Curt Cignetti won his 150th career game as head coach in the 29-23 win Week 4 over Northwestern.



The win extended Indiana's win streak to a nation's best 20, dating back to Week 1 of 2025. It is the longest nationally since Washington from 2022-24 (21) and the longest in the Big Ten since Ohio State (23) from 2013-14.

SETTING THE SCENE

• Indiana will head east for its first road test of the season in Week 5 at Rutgers on Saturday (Oct. 3) at SHI Stadium in Piscataway, New Jersey. The game will broadcast on Big Ten Network.

• The all-time series between the two programs is tied at 5-5 with Rutgers winning the previous three matchups. The last meeting was a 31-14 win for Rutgers in Bloomington in 2023.

• This will be the first time that **Curt Cignetti** has faced Rutgers in his time as head coach at Indiana. Rutgers is one of three conference opponents that Cignetti has not coached against while at IU (Minnesota, USC).

NEWS & NOTES

• **Curt Cignetti** reached 30 wins in his first 32 games as a Power 4 head coach with the Week 3 win over Western Kentucky (9/19). Only Larry Coker (Miami (Fla.), 2001-03) and Gil Dobie (Washington, 1908-12) reached the mark faster - both doing so in 31 games.

• Cignetti won his 150th career game as head coach in the 29-23 win in Week 4 over Northwestern (9/25).

• Indiana's 20-game winning streak is the longest nationally since Washington from 2022-24 (21) and the longest in the Big Ten since Ohio State (23) from 2013-14.

• The 20-game winning streak marks just the fourth 20-plus game winning streak in the Big Ten since 1980: Indiana 20, 2024-present; Ohio State 23, 2014-15; Ohio State 24, 2012-13; Penn State 20, 1993-95.

• Indiana has won 31 games over the past three seasons (2024-26) which are the most in a three-year span in program history. **MORE ON PAGE 4**

• Indiana's two rushing scores against Northwestern marks 27 multi-rushing touchdown games since the start of 2024 (33 games).

• Indiana's opening score against Northwestern was a safety, which was the first since 2024 at Michigan State (blocked punt) and first defensive safety since Idaho in 2022.

• The Hoosiers won time of possession for the 24th time in 33 games under Cignetti against the Wildcats.

• **Josh Hoover** had his first rushing touchdown as a Hoosier on a fourth quarter, 1-yard score against Northwestern to extend IU's lead to 29-20 with 1:56 left in the game. **MORE ON PAGE 7**

• **Lee Beebe Jr.** had his first 200-yard rushing game when he went for a career-high 203 yards against Northwestern along with a career-long 70-yard rush in the fourth quarter. His 4-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter marked back-to-back weeks with a score. **MORE ON PAGE 8**

• It was the first 200-yard rushing game by an Indiana player since **Stevie Scott** had 204 in Week 2 against Virginia in 2018.

• **Nick Marsh's** 8-yard touchdown reception against Northwestern marked three out of the last four weeks with a score for Marsh. He also is among the FBS leaders in consecutive games with a reception, 27-straight games dating back to his time at Michigan State (2024-25).

TEAM NOTES

PACKING & DEFENDING THE ROCK

In just three years at the helm of the Indiana program, head coach **Curt Cignetti** has made Merchants Bank Field at Memorial Stadium a daunting place for opposing teams to play.

The Hoosiers are 19-0 in home games on Merchants Bank Field at Memorial Stadium under Cignetti. The 19-straight home wins is also a program record and leads the nation in active home winning streak.

In 2024, Indiana defeated seven of their eight home opponents by double digits and won on average by 35.5 points at home.

In 2025, Indiana improved upon that, winning all seven of its home games by double digits, with an average margin of victory of 40.7 points. Six of those wins came by at least 24 points and three were by 50-plus.

So far in 2026, Indiana has won its four home games by an average of 33.8 points per game. Across Cignetti's entire tenure, Indiana has defeated its home opponents by an average of 37.1 points.

CHANGING THE CULTURE

When he arrived in Bloomington, head coach **Curt Cignetti** talked about injecting life into the fan base, and with a 19-0 record on Merchants Bank Field at Memorial Stadium, he has done just that.

For the first time in program history, Indiana has sold out eight home games, all occurring prior to the 2026 campaign's start. It is the second time selling out all of its home games in a season.

In the two previous years, Indiana logged four sellouts each in both 2024 and 2025 which mark the third-most in a single season in program history. The 1969 team sold out all five home games.

Since the stadium capacity expanded to 50,000-plus in 1970, Indiana has sold out 26 home games. Of those 26, 16 have come under Cignetti's watch. Since 1970, only seven seasons have featured multiple sellouts, with 2024-26 among those.

Twelve of the top 15 crowds in program history have come in Cignetti's tenure as head coach.

The longest tenured Hoosiers in the NFL are **Dan Feeney** (10th), **Ian Thomas** (9th) and **Nick Westbrook-Ikhine** (7th) who all have spent at least five seasons in the league.

Of the 24, 12 are rookies who played for the Hoosiers in 2025, including a program-record eight draftees this past spring. Sixteen of the Hoosiers in the NFL played for **Curt Cignetti** at IU.

A VETERAN STAFF

Heading into year three at the helm, Indiana head coach **Curt Cignetti** has retained nearly the entire coaching staff since his first season in 2024.

The only change for any countable, on-field assistant was in the quarterbacks room. To replace Chandler Whitmer, who took the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' quarterbacks coach job, Cignetti brought back **Tino Sunseri** who previously served as IU's quarterbacks coach/co-offensive coordinator in 2024.

Six of Cignetti's staff members were with him at James Madison, including: defensive coordinator/linebackers **Bryant Haines**, offensive coordinator/wide receivers **Mike Shanahan**, quarterbacks/co-offensive coordinator Tino Sunseri, special teams coordinator/tight ends **Grant Cain**, defensive tackles **Pat Kuntz** and running backs **John Miller**.

