SEASON NEWS AND NOTES

2026 Preview: With a deep sophomore offensive core and a veteran group on the mound, the Indiana baseball program will be looking for a third NCAA Tournament trip in the last four seasons. The Hoosiers have won at least 32 games in each of the last three years.

Eighth-year skipper Jeff Mercer has loaded up a challenging non-conference schedule to prepare his ballclub for the second season of the 17-team Big Ten. IU has road trips against North Carolina, Oregon and Nebraska this season that will present a number of RBI-boosting opportunities.

The Hoosiers are schedule to play 24 games at Bart Kaufman Field, highlighted by weekend series against Illinois, Iowa and Washington. The season kicks off in Chapel Hill on February 13th.

The Sophomore Core: IU played a deep collection of freshman position players last season. Four players made at least 35 starts with three of them making the Big Ten All-Freshman team. That entire group is back in 2026 and will take over the reigns in the middle of Mercer's lineup.

First baseman Jake Hanley, the reigning Big Ten Freshman of the Year, broke on to the scene in 2025. He hit .333 with 14 home runs and 52 RBI's, becoming the fourth player in program history to earn the league's premier first-year award. He started all 56 games and was a national Gold Glove finalist.

Him, alongside shortstop Cooper Malamazian, third baseman Will Moore, catcher Hogan Denny and outfielder/pitcher Caleb Koskie are now the veteran group in Bloomington and will be the main source of production for the Hoosiers in 2026. Add in Brayden Ricketts and Cole Decker and IU's 2024 recruiting class is poised for a big two-year run on the diamond.

New Era on the Mound: After pitching coach Dustin Glant departed for a job with the Washington Nationals, Mercer replaced the post with veteran leader Matt Myers. He will usher in a new era on the bump with a talented group of arms to work with. Myers was the head coach at Western Kentucky when Mercer worked as an assistant (2012-13).

Mercer and his staff went out and brought in a collection of fourth and fifth-year arms to supplant some talented returners. Jackson Bergman (Toledo), Tony Neubeck (Missouri), Kaden Jacobi (Missouri) and Reagan Rivera (Coppin State) all have at least four years of college experience.

Gavin Seebold, Pete Haas, Brayton Thomas, Jacob Vogel and Jackson Yarberry are all back after making at least 10 appearances a season ago. Talented freshman Xavier Carrera is a name to keep an eye on for Myers' bullpen group.

Mercer Milestone: Head coach Jeff Mercer has been one of the best coaches in the midwest over the decade. In an area of the country that is hard to win at a consistent pace, Mercer has defied that notion. He needs just 16 wins in 2026 to reach 300 overall wins in his 10th year as a skipper.

Omaha Regulars: IU has been the most consistent Big Ten team over the past decade. If they qualify this year, the Hoosiers will have made 13-straight Big Ten tournaments, the longest such streak in the league. Since 2011, IU has finished short of 30 wins in a full season just once.

The Sophomore Jump: Position players under Jeff Mercer have often played well as freshmen but even better as sophomores. With four players that appeared regularly in the lineup back for their second seasons, expect the likes of Hogan Denny or Cole Decker to take off in their sophomore campaign in Bloomington.

Tough Slate: There will be no easing into the 2026 season for the Hoosiers. IU will head down to North Carolina, a super regional host in 2025, for an early three-game set. It will follow that up by playing LSU, the defending national champions, in Jacksonville. A tough conference slate that includes Oregon and Nebraska will have IU prepped for the stretch run this year.

Veteran Breakout: IU has done a great job at taking veteran arms out of the portal and molding them into pro prospects. After adding a plethora of talented arms, IU is hoping to get similar returns from its pitching staff in 2026. Expect Tony Neubeck, Michael Sarhatt and Jackson Bergman to have big seasons for the Hoosiers.

The Next Great Freshman: It's no secret that IU loves to play freshmen from the jump. A freshman position player always finds their way into the lineup. Mateo Noto and Cal Gates are talented options to get some early at-bats during the 2026 season.

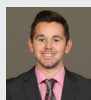

• The first former student-athlete to be named head coach of the baseball program, Mercer led Wright State for two seasons and amassed 77 victories. In his two seasons at the helm, WSU won nearly 70 percent of its games and averaged 38.5 wins per season.

• The 2018 Horizon League Coach of the Year, the Raiders won the regular season and conference tournament title in the 2018 to earn a spot in the NCAA Stanford Regional. In 2017, Mercer's squad earned the programs first-ever national ranking.

• The 2018 Horizon League champions, Wright State won eight of its last 10 games and 15 of its last 19 to close the season. The Raiders grabbed the tournament title with three-straight wins and outscored opponents 32-11 during the run.

• With a 39-17 overall record and a 22-6 league mark, WSU ranked No. 8 in the country in scoring (7.8 rpg) and stolen bases (110) and was No. 21 in on-base percentage (.394). The Raiders' .979 fielding percentage was No. 10 nationally.

