FIRST SERVE

BIG WEEK AHEAD

• Every team in the country is entering the final week of the non-conference slate before respective conference schedules get underway. IU will meet Notre Dame in a home-and-home series on Friday (A) and Sunday (H).

• Notre Dame is off to a 6-1 start with a pair of wins over Northwestern and a true road win at Mississippi State. The road to an at-large bid for the Hoosiers would look a lot clearer with one, if not, two wins over the Fighting Irish this week. The two teams are meeting for the first time since 2003.

TATUM'S CAREER DAY

• Junior opposite Avry Tatum had every answer on Saturday afternoon to end the Indiana Invitational. With IU struggling to put away upstart Ball State, Tatum took the match over in the final two sets. From game four on, she delivered 14 kills including nine in set four.

• She became the first IU player with 25 kills since 2021 and was the first Hoosier with 25+ kills and a hitting percentage of .430+ in one match since Ashley Benson in 2010. On the season, she leads all non-Big Ten middle blockers in hitting percentage (.387).

LEARNING WHILE WINNING

• The Hoosiers haven't been perfect this season but are still 6-2 with both losses to team in the top-20 of last week's AVCA poll. IU has had to grit out wins over very good teams in Wichita State, Ball State and UC-Davis.

• IU is learning to play with a new lineup that features a pair of new middles and a couple new back row faces. Freshman middle blocker Ella Boersema and graduate student defensive specialist Delayniece Maple have each improved. Expect to see an even more motivated team defensively heading forward.

ROCKWELL-AIRD CONNECTION

• Indiana head coach Steve Aird and Notre Dame head coach Salima Rockwell are tied together by a deep love for their alma mater, Penn State. Both coaches played at Penn State and went on to coach under legendary head coach Russ Rose.

• The two overlapped as part of the 2007 team at Penn State, helping to coach the team to the national title. It was the beginning of a four-year run of NCAA Championships for the illustrious program.

ALL-TIME COUNTDOWN

• Senior setter Camryn Haworth and outside hitter Mady Saris are closing in on massive milestones. They've started a majority of the matches in their career, proving to be a reliable duo for IU.

• Haworth passed the 3,000-assist threshold - the 8th in program history to do so - and is now chasing 4,000 assists. Along the way, she is hoping to pass the all-time aces mark of 197. She's got 180 for her career, needing just 18 in 22 remaining regular season matches.

• Saris is looking to become the 20th member of the 1,000-kill club at Indiana. She has 947 for her career, just 53 away from reaching the threshold. Breana Edwards (2018-21) is the only other player under head coach Steve Aird to hit the mark.

TEAM NEWS AND NOTES

2023 IN REVIEW

It was a marquee year for the Hoosiers in 2023, matching a program record with 21 regular season wins. Head coach Steve Aird and team finished in a tie for sixth in the Big Ten conference with an 11-9 record.

IU broke an 11-year losing streak to Purdue with a 3-1 victory over its in-state rival in front of a record crowd at Wilkinson Hall. Twice over the course of the season, the Hoosiers set attendance records in the five-year-old building.

Setter Camryn Haworth and libero Ramsey Gary were the backbone of an electric, tough volleyball team. Haworth was an AVCA and Volleyball Mag All-American after finishing the year with 1,247 assists and 73 service aces.

Gary, in her freshman season, was a Second Team All-Big Ten Selection and broke program records for single season digs and freshman single season digs (530).

The Hoosiers were well balanced offensively with six different players providing 170+ kills on the season. Graduate student middle blocker Kaley Rammelsberg joined Haworth and Gary on the All-Big Ten teams.

After the season, head coach Steve Aird was awarded an extension to keep him in Bloomington through the end of the 2029 season. Associate coach Rachel Morris, assistant coach Kevin Hodge and director of operations Hallie Enderle continue their roles on his staff.

2023 OFFSEASON

With five departing seniors, and six departing players in total, IU added some depth at key positions with the addition of eight players to the program. Junior middle blocker Madi Sell (Missouri) and graduate student and defensive specialist Delaynie Maple (USC Beach) joined as transfers.

A five player freshman class includes outside hitter Reese Hazelton (Philipsburg, Pa.), right side Avery Daum (Peachtree Corners, Ga.) and middle blocker Ella Boersema (Churubusco, Ind.)

PRESEASON PRIMER

The Indiana volleyball program officially kicked off its 2024 season with report day to Bloomington on August 7th (Wednesday) and the first day of practice on August 8th (Thursday).

IU won 11 conference games in 2023, the most since 1999, and returns its starting setter (Camryn Haworth), starting libero (Ramsey Gary) and the top four pin options from a season ago.

Led by juniors Candela Alonso-Corcelles and Avry Tatum and seniors Mady Saris and Morgan Geddes, the Hoosiers have the most talent and depth at the outside/opposite hitter position of any season in the Steve Aird era.

