the freshman trio of Carter Mathison, Josh Pyne and Brock Tibbitts each earned Freshman All-America honors, while the trio was joined by Evan Goforth on the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. The freshman home run record was topped by Mathison at 19 home runs, which raced past Alex Dickerson's mark (14) from 2009. That total ranked No. 3 among Division I freshmen and his 58 RBIs were No. 8 among rookies nationally.

Catcher Matthew Ellis – a junior college transfer – was among the veterans to impact the 2022 season with his 18 home runs ranking No. 2 on the team. Ellis was a third-team All-Big Ten selection at seasons end. Starting pitcher Jack Perkins made the most of his one year in Bloomington with 15 starts and 91 strikeouts, before the Oakland Athletics made him the organization's fifth-round pick in the 2022 Major League Baseball Draft.

Bradley Brehmer and Reese Sharp also hear their names called in the draft, both by the Baltimore Orioles. Brehmer was the 12th round selection and Sharp was the taken in the 20th round of the event.

The conference-only slate of 2021 produced just the second 20-plus win Big Ten effort in program history (2014) and a school-record 26 wins against B1G opponents. Twice during the season, the Hoosiers won eight of nine games, including eight straight games after dropping the season opener. Grant Richardson was a first-team All-Big Ten pick, while Gabe Bierman (second team), McCade Brown (second team) and Cole Barr (third team) also earned all-conference honors.

In the Major League Baseball Draft, the Hoosiers saw its three weekend starting pitchers, closer and top two RBI producers selected. With four picks in the first 10 rounds, the 2021 edition marked the second time in program history that four Hoosiers were taken in the top 10 rounds (2009).

In the shortened 2020 season, Mercer led the Hoosiers to a 9-6 record overall. Indiana recorded three road victories over ranked teams, beating No. 11 LSU, No. 30 South Alabama, and No. 17 East Carolina. IU also defeated in-state rival Purdue, 17-2, in seven innings.

Individually, Richardson posted a .424 batting average with three doubles, two triples, five home runs, 17 RBI and 21 runs scored over 15 games. The sophomore led the Big Ten in runs scored, home runs, slugging percentage, and total bases. He finished among the top 20 nationally in runs per game (No. 5), total bases (No. 11), slugging percentage (No. 12) and RBIs (No. 19).

In his first season as head coach, Mercer led the Hoosiers to the 2019 Big Ten regular season title and earned Big Ten Coach of the Year. The conference title was the seventh in program history for IU and the first since 1914.

The Bargersville, Indiana, native became the first Big Ten head coach since 1982 (John Anderson, Minnesota) to win a regular season conference title in their first season as the skipper. He became just the second coach in IU history – any sport, men's or women's – to win an outright Big Ten championship in his or her first year. Everett Dean (1924-25) did it in baseball in his first year at the helm.

Indiana earned the No. 2 seed in the NCAA Louisville Regional and finished the season with an overall record of 37-23 and a Big Ten mark of 17-7. A school-record 10 Hoosiers were selected in the 2019 MLB Draft, led by outfield Matt Gorski. The highest drafted Hoosier since Kyle Schwarber (No. 4 overall) in 2014, Gorski was picked in the second round (57th overall) by the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Pitcher Andrew Saalfrank was named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and earned a spot on the All-Big Ten first team along with utility player Matt Lloyd. Scotty Bradley, Cole Barr and Gorski each made the second team. Elijah Dunham rounded out the all-conference honors with a third-team selection.

Wright State Era (2014-18)

The first former student-athlete to be named head coach of the baseball program, Mercer led Wright State for two seasons and amassed 77 victories. In his two seasons at the helm, WSU won nearly 70 percent of its games and averaged 38.5 wins per season. The 2018 Horizon League Coach of the Year, the Raiders won the regular season and conference tournament title in the 2018 to earn a spot in the NCAA Stanford Regional. In 2017, Mercer's squad earned the programs first-ever national ranking.

The 2018 Horizon League champions, Wright State won eight of its last 10 games and 15 of its last 19 to close the season. The Raiders grabbed the tournament title with three-straight wins and outscored opponents 32-11 during the run. With a 39-17 overall record and a 22-6 league mark, WSU ranked No. 8 in the country in scoring (7.8 rpg) and stolen bases (110) and was No. 21 in on-base percentage (.394). The Raiders' .979 fielding percentage was No. 10 nationally.

Wright State was led by Horizon League Player of the Year Gabe Snyder, who paced the conference in home runs (15) and RBI (73), and was second in batting average (.359), missing the league's Triple Crown by one batting average point. Snyder was one of 11 Raiders who earned all-league honors, including five first team honorees (Snyder, Matt Morrow, Chase Slone, Peyton Burdick and Ryan Weiss), four second teamers (Seth Gray, JD Orr, Zane Harris and Derek Hendrixson) and two named to the freshman team (Harris and Quincy Hamilton).

