WEEKEND RECAP

• Indiana continued its outstanding start to the season, sweeping Baylor in its own ballpark by a combined score of 29-10. The Hoosiers never trailed in the three-game series and took an early lead in the first inning of all three contests.

Weekend Notes

- First non-conference true road series sweep for IU since 2007 (at Florida A&M)
- Fewest runs conceded in a three-game series since 2019 (10)
- 15 runs scored in the Sunday game (Feb. 25) were most in non-conference road game since '15
- Best start (6-1) to a full 56-game season since 2018

MOVING UP THE POLLS

• The Hoosiers find themselves in the four main baseball polls (D1 Baseball, Baseball America, Perfect Game and NCBWA) this weekend after a 6-2 start to the season. IU is as high as No. 20 (D1 Baseball), setting the stage for two more ranked matchups this weekend.

• Friday's matchup with No. 16 and undefeated Alabama will be a top-20 matchup in Frisco and will also pit IU against former Maryland coach Rob Vaughn. The Hoosiers will then see No. 25 Dallas Baptist on Saturday afternoon, another undefeated program.

• IU's first three weekends see it play four different top-25 programs. Following the trip to Frisco Classic is a visit from undefeated Troy, one of the top mid-major teams in the entire country.

SOPHOMORE STUD

• Sophomore Devin Taylor is tearing the cover off the ball to begin 2024, reaffirming his case to be one of the top available college bats in the 2025 MLB Draft. Through seven games this year, the Cincinnati native is batting .500 (17-34) with three home runs and eight RBIs.

• He leads an IU lineup that is hitting a collective .312 on the campaign with four players at a .300 average or better. The Hoosiers have mashed 16 home runs this year and have scored 66 runs. He was named Big Ten Player of the Week on Feb. 26 and currently leads the conference in batting average.

FOLEY'S THAT DUDE

• Facing the task of building the entire weekend rotation from a year ago, sophomore Connor Foley has helped ease the task for Saturdays. Through two starts, he has yet to concede a run and has struck out 14 batters in 10 scoreless innings. He dominated Baylor on Saturday afternoon with six innings and just one hit enroute to the victory.

• Fellow sophomores Brayden Risedorph (Friday) and Ethan Phillips (Sunday) have made consecutive starts in their respective roles as well.

OFFENSE IS ROLLING

• It should be no surprise that the IU offense is starting to click in the early parts of the season. Despite leaving a number of runners on base, IU has scored 66 runs in eight games and put up at least nine hits in each contest so far.

• Six different players have eight-or-more hits with four Hoosiers (Taylor, Carter Mathison, Josh Pyne and Tyler Cerny) in double figures for hits already this season.

WRIGHT STATE

Assistant Coach (2014-16), Head Coach (2017-18)

• The first former student-athlete to be named head coach of the baseball program, Mercer led Wright State for two seasons and amassed 77 victories. In his two seasons at the helm, WSU won nearly 70 percent of its games and averaged 38.5 wins per season.

• The 2018 Horizon League Coach of the Year, the Raiders won the regular season and conference tournament title in the 2018 to earn a spot in the NCAA Stanford Regional. In 2017, Mercer's squad earned the programs first-ever national ranking.

• The 2018 Horizon League champions, Wright State won eight of its last 10 games and 15 of its last 19 to close the season. The Raiders grabbed the tournament title with three-straight wins and outscored opponents 32-11 during the run.

• With a 39-17 overall record and a 22-6 league mark, WSU ranked No. 8 in the country in scoring (7.8 rpg) and stolen bases (110) and was No. 21 in on-base percentage (.394). The Raiders' .979 fielding percentage was No. 10 nationally.

• Wright State was led by Horizon League Player of the Year Gabe Snyder, who paced the conference in home runs (15) and RBI (73), and was second in batting average (.359), missing the league's Triple Crown by one batting average point.

3rd Season • Purdue ('03)

Dustin Glant helped oversee the development of starting pitcher Luke Sinnard into one of the nation's most dominant strikeout forces in 2023. He set the Indiana single-season strikeout record with 114 punchouts which ranked No. 1 in the Big Ten and No. 16 in the NCAA.