Gary and Haworth form one of the most potent libero/setter combinations in the league. They join Nebraska (Rodriguez/Reilly) as the only other setter-libero duo to earn All-Big Ten honors last season.

Grad student defensive specialist Delaynie Maple and sophomore libero Ramsey Gary joined head coach Steve Aird to talk about the program's upcoming season and partake in fun social media trends, behind the scenes interviews and photo shoots at network studios.

AIRD NAMES TEAM CAPTAINS

Senior setter Camryn Haworth, senior outside hitter Kenzie Daffinee and graduate student defensive specialist Delaynie Maple were named the three captains for the 2024 season. Haworth and Daffinee have each spent four years with the Hoosiers while Maple was a multi-time captain with the USC Beach Program.

THE LAST COVID WAIVER

Morgan Geddes will be the final IU athlete to use her fifth-year COVID player to close out her volleyball career at Indiana. A member of the 15th-ranked recruiting class in 2020, Geddes has transformed herself into a potent Big Ten arm for Steve Aird.

Despite battling some injuries at times, Geddes has produced at a high level and will be a reliable option for the Hoosiers. IU has had good success with players using their COVID waiver including setter Brooke Westbeld (2021), libero Paula Cerame (2022) and middle blocker Kaley Rammelsberg (2023).

FINAL RIDE FOR A PROGRAM GREAT

Camryn Haworth is one of seven seniors on this year's roster. A starting setter in some capacity since her freshman year, Haworth has been a treat for IU fans and has helped create some memorable moments over the past three years.

She will have a chance to break the all-time aces record at Indiana and will climb the ranks in all-time assists before its all said and done. She's helped IU to a 37-28 record the last two years and 20 conference wins in 2022 and 2023.

Already an All-American and a unanimous All-Big Ten selection, Haworth will have a plethora of offensive options to pick from in 2024 and will hope to parlay that into ending an NCAA Tournament drought at IU that dates back to 2010.

AIRD SIGNS EXTENSION

Following an outstanding season in which the Indiana volleyball team matched a program record with 21 regular season wins, head coach Steve Aird was awarded a contract extension through the 2029 season.

The Hoosiers won 11 games in the Big Ten for the first time in 24 years and finished in a tie for sixth in the conference. IU broke a losing streak to Purdue that dated back to 2012. Camryn Haworth earned the program's first All-American honors since 2010.

MORRIS NAMED TO UNDER 40 COACHING LIST

Rachel Morris, one of the nation's finest young coaches, was named to Volleyball Magazine's Under 40 College Coaching Hotshots list in the spring of 2024.

Morris, the program's associate head coach and recruiting coordinator, helped improve an IU offense that hit a collective .237 in 2023. She works directly with setter Camryn Haworth who was a unanimous First Team All-Big Ten selection.

She has also helped recruit a pair of outstanding recruiting classes with the 2025 class set to put pen to paper in November of 2024.

PUTTING PLAYERS IN PROS

Two of IU's most recent alumni, Paula Cerame and Kaley Rammelsberg, are off to their second year of pro volleyball in the 2025 season.

In the second year of the Pro Volleyball Federation, Cerame and Rammelsberg will be reunited as members of the Columbus Fury. It will be a homecoming for Rammelsberg. She grew up in Westerville, Ohio, just outside of Columbus.

50 YEARS OF VOLLEYBALL

The Hoosiers will be celebrating 50 season of volleyball and 50 seasons of opportunities for female student-athletes in 2024. A program that began in 1975, six years before the Big Ten and NCAA began sponsoring it, has grown to encompass sellouts in Wilkinson Hall.

- Camryn Haworth recorded the ninth 50-assist match of her career. It was the second this season. She's got 3,176 assists for her illustrious career, moving her into sixth on the all-time program list. Haworth tacked on a pair of service aces to move to 180 for her career. The Fishers, Ind. native needs just 18 aces for the all-time school record.

An exciting chapter began for Indiana University Athletics in the 2018-19 school year as IU unveiled a new, state-of-the-art, 3,000-seat facility - Wilkinson Hall.

Wilkinson Hall is a multi-use training and performance center that is the new home venue for the Indiana Volleyball and Wrestling programs. One of the earliest volleyball specific arenas in the country, athletes and coaches have unlimited access to practice time and resources few schools in the country can provide.

Consistent with the university's master plan, the facility brings these two programs' home competitions back onto the IU Athletics campus from their former University Gymnasium home at the intersection of 10th Street and the 45/46 bypass.

In addition, Wilkinson Hall will provide the entire Indiana University Athletic Department and its programs with a new top-flight facility for year-round training, and will serve as a venue to host department and university events.

Wilkinson Hall is named after IU alumnus Jay Wilkinson and his family, who have an incredible history of support for IU Athletics and its student-athletes.

Indiana Volleyball played its first official matches in Wilkinson Hall during the 2019 campaign and has played there every year since.

In 2019, the opening year of Wilkinson Hall, the Hoosiers were 15th in the NCAA in attendance, the highest the team has ever been in program history.