In the weight room, **Tyson Brown** took over as the program's Director of Athletic Performance in 2026. Brown comes to Bloomington after serving as the Head Strength & Conditioning Coach for Mississippi State, UConn and Washington State.

WIN STREAKING

Indiana enters the season with a number of streaks that rank among the nation's best and continue to rewrite the program record book. From its rank among active leaders in victories over the past two seasons to a program-best home winning streak, Indiana is among the best teams in the FBS in the win column.

2026 INDIANA FOOTBALL

ONE-SCORE SQUAD

Indiana head coach **Curt Cignetti** has compiled an impressive 150-37 record across his 16 years as a head coach, including stops at Indiana University of Pennsylvania (2011-16), Elon (2017-18) and James Madison (2019-23). No matter if he was coaching in the Division II ranks, the FCS level or in the FBS, winning close games is a difference-making part of Cignetti's success with a 32-18 record in games decided by one score. After going 6-9 in one-score games at IUP, Cignetti has a combined 26-9 record in one-score contests from 2017-25. He went 10-2 in such games at Elon and 10-7 while at James Madison. At Indiana, he's 6-0 in one-score contests, including the 2025 Big Ten Championship versus Ohio State (13-10) and the 2026 College Football Playoff National Championship versus Miami (Fla.) (27-21). He is 1-0 in one-score games thus far in 2026, defeating Northwestern (29-23) in Week 4 (9/25). Cignetti has never had a losing season as a head coach.

A FULL BIG CYCLE

With Rutgers, Minnesota and USC on the schedule for the 2026 campaign, that marks the final three Big Ten opponents Curt Cignetti has not faced in his time as head coach at IU. The Hoosiers will travel to Piscataway, N.J. to face Rutgers in Week 5 for the team's first road test of the season on Oct. 3. The last meeting between the two programs came in 2023 when Rutgers won in Bloomington. Indiana hosts Minnesota in Week 9 and on Halloween this season. It's the first game between the Hoosiers and Golden Gophers on the gridiron since 2021, when Minnesota won on Merchants Bank Field at Memorial Stadium. The home matchup with USC on Nov. 14 in Week 11 will be the first time that the Hoosiers and Trojans play against one another as conference foes. It will be the first time the two teams played against one another since 1982 and the first time for USC playing in Bloomington since 1981. Indiana also faced USC in its first Rose Bowl appearance in 1968. Cignetti owns an 18-1 record in conference play since coming to Bloomington.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

Indiana played in a Friday night game for a fifth consecutive season in 2026. The Hoosiers opened Big Ten play with a Friday night win over Northwestern, 29-23, on Merchants Bank Field at Memorial Stadium in Week 4 (9/25). That game was the 15th Friday night game in program history. In 2025, Indiana played a program-record three Friday games in one season. The first Friday night game at Memorial Stadium came in 1995 in a battle for the Old Oaken Bucket and was the only Friday night game on IU's campus until 2022 versus Illinois.

HALLOWEEN HOOSIERS

Indiana's Week 9 matchup against Minnesota will be played on Halloween. It's the first time that Indiana has played on the holiday since 2020 when Indiana defeated Rutgers, 37-21, in Piscataway, N.J. The game against Minnesota marks only the 18th time in program history that Indiana has played on Halloween and it will be just the third time it has occurred since the turn of the century. The first IU Halloween game was in a rivalry battle against Purdue in 1891. The first Indiana Halloween victory was a 16-0 win over Cincinnati at home in 1896. Indiana is 4-13 all-time in Halloween games.

AN EXPERIENCED GROUP

Curt Cignetti's 2026 squad has no shortage of college football experience. A little under a quarter of Indiana's roster is in their fifth year or older. The Hoosiers boast 21 fifth-year players, one sixth-year and two seventh-year student-athletes. Of the 24 student-athletes, 15 are returners from a year ago while nine are transfers.

THE BISON IS BACK

Indiana University's official mascot – Hoosier The Bison – returned to the IU-Bloomington campus after a nearly 60-year hiatus in Week One of the 2025 season. The mascot's homecoming was a result of the 'Bring Back the Bison Act' passed by the Indiana University Student Body Congress on Dec. 16, 2024. In response to the student government vote to re-adopt the Bison as the official IU-Bloomington mascot, IU Athletics moved forward with embracing it as a symbol of both the department and campus' spirit, passion, tradition, unity, and success. Hoosier The Bison made its first public debut at the against Old Dominion on Aug. 30 at Merchants Bank Field at Memorial Stadium.
The state of Indiana and the bison have been linked for more than two centuries. The bison has been used as an Indiana symbol longer than Indiana has been a U.S. state. The bison first appeared on official court documents signed by then Indiana Territory Governor and future U.S. President William Henry Harrison in 1801, a full 15 years before Indiana became the country's 19th state in 1816. The Indiana Territory seal depicted a woodsman chopping trees while a bison runs in the foreground, symbolizing the country's expansion on the Indiana frontier (at the time, the western boundary of the United States). The bison has been part of the Indiana state seal ever since.
At the recommendation of the IU Student Athletic Board and confirmed by the Indiana University Student Senate, the bison mascot was officially adopted and brought to life on October 14, 1965. While the original intent was to have a live bison, that never came to fruition, so the first bison mascot debuted just in time for the final home football game that year – the Old Oaken Bucket game on November 20, 1965.
The 1966 Indiana Football season featured a new costume that was focused on a more realistic look with a very large, authentic-looking bison head. This look lasted through the 1967 season before moving on to a costume more catered to the performer inside with an emphasis on an ease of mobility.
The new bison mascot costume debuted just in time for the January 1, 1968, Rose Bowl matchup with USC. The updated bison costume returned for the 1968 and 1969 seasons but fan support for the bison mascot began to wane and ultimately led to a hiatus from campus.