Sinnard started 16 games on the mound, collecting six victories while holding opponents to three-or-fewer runs on 10 different occasions. IU's 598 strikeouts as a team are second only to the 2022 team, also

coached by Glant, in program history.

Ryan Kraft was named a First Team All-Big Ten relief pitcher after appearing in 21 games and collecting six victories and five saves. He finished the season with a 2.48 ERA while striking out 51 batters and holding opponents to just a .249 batting average.

In his first season on campus, Glant helped the Indiana pitching staff continue a run of success in the Major League Baseball Draft, as well as establish a new program record for strikeouts in a season. The 600 strikeouts in 2022 rank atop the IU charts and are No. 2 in Big Ten history, behind Iowa's 609 strikeouts during the same 2022 campaign.

In the MLB Draft, Indiana's top two starting pitchers and top reliever were each selected in the 2022 event. The No. 1 starter on the staff, Jack Perkins, was picked in the fifth round by Oakland after posting 91 strikeouts to pace the team. Bradley Brehmer and Reese Sharp were taken in the 12th and 20th rounds.



4 • ASSISTANT COACH • DEREK SIMMONS

5th Season • Georgia State ('09)

Derek Simmons enters his fifth season at Indiana and continues to work with the hitters and coach the infielders and man the third-base coaches' box on game days, while entering his third season as the program's recruiting coordinator.

The 13-year coaching veteran has thrived on the recruiting front in previous stops, with a pair of top-25 recruiting class to go along with four other "top classes" per Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. The Duluth, Georgia, native was also named to Baseball America's Coaches to Watch list in 2018 and 2019.

In his career, he has coached or recruited 58 all-conference honorees, three conference "of the year" award winners, nine All-Americans and five Freshmen All-Americans. The Duluth, Georgia, native is also a part of the USA Baseball program, which includes stints with the 18U National Team and the 14U National Training Development Program.

His time in Bloomington has seen the development of multiple MLB Draft picks, three Freshmen All-Americans in 2022, one freshman All-American hitter in 2023, a shortened 2020 season and a program-record 26 Big Ten victories during the 2021 conference-only slate.

Devin Taylor broke onto the scene as a freshman in 2023, breaking the Indiana freshman RBI record (59) and earning Big Ten Freshman of the Year honors. He hit 16 home runs in his rookie year which is No. 2 among freshmen in program history behind only Carter Mathison's 19 in 2022.

Zach Weatherford starts year three with Indiana and his first as a full-time assistant coach. He works with the program's outfielders and base runners. He also assists head coach Jeff Mercer and assistant coach Derek Simmons with the Hoosiers' hitters.

Devin Taylor broke onto the scene as a freshman in 2023, breaking the Indiana freshman RBI record (59) and earning Big Ten Freshman of the Year honors. He hit 16 home runs in his rookie year which is No. 2

among freshmen in program history behind only Carter Mathison's 19 in 2022. Taylor made 42 starts in the outfield in 2023.

In 2022, the trio of position players, Carter Mathison, Josh Pyne and Brock Tibbitts were all tabbed to Freshman All-America teams, with Mathison setting the Indiana freshman home run mark at 19 home runs. That total ranked No. 3 nationally among freshmen. Along with the trio of Freshman All-America picks, Evan Goforth joined them on the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. On the bases, Indiana stole 65 bases, its most since 2018 (72) season.

Weatherford also spent his first season in collegiate baseball as the Director of Operations at Wright State. The Raiders advanced to the 2021 NCAA Knoxville Regional when they swept through the Horizon League Tournament by outscoring its three opponents 40-10 after a Horizon League-record 28 conference victories in the regular season.

Denton Sagerman enters his sixth season as a member of the staff. He serves as Director of Player Development and Operations.

The former collegiate pitcher also works closely with pitching coach Dustin Glant assisting him with pitch design, video analysis, TrackMan and Rapsodo in a non-coaching capacity.

Prior to Indiana, Sagerman served as the director of baseball operations at Wright State University, under head coach Jeff Mercer. He also focused on analytics and its uses in player development.

