LEADING OFF

DT RAKES: Junior outfielder **Devin Taylor** enters 2025 as a consensus Preseason All-American and the favorite to win Big Ten Player of the Year. He is just **12** home runs away from breaking IU's all-time program record. Taylor also needs **51** hits to reach 200 in his career.

QUIET STAR: Junior shortstop **Tyler Cerny** flies under the radar in comparison to his fellow junior star Taylor. But the Greenwood, Ind. native is poised for a massive season. He's only **58** hits away from the 200 mark and is also searching for his third-straight season with **10** home runs.

PYNE PROVIDES: Senior third baseman **Josh Pyne** has been an every day guy for head coach Jeff Mercer the last three years. He's just six (**6**) doubles away from breaking IU's all-time record. He's also hoping to be the first IU player to appear in **200** career games since Logan Sowers (2015-18).

NEXT FRESHMAN STAR: First baseman **Jake Hanley** and catcher/outfielder **Hogan Denny** are next in line to make waves as a true freshmen in Bloomington. IU's had at least one true freshman hit **10+** home runs in three-straight campaigns.

BUHR IS BACK: Veteran reliever **Drew Buhr** received an extra year of eligibility and intends to make it count. Expect pitching coach Dustin Glant to turn the ball over to Buhr early in the weekend. The Austin, Ind. worked a **2.08** ERA in Big Ten play in 2024.


RUNS GALORE: The Hoosiers can score and score fast. Jeff Mercer's ballclub has scored at least 480 runs in each of the last two seasons. It's been since 1985 that the Hoosiers have reached 500 runs in a year. Last year's mark of **482** sits No. 5 in program history.

WEEKEND NOTES: COLLEGE BASEBALL

BIG CHALLENGE AHEAD: The Indiana Baseball team will open its 2025 campaign in Surprise, Arizona at the Sanderson Ford College Baseball Classic. Xavier, UNLV and Oregon State are the other teams in the event.

For the first time since the Big Ten only 2021 season, the Hoosiers will play four games on opening weekend. Due to President's Day on Feb. 17th, the Hoosiers will play an extra game - against UNLV - out in Arizona before returning home.

IU is no stranger to playing ranked opponents in the non-conference. The Hoosiers beat #18 Coastal Carolina and #25 Dallas Baptist last year early in the campaign. Oregon State, IU's third opponent (Feb. 16th), opened the season ranked No. 7 by D1 Baseball.

NEW FACES INTO THE LINEUP: The Hoosiers return six players that started 40+ games a season ago. Still, head coach Jeff Mercer is expected to feature a number of new faces across the opening four games in Arizona.

Freshmen Hogan Denny (C/OF) and Jake Hanley (1B) are expected to be everyday starters from day one. Hanley, a native of Mason, Ohio, is set to play first base for the Hoosiers. Denny, an elite-level bat, has defensive versatility and can play behind the dish or in the outfield.

Louisville transfer Korbyn Dickerson (OF) could be the other new face that makes way onto the lineup card. A natural center fielder, Dickerson has all the tools to be an elite offensive threat as well.

NEW ARMS AND LOTS OF THEM: Pitching coach Dustin Glant will have a large variety arms to select from as he begins to settle into a rotation early in the season. Transfers Gavin Seebold (Southern Indiana), Cole Gilley (Indiana State) and Jackson Yarberry (Saint Louis) are guys that could open up on the mound for IU.

Glant will also turn to reliable long relievers in Drew Buhr, Aydan Decker-Petty and Ryan Kraft before the weekend is over. Backend arms Jacob Vogel and Ben Grable are working back into the mix but could factor heavily in high-leverage situations.

With a quick turnaround ahead of a Wednesday midweek against Purdue Fort Wayne, expect most arms to feature just one time around the order. Talented freshmen Brayton Thomas and Henry Brummel are likely to make collegiate debuts sometime in the first five games.

LAST TIME OUT: NCAA KNOXVILLE REGIONAL

SOUTHERN MISS 15, INDIANA 3
June 2, 2024 | Knoxville, Tenn. | Lindey Nelson Stadium

• The Hoosiers bowed out of the NCAA Tournament with a 15-3 loss to Southern Miss in Knoxville. IU fell behind early after giving up five runs in the first inning.