TWO HOOSIERS ON COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME BALLOT

A pair of Indiana All-Americans in running back **Vaughn Dunbar** (1990-91) and quarterback **Antwaan Randle El** (1998-2001) are on the ballot for the College Football Hall of Fame in 2026.
Randle El earned All-Big Ten distinction in 1999, 2000 and 2001, and was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 1998. The Big Ten MVP, and first-team All-American in 2001, Randle El finished sixth in the Heisman Trophy balloting that season.
The Riverdale, Illinois, native was the first in NCAA history to score 40 career touchdowns (45) and throw 40 career touchdown passes (42). He was also the first to record over 2,500 total yards in four seasons, and the first to both pass for over 6,000 and rush for over 3,000 career yards.
Dunbar was a first-team All-B1G pick and unanimous first-team All-American in 1991 when he led the nation in rushing (1,805) and finished sixth in Heisman voting.
The Fort Wayne, Indiana, native posted consecutive 1,000-yard seasons and finished his career No. 3 on the career rushing charts at IU with 3,029 yards, a total that currently sits No. 7 all-time in program history. He led IU to a pair of bowl appearances and a win in the 1991 Copper Bowl as the game's offensive MVP.
Six Indiana football student-athletes are already among the less than one percent enshrined in the CFB Hall of Fame: **Zora Clevenger** (HB; 190--3), **Alvin "Bo" McMillin** (Coach; 1934-47), **Pete Pihos** (End/FB' 1942-43, 45-47), **George Taliaferro** (HB; 1945, 47-48), **Anthony Thompson** (RB; 1986-89) and **John Tavener** (1941-44).

FISCHER AMONG ICONIC VOICES IN COLLEGE FOOTBALL

In his 54th season with the Indiana football program, the legendary voice of the Hoosiers, Don Fischer, is among the longest tenured play-by-play voices in the sport.
The 2022 recipient of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame's Chris Schenkel Award and IU Hall of Fame Class of 2022, Fischer is the longest tenured radio play-by-play announcer in college football, tied with Tommy Suggs of South Carolina.

A SIGNIFICANT PARTNERSHIP

Just over a week before the start of the 2025 season, Indiana announced that IU Athletics and Merchants Bank formed a new partnership in support of the University's Department of Intercollegiate Athletics.
The agreement includes a \$50 million commitment over 20 years. As part of the agreement with Indiana Athletics and Learfield's IU Sports Properties, Memorial Stadium's playing surface was renamed Merchants Bank Field at Memorial Stadium.
While the new branding is the biggest change that IU fans see, what separates this agreement from many others is that it extends well beyond naming rights. An exciting part of the partnership for IU student-athletes – both present and future – is that Merchants Bank provides them with comprehensive financial literacy training. This training is at no cost to the student-athletes and helps ensure that they have the tools to maximize their opportunities in a new intercollegiate athletics landscape that includes, among other things, revenue sharing and NIL.
"Merchants Bank Field at Memorial Stadium" is prominently displayed in multiple locations on the stadium's playing surface with interior, exterior and directional signage also evident.
This is the first time in program history that Memorial Stadium's field has had its own distinct name.

- **Tino Sunseri** is back as Indiana's quarterbacks/co-offensive coordinator in 2026 after serving in the same role in 2024. Sunseri spent time as UCLA's offensive coordinator in 2025.
- Sunseri is the one new on-field coaching staff member in 2025 for IU.
- Sunseri was previously at James Madison (2021-23) with **Curt Cignetti** where he tutored three quarterbacks who earned conference player of the year honors.
- Prior to JMU, Sunseri was a quality control assistant at Florida State (2016-17) and Tennessee (2018) and a graduate assistant for Alabama (2019-20).
- He was a standout at Pitt where he finished second all-time in total offense (8,591) and third in yards passing (8,590).
- After spending the first four years of his career at TCU (2022-25), **Josh Hoover** is spending his final collegiate season in Bloomington.
- In Hoover's 40 appearances and 35 starts over the course of his career, he has completed 827-1,263 passing attempts for 10,479 yards with 82 touchdowns. Additionally, he has run for nine rushing scores.

• He ranks tied for No. 5 in the FBS for most starts by a quarterback (35).

- Hoover owns 16 career 300-yard passing games (5, 2025; 6, 2024; 5, 2023) and 10 games with four-or-more touchdown passes (2, 2026; 4, 2025; 2, 2023; 2, 2022).
- He had his first rushing touchdown as a Hoosier on a fourth quarter, 1-yard score in Week 4 against Northwestern (9/25) to extend IU's lead to 29-20 with 1:56 left in the game.
- Hoover again threw four touchdown passes in Week 2 against Howard (9/12). He tied the program record for most touchdown passes in first two games of the season with eight. (**Nate Sudfeld**; 2013).
- Hoover is only the sixth quarterback (ninth occasion) in program history with eight-plus touchdown passes in a two-game span, including **Fernando Mendoza** (3, 2026), **Nate Sudfeld** (1, 2013; 1, 2015), **Kellen Lewis** (1, 2006), **Blake Powers** (1, 2005), **Antwaan Randle El** (1, 1999) also accomplished the feat.
- His four touchdown passes in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5) are the most by an Indiana quarterback in their IU debut in program history. The four touchdown passes are tied for the most in a season opener with **Nate Sudfeld** (2013; Indiana State).
- At TCU in 2025, Hoover started 12 games and helped the team to an 8-4 regular season before portaling ahead of the Valero Alamo Bowl. He charted 3,472 yards passing with 29 touchdowns and had four rushing yards for two rushing touchdowns.
- In Week Four against SMU (9/20), he had his first collegiate five-touchdown pass game.
- Hoover became TCU's full-time starter under center, starting all 13 games in 2024 and leading the Horn Frogs to a 9-4 record and a win in the New Mexico Bowl.
- He set TCU's single-season yards passing record (3,949) while throwing 27 touchdowns and rushing for four more.
- Led the Big 12 and was No. 5 in FBS with 61 completions of 20 yards or more. He was one of four quarterbacks nationally to average 300 yards per game passing (303.8) with a passer rating better than 150.0 (151.1).
- In 2023, he made six starts in his 10 appearances. He completed 62.1% (185-298) of his passes for 2,206 yards and 15 touchdowns. Hoover also had five rushing yards and two rushing touchdowns.
- He became the first Power Five quarterback since 2019 with 400 yards passing and four touchdowns in his first career start with 439 yards and four touchdowns against BYU (10/14).
- Hoover made his collegiate debut in 2022 against Tarleton State (9/10) in his lone appearance that season. In the game, he had his first collegiate completion on a 2-yard pass.