• Wright State was led by Horizon League Player of the Year Gabe Snyder, who paced the conference in home runs (15) and RBI (73), and was second in batting average (.359), missing the league's Triple Crown by one batting average point.

• WSU received its first-ever top 25 ranking in 2017 and finished the year at 38-21 and 21-9 in league action. Mercer's aggressiveness in the run game resulted in Wright State ranking No. 2 nationally with 130 stolen bases.

• Weiss was selected as the 2017 Horizon League Freshman of the Year and first-team all-league along with Morrow. Pitcher Danny Sexton was named a second-team All-Horizon League along with Hendrixson and Gray. Both Weiss earned Freshman All-American and second-team ABCA All-Midwest selection.

Matt Myers, a longtime leader at the collegiate and professional level, was announced as Assistant Coach/Pitching Coach on December 19th, 2025. Myers will take over the reins of IU's pitching staff following the departure of Dustin Glant to the professional ranks. He is the third pitching coach to work under head coach Jeff Mercer at Indiana.

In his most recent stop, Myers served as the pitching coach for the Greensboro Grasshoppers, the High-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates. In 2025, his staff tossed two perfect games within nine days. The Greensboro coaching staff was announced as the organization's Staff of the Year in October.

The California native is a longtime veteran of the game with stints as a head coach and a pitching coach. He pitched at three colleges in the mid-1990's, finishing his playing career with Tennessee from 1996-97. After his playing days were over, he began his coaching tenure as a graduate assistant at Tennessee. His first full-time role came with UNC-Asheville in 2000. The next year, he became one of the youngest head coaches in Division One with the Bulldogs.

Myers spent eight seasons as a head coach – four at UNC-Asheville and four at Western Kentucky. He was the 2003 Big South Coach of the Year. The veteran coach also spent time as a pitching coach with Auburn (2005-07), Western Kentucky (2008-11), UNC Wilmington (2019-2021) and Lipscomb (2022-23) before accepting the job in the Pirates' organization.

During the 2012 and 2013 season at Western Kentucky, Myers served as the head coach while Mercer played the role of assistant coach. In his career, 20 different pitchers have been selected in the MLB Draft under his watch.

5th Season • Wright State ('19)

Zach Weatherford completed his third year as a full-time assistant coach and his fourth year on staff during the 2025 campaign. He added additional duties as the team's recruiting coordinator following a promotion in August of 2024. He is also charge of working with the program's outfielders and base runners.

Weatherford, a Gold Glove outfielder at Wright State, also assists head coach Jeff Mercer with the hitters and offensive strategy. During games, he coaches the first base box and works on the scouting report for opposing teams.

Despite playing a number of true freshmen in the lineup, IU's offense continued to chug along during the 2025 season. The Hoosiers led the Big Ten in batting average (.298), on-base percentage (.418) and scoring (8.2 runs per game). IU was also among the top three in the league in home runs (90), runs (459) and slugging percentage (.512).

Behind a pair of disciplined hitters at the top of its lineup, IU was 21st nationally in on-base percentage (.418). Freshman third baseman Will Moore was the conference leader and second among freshmen in the county in getting on base (.514). Veteran outfielder Devin Taylor was also top-50 nationally (.494).

One of IU's biggest success stories of the season was the development of redshirt sophomore Koryn Dickerson. Behind the help of Weatherford, Dickerson slugged 19 home runs and finished second in the conference in RBIs (77). He was also one of the best defensive players in the conference, earning a spot on the Big Ten's All-Defensive team (CF).

Denton Sagerman completed his seventh season on head coach Jeff Mercer's staff during the 2025 season. He came to Bloomington with Mercer from Wright State and is the lone remaining member of Mercer's initial staff at Indiana. The longtime Director of Operations, Sagerman was promoted to Assistant Coach – Pitching & Catching on July 1, 2025.

As an assistant coach, Sagerman is responsible for building individualized player development plans for both the hitters and pitchers with the use of analytics and high speed video. He works closely with pitching coach Matt Myers on Pitch Design and mechanical breakdowns to assist with the development of the pitchers.

While also leveraging his background in strength and conditioning, Sagerman also works to access movement quality and potential drills/interventions from the use of biomechanics software and force plate/mound data to optimize player performance.

From a pitch design perspective, he works to incorporate his knowledge of seam-shifted wake, seam-orientation and use of analytics to help optimize pitchers arsenal's. From the catching side, Sagerman works to build catching development plans to assist head coach Jeff Mercer in working with the catchers.

The former collegiate pitcher also works closely with pitching coach Matt Myers, assisting him with pitch design, video analysis, TrackMan and Rapso-do. Sagerman has been instrumental in bullpen development while working with both pitchers and catchers to get players ready in a timely manner.
