LEADING OFF

DO IT ALL: Sophomore outfielder Hogan Denny is on a tear as of late in conference play for the Hoosiers. This season, he's the **only** player in the Big Ten hitting **.360** with at least **10** home runs, **10** doubles, **10** stolen bases and more than **25** walks.

MORE FROM DENNY: Additionally, Denny ranks near the top of the Big Ten in a lot of categories. He's top five in the league in batting average (**.363**), runs scored (**52**) and OPS (**1.169**). Denny is top 10 in a handful of other areas including doubles (**14**).

HITS FROM HANLEY: Sophomore first baseman Jake Hanley has been a model of consistency since coming to Bloomington last year. He's a career **.339** hitter over **104** consecutive starts for the cream and crimson. Hanley now has **27** home runs in his collegiate career.

FINE FORM: Graduate student Tony Neubeck returned to his normal self last Friday with **6** scoreless innings in a win at Northwestern. He has **5** quality starts in **8** Big Ten outings this year and will look to continue that this week against a tough Purdue offense.

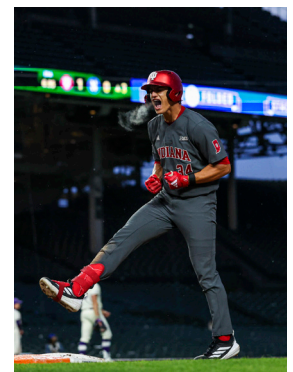
SEEING SEBOLD: Graduate student right-handed pitcher Gavin Seebold had a career high **8** strikeouts in last week's series finale at Northwestern. He's had at least **5** strikeouts in **5** of his last **8** outings. This past weekend was the **3rd** time he's worked at least **4** innings in relief this year.

PUSHING FORWARD: IU has won **3-straight** series over Purdue since a weekend loss in the 2022 season. As head coach of the Hoosiers, Jeff Mercer has won **13** of **18** meetings against the in-state foe. IU worked a magical **9th** inning comeback against Purdue on Sunday in 2024 at Alexander Field.

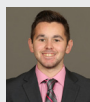

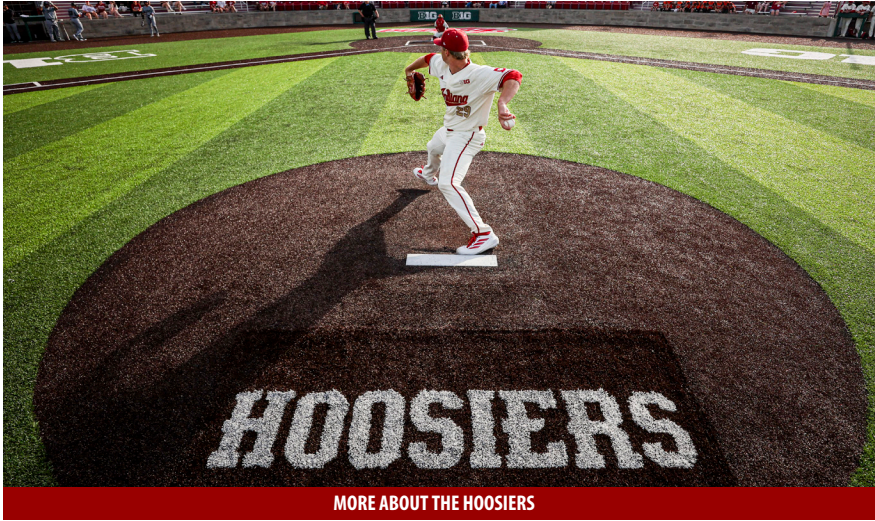

LAST TIME VS. PURDUE

Indiana 14, Purdue 4 (F/7)

May 11, 2025 | Bloomington, Ind. | Bart Kaufman Field

• The Hoosiers exploded for 14 runs in a dominant run-rule victory over its in-state rival. The win was the third-straight series victory against Purdue. Korbyn Dickerson had three hits including a mammoth three-run home run.

• Cole Gilley produced a quality start with six innings and six strikeouts. He allowed just three runs (all unearned). Aydan Decker-Petty came on to get the save.

A WIN WOULD...

SERIES WIN: Be the fourth-straight series victory over the Boilermakers and the second straight at Alexander Field. It would also give the Hoosiers their first road series win of the season.

SERIES VS. PURDUE

PURDUE: The most commonly played opponent in program history as pitted these two rivals against each other 300 times. Since the Big Ten rearranged its schedule, Purdue and Indiana now play a weekend series every season at alternating host sites.

Head coach Jeff Mercer has been dominant against the Boilermakers during his time as skipper. He has only lost one series (2022) and has won three-in-a-row against Purdue (2023-25). Over the last 10 meetings, the Hoosiers hold a commanding 8-2 record.