- Hoover finished his time in Fort Worth all over the TCU career record books: ranked No. 2 in completion percentage (65.2), No. 3 on the completions list (771), No. 4 in passing yards (9,629), touchdown passes (71), total offense yards (9,619) and points responsible for (474).
- He has two of the top-5 single-season yards passing marks with a program-record 3,949 (2024) and the No. 5 mark at 3,472 (2025). He set program record for completions (313, 2024) and has the No. 3 mark (272, 2025). Also owns two of the top-5 season marks in completion percentage with No. 2 (66.5, 2024) and No. 5 (65.9, 2025). Posted the No. 4 (29) and No. 5 (27) single season touchdown pass marks.
- Was a consensus three-star prospect out of Rockwall-Heath High School and was rated as the No. 26 quarterback in the 2022 class. Was originally committed to Indiana out of high school before flipping to TCU.
- **Grant Wilson** is in his second season with Indiana and his seventh collegiate season after spending the first five years of his career at Old Dominion (2023-24) and Fordham (2020-22).
- He had his first two passing touchdowns as a Hoosier when he found **Davion Chandler** and **Nick Marsh** in the end zone in the third quarter of Week 2 against Howard (9/12).
- Wilson capped the scoring in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5) with a 43-yard rushing touchdown for his first score as a Hoosier.
- Wilson appeared in 26 games with 14 starts prior to IU. At Old Dominion, he appeared in 15 games with 14 starts including 11 starts in 2023 when he accounted for 21 total touchdowns (17 passing, 4 rushing).
- In 2024, Wilson started three games before suffering a season-ending injury. He had five scores on the year (4 passing, 1 rushing).
- Wilson made his collegiate debut against Wagner (10/9) in the 2021 season while at Fordham.
- **Tyler Cherry** is back in Indiana's quarterback room after missing the 2025 season due to injury and serving as a student assistant coach.
- Cherry made his first appearance since 2024 when he played in the fourth quarter of Week 2 against Howard (9/12). Cherry had his first career completion to **Jackson Wasserstrom** for a 10 yard gain.
- In 2024, Cherry appeared in one game, making his collegiate debut in Week 2 against Western Illinois (9/6) where he led the final scoring drive of the game in the fourth quarter.
- Out of Center Grove (Ind.) High School, Cherry was tabbed a four-star prospect by 247Sports, Rivals and On3. He was rated the No. 105 overall prospect nationally by On3 and was a top-25 quarterback prospect nationally across all major recruiting outlets.

- **John Miller** enters his third season coaching the Indiana running backs in 2026. Prior to Indiana, he coached the same position at James Madison for three seasons (2021-23).
- Since Miller took over in the position, Indiana has scored multiple rushing touchdowns in 27 of 33 games dating back to the start of 2024.
- **Lee Beebe Jr.** (117 yards) and **Turbo Richard** (108 yards) in Week 2 against Howard (9/12) became IU's first 100-yard rushing duo in the same game since a win over Rutgers in 2017 (*Morgan Ellison*, 149; *Cole Gest*, 104).
- After two years at Boston College (2024-25), Richard joined the Hoosiers in 2026. He rushed for over 100 yards for the second-straight week when he had 149 yards and a touchdown in Week 3 against Western Kentucky (9/19).
- In his IU debut, Richard totaled two rushing touchdowns and 58 yards rushing in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5). He also added a 38-yard reception and two kickoff returns for 59 yards.
- Richard has appeared in 23 games with 15 starts and owns five multi-touchdown games with four multi-rushing touchdown efforts.
- In 2025, he logged three 100-yard rushing efforts and three multi-rushing touchdown games, all occurring in the same contests (California, 9/27; Georgia Tech, 11/15; at Syracuse, 11/29).
- He produced his first collegiate game with both a rushing and receiving touchdown at Michigan State (9/6).
- Richard made eight appearances in his first year in 2024. He missed the final five regular season games due to injury before returning for the Pinstripe Bowl when he had a two-catch, 62-yard day.

- The North Carolina native scored his first collegiate touchdown on an 11-yard rush against Michigan State (9/21) in 2024.
- He made his collegiate debut in the season opener at Florida State (9/2) when he had four carries for 28 yards.
- Beebe Jr. has played in 31 career games with 10 starts after beginning his career at UAB (2022-24).
- He charted his first 200-yard game in a 203-yard rushing effort with a career-long 70-yard rush and a touchdown in Week 4 against Northwestern (9/25). He became the first IU player to rush for 200 yards since **Stevie Scott** had 204 in Week 2 against Virginia in 2018.
- He had his first multi-touchdown game as a Hoosier and fifth of his career when he had two rushing scores in Week 3 against Western Kentucky (9/19).
- Beebe Jr. had his fourth career 100-yard rushing game in Week 2 against Howard (9/12) when he charted 112 yards rushing on 16 carries.
- He had 33 yards rushing and two kickoff returns for 72 yards, including a 67-yard return to open the game in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5).
- In 2025, Beebe Jr. suffered a season-ending injury in Week 3 against Indiana State (9/12).
- In the weeks prior, he had 90 yards rushing with a touchdown in Week 2 against Kennesaw State (9/6) and 73 yards rushing in his IU debut in Week 1 against Old Dominion (8/30).
- In 2024 at UAB, Beebe Jr. appeared in all 12 games and made 10 starts en route to being named third-team All-American Athletic Conference.
- Beebe Jr. has accumulated 2,317 career all-purpose yards (1,883 rushing, 328 receiving, 106 kickoff return, 1 fumble return) and totaled 16 career touchdowns (15 rushing, 1 receiving).
- Third year **Khobie Martin** has appeared in 17 games since arriving in Bloomington in 2024. He sustained an injury in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5) that caused him to miss the rest of the game and Weeks 2-4.
- In 2025, Martin appeared in 14 games while logging 506 yards rushing and six touchdowns with two 100-yard rushing games.
- In the Old Oaken Bucket Game at Purdue (11/28), Martin totaled eight carries for 51 yards and a rushing score.
- In back-to-back weeks, Martin had his first career 100-yard rushing games.
- In Week 3 against Indiana State (9/12), Martin eclipsed 109 yards on 11 rushes and his first two collegiate touchdowns in just the final three drives of the game.