Wright State saw three players drafted in the 2018 MLB Draft, each taken in the first 21 rounds, led by Weiss in the fourth round by the Arizona Diamondbacks (129th overall). Caleb Sampen (20th round) was picked by the Los Angeles Dodgers and Snyder (21st round) went to the Minnesota Twins.

Known for his strength as a recruiter, Mercer and his staff helped Wright State compiled its first-ever top 100 ranked recruiting class. The 2018 signing class was ranked 87th nationally.

WSU received its first-ever top 25 ranking in 2017 and finished the year at 38-21 and 21-9 in league action. Mercer's aggressiveness in the run game resulted in Wright State ranking No. 2 nationally with 130 stolen bases.

Weiss was selected as the 2017 Horizon League Freshman of the Year and first-team all-league along with Morrow. Pitcher Danny Sexton was named a second-team All-Horizon League along with Hendrixson and Gray. Both Weiss earned Freshman All-American and second-team ABCA All-Midwest selection.

Mercer, who was a two-time All-Horizon League honoree in 2008 and 2009, returned to the Raiders as an assistant coach in 2013 and promptly helped WSU set a then-school record for wins (43) in 2015. The Raiders followed that up with a program-record 46 victories.

He assisted then-head coach Greg Lovelady, who is now the head coach at UCF, and coached six players that were taken in the MLB Draft, including five in 2016. During Mercer's three years as an assistant, the Raiders had 30 All-Horizon League honorees, two Horizon League regular season and tournament titles and two NCAA appearances.

The program's recruiting coordinator, Mercer brought in a wealth of talent to one of the premier mid-major programs in the country. He also excelled in his role as hitting coach, with 47 home runs in 2016, its most in a season since 2009

Early Coaching Career (2010-13)

Prior to the return to his alma mater, Mercer spent two seasons as a volunteer assistant coach at Western Kentucky University (2012-13). While with the Hilltoppers, he worked with pitchers and outfielders, and was also instrumental in the development and organization of the program's camps.

His first Division I experience came at the University of Michigan as the volunteer assistant coach in 2011. During his time with the Wolverines, he worked with the catchers and outfielders.

Before his arrival in Ann Arbor, Mercer spent the 2010 season as the graduate assistant coach at Ohio Northern University where he was in charge of the infielders and hitters and was the recruiting coordinator.

Inside The Series

Scouting The Opponent

- Michigan State enters the weekend with a 30-19 overall record and a 10-11 mark in Big Ten play. MSU won its midweek contest versus Central Michigan, 9-2.
- The past two Big Ten weekends have not been kind to the Spartans, as they were swept in a pair of road series at Illinois and at Nebraska.
- As a team, Michigan State has 100 doubles, 51 home runs and a nation-best 28 triples.
- Brock Vradenburg leads the team with a .419 average, 60 runs scored, 80 hits and 64 RBIs. His 147 total bases are 57 total bases more than the next closest Spartan.
- Trent Farquhar has been the table setter at the top of the order with 57 runs scored and .480 on-base percentage. He has walked 38 times with 11 HBP to just 19 strikeouts.
- Joseph Dzierwa has started 12 games on the season with a 5-3 record and a 5.83 ERA. He owns 51 strikeouts to just 18 walks in 66 1/3 innings of work.
- Wyatt Rush anchors the bullpen with eight saves and a 4-0 record. Over 39 innings he has 36 strikeouts and just seven walks.

Series Notes

- In 202 all-time meetings between Indiana and Michigan State, MSU leads the series 105-96-1 dating back to the first meeting in 1918.
- This will be the fourth straight visit to East Lansing for Indiana, as the Hoosiers are 7-5 in those games with three series wins.
- Last home series came in 2015, which Michigan State won (2-1). The last home team to win a series was Indiana during the 2014 season.
- Over the 202 all-time meetings, 59 of those have been one-run games. Michigan State is 30-29 in those games.
- Prior to last weekend's 51-run outburst versus Purdue, Indiana's previous B1G series high run output was a 46-run outburst versus Michigan State (1988) and Michigan (2010).

Team Notes

10 Years at The Bart

- The 2023 season marks the 10th season of Bart Kaufman Field, with the program playing the prior 62 years at Sembower Field.
- In 10 seasons at Bart Kaufman Field, Indiana has 189 victories and a .755 winning percentage.
- Over the first 10 seasons, IU has reached at least 14 home wins in each of them - minus the 2020 COVID shortened season, with three 20-win seasons.
- The 2018 and 2019 teams each went 21-5 at home, but the 2023 team surpassed that mark with 25 victories.
- A 16-game winning streak that spanned 2022-23 is the longest home winning streak in venue history.

The Bart Record Books

- On Friday, May 12, 2023, Indiana won a dominating 26-11 contest over Purdue, which are the second-most runs in the venues history (27; vs. Butler, 2016).
- The eight home runs hit in the game were the most in Bart Kaufman Field history, as were the 25 hits and 26 RBIs. The 55 total bases were also a BKF record.
- Earlier in the season, Indiana hit five home runs, scored 23 runs with 22 RBIs, which are all tied for No. 3 on the Bart Kaufman Field top-10 list.