• Devin Taylor hit his 20th home run of the season while Jasen Oliver hit his 10th home run of the season in the loss. Southern Miss racked up 16 hits, avenging its loss from the first game of the Knoxville Regional.

SERIES VS. COLLEGE BASEBALL CLASSIC OPPONENTS

UNLV: IU will meet the Rebels for the first time in program history on the diamond. Due to President's Day, the two teams will play twice on opening weekend. IU hasn't won on Opening Day since 2019.

XAVIER: The Hoosiers hold a 28-6 advantage through 34 all-time meetings with the Musketeers. The two sides last met in Cincinnati in 2023 with Ty Bothwell picking up the win in an 8-6 victory for IU.

IU and Xavier will play twice in 2025. The first meeting will, obviously, come in Surprise, Ariz. on a neutral site field. The two teams will play just 10 days later in a midweek game in Bloomington (Feb. 25).

Grad student outfielder Tyler DeMartino played four years at Xavier, helping them to the NCAA Tournament in 2023. Former IU right-handed pitcher Evan Whiteaker (2023-24) transferred to Xavier this offseason.

OREGON STATE: Despite being separated by over 2,200 miles, IU and Oregon State have met six times since 2011. The Beavers have won all six contests including an elimination game in the College World Series in 2013.

The two teams have met once during the Jeff Mercer era at IU. Oregon State won 8-3 on March 9, 2019 in a neutral site game in Seattle. Future big leaguer Tanner Gordon took the loss for IU.

Oregon State catcher Adley Rutschman went on to be selected No. 1 overall in the 2019 MLB Draft. The Beavers were a national seed that year but were upset on their own field in the NCAA Tournament.

A WIN WOULD...

OPENING DAY: IU plays UNLV to kick off the 2025 season on February 14th. A victory over the Rebels would be IU's first victory on Opening Day since 2019 (at Memphis). This is the furthest west that IU has opened the season since 2017 - those games also in Surprise, Ariz.

VS. OREGON STATE: The Hoosiers are looking for their first top-10 win since beating #10 Louisville on April 18, 2023. Since 2015, the Hoosiers have beaten the Cardinals three times when they were in the top-10.

It would also be the first win in program history against the Beavers. Oregon State is playing its first season as an independent team. The Hoosiers beat #11 LSU on opening weekend in 2020.

GOING 4-0: IU hasn't started a season 4-0 since the 2003 campaign. It has gone at least 3-1 to start the year on three separate occasions since 2018 but hasn't won the opening four games in 22 years.

The Hoosiers opened last year at 6-1 before a tough month of March. IU would take a 3-1 start to the 2025 year but would come home thrilled with a perfect beginning to the campaign.

2025 QUICK FACTS

Fresh off back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances and top-three finishes in the Big Ten, the Indiana Baseball team has big expectations again in 2025.

Head coach Jeff Mercer - in his seventh season - has created one of the best player development programs in the country. The high school driven model has turned out professional players and a plethora of wins over the last seven years.

With a strong returning core and one of his deepest rosters to date, the Hoosiers are expected to contend in the new-look Big Ten Conference. Here are some notes and numbers to know ahead of a much-anticipated 2025 campaign.

Returning Depth in the Field: The Hoosiers return six different position players that made at least 40 starts last season. Junior Tyler Cerny (SS) and senior Josh Pyne (3B) both started all 60 games a year ago. Junior Devin Taylor (OF) started 59 contests, missing just one due to personal reasons.

Head coach Jeff Mercer will have what is expected to be his deepest and most talented offensive roster of his seven-year tenure in Bloomington.

Paired with the six returning starters, IU brought another strong crop of prep players to campus this fall. Hogan Denny (C/OF) and Jake Hanley (1B) are the blue-chip pieces but Cooper Malamazian (INF) and Cole Decker (OF) could also see plenty of at-bats.