- In Week 4 versus No. 9 Illinois (9/20), Martin went for 107 yards on the ground and another two touchdowns, which included a 31-yard breakaway score at the start of the fourth quarter.
- Martin played in two games in 2024 and had 57 yards rushing on eight carries in Week Two against Western Illinois (9/6).
- **Sean Cuono** has made five career appearances since joining the program in 2025.
- He made his Indiana debut in Week 3 of 2025 against Indiana State (9/12) when he had 17 yards rushing on two carries.
- **Jayreon Campbell** made his Indiana debut in Week 2 against Howard (9/12) and logged 36 yards rushing on five carries. He had a long rush of 23 yards in the fourth quarter.

- Entering his third year as Indiana's offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach, **Mike Shanahan**, continues to raise the standard.
- Shanahan led the Hoosiers to the No. 3 ranked offense in the FBS last season, scoring 41.6 points per game. In 2024, the offense ranked No. 2, putting up 41.3 points per contest.
- **Charlie Becker** has appeared in all 33 games since arriving on campus. After he appeared mostly on special teams in 2024, he emerged as a main receiving threat in the second half of 2025.
- With his sixth touchdown reception of the season against Western Kentucky in Week 3 (9/19), Becker set the standard for most receiving scores through the first three games of a season in program history.
- He had a career-long 79-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter of Week 3 against Western Kentucky (9/19) as part of a 127-yard day and chart three weeks in a row with a score.
- Becker and **Davion Chandler** are two of eight - 10 occurrences - with at least one touchdown in the first three games of a season in program history. They join **Kofi Hughes**, 2013; **Shane Wynn**, 2012; **Ted Bolser**, 2010; **James Hardy**, 2007 & 2005; **Ernie Jones**, 1987; **Jade Butcher**, 1969 & 1967).
- Becker had his first career three-touchdown game when he had three first half scores in Week 2 against Howard (9/12). He is the first IU player with multiple touchdown catches in consecutive games since **Ty Fryfogle** (2, at Michigan State; 3, at Ohio State) in 2020.
- Posted his first multi-touchdown game with two receiving scores and 64 yards on six receptions in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5).
- In the 2026 College Football Playoff National Championship Game against Miami (Fla.) (1/19), he had a 19-yard reception on fourth down with five minutes to go in the game to set up an Indiana touchdown that gave IU a 24-14 lead.
- Becker hauled in scores in back-to-back weeks with a 36-yard touchdown reception in the Peach Bowl against Oregon (1/9) and scored the first touchdown in IU's Rose Bowl Game history against Alabama (1/1) on his 21-yard reception.
- He posted 126 yards receiving on six catches in the Big Ten Championship Game against Ohio State (12/6).
- Made his first career start in Week 9 of 2025 against UCLA (10/25) when he had two catches for 35 yards. Earlier in the season, he caught his first career touchdown on a 6-yard score in Week 2 against Kennesaw State (9/6).
- In his collegiate debut in Week 2 of 2024 against Western Illinois (9/6), he scored his first career touchdown on a 3-yard rush in the fourth quarter.

- **Nick Marsh** made it three out of his first four weeks as a Hoosier with a touchdown when he caught an 8-yard score from **Josh Hoover** in Week 4 against Northwestern (9/25).
- He caught a **Grant Wilson** pass for a 51-yard touchdown reception in Week 2 against Howard (9/12).
- His first reception as a Hoosier was a one-handed, 15-yard touchdown grab for Indiana's first score of the season in the first quarter of Week 1 against North Texas (9/5).
- He joined the Hoosiers after two years at Michigan State (2024-25) where he appeared in 23 games with 20 starts.
- Marsh has at least one reception in all 27 career games with multiple receptions in 26-straight games dating back to Week 2 of 2024.
- He had back-to-back weeks with a touchdown in Weeks 8 (10/11; UCLA) and 9 (10/18; at Indiana) in 2025.
- Marsh posted his first multiple receiving touchdown game in Week 2 against Boston College when he had two touchdowns (9/6).
- In 2024, Marsh ranked No. 4 in FBS among true freshman in the regular season with 649 receiving yards and No. 6 in catches with 41. Twenty-six of his 41 catches went for a first down or touchdown.
- He became the first Spartan true freshman to record two 100-yard receiving games (9/7 at Maryland; 10/19 at Iowa).
- **Tyler Morris** had three catches for 35 yards receiving in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5) after missing all of 2025 with injury. He owns 38 career games with 16 starts across his time at Indiana (2025-) and Michigan (2022-24).
- In 2024, Morris made 10 starts and 11 appearances for the Wolverines. He charted 248 yards receiving and two touchdowns.
- Morris helped Michigan to their 2023 National Championship season. He caught his first career touchdown on a 38-yard completion against Alabama in the Rose Bowl Game (1/1).
- He made his first collegiate start at Nebraska (9/30) earlier that year, after his collegiate debut against Colorado State (9/3) in Week1 of 2022.
- **Shazz Preston** owns 35 career appearances and 14 starts after stops at IU (2026), Tulane (2024-25) and Alabama (2022-23).
- Preston caught his first touchdown as a Hoosier on a 32-yard score in the first quarter of Week 2 against Howard (9/12). He logged one reception for 10 yards and time on special teams in his IU debut in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5).
- Preston made 13 starts in 14 appearances in 2025 to help Tulane reach the College Football Playoff. He had receptions in all 14 games with multiple catches in 12 of them.
- He posted his first collegiate 100-yard receiving game in the College Football Playoff versus Ole Miss (12/20) with 125 yards on five catches.
- He made his first collegiate start in the season opener against Northwestern (8/30) in 2025.
- In 2024, Preston missed the first seven games due to injury before making his season debut at Charlotte (10/31). His first collegiate reception was a 53-yard touchdown grab against Temple (11/9).
- At Alabama, he made his collegiate debut against ULM (9/17) in 2022. He also appeared in the Allstate Sugar Bowl versus Kansas State (12/31).