Seven is a Winning Number

- Since **Jeff Mercer** took over the program in 2019, Indiana's magic number has been seven runs. Over his five seasons, Indiana has scored seven-or-more runs on 109 occasions.
- In those 109 games, IU owns a 92-17 (.844) record, including 27 straight victories between 2020-22.
- The 2020 team went 5-0 during the COVID-19 shortened campaign and 15-0 during the 2021 season, before seven-straight wins to start 2022.
- Overall in 2022, Indiana was 21-12 in games which it scored seven-or-more runs.
- Indiana is 25-1 when reaching the seven-run threshold in 2023, with its lone loss in the series finale against Maryland.

Strikeouts Abound

- The Hoosiers picked up where they left off in the 2022 season on the mound with another solid season striking out opposing hitters.
- After setting the school standard with 600 strikeouts - a total that ranks No. 2 all-time in the Big Ten - the Hoosiers have struck out 503 batters in 2023, a total that is No. 3 in single-season school history.

Taylor Earning B1G Honors

- Freshman **Devin Taylor** has earned three Big Ten Freshman of the Week Awards in 2023, which is tied for the fifth most since the Big Ten started handing out the award in 2011.
- In all, only 13 Big Ten baseball student-athletes have won three-or-more Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors, led by Iowa's *Keaton Anthony* (6; 2022).
- Overall, Indiana has 32 honorees all-time, the most in Big Ten history. **Logan Sowers** (4; 2015), **Dustin DeMuth** (3; 2011), **Kyle Schwarber** (3; 2012) and **Sam Travis** (3; 2012) all won at least three in their rookie seasons.
- Taylor won his first Big Ten Freshman of the Week award, hitting .467 with a 1.712 OPS versus Kentucky and Morehead State. Four of his seven hits went for extra bases and he scored seven runs with four RBIs.
- He followed that with at least one hit in each of his four games versus Indiana State and Ohio State to move his reached base streak to 13 straight. He hit .385 with five runs scored and a team-best eight RBIs.
- Sophomore **Brock Tibbitts** earned Big Ten Player of the Week after he hit .500 with a 1.339 OPS. He logged seven RBIs and eight runs scored with at least one run scored in each game and at least one RBI in three of the four games on the week.

Weekly Awards

- Sophomore right-handed pitcher **Luke Sinnard** fanned 13 Morehead State batters on his way to six innings of work in a win on the mound to garner a spot on the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper National Player of the Week Honor Roll (March 20).
- Sophomore **Brock Tibbitts** earned Big Ten Player of the Week after he hit .500 with a 1.339 OPS against Indiana State and Ohio State. He logged seven RBIs and eight runs scored with at least one run scored in each game and at least one RBI in three of the four games on the week.
- Freshman **Tyler Cerny** and **Ethan Phillips** each earned awards from the Big Ten on April 24 after helping IU to a 5-0 week. Cerny hit .444 with a 1.056 slugging percentage to earn Freshman of the Week. Phillips went 2-0 in a pair of relief appearances with wins over No. 10 Louisville and Ohio to win Pitcher of the Week.
- After a record-setting offensive weekend against Purdue, **Josh Pyne** earned NCBWA National Player of the Week and Big Ten Player of the Week. He hit .588 for the week with 10 hits, nine runs scored and 14 RBIs.

#ProIU

- Veteran **Kyle Schwarber** (Phillies) is a two-time All-Star and World Series champion in his ninth MLB season after leading the National League in home runs in 2022.
- Scott Effross** (Yankees) is currently on the injured list after having Tommy John surgery before the 2022 postseason and have three years of service.
- Tim Herrin (Guardians) made his debut for the Guardians on opening weekend and became the first pitcher in MLB history to debut by striking out each batter he faced in an MLB debut (*four-plus batters faced*; *Sarah Langs & Elias Sports*).
- In all, 34 Hoosiers have appeared in Major League Baseball with five winning World Series titles and four earning All-Star selections.

- Indiana has won seven Big Ten regular season crowns, its first coming in 1925, when Everett Dean led the Hoosiers to a 9-2 conference record in his first season as head coach.
- The last came in 2019, when first-year head coach Jeff Mercer led IU to a 17-7 record. In between, IU claimed the regular season title in 1932, 1938 (co), 1949 (co), 2013 and 2014.
- Of the seven regular season titles, four different coaches have won them. Dean (3 times), Ernie Andres (1), Tracey Smith (2) and Mercer (1).
- In 1938 Indiana and Iowa tied for the Big Nine Conference title and in 1949 it was a three-way tie with Iowa and Michigan.

Successful Series - B1G Style

- Indiana has won six of seven Big Ten series in 2023 and will look to join a select few teams in program history in the final weekend at Michigan State.
- Since the Big Ten went to the eight weekend schedule in 2002, IU has won six or more weekend series on eight occasions.

- On Friday, May 12, 2023, the Indiana offense slugged eight home runs and piled up 26 runs against Purdue in the series opener.
- That total that ranks No. 11 all-time at Indiana and tied for the most in a Big Ten game in program history.
- The 26 runs equaled the total for Indiana against Michigan on May 4, 2010.