New Look, New Feel on the Mound: After losing a number of big arms to the 2024 MLB Draft (Sinnard, Foley and Risedorph), the Hoosiers completely overhauled their pitching staff with the goal to throw strikes at a more consistent rate this year.

Pitching coach Dustin Glant, who has turned IU into a strikeout machine on the mound, will rely on transfers Gavin Seebold (Southern Indiana), Cole Gilley (Indiana State) and Jackson Yarberry (Saint Louis) as expected starters.

Returning pitchers Drew Buhr, Ryan Kraft and Aydan Decker-Petty will give IU a number of long-relief options. Buhr worked a 3.31 earned run average last year, developing into a reliable option out of the bullpen.

At the back end of the bullpen, Jacob Vogel will return for late-inning action. Ben Grable and Will Eldridge have electric arms and give Glant morfirepower to close down games.

Other options on the mound include freshmen Brayton Thomas and Henry Brummel as well as Seth Benes, Clayton Weisheit, Grant Holderfield, Trey Telfer and Deron Swanson.

2025 THINGS TO WATCH

DT Legacy Season

Devin Taylor will go down as one of the best players in program history. One of the smoothest swings to ever grace Bloomington, the junior will be on record watch throughout the year.

The expected top-15 MLB Draft Pick this summer is just 12 home runs away from breaking the program's all-time home run record. He needs just 51 hits to reach 200 in his IU career and is currently batting .338 across his first two seasons.

Only two other players in IU history (Sam Travis, Alex Dickerson) was named a Big Ten Freshman of the Year and Big Ten Player of the Year during their career. Taylor already was the league rookie of the year (2023) and will now search for the top individual prize in the Big Ten.

Mercer Keeps the Hoosiers Going

Since being hired as the skipper in Bloomington, head coach Jeff Mercer has kept the Hoosiers humming along at a high level. He is just 16 Big Ten wins away from becoming the fastest coach to 100 league wins in program history.

He needs 25 overall wins for 200 in his career at IU and is also on track to become the first IU coach in program history to take the team to three-straight NCAA Tournaments.

Milestones Coming

Players and coaches aren't the only ones with milestones on the horizon in 2025. As a program, the Hoosiers need just 29 wins to reach 2,500 all-time victories. The program is heading into its 131st season and has become a nationally-recognized team over the past 15 years.

If the Hoosiers could get to 40 wins, it would be the fifth 40-win season since 2013. Three different coaches have led IU to a 40-win season in that span. Since 2013, IU has had at least 30 wins in all but one fully contested season.

• The 2018 Horizon League Coach of the Year, the Raiders won the regular season and conference tournament title in the 2018 to earn a spot in the NCAA Stanford Regional. In 2017, Mercer's squad earned the programs first-ever national ranking.

• WSU received its first-ever top 25 ranking in 2017 and finished the year at 38-21 and 21-9 in league action. Mercer's aggressiveness in the run game resulted in Wright State ranking No. 2 nationally with 130 stolen bases.

• Weiss was selected as the 2017 Horizon League Freshman of the Year and first-team all-league along with Morrow. Pitcher Danny Sexton was named a second-team All-Horizon League along with Hendrixson and Gray. Both Weiss earned Freshman All-American and second-team ABCA All-Midwest selection.

4th Season • Purdue ('03)

Despite losing Luke Sinnard, Ben Grable and Matthew Bohnert for the season, three weekend caliber arms, the Hoosiers weathered some early struggles on the mound in 2024. A productive two-month stretch on the bump in April and May helped the program to a second-straight NCAA Tournament appearance.

Dustin Glant helped turn Ty Bothwell and Connor Foley into a pair of reliable starters on the mound. After an up-and-down start to his college career, Bothwell turned in his most complete season in 2024. He pitched 84.2 innings with 91 strikeouts to just 25 walks. He won seven games including the NCAA Tournament opener over Southern Miss.

The Hoosiers had three pitchers picked in the 2024 MLB Draft, part of a Big Ten-best six athletes selected from the program. Luke Sinnard (3rd), Connor Foley (5th) and Brayden Risedorph (20th) combined to make nearly two million dollars in signing bonus money.