- Four of Chandler's seven career catches have been touchdown receptions with one through the first three weeks of 2026. His most recent was a 26-yard touchdown in Week 3 against Western Kentucky (9/19).
- In Week 2 against Howard (9/12), he caught a 3-yard touchdown in the third quarter, and caught a 42-yard touchdown pass from **Josh Hoover** in the fourth quarter of Week 1 against North Texas (9/5).
- In 2025, Chandler's first collegiate catch went for a 65-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter at Purdue (11/28). He made his collegiate debut in Week 9 against UCLA (10/25).
- **Lebron Bond** has appeared in 15 games since joining the team in 2025.
- Bond opened collegiate career with a reception in his first three games. He also caught passes twice in Big Ten play (at Maryland 11/1; vs. Wisconsin 11/15).
- He made his collegiate debut in Week 1 of 2025 when he caught a 12-yard pass against Old Dominion (8/30).

- This is Cain's eighth year coaching the position group as he has done so every year in his time under **Curt Cignetti** (2019-present).
- **Brock Schott**'s first catch as a Hoosier was a 25-yard reception in his IU debut in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5).
- He returned to his home state after spending his first collegiate season at Miami (Fla.).
- Schott played two games in 2025 for the Hurricanes with his collegiate debut coming in Week 2 against Bethune-Cookman (9/6) where he had two receptions for 24 yards.
- The Fort Wayne native prepped at Leo High School and was considered a consensus four-star recruit nationally and a top-25 ranked tight end in the class of 2025.
- He was named the Indiana Football Coaches Association Mr. Football at tight end. He also earned all-state honors from IFCA as a junior and senior.
- **Andrew Barker** and **Blake Thiry** are the lone returners of Indiana's tight end room.
- Barker made his first career start in Week 2 against Howard (9/12) and two weeks later made his first career catch on a 6-yard reception in Week 4 against Northwestern (9/25).
- He made his collegiate debut against Kennesaw State (9/6) in his lone appearance in 2025. He saw time on offense and was one of 12 true freshmen to make their collegiate debut.
- Barker was considered a consensus three-star prospect out of Kokomo High School (Ind.) and a top-85 nationally ranked tight end from all three major recruiting services of ESPN, 247Sports and On3.
- He played both offense and defense in high school and was tabbed first-team all-conference in his senior season.

- Thiry made his collegiate debut in Week 2 against Howard (9/12), appearing on offense in the fourth quarter.
- Out of Prairie De Chien High School (Wis.), Thiry earned recognition as a consensus three-star prospect per ESPN, 247Sports, Rivals and On3. He was also tabbed a top-50 tight end prospect nationally and was ranked as a top-10 player out of Wisconsin in the 2025 class.
- He was named the Wisconsin Football Coaches Association Small School Offensive Player of the Year as a senior.
- He was also a two-time Southwest Wisconsin Conference first team selection and the conference's offensive player of the year as a senior.

- Back for year four to lead the offensive line in Bloomington, **Bob Bostad** looks to continue his progress with the unit as the lone holdover from Indiana's coaching staff in 2023.
- Bostad tutored 11 All-Americans over two stints at Wisconsin. That included eight on the offensive line, one tight end and two linebackers to earn All-America honors. He had his first Hoosier All-American last year in consensus All-American **Carter Smith**.
- The fifth year standout and 2025 Rimington-Pace Big Ten Offensive Lineman of the Year has made 45-straight starts at left tackle since Week 1 of 2023.
- He helped lead an Indiana offensive line that was a semifinalist for the Joe Moore Award in back-to-back years (2024-25) and a finalist in 2025.
- **Drew Evans** also returns from Indiana's stellar 2025 offensive line for his fifth season. Evans has served as the Hoosiers' left guard in 25 of 33 games since Week 1 of 2024.
- He missed weeks 10-12 and 14 in 2025 and started the first nine games of 2024 at left guard before suffering a season-ending injury prior to Week 11 against Michigan (11/9).
- Prior to nine starts in 2024, Evans did not see any game action in 2022 at Wisconsin or 2023 after transferring to at Indiana.
- **Bray Lynch** is the third returning starter from the 2025 Joe Moore finalists and has logged 33-straight starts since Week 1 of 2024. He started at right guard in all of 2024-25 (29 games). In all four games of 2026, he has made his first career starts at center.
- Lynch made nine appearances across the 2022 and 2023 seasons, logging his first career appearance against Idaho (9/10) in Week 2 of 2022.

- **Adedamola Ajani** has logged 19 appearances with eight starts since arriving on campus in 2024.
- Ajani made has made starts at left guard (3) and right tackle (5). He started at right tackle in all four games of 2026.

- **Austin Leibfried** made his first career start in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5) as part of Indiana's heavy package. He has made 17 career appearances with two starts since joining the program in 2024.
- First year student-athletes **Ben Novak** and **Sam Simpson** made their collegiate debuts in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5). In Week 2 versus Howard (9/12), first year **Kenton Mondeau** and second year **Evan Parker** both made their collegiate debuts.