A two-time graduate from the University of Dayton, Sagerman owns his bachelor (2015) and master (2017) of engineering degrees. He was also a two-time letterwinner for the Flyers baseball program and a part of the 2012 Atlantic 10 championship team that qualified for the NCAA Tournament.

2024 PRESEASON PRIMER

2023 Review

After starting a lineup consisting mostly of freshmen in 2022, the Hoosiers took a massive step forward in 2023 with a program filled with budding stars.

IU improved from 27 to 43 wins in 2023, a 16-win turnaround led by a strong sophomore core featuring Brock Tibbitts, Josh Pyne, Carter Mathison and transfer pitcher Luke Sinnard.

Along with a collection of talented freshmen in Devin Taylor ('23 Big Ten Freshman of the Year), Tyler Cerny, Brayden Risedorph and Connor Foley, IU returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2019.

The Hoosiers came within one win of a Super Regional date with overall No. 1 seed LSU, dropping the final two games of the regional to the hosts Kentucky.

IU finished second in the Big Ten but had a chance to clinch a share of the title on the final weekend. Taylor and relief pitcher Ryan Kraft were First Team All-Big Ten selections after dominating years.

Head coach Jeff Mercer tallied the first 40-win season of his head-coaching career and returned the Hoosiers to the 40-win plateau for the first time since 2014.

Phillip Glasser and Craig Yoho saw their names selected in the MLB Draft while IU totaled three Freshman All-Americans for the second-straight year.

A dominating force at home, IU won a record 26 games at Bart Kaufman Field and finished the season 26-4 in the friendly confines. IU finished 16-8 in Big Ten play, coming within a game of first-place Maryland for the title.

Peter Serruto's walk-off home run over Kentucky sent the Hoosiers to the NCAA Regional final for the first time since 2014 while Luke Sinnard broke IU's single-season strikeout record in 2023.

IU picked up wins over powerhouses Texas, Louisville and Auburn in 2023 to give it the highest RPI in the Big Ten at 30.

The Hoosiers return five position starters for the 2024 season.

2024 Preseason Primer

After an appearance in the NCAA Regional finals a season ago, the Indiana Baseball program gets ready to open the 2024 season in February with a roster full of young and dynamic talent.

Armed with an outstanding coaching staff and array of talented players, IU will be among the top contenders in the Big Ten across preseason publications come February.

The Core Five in the Field

Albeit graduating starting shortstop Phillip Glasser, a 10th round pick of the Washington Nationals, IU returns four of its five best offensive options as well as Glasser's replacement in sophomore Tyler Cerny.

Cerny (.276) along with junior Brock Tibbitts (.357), sophomore Devin Taylor (.315), junior Carter Mathison (.311) and junior Josh Pyne (.295) make up a stellar offensive core for head coach Jeff Mercer in 2024.

The five players, four of which are draft eligible in 2024, combined for 52 home runs last season and contributed 275 runs batted in for the Hoosiers. Mathison and Taylor will pair with Western Illinois transfer Nick Mitchell to make up one of the most potent offensive outfields in the entire country.

Testing the Team Early

No stranger to scheduling tough tests early in the non-conference season, Mercer has once again loaded up the first part of his schedule to test his program early.

IU will face seven NCAA tournament teams from last season across the first four weekends with a three-game set on the road at Baylor sprinkled in the same stretch.

The Hoosiers have faced an SEC team in the non-conference in each of Mercer's seasons at the helm. IU went to Tennessee (2019), LSU (2020) and Auburn (2023) and have had matchups in round robin tournaments in Texas against Arkansas (2022) and Alabama (2024).

Young and Deep on the Mound

Even without the services of right-handed pitcher Luke Sinnard, who is expected to miss the entire of the 2024 season, IU has a strong collection of arms that have continued to develop under third-year pitching coach Dustin Glant.

IU won't ride a traditional starting rotation, electing to attack each day of the weekend series one at a time. Seven pitchers return in 2024 who made at least 13 appearances on the mound last year including sophomore Brayden Risedorph (25), junior Ryan Kraft (21) and sophomore Connor Foley (20).