Adding to a long history of early success in Bloomington, Jacob Vogel was named a First Team Freshman All-American by the NCBWA. He pitched in 21 games, throwing 23 innings and allowing just six earned runs. It marked the third pitcher in the last two years to earn Freshman All-American honors.

As a group, the Hoosiers totaled 589 strikeouts. The pitching staff was top-25 in the nation in both total strikeouts (589) and strikeouts-per-nine innings (10.1). In 14 games in the month of May, IU's pitching staff produced a 3.78 earned run average to help the program to the postseason.



1 • ASSISTANT COACH • ZACH WEATHERFORD
4th Season • Wright State ('19)

Zach Weatherford starts year four with Indiana and his second as a full-time assistant coach in the 2025 campaign. He added additional duties as the team's recruiting coordinator following a promotion in August of 2024. He is in charge of working with the program's outfielders and base runners.

Weatherford, a Gold Glove outfielder at Wright State, also assists head coach Jeff Mercer with the hitters and offensive strategy. During games, he coaches the first base box and works on the scouting report for opposing teams.

In his first season as a full-time assistant coach, Weatherford helped assist the Hoosiers to one of the best offensive seasons in program history. IU led the Big Ten in hits (625), RBIs (451), total bases (1,030), runs (482) and doubles (140). The Hoosiers hit 83 home runs, good for second in the conference.

Tyler Cerny transformed himself into one of the best hitters in the Big Ten. He led the team and conference in doubles (24), helping IU to a single-season program record for two-baggers. Seven different players had at least 10 doubles including Josh Pyne (22) and Carter Mathison (16).

As the coach for the outfielders, Weatherford helped transition Mathison into a premier defensive threat. In 56 games as the team's starting center fielder, Mathison had a perfect fielding percentage (1.000). He had 145 putouts and one outfield assists with no errors on the campaign. Devin Taylor improved his fielding percentage by 48 points, spending most of the campaign as the team's left fielder.



4 • ASSISTANT COACH • BLAKE ALLEN
1st Season • Blackburn ('01)

A coach of over 20 years and a veteran leader with Midwest ties, former DePauw head coach **Blake Allen** was added to the Indiana Baseball staff as the program's third assistant coach for the 2025 season. He will wear the number four on his jersey.

Allen, who worked with head coach Jeff Mercer during their overlapping stints at Western Kentucky, will coordinate team practice, help coach team defense, work with infielders and hitters and will man the third base box on gamedays. He brings along 20+ years of coaching experience as an assistant and head coach, highlighted by five years working at national powerhouse Vanderbilt.

In his most recent stop, Allen served as the head coach at DePauw for the past eight seasons. His wife, Cristin, worked simultaneously at DePauw as the head women's soccer coach. The Tigers finished 23-17 in 2024, the best mark of a team during his tenure. DePauw went 12-4 in the North Coast Athletic Conference.

At DePauw, Allen oversaw the development of Grady Johnson as one of the league's most prolific hitters in 2024. The freshman hit .370 on the season, collecting 61 hits over 165 at-bats in his freshman season. On the mound, Michael Vallone finished off his senior season with a 2.95 earned run average in 58.0 innings pitched. He worked a 7-1 record with a WHIP of 0.98. Vallone was named a Division Three All-American.

Prior to his time at DePauw, Allen worked as an assistant coach at Vanderbilt across two different stints. He worked with Tim Corbin from 2004-08 and then again from 2015-16 in Nashville.