That stretch includes a fantastic comeback in 2024 on Sunday (W, 5-4) to secure the series and help punch a bid to the NCAA Tournament.

2026 QUICK FACTS

With a deep sophomore offensive core and a veteran group on the mound, the Indiana baseball program will be looking for a third NCAA Tournament trip in the last four seasons. The Hoosiers have won at least 32 games in each of the last three years.

Eighth-year skipper Jeff Mercer has loaded up a challenging non-conference schedule to prepare his ballclub for the second season of the 17-team Big Ten. IU has road trips against North Carolina, Oregon and Nebraska this season that will present a number of RBI-boosting opportunities.

The Hoosiers are schedule to play 24 games at Bart Kaufman Field, highlighted by weekend series against Illinois, Iowa and Washington. The season kicks off in Chapel Hill on February 13th.

The Sophomore Core: IU played a deep collection of freshman position players last season. Four players made at least 35 starts with three of them making the Big Ten All-Freshman team. That entire group is back in 2026 and will take over the reigns in the middle of Mercer's lineup.

First baseman Jake Hanley, the reigning Big Ten Freshman of the Year, broke on to the scene in 2025. He hit .333 with 14 home runs and 52 RBI's, becoming the fourth player in program history to earn the league's premier first-year award. He started all 56 games and was a national Gold Glove finalist.

Him, alongside shortstop Cooper Malamazian, third baseman Will Moore, catcher Hogan Denny and outfielder/pitcher Caleb Koskie are now the veteran group in Bloomington and will be the main source of production for the Hoosiers in 2026. Add in Brayden Ricketts and Cole Decker and IU's 2024 recruiting class is poised for a big two-year run on the diamond.

New Era on the Mound: After pitching coach Dustin Glant departed for a job with the Washington Nationals, Mercer replaced the post with veteran leader Matt Myers. He will usher in a new era on the bump with a talented group of arms to work with. Myers was the head coach at Western Kentucky when Mercer worked as an assistant (2012-13).

Mercer and his staff went out and brought in a collection of fourth and fifth-year arms to supplement some talented returners. Jackson Bergman (Toledo), Tony Neubeck (Missouri), Kaden Jacobi (Missouri) and Reagan Rivera (Coppin State) all have at least four years of college experience.

Gavin Seebold, Pete Haas, Brayton Thomas, Jacob Vogel and Jackson Yarberry are all back after making at least 10 appearances a season ago. Talented freshman Xavier Carrera is a name to keep an eye on for Myers' bullpen group.

2026 THINGS TO WATCH

Mercer Milestone: Head coach Jeff Mercer has been one of the best coaches in the midwest over the decade. In an area of the country that is hard to win at a consistent pace, Mercer has defied that notion. He needs just 16 wins in 2026 to reach 300 overall wins in his 10th year as a skipper.

Omaha Regulars: IU has been the most consistent Big Ten team over the past decade. If they qualify this year, the Hoosiers will have made 13-straight Big Ten tournaments, the longest such streak in the league. Since 2011, IU has finished short of 30 wins in a full season just once.

The Sophomore Jump: Position players under Jeff Mercer have often played well as freshmen but even better as sophomores. With four players that appeared regularly in the lineup back for their second seasons, expect the likes of Hogan Denny or Cole Decker to take off in their sophomore campaign in Bloomington.

Tough Slate: There will be no easing into the 2026 season for the Hoosiers. IU will head down to North Carolina, a super regional host in 2025, for an early three-game set. It will follow that up by playing LSU, the defending national champions, in Jacksonville. A tough conference slate that includes Oregon and Nebraska will have IU prepped for the stretch run this year.

Veteran Breakout: IU has done a great job at taking veteran arms out of the portal and molding them into pro prospects. After adding a plethora of talented arms, IU is hoping to get similar returns from its pitching staff in 2026. Expect Tony Neubeck, Michael Sarhatt and Jackson Bergman to have big seasons for the Hoosiers.

The Next Great Freshman: It's no secret that IU loves to play freshmen from the jump. A freshman position player always finds their way into the lineup. Mateo Noto and Cal Gates are talented options to get some early at-bats during the 2026 season.

• The first former student-athlete to be named head coach of the baseball program, Mercer led Wright State for two seasons and amassed 77 victories. In his two seasons at the helm, WSU won nearly 70 percent of its games and averaged 38.5 wins per season.

• The 2018 Horizon League Coach of the Year, the Raiders won the regular season and conference tournament title in the 2018 to earn a spot in the NCAA Stanford Regional. In 2017, Mercer's squad earned the programs first-ever national ranking.

• The 2018 Horizon League champions, Wright State won eight of its last 10 games and 15 of its last 19 to close the season. The Raiders grabbed the tournament title with three-straight wins and outscored opponents 32-11 during the run.