Following a condensed COVID-19 season in 2020-21, fan support for IU volleyball has continued to grow in the three seasons following the pandemic.

The Hoosiers averaged over 1,300+ fans per season in 2022 and 2023. Matches against Purdue and Nebraska in 2023 were completely sold-out. The match with the Boilermakers, broadcasted on Big Ten Network, saw 2,725 fans in attendance.

Three of IU's four-biggest crowds in volleyball-specific areans came in 2023 in matches against No. 15 Purdue, No. 2 Nebraska and No. 3 Wisconsin.

The Big Ten Network broadcasted live on two occasions from Wilkinson Hall with the Hoosiers knocking off their first top-25 opponent against No. 15 Purdue on Oct. 11, 2023.

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH • RACHEL MORRIS

3rd Season • Oregon ('10)

Rachel Morris completed second season with the Indiana Volleyball program in 2023. She was elevated to associate head coach and recruiting coordinator on July 1, 2023.

Programmed with a desire to develop student-athletes on and off the court, Morris helped implement daily meditation, conversations about mental health and group-bonding activities upon arrival to Bloomington in 2022.

Morris, handed the keys to the team's offensive gameplan, helped orchestrate a team that hit .237 on the season, the fourth-best mark in program history. She oversaw the development of junior setter Camryn Haworth who was the only conference setter to be named a unanimous selection to the All-Big Ten First Team in 2023.

Haworth led the Big Ten in assists (1,247) and led the Big Ten and NCAA in service aces (73), the most in a single season at IU since volleyball became a NCAA sponsored sport in 1981. She was the only power five player with multiple triple-doubles and finished the season with 10.22 assists per set.

The Hoosiers matched a program record with 21 regular season wins in 2023 and beat Purdue for the first time since 2012. IU finished in a tie for sixth in the conference standings, the best finish by the program since the Big Ten expanded to 14 teams.



ASSISTANT COACH • KEVIN HODGE

2nd Season • Penn State

Kevin Hodge completed his first season in Bloomington in 2023. A longtime friend, teammate and co-worker of Aird's, he was named an assistant coach for Indiana volleyball on July 6, 2023.

Hodge spent time working with the team's defensive gameplan and in-game serving strategy. The Hoosiers totaled 215 aces in 2023, becoming the first Big Ten program since 2001-02 with consecutive seasons of 200+ aces. IU's defense was vastly improved in 2023,

totaling 1,647 digs and 303 blocks.

The Hoosiers matched a program record with 21 regular season wins in 2023 and beat Purdue for the first time since 2012. IU finished in a tie for sixth in the conference standings, the best finish by the program since the Big Ten expanded to 14 teams.

Freshman libero Ramsey Gary, who worked closely with Hodge, broke both IU's freshman and all-time single season digs record (530). She was a unanimous selection to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team and earned a nod as a Second Team All-Big Ten selection.

Hodge joins the IU program after working as the Director of Girls Indoor Recruiting at WAVE, California's premier club volleyball program, since 2015. He took on a variety of roles for the club, most notably being named 2019 National 17's Club Coach of the Year.



ASSISTANT COACH • MATT KEARNS

1st Season • Xavier ('17)

Matt Kearns was named the program's third assistant coach on August 5th, 2024.

Known for his work in volleyball analytics and game preparation, Kearns joins the Indiana program after serving one season as the head coach at Louisiana-Monroe.

Prior to his first head coaching job in 2023, Kearns spent six seasons in various roles at mid-major powerhouse Northern Kentucky. He helped lead the Norse to an NCAA Tournament bid in 2019, winning the conference's tournament title with three-straight wins.

In six seasons at Northern Kentucky, the program compiled a 108-69 record with overall season mark above .500 in the final five campaigns. He helped coach a number of All-Horizon League selections including libero Ashton Terrill and outside hitter Anna Brinkmann.

Kearns did his undergraduate studies at Xavier University where he assisted with the volleyball program for parts of four seasons. He became integrated with the Date Volley program, learning the system that helps with analytics and trends in matches. He worked as a Technical Advisor and then as a student coach from 2014-17. He graduated with a degree in Philosophy.

Originally from Bellingham, Mass., Kearns will join the Hoosiers for the beginning of fall camp on head coach Steve Aird's 2024 coaching staff.



DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS • HALLIE ENDERLE

3rd Season • Central Michigan ('15)

Hallie Enderle completed her second season with the Indiana Volleyball program in 2023. She was elevated to director of operations on July 1, 2023.

Her duties include coordinating travel, equipment and facility arrangements as well as helping with the overall function and day-to-day operations of the Indiana Volleyball program.

Enderle spent four seasons playing college volleyball at Central Michigan where she recorded 367 kills for the Chippewas. During her playing career, Central Michigan won the MAC's automatic bid in 2011 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

In 2021, Enderle served as Head Coach for Northern Indiana Volleyball Association's 18-1s, bringing home a USAV National Championship at the 18 Patriot Division.