- After a standout playing career at Georgia Southern, assistant coach **Derek Simmons** oversees the infield group and assists head coach **Jeff Mercer** with the hitters, while serving as the programs recruiting coordinator.

- Simmons has long been regarded as one of the top recruiters in the NCAA, with a pair of top-25 recruiting class to go along with four other "top classes" per Collegiate Baseball Newspaper.

- Senior **Phillip Glasser** captains the defense from the shortstop position, as he owns 218 career starts - 100 coming at Indiana over the last two seasons - after transferring from Youngstown State.

- The Tallmadge, Ohio, native sits among the NCAA active leaders in seven marquee categories:

- Over his 100 career games at Indiana, he reached base in 94 games with a hit in 76 of those. In 2023, Glasser has 27 multi-hit games over 53 starts and has reached base safely 51 games.

- Glasser started 47 games in 2022 - 45 at shortstop - and missed 12 of 13 games from March 20-May 12 due to injury (finger).

- His 45-game reached base streak is tied for the longest reached base streak at IU since at least 2005.

- Sophomore **Josh Pyne** has come on at the right time for Indiana, as he is hitting .389 over the last 21 games.

First 31 Games: .272 BA, 26 R, 34 H, 22 RBI, .352 OB%
Last 21 Games: .389 BA, 19 R, 35 H, 28 RBI, .429 OB%

- After a 10-hit, 9-run scored, 14 RBI week against Xavier and Purdue, Pyne earned NCBWA National Player of the Week and Big Ten Player of the Week. His efforts on the week equated into a .588 batting average and a 1.902 OPS.

- In 2022, he started 56 games at third base and was a consensus second-team Freshman All-American in 2022 after leading the team in hits (74) and doubles (20).

- Just the sixth IU freshman to reach the 70-hit mark, Pyne was the first rookie to lead the team in hits since **Sam Travis** (2012).

- His doubles total tied for No. 8 on the single season list with **Josh Phegley** (20; 2008) and **Kevin Goins** (1991).

- Pyne reached base safely in 52 of 57 games played with a hit in 44 of those games in 2022. His 15-game hitting streak from March 8-April 2, 2022 was the longest streak for an IU hitter since 2014 and tied for the ninth longest single-season streak since at least 2005.

- Along with figuring out college pitching for the first time in 2022, **Brock Tibbitts** also switched positions after being a full-time catcher his entire youth/prep career and went on to earn Freshman All-America honors from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper.

- The sophomore earned his first weekly honor from the Big Ten in 2023 after IU swept Ohio State to start Big Ten play. Tibbitts hit .500 with a 1.339 OPS, seven RBIs and eight runs scored in four games to earn B1G Player of the Week.

- In his career, Tibbitts reached base safely in 94 of 111 games played and owns a hit in 80 games.

- Tibbitts posted his second career multi-home run game against Ball State (4/11) with a three-run home run in the fourth inning and a two-run shot in the sixth inning.

- The New Albany, Ohio, native hit nine home runs in 2022 to finish No. 5 on the Indiana freshman charts. He has 10 home runs so far in 2023 to push his career total to 19.

- In 2022, Tibbitts finished No. 12 on Indiana's freshman RBI charts (43) and joined **Carter Mathison** (58) and Pyne (57) as the first IU freshman trio to drive in 40 RBIs in the same season in program history.

- Freshmen **Tyler Cerny** has develop quickly into a starter for Indiana, making 50 starts in 48 appearances in his first season on campus.

- In Week 13, Cerny homered in three straight games to push his season total 10 and join fellow freshman Devin Taylor with double-digit home runs - the first IU rookies to both hit 10-plus home runs.

- Cerny went 1-for-2 with two runs scored and one RBI against Butler. He was on base four times, including three hit-by-pitch, the most by an IU hitter since **Michael Basil** was plunked three times at Michigan State on April 14, 2013.

- He also stole three bases against Butler, the most in a game since **Micah Johnson** swiped four bases against Evansville on March 27, 2011.

- His first home run was a 409-foot blast to center field against Ohio State (3/26) in the first game of a doubleheader in the Hoosiers Big Ten opening series.

- Cerny put a 2-for-27 stretch (seven games) to bed with a 4-for-5 day in the series finale versus Illinois (4/15) with a solo home run and three runs scored.

- Cerny earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week on April 27 after hitting .444 over five IU wins. Five of his eight hits went for extra bases with three home runs and 11 RBIs on th week.

- A four-year letterwinner at Center Grove High School, Cerny was rated the No. 8 overall prospect and No. 2 shortstop in Indiana by Perfect Game.

- Following the COVID-19 pandemic year, Cerny missed most of his junior high school season and the summer due to a non-COVID illness, but returned to help his team to a conference championship as a senior.

- Made his collegiate debut in the series finale at Auburn (2/19) as a defensive replacement at second base and started his first collegiate game at second base against Miami (Ohio) (2/21) with his first hit and RBI in that contest.