- Defensive coordinator **Bryant Haines** is in his third season serving in the role and as linebackers coach. He won the 2025 Broyles Award and also is a two-time semifinalist for the honor.
- Haines' defense ranked No. 4 in total defense in the FBS last season, only allowing opponents to 266.0 yards per game and was the No. 2 rushing defense (77.2 yards per game) and scoring defense (11.6 points per game).
- In his third year at IU, **Rolijah Hardy** has appeared in all 33 games of his college career with 24 starts since joining the program in 2024.
- Hardy logged 2.0 tackles for loss among his nine stops in Week 3 against Western Kentucky (9/19).
- In Week 2 against Howard (9/12), Hardy had his second career pick-6 and his third career interception when picked off Ja'Shawn Scroggins for a 19-yard touchdown return.

- Isaiah Jones** wears the green dot for Indiana's defense and intercepted Brock Glenn for a 21-yard return in Week 3 against Western Kentucky (9/19).
- He posted his first double-digit tackle game with 12 stops in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5).
- Jones logged at least 0.5 tackle for loss in 11 games of 2025 and had 15.5 tackles for loss en route to being an All-Big Ten third team pick.
- He scored his first career touchdown on a blocked punt recovery in the end zone versus Miami (Fla.) (1/20) in the 2026 College Football Playoff National Championship Game.
- Jones had his first career fumble recovery in the Rose Bowl Game against Alabama (1/1) after **D'Angelo Ponds** stripped Ty Simpson.
- He had 2.0 sacks and seven tackles in the Big Ten Championship Game against Ohio State (12/6), where he joined his father, D.J. (Ohio State, 1993 & 1996) as father-son combos to win a Big Ten championship.

- Defensive tackles coach **Pat Kuntz** and ends coach **Buddha Williams** are each in their third seasons leading the defensive line for the Hoosiers.
- 2025 consensus All-American and first-team All-Big Ten selection **Tyrique Tucker** picked up where he left off last year with 1.0 sack in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5).
- Tucker is the lone remaining player on Indiana's roster that played for **Curt Cignetti** at James Madison prior transfer. He has appeared in 46 career games with 25 starts, including 20-straight starts since Week 1 of 2025.
- He had a team-high 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks in Week 9 of 2025 against UCLA (10/25).
- In back-to-back games in Week 3 and 4, Tucker had 1.5 tackles for loss and a solo sack (Indiana State; 9/12) and 2.0 sacks (No. 9/8 Illinois; 9/20).
- Tucker spent his first two seasons at James Madison (2022-23) where he redshirted in 2022 and then made five starts over 13 appearances in 2023.

- **Stephen Daley** had two forced fumbles and 1.0 sack in Week 4 against Northwestern (9/25).
- He made his first appearance back from injury in the 2025 Big Ten Championship Game against Ohio State (12/6) when he notched a tackle in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5).
- In 2025, Daley led the Big Ten with 19.0 tackles for loss on the season, a total that ranks tied for No. 7 in IU single season history. He logged at least 0.5 tackle for loss in 11 of 13 games in 2025 and earned All-America honors (CBS Sports & On3).

- **Ola Adams** is back for his third year coaching Indiana's safeties in 2024.
- In 2023, Adams was a defensive analyst and analytics coordinator at Penn State. Prior to 2023, Adams coached defensive backs across the collegiate and professional ranks.

- Seventh year **Preston Zachman** joined IU for his final year of eligibility after six seasons at Wisconsin (2020-25). With the Badgers, he made 35 appearances with 20 starts.
- He logged eight-plus tackles in back-to-back weeks with nine tackles in Week 4 against Northwestern (9/25) and eight stops in Week 3 against Western Kentucky (9/19).
- Zachman started and charted five tackles in his IU debut in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5).
- Throughout Zachman's career, he missed all of 2021 and parts of 2022 and 2025 due to injury.
- In 2025, he started the first three games before missing the rest of the season with injury. He had a pair of interceptions in the season opener against Miami (Ohio) (8/28).
- In 2023-24 he appeared in all 25 games and started in 17, he was a starter for all 12 games of 2024.
- He had the first double-digit tackle game of his career with 10 stops at Rutgers (10/12) in 2024.
- In 2023, he had a game-sealing interception in overtime against Nebraska (11/18). In the same game he had his first solo tackle for loss.
- He had his first career interception in the season opener against Illinois State (9/3) in 2022.
- Made his collegiate debut against Michigan (11/14) in 2020.
- **Quan Sanks** logged his first career interception for a 31-yard return and added 0.5 tackle for loss in his IU debut in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5).
- Sanks came to Indiana after two seasons at Cincinnati (2024-25) where he made 24 appearances and 12 starts. He was the first true freshman to start a season opener for Cincinnati since 2015 when he did so against Towson in Week 1 (8/31) of 2024.

- Had a forced and recovered fumble in Week 9 of 2025 against Baylor (10/25) after his first fumble recovery two weeks prior against UCF (10/11).
- Had his first career forced fumble and broke up first collegiate pass at Iowa State (11/16) in 2024.
- **Byron Baldwin Jr.** had his first career sack when he brought down Aidan Chiles and forced an intentional grounding penalty in Week 4 against Northwestern (9/25). The week before posted his first career 0.5 tackle for loss in Week 3 versus Western Kentucky (9/19).
- Baldwin Jr. made his first career start in Week 2 against Howard (9/12) and chipped in three tackles. He finished as the Hoosiers' second leading tackler with seven stops in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5).
- He missed the first eight games of his first year in 2025 and made his Hoosier debut in Week 9 against UCLA (10/25) and played the final eight games of the season.
- He had his first career fumble recovery after a forced fumble by **Jamari Sharpe** in Week 10 at Maryland (11/1).
- The Maryland native was an Under Armour All-American and consensus four-star prospect per ESPN, 247Sports, Rivals and On3 and a top-100 national recruit by 247Sports and On3, after prep career at St. Frances Academy.
- **Clay Conner** has 21 career appearances and played all 16 games in 2025, mostly on special teams.
- Conner logged his first career tackle in Week 3 against Indiana State (9/12) and blocked his first career punt in Week 2 against Kennesaw State (9/6) in 2025.
- He made his Indiana debut in Week 14 against Purdue (11/30) in 2024.
- **Anthony Chung** has 20 career appearances with most of his snaps coming on special teams. He played all 16 games in 2025 after not seeing the field in 2023 or 2024.
- **Garrett Reese** has played in 14 games on special teams since joining the program in 2025.
- He had his first career fumble recovery when he fell on a Jahmari Powell-Wonson fumble in Week 10 at Maryland (11/1).
- Reese made his Hoosier debut in Week 1 of 2025 against Old Dominion (8/30) on special teams.
- First year **Jamar Owens** made his collegiate debut in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5) on special teams.