Grant Holderfield, who made 25 appearances as a freshman in 2022, makes his return to action after missing last year through injury. Impact transfers Ben Grable (Northwestern), Jack Moffitt (Gonzaga), Drew Buhr (Bellarmine) and Julian Tonghini (Boston College) add depth to IU's collection of options out of the bullpen.

The Big Ten Standard

Since IU's magical 2013 season, which took the program to its first College World Series, it has been the standard for the rest of the Big Ten when it comes to success.

Over the past seven years, IU has the joint-most wins in conference play (112). The Hoosiers have won the most Big Ten regular season titles (3) since 2013) while also making the most NCAA Tournament appearances (7) in the same span.

IU holds the longest streak of consecutive Big Ten Tournament appearances (10 straight) and has made four NCAA regional finals since 1999.

Since opening Bart Kaufman Field in 2013, IU has created one of the best home environments. The Hoosiers have 189 home wins in the time frame including a 26-4 record in 2023.

40 is the Magic Number

The standard of success in a college baseball season is eclipsing 40 wins. The Hoosiers did so last year in the regular season, winning the 40th game of the year on the final day at Michigan State before winning three more in the postseason.

Since college baseball went to a standard 56-game schedule in 1991, IU has had five 40-win seasons, all of which have resulted in NCAA Tournament bids. The Hoosiers will be searching for its first back-to-back 40-win seasons since 2013-14. IU has never won 40 regular season games in back-to-back years.

Over the course of the season, Mercer will be chasing 250 career wins. He is 31 shy of 250 and will be looking for his third season of 37+ wins in his first full four years (2020 and 2021 were shortened).

BART KAUFMAN FIELD

Bart Kaufman Field Dedication: April 27, 2013

Capacity: 2,500

On August 19, 2011, the Indiana University Board of Trustees approved plans for a new baseball–softball complex. These new fields would be located just north of Assembly Hall, near the intersection of the 45/46 bypass and Fee Lane.

The new baseball field would replace Sembower Field, which had been the Hoosiers' home field since 1951. On February 15, 2012, Indiana University announced that the new baseball field would be named after Bart Kaufman, CEO of the Indianapolis-based Kaufman Financial Corporation, and an Indiana baseball alumnus. This announcement came after Kaufman pledged \$2.5 million to the construction of a new stadium.

Construction began on Bart Kaufman Field in May 2012, and was finished in March 2013; the stadium was formally dedicated on April 27 of that year. The Hoosiers' first game in the stadium was March 20, 2013, with a 15–1 win over Miami University.

On December 19, 2017, Indiana University Athletics announced plans to install an LED video scoreboard, beyond the outfield wall. The size of the new scoreboard is estimated to be 26.8 feet (8.16 m) high by 48.7 (14.84 m) feet wide.

Installation of the new scoreboard was completed prior to the start of the 2018 season, with it being utilized for the Hoosiers' home opener on March 6, 2018, against Cincinnati.

The facility has a clubhouse and locker room, training area and team rooms, indoor and outdoor hitting cages, turf field, press box, lights for night play, bench and stadium chair seating, entry plaza, picnic area, concessions and restrooms.

The stadium hosted an NCAA Regional in its first two years of existence; it marked the first two times the IU baseball program has played tournament games on campus. Bart Kaufman Field hosted its first Big Ten baseball tournament from May 24 to 28, 2017.

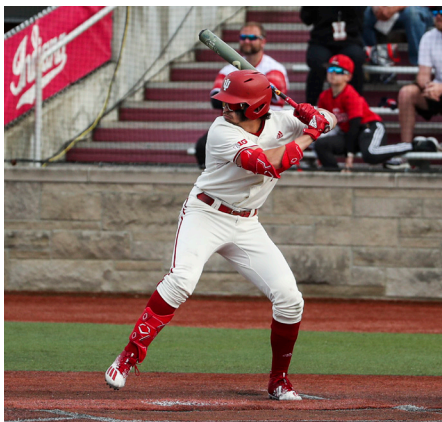