- The most experienced group on the team patrols the outfield, with 432 career games started is guided by volunteer assistant **Zach Weatherford** in his second season on staff, as well as working the base runners.
- In four seasons as a student-athlete at Wright State - three playing for IU head coach **Jeff Mercer** - Weatherford set the WSU single season stolen base record (36) and won the Rawlings Gold Glove patrolling center field.
- Weatherford played one season in the Cleveland Guardians system, before getting his start in college coaching at Wright State as the director of operations.
- Sophomore **Carter Mathison** hit his first home run of the 2023 season - a first-inning grand slam - at Auburn (2/19) that set the tone for IU's 11-2 win in the series finale, which gave Mercer his 100th coaching victory at Indiana.
- Mathison got off to a slow start, but has picked up his production over the last 25 games. After hitting .235 for the first 28 games, he has clipped a .367 batting average in the last 25 games.

- The Fort Wayne, Indiana, native set the Indiana freshman record for home runs with a team-best 19 during the 2022 season, a total that ranks No. 2 all-time in Big Ten history among freshmen (21 - **Brad Carlson**, Iowa; 1999).
- Mathison toppled **Alex Dickerson's** mark of 14 home runs in 2009 and became the first freshman to lead Indiana in home run since **Sam Travis** (9) in 2012.
- He also tied IU's 34 year-old freshman RBI record with 58 in 2022, which equaled the mark of **Phil Dauphin** (1988) on his way to consensus Freshman All-America honors.
- His 10 home runs and 28 RBIs in Big Ten play during the 2022 season rank tied for No. 2 and No. 10, respectively, on the conference only charts at Indiana. He is just the fourth Hoosier to reach double-digit home runs in conference-only action in program history.
- Redshirt junior **Bobby Whalen** is in his third season with the program after one season at Louisville.
- A Pennsylvania high school wrestler, Whalen patrols center field with an edge that includes crashing into walls and multiple diving catches. Since 2021, Whalen left his feet on 21 occasions to rob opponents of possible extra bases.
- Whalen is from an athletic family with father, Bob (*Cornell wrestling*), sisters Ashton (*Villanova field hockey*) and Brett (*Notre Dame track and field*) and brother Cole (*Lafayette College baseball*) all participating in college athletics.
- After playing in just eight games as a redshirt freshman, Whalen started all 59 games in 2022 and reached base safely in 50 contests with at least one hit in 42 games.
- Whalen has reached base safely in 97 of 114 career starts with a hit in 83 contests. He has scored at least one run in 70 of those games.
- His aggressive approach also showed on the bases with a team-best 22 stolen bases in 2022. Whalen is just the fourth Hoosier since 2010 to reach the 20 stolen base mark and first since **Matt Gorski** (24) in 2018.

- Senior **Hunter Jessee** appeared in 14 of 15 games in 2020 (12 starts) then saw action in just 21 games in the 2021 campaign, before breaking out in 2022.
- The left-handed hitter became the first Indiana hitter to hit .400 in conference play since **Dustin DeMuth** (.448) in 2014 with a .402 batting average against Big Ten opposition in 2022.
- The South Lebanon, Ohio, native also posted highest single-season on-base percentage since Dickerson (.472) in 2010. That was thanks in part to 33 walks and four hit-by-pitch to only 33 strikeouts in 2022.
- Jessee reached base safely in the final 19 games of 2022 - missing the final game due to an injury (hand) he suffered in a win over Maryland at the Big Ten Tournament - and reached in the first 15 games of 2023 to equate to a 34-game reached base streak.

- Against Purdue, Jessee homered twice in the sixth inning of a 26-11 victory on Friday night. The occurrence has happened many times according to the NCAA record books, most recently by East Carolina's **Bryson Worrell** and Auburn's **Cole Foster**, who both did so in the NCAA Regional round for their schools.

- Redshirt junior **Morgan Colopy** missed a good chunk of the 2022 season due to injury (wrist), but has started 65 career games at Indiana in the outfield. He has nine career home runs and 42 RBIs, with five and 21, respectively, coming as a redshirt freshman in 2021.

- One of the biggest hits of the season came from Colopy in the 10th inning of a scoreless game against Iowa. His two-run home run gave Indiana the win to square the series at one game apiece and eventually a Hoosier series win.

- After a decorated career at LaSalle High School in Cincinnati, freshman **Devin Taylor** has started 41 games and leads the team with 14 home runs in 2023.

- He had his breakout game against Bellarmine in the third game of the series with a 4-for-4 day, four runs scored, one walk and stole one base in the contest.

- The rookie currently leads the team in home runs (14) and has 32 walks to just 36 strikeouts on the season to bolster a .453 on-base percentage.

- He is a three-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week, winning the award on March 20, 27 and April 17. He claimed his first after hitting three home runs in a weekend series with Morehead State and then followed that by hitting .385 with five runs scored and a team-best eight RBIs in his first career Big Ten series with Ohio State.