• With a 39-17 overall record and a 22-6 league mark, WSU ranked No. 8 in the country in scoring (7.8 rpg) and stolen bases (110) and was No. 21 in on-base percentage (.394). The Raiders' .979 fielding percentage was No. 10 nationally.

• Wright State was led by Horizon League Player of the Year Gabe Snyder, who paced the conference in home runs (15) and RBI (73), and was second in batting average (.359), missing the league's Triple Crown by one batting average point.

• WSU received its first-ever top 25 ranking in 2017 and finished the year at 38-21 and 21-9 in league action. Mercer's aggressiveness in the run game resulted in Wright State ranking No. 2 nationally with 130 stolen bases.

• Weiss was selected as the 2017 Horizon League Freshman of the Year and first-team all-league along with Morrow. Pitcher Danny Sexton was named a second-team All-Horizon League along with Hendrixson and Gray. Both Weiss earned Freshman All-American and second-team ABCA All-Midwest selection.

COACHING STAFF



12 • ASSISTANT COACH • MATT MYERS
1st Season • Tennessee ('98)

Matt Myers, a longtime leader at the collegiate and professional level, was announced as Assistant Coach/Pitching Coach on December 19th, 2025. Myers will take over the reins of IU's pitching staff following the departure of Dustin Glant to the professional ranks. He is the third pitching coach to work under head coach Jeff Mercer at Indiana.

In his most recent stop, Myers served as the pitching coach for the Greensboro Grasshoppers, the High-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates. In 2025, his staff tossed two perfect games within nine days. The Greensboro coaching staff was announced as the organization's Staff of the Year in October.

The California native is a longtime veteran of the game with stints as a head coach and a pitching coach. He pitched at three colleges in the mid-1990's, finishing his playing career with Tennessee from 1996-97. After his playing days were over, he began his coaching tenure as a graduate assistant at Tennessee. His first full-time role came with UNC-Asheville in 2000. The next year, he became one of the youngest head coaches in Division One with the Bulldogs.

Myers spent eight seasons as a head coach – four at UNC-Asheville and four at Western Kentucky. He was the 2003 Big South Coach of the Year. The veteran coach also spent time as a pitching coach with Auburn (2005-07), Western Kentucky (2008-11), UNC Wilmington (2019-2021) and Lipscomb (2022-23) before accepting the job in the Pirates' organization.

During the 2012 and 2013 season at Western Kentucky, Myers served as the head coach while Mercer played the role of assistant coach. In his career, 20 different pitchers have been selected in the MLB Draft under his watch.

5th Season • Wright State ('19)

Zach Weatherford completed his third year as a full-time assistant coach and his fourth year on staff during the 2025 campaign. He added additional duties as the team's recruiting coordinator following a promotion in August of 2024. He is also charge of working with the program's outfielders and base runners.

Weatherford, a Gold Glove outfielder at Wright State, also assists head coach Jeff Mercer with the hitters and offensive strategy. During games, he coaches the first base box and works on the scouting report for opposing teams.

Despite playing a number of true freshmen in the lineup, IU's offense continued to chug along during the 2025 season. The Hoosiers led the Big Ten in batting average (.298), on-base percentage (.418) and scoring (8.2 runs per game). IU was also among the top three in the league in home runs (90), runs (459) and slugging percentage (.512).

Behind a pair of disciplined hitters at the top of its lineup, IU was 21st nationally in on-base percentage (.418). Freshman third baseman Will Moore was the conference leader and second among freshmen in the county in getting on base (.514). Veteran outfielder Devin Taylor was also top-50 nationally (.494).

One of IU's biggest success stories of the season was the development of redshirt sophomore Korbyn Dickerson. Behind the help of Weatherford, Dickerson slugged 19 home runs and finished second in the conference in RBIs (77). He was also one of the best defensive players in the conference, earning a spot on the Big Ten's All-Defensive team (CF).



11 • ASSISTANT COACH • DENTON SAGERMAN
8th Season, 1st as Assistant • Dayton ('15)

Denton Sagerman completed his seventh season on head coach Jeff Mercer's staff during the 2025 season. He came to Bloomington with Mercer from Wright State and is the lone remaining member of Mercer's initial staff at Indiana. The longtime Director of Operations, Sagerman was promoted to Assistant Coach – Pitching & Catching on July 1, 2025.

As an assistant coach, Sagerman is responsible for building individualized player development plans for both the hitters and pitchers with the use of analytics and high speed video. He works closely with pitching coach Matt Myers on Pitch Design and mechanical breakdowns to assist with the development of the pitchers.

While also leveraging his background in strength and conditioning, Sagerman also works to access movement quality and potential drills/interventions from the use of biomechanics software and force plate/mound data to optimize player performance.