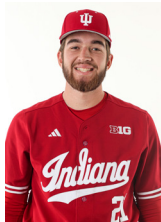

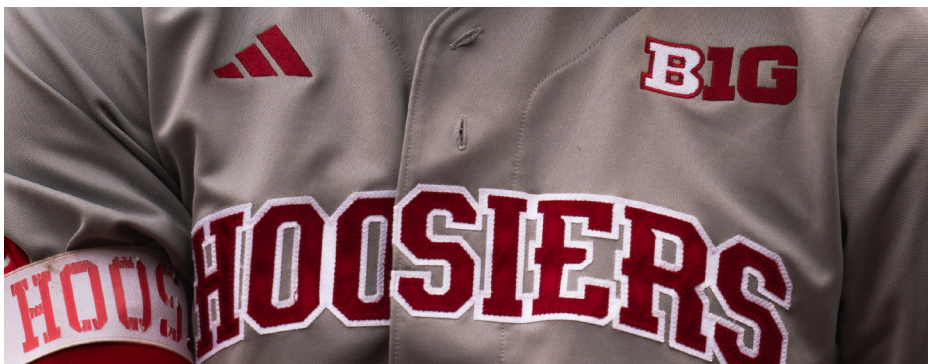

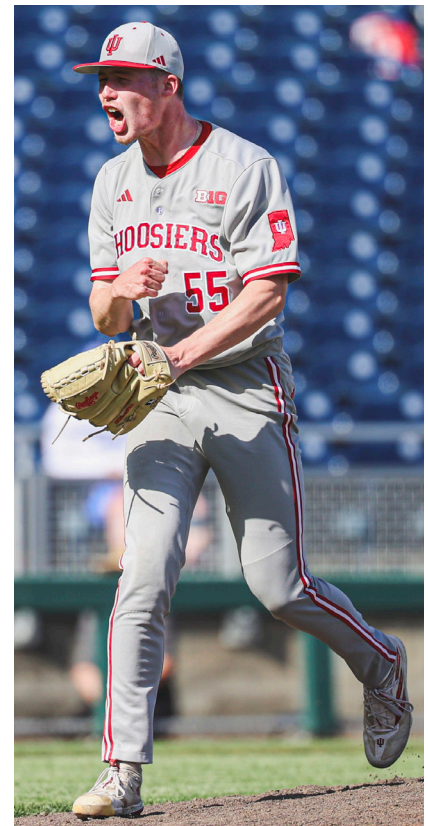

Bart Kaufman Field Dedication: April 27, 2013

Capacity: 2,500

On August 19, 2011, the Indiana University Board of Trustees approved plans for a new baseball–softball complex. These new fields would be located just north of Assembly Hall, near the intersection of the 45/46 bypass and Fee Lane.

The new baseball field would replace Sembower Field, which had been the Hoosiers' home field since 1951. On February 15, 2012, Indiana University announced that the new baseball field would be named after Bart Kaufman, CEO of the Indianapolis-based Kaufman Financial Corporation, and an Indiana baseball alumnus. This announcement came after Kaufman pledged \$2.5 million to the construction of a new stadium.

Construction began on Bart Kaufman Field in May 2012, and was finished in March 2013; the stadium was formally dedicated on April 27 of that year. The Hoosiers' first game in the stadium was March 20, 2013, with a 15–1 win over Miami University.

On December 19, 2017, Indiana University Athletics announced plans to install an LED video scoreboard, beyond the outfield wall. The size of the new scoreboard is estimated to be 26.8 feet (8.16 m) high by 48.7 (14.84 m) feet wide.

Installation of the new scoreboard was completed prior to the start of the 2018 season, with it being utilized for the Hoosiers' home opener on March 6, 2018, against Cincinnati.

The facility has a clubhouse and locker room, training area and team rooms, indoor and outdoor hitting cages, turf field, press box, lights for night play, bench and stadium chair seating, entry plaza, picnic area, concessions and restrooms.

The stadium hosted an NCAA Regional in its first two years of existence; it marked the first two times the IU baseball program has played tournament games on campus. Bart Kaufman Field hosted its first Big Ten baseball tournament from May 24 to 28, 2017.

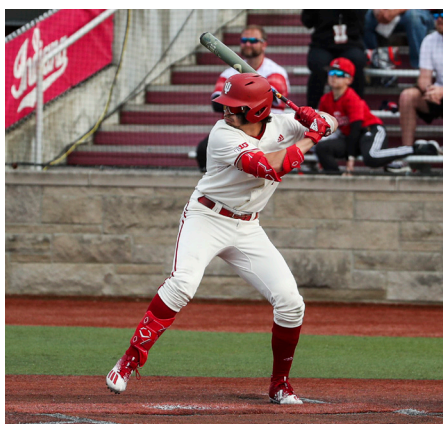