- He then hit three home runs in a series against Illinois, which included a grand slam that opened the scoring in a series clinching victory. In four games, Taylor hit .500 with a 1.778 OPS, as seven of nine hits went for extra bases.
- Taylor is joining some select company in the Indiana record books, as he continues to climb the freshman home run charts, already passing fellow southwest Ohio product **Kyle Schwarber** (8, 2012).

- The 2023 pitching staff features 20 student-athletes, with just four throwing a pitch for the Cream and Crimson entering 2022. Of the 15 newcomers, six are true freshmen, eight are Division I additions and one is a junior college transfer.
- All 19 available pitchers have appeared on the mound in 2023, the most in program history. The previous high came in 2011 when 18 arms were used.
- With experience at every level of baseball from high school to Major League Baseball, pitching coach **Dustin Glant** has impacted the IU staff in just two seasons.
- In his first year, Indiana became the second team in Big Ten history to reach the 600-strikeout mark in a season. In 2022, the Hoosiers joined Iowa (602 strikeouts) as the only Big Ten programs to strikeout 600 in a single season.
- The Hoosiers finished No. 2 in the Big Ten in total strikeouts (600) and strikeouts per nine innings (10.5), a total that sat No. 12 in Division I.
- During his time at Ball State, Glant's staff set a then-NCAA record with 11.1 strikeouts per nine innings during the 2019 season.

Since 2019, Indiana has seen a Big Ten-best 19 student-athletes taken in the Major League Baseball Draft, with 11 of those pitchers.

The 11 pitchers drafted includes eight of the possible 12 weekend starters over that span. All three weekend starters were picked in 2019 and 2021 and seven of the 11 had at least one year of eligibility remaining, with two drafted after their second full collegiate seasons.

- Sophomore **Luke Hayden** is a Bloomington, Indiana, native and appeared in 20 games with six starts in 2022. He collected four wins to rank No. 2 on the team.
- Hayden missed time during 2023 with an injury (wrist - non-throwing), but returned to close out the Ohio State victory and earn the win. He fired 3 1/3 innings and allowed one run on one hit with five strikeouts.
- As Indiana got set for the final weekend series of 2023, Hayden played a big role in the final midweek win. He threw the final four innings - a career-high-tying effort - and allowed just one run on three hits with four strikeouts to earn his first career save.

Fishers, Indiana, native **Craig Yoho** spent his first two collegiate seasons as a hitter at University of Houston, before transferring to Indiana for the 2021 season.

Yoho suffered a pair of injuries that kept him out of the 2021 (arm) and 2022 (knee) seasons. In the offseason, he married the former Sydney Dusek on July 2, 2022 in Dripping Springs, Texas.

- The right-hander fired his first collegiate pitch against Miami (Ohio) on February 21, 2023 and worked two scoreless innings with five strikeouts in his first collegiate game in 1,082 days.
- He earned his first career victory in with one scoreless inning and two strikeouts against Georgetown at the Keith LeClair Classic in Greenville, North Carolina.
- The first save for Yoho came as part of a combined shutout at Northwestern (5/5). He tossed 2 1/3 innings scoreless with three hits, two walks and two strikeouts.
- Over 15 appearances in 2023, Yoho has piled up 53 strikeouts in 13 innings of work - 15.4 strikeouts per 9 innings - and walked just 14 batters. He leads the team with a 4-1 record.

After four seasons at Davidson College, right-hander **Gabe Levy** adds versatility to the Indiana staff, as he has served as a starter and closer in his career.

Levy started 20 of 40 appearances over his first three seasons at Davidson, before 23 relief appearances with eight saves as a senior. He also had 11 saves as a freshman in 2019.

After posting nine quality starts in 12 starts on the mound for Tacoma Community College in 2022, **Seti Manase** was named the Northwest Athletic Conference West Region Pitcher of the Year in 2022.

In 2020, Manase led Tacoma C.C. in victories (9), innings pitched (74 2/3), strikeouts (92), ERA (1.69), appearances (13) and games started (12) and allowed three-or-fewer runs in 10 of 12 starts.

In 2023, Manase has made 15 appearances - 13 starts - and allowed just 10 earned runs on 32 hits over 33 innings of work. Opponents are hitting just .256 against the right-hander.

After one season at Western Kentucky, **Luke Sinnard** arrived on campus in Bloomington with 26 1/3 innings and has more than doubled that total in 2023.

Sinnard earned his first action in the cream and crimson in the series finale at Auburn (2/19) with five innings of one-run work. He struck out four, walked one and allowed just one hit in a victory.

The 6-foot-8 right-hander followed that with five innings of two-run work on Sunday at Texas (2/26) to earn the victory. He struck out seven with five hits allowed and no walks.

A quality start versus Georgetown at the LeClair Classic in Greenville, North Carolina, was followed by a career-best 13 strikeouts over six innings of work (72% of outs via strikeout) against Morehead State. He allowed two runs on two hits in a no decision and was a part of the Collegiate Baseball Magazine National Player of the Week Honor Roll for his efforts.