From a pitch design perspective, he works to incorporate his knowledge of seam-shifted wake, seam-orientation and use of analytics to help optimize pitchers arsenal's. From the catching side, Sagerman works to build catching development plans to assist head coach Jeff Mercer in working with the catchers.

The former collegiate pitcher also works closely with pitching coach Matt Myers, assisting him with pitch design, video analysis, TrackMan and Rapsodo. Sagerman has been instrumental in bullpen development while working with both pitchers and catchers to get players ready in a timely manner.

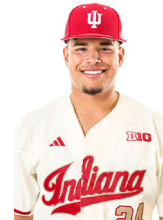

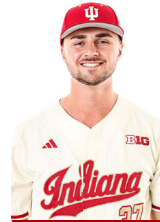

HOMEGROWN HOOSIERS

• On Friday, February 20th, 2026 IU rolled out a starting offensively lineup of all homegrown recruits. It was the first time in the **Jeff Mercer** era that the Hoosiers had nine players on the offensive lineup card that were all recruited to IU directly out of high school.

• In that lineup, the collection of athletes included four players from Indiana, two from Canada, two from Illinois and one from Ohio. All but one (**T.J. Schuyler**) were underclassmen players.

• In total, it has happened **19** times this year where IU has played a starting lineup consisting of all homegrown players. On **5** occasions, IU has done it while also putting out a starting pitcher that was recruited straight out of high school.

JEFF MERCER ERA

- Head coach **Jeff Mercer** was named the head coach of the Indiana Baseball program in the summer of 2018. Before that, he had a successful two-year stint as the skipper at mid-major powerhouse Wright State. At the time, Mercer was one of the youngest head coaches in the country.
- The expectations around the program had been raised greatly since the Hoosiers went to the College World Series in 2013. Mercer quickly met the standard of the program, winning the Big Ten regular season title in his first season in 2019.
- Mercer felt like his 2020 team was destined to do big things, beating LSU and East Carolina before the season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Since then, the world of college athletics has completely changed.

- When baseball returned to a full schedule in 2022, Mercer decided to build from within in Bloomington. He played a lineup of young freshmen to allow them to experience college baseball at a high level. That move paid off as IU earned at-large bids to the NCAA Tournament in 2023 and 2024.
- Now, IU is trying to repeat that cycle. The Hoosiers played a cohort of freshmen in the lineup regularly in 2025. This year's edition of the team features a selection of mostly underclassmen position players. Paired with veteran arms, Mercer will hope it adds up to a return to postseason play.

Bart Kaufman Field Dedication: April 27, 2013

Capacity: 2,500

On August 19, 2011, the Indiana University Board of Trustees approved plans for a new baseball-softball complex. These new fields would be located just north of Assembly Hall, near the intersection of the 45/46 bypass and Fee Lane.

The new baseball field would replace Sembower Field, which had been the Hoosiers' home field since 1951. On February 15, 2012, Indiana University announced that the new baseball field would be named after Bart Kaufman, CEO of the Indianapolis-based Kaufman Financial Corporation, and an Indiana baseball alumnus. This announcement came after Kaufman pledged \$2.5 million to the construction of a new stadium.

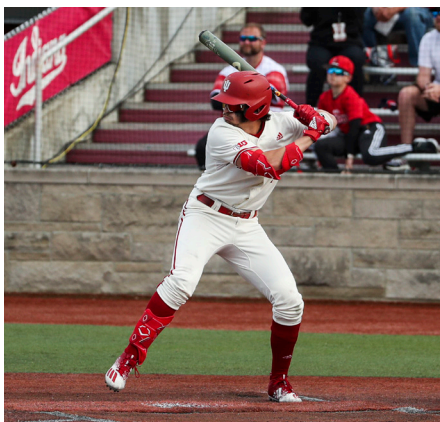
Construction began on Bart Kaufman Field in May 2012, and was finished in March 2013; the stadium was formally dedicated on April 27 of that year. The Hoosiers' first game in the stadium was March 20, 2013, with a 15-1 win over Miami (Ohio).

On December 19, 2017, Indiana University Athletics announced plans to install an LED video scoreboard, beyond the outfield wall. The size of the new scoreboard is estimated to be 26.8 feet (8.16 m) high by 48.7 (14.84 m) feet wide.

Installation of the new scoreboard was completed prior to the start of the 2018 season, with it being utilized for the Hoosiers' home opener on March 6, 2018, against Cincinnati.

The facility has a clubhouse and locker room, training area and team rooms, indoor and outdoor hitting cages, turf field, press box, lights for night play, bench and stadium chair seating, entry plaza, picnic area, concessions and restrooms.

The stadium hosted an NCAA Regional in its first two years of existence; it marked the first two times the IU baseball program has played tournament games on campus. Bart Kaufman Field hosted its first Big Ten baseball tournament from May 24 to 28, 2017.