His first Big Ten outing lasted six innings in the middle game of the series versus Ohio State. He struck out eight, walked one and allowed four runs on eight hits in a no decision.

A third quality start came against Iowa with six innings of scoreless work and 12 strikeouts. He didn't walk a batter and hit one batter in a no decision and a game that Indiana eventually won, 2-0, in the 10th inning.

Entering Week 14, Sinnard is closing in on the 100-strikeout mark in a season, which would be the seventh in Hoosier history.

Sinnard struck out 28 batters over 26 1/3 innings at WKU in 2022 and has 94 punchouts in 72 2/3 innings of work in 13 starts in 2023.

After two seasons at Fordham, **Brooks Ey** joined the IU pitching staff with 27 appearances - 20 starts - and 128 innings of work for the Rams. He struck out 105 batters and won four games on the mound at Fordham.

In his first Indiana start, Ey went six innings and allowed two runs on five hits to earn the victory and seal a series win at Illinois. He struck out two and didn't walk a batter.

Graduate transfer **Wes Burton** joins the staff a season after being a part of the College World Series championship team at Ole Miss.

Burton earned his first career save with 2 1/3 scoreless innings at Penn State (4/2) in the second game of a doubleheader. He stranded the bases loaded in a three-run game in the seventh and struck out five of the final seven batters of the game.

All six true freshman pitchers have debuted in 2023 and the entire freshman class had earned their first collegiate victories by the midway point of the 2023 season.

Aydan Decker-Petty was ranked as the No. 149 right-handed pitcher nationally by Perfect Game. He has eight appearances and is 1-0 with 10 1/3 innings of work and 10 strikeouts.

Connor Foley was a two-time all-state pick out of Jasper (Ind.) High School, where he helped the program to the Indiana High School Athletic Association Class 4A state championship as a junior. He struck out 86 batters 54 innings as a senior.

Foley owns three victories and two saves in 17 appearances with 32 strikeouts over 22 1/3 innings.

Cooper Katskee earned honorable mention All-West Region from Perfect game on three occasions and led Colorado High School Activities Association Class 5A in regular season strikeouts (74) as a senior. He was a two-time state champion in football as a quarterback, once at Cherry Creek High School (Colo.) and once at Burke (Omaha, Neb.) High School.

After a prep career at Calvary Christian High School in Dunedin, Florida, where he finished his career 7-0 with a 0.58 ERA over 48.2 career innings, **Ethan Phillips** has impacted the bullpen.

His best outing was 4 2/3 innings of relief against No. 10 Louisville, where he stranded a base runner in the third inning and allowed one unearned run with four strikeouts to earn his second career victory.

Phillips threw four innings against Evansville in the final midweek game to earn the victory - his fourth of the season - with one run allowed on four hits.

Rated the No. 221 overall prospect and No. 66 right-handed pitcher nationally by Perfect Game, **Brayden Risedorph** was the No. 4 prospect in Indiana after striking out 74 batters in 39 innings of work as a senior.

Risedorph has started four games with 20 total appearances. He owns a 2-0 record and five saves with 48 punchouts over 40 1/3 innings of work.

His best start came at Cincinnati (4/19) with four scoreless innings and career-best seven strikeouts. He scattered two hits and did not walk a batter to earn the win.

Evan Whiteaker (pronounced *White-acre*) was a top-15 recruit out of Ohio by Perfect Game after posting the lowest WHIP in program history at Lakota East. The right-hander also lettered in hockey.

- Sophomore **Ryan Kraft** is in his second season on the mound after a rookie campaign that featured a team-high-tying 25 appearances with one start.
- In 43 career appearances, Kraft has fired more than one inning on 27 occasions, including 21 relief outings or two-or-more innings.
- The left-hander carried a 24 1/3-inning scoreless streak that spanned the series opener against Morehead State (3/15) to Maryland (4/30). During the eight outing stretch he allowed 18 hits - three doubles - and struck out 18 batters.
- Kraft earned his first career save with three scoreless innings in the series finale at Texas and is currently tied for the lead in the Big Ten with five saves in 2023.
- He logged three saves in Indiana's four-game sweep of Bellarmine with just four base runners allowed and no earned runs in four total innings of work.
- In the first game of a doubleheader at Illinois, Kraft fired six scoreless innings to allow IU to rally for a 6-4 win. He scattered six hits, walked two and struck out three to earn the win.
- At Northwestern, Kraft entered in the second inning with IU trailing 1-0 and threw the next 7 1/3 innings to allow Indiana to rally for an extra inning win. He allowed one unearned run on four hits and one walk. He tied a career-high seven strikeouts in a no decision.
- Kraft finished off a **Brayden Risedorph** start against Purdue (5/13) with five innings of two-run work to earn his sixth win of the season. He allowed five hits, walked two and struck out four in the series clinching victory.
- Kraft finished tied for No. 2 among Indiana freshman all-time in strikeouts (59), just behind Brad Edwards (69; 1999). He equaled the mark of **Tim Clifford** (1978) and **Blake Monar** (2009), with his total the highest among IU freshman that were primarily relievers in program history.
- The No. 85 left-handed pitching recruit nationally by Perfect Game as a senior in high school, two of Kraft's grandparents graduated from Indiana.

- Among NCAA relievers, Kraft ranks No. 6 in innings pitched as a reliever (*doesn't include innings as a starter*).

- A season after stranding all 18 inherited runners, **Grant Holderfield** will miss his sophomore season (injury).
- The left-hander didn't allow a run of his own 11 outings and issued two-or-fewer walks in 23 games over a team-high-tying 25 appearances in 2022.
- Holderfield posted two wins, two holds and two saves in his first collegiate season.
- Not the only student-athlete in the family, his brother Griffin was a right-handed pitcher at Creighton (2020-22) for three seasons.

- Redshirt senior **Ty Bothwell** owns 43 career appearances and 12 starts at Indiana. He owns 101 innings of work with 130 strikeouts.
- The southpaw owns a 9-4 record on the mound with one save and a .190 batting average against.
- His 6.15 hits per nine innings rank No. 8 among the NCAA active leaders and his 11.58 strikeouts per nine innings sit No. 46 among the active Division I pitchers.
- In 2022, Bothwell took the mound in the third inning of a resumed game from the day before and tossed the final seven innings hitless against Minnesota (5/15).
- After 38 career appearances at Siena, **Ben Seiler** made his first career Indiana appearance in a start on opening night at Auburn (2/17).
- Seiler owns 54 career appearances with 182 strikeouts over 185 1/3 innings of work in his career.
- The Albany, New York, native owned the top single game strikeout mark in NCAA Division I during the 2022 season with 19 punchouts against Niagara (4/23/22).
- After making four starts to open his Indiana career, Seiler has appeared out of the bullpen his last three outings. He earned his first career save against Morehead State (3/16) with four shutout innings in relief. He struck out seven and only issued one walk.
- Seiler won his first game at Indiana with three innings of relief work at Northwestern (5/7). He allowed two runs - one earned - on three hits and struck out two in the series finale.

- Redshirt senior **Matthew Ellis** earned third-team All-Big Ten honors in 2022 after hitting 18 home runs and driving in 65 RBIs, both which rank among the top 10 on the IU single season charts.
- He finished tied for No. 7 on IU's single season home run charts (18) with **Kyle Schwarber** (2013) and **Alex Smith** (1986), and tied for No. 10 on the single season RBI charts (65) with **Seth Bynum** (2004), **Vasili Spanos** (2002) and **Doug DeVore** (1999).
- In 83 career starts, Ellis reached base safely in 71 of them with a hit in 51 games. He owns 85 RBIs and 22 home runs with a .265 batting average. His on-base percentage of .397 is bolstered by 55 walks and 11 hit-by-pitch.
- Ellis spent his first collegiate season at Tennessee, but did not appear in a game. He transferred to Walters State Community College and reached base in 76 of 87 games over two seasons.
- After three seasons at Big Ten foe Rutgers, **Peter Serruto** transferred to Indiana after playing in 84 career games with 58 starts for the Scarlet Knights.
- In his first season at Indiana, Serruto appeared in 34 games with 23 starts behind the plate and earned his degree in liberal studies in 2022.
- At Texas on Feb. 26, Serruto gunned down three potential base stealers in a 4-2 Indiana victory in the series finale. He also caught one runner trying to advance to second on a wild pitch that got off the home plate dirt.
- Serruto continued his great play in 2023 with a 4-for-4 day at the plate with the game-tying RBI in the eighth inning of the series-clinching game versus Iowa. He scored two of the four runs, as well.
- Out of high school, Serruto was drafted in the 22nd round of the 2018 Major League Baseball Draft by the Cincinnati Reds after he was ranked the No. 62 catcher nationally by Perfect Game.
- Sophomore **Brock Tibbitts** was No. 65 catcher nationally and No. 14 overall prospect in Ohio per Perfect Game as a prep and should see some time behind the plate during the 2023 season. **MORE INFO ON PAGE 7**
- Freshman **AJ Shepard** will miss the 2023 season due to injury. The catching prospect was rated the No. 359 overall prospect and No. 23 catcher nationally by Perfect Game as a senior and earned high honorable mention All-America from the publication.
- Older brother, Corey, was a collegiate swimmer at the United States Air Force Academy and competed at the 2020 USA Swimming Olympic Trials.
- A pair of transfers were added to the catching corps, in Louisville transfer **Austin Bode** and Maryland transfer **Riley Langerman**.
- Bode appeared in 16 games with one start at Louisville and helped the Cardinals to the NCAA Super Regional round in 2022. He hit .294 with five RBIs and owned a .409 on-base percentage.
- Langerman started 16 games over two seasons at Maryland after playing two seasons at Ventura (Calif.) College. He as a part of back-to-back NCAA Regional appearances, the 2022 Big Ten Championship team and Super Regional squad.
- Langerman made his first start at Indiana in a midweek game at Cincinnati (4/19). We worked one walk in three plate appearances.