- **Grant Cain** is in his third season at the helm of Indiana's special teams unit and his eighth under **Curt Cignetti**, previously leading the same unit for James Madison from 2019-23.
- In his time leading special teams units, his pupils have notched three All-America honors and 16 all-conference selections.
- IU led the FBS with five blocked punts in 2025, which included blocks in both the Peach Bowl and College Football Playoff National Championship Game.
- **Nico Radacic** has 32 career appearances and has been the field goal specialist in 31 of 33 games since the start of the 2024 season. He missed Weeks 2-3 due to injury in 2026.
- His two field goals made in Week 4 against Northwestern (9/25) put his career total at 32. That total tied for No. 10 on the career field goals made list with **Logan Justus** (32; 2018-19).
- Radacic made a career-long 49-yard field goal in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5) as part of his seventh double-digit scoring game with 10 points.
- He garnered All-Big Ten first team (coaches & media) honors and was named the Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year in 2025.

- Radacic's 29-yard field goal in the 2025 Big Ten Championship Game against Ohio State (12/6) improved his consecutive field goals made streak to a program-record 16 straight. He passed **Austin Starr** (15; 2007).
- His nine total points in the national championship game against Miami (Fla.) (1/19) pushed his 2025 season total to 141 and into No. 3 on the single-season charts, and the most by any IU kicker, passing **Griffin Oakes** (125; 2015). Radacic accounts for just the sixth 100-point season in IU history and third for a kicker.
- The nine points against Northwestern improved his career total to 264 to pass **Scott Bonnell** (261; 1989-92) for No. 5 on the career list.
- His three extra points against Northwestern improved his career total to 168 to extend his own program record. He went 7-for-7 on extra points in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5) to pass **Mitch Ewald** (2010-13; 161) and claim the No. 1 spot with 165 points at the time.
- With 168 consecutive extra points made, Radacic's streak is the best in program history and sits No. 2 in Big Ten history. He trails **Sean Nuernberger** of Ohio State (216; 2014-18) for the No. 1 spot.
- He is just the third Hoosier to make 100 consecutive extra points as he joined Ewald (100-for-100 before first miss; 2010-13) and Stoyanovich (107-for-107; 1985-88).
- His 3-for-3 effort on extra points against Miami (Fla.) last season pushed his season total to 87 which extended his own school record. He previously set the record in 2024 with 69 extra points.
- Radacic holds nine of the top-10 single-game extra points made marks with No. 1 (11 - Western Illinois, 2024), T-No. 2 (10 - Indiana State, 2023), T-No. 4 (9 - Illinois, 2025; Purdue, 2024), T-No. 6 (8 - Oregon, 2025; Purdue, 2025; UCLA, 2025; Kennesaw State, 2025; Nebraska, 2024).
- Radacic led the FBS in 2025 with extra points made (87) and finished No. 2 (69) in 2024 while posting an FBS-best 5.3 extra points made per game.
- He is 32-of-34 (.941) on field goal attempts and 168-of-168 (1.000) on extra point attempts in his collegiate career.
- A five-star prospect per Kohl's Kicking, Radacic was rated the No. 3 kicker nationally by 247Sports and the No. 4 by ESPN in the class of 2023. He was selected to participate in the 2023 Army All-American Bowl.
- **Quinn Warren** has appeared in 24 games since joining the Hoosiers in 2024 and has seen time as, kickoff specialist, punter and the holder.
- In 2026, he has logged six touchbacks on nine kickoffs.
- Warren took over on kickoff duties starting in Week 9 of 2025 against UCLA (10/25) in relief of special teams injuries. He had 56 kickoffs with 33 touchbacks in nine games.

- He punted in Weeks 1-4 of 2025 and got three of his seven punts inside the 10-yard line.
- Warren appeared in seven games in 2024 as a kickoff specialist due to injuries in the special teams unit.
- **Billy Gowers** is in just his second season of American football after earning All-America (Pro Football Focus & FWAA) honors at Hawai'i in 2025.
- Gowers had one punt for 40 yards in his IU debut in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5).
- He appeared in all 13 games at Hawai'i and was the highest-graded punter in FBS (93.2) per Pro Football Focus.
- He set the Hawai'i single-season record for punting average (46.2) and pinned 25 punts inside the 20-yard line, including seven punts inside the opposition's 10-yard line.
- Prior to Hawai'i, Gowers played eight seasons of Australian Rules Football and spent five seasons in the Australian Football League and three seasons in the Victorian Football League. He also played professional Kabaddi - a high-energy contact team sport combining elements of tag and wrestling.
- **Paddy McAteer** comes to Indiana as the kickoff specialist after two seasons at Troy (2024-25) where he appeared in 26 games.
- With Radacic injured in Weeks 2-3, McAteer filled in as placekicker and was 12-for-13 on extra points attempts and 1-for-2 on field goals.
- McAteer logged five touchbacks on all five of his kickoffs in his IU debut in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5).
- He set a Troy record for longest field goal made (53 yards) in Week 7 of 2025 at Texas State (10/11).
- He has notched 89 touchbacks on his 142 career kickoffs.
- He didn't start playing American football until April 2024. He previously played Gaelic Football for Mullaghbawn Cúchulainn's Gaelic Football Club.
- **Drew Clausen** appeared in 41 career games at long snapper over his six collegiate seasons at Indiana (2026) Iowa State (2024-25) and Northern Iowa (2021-23).
- Clausen made his IU debut in Week 1 against North Texas (9/5), and has fulfilled the Hoosiers' long snapping duties ever since.
- He made his Iowa State debut in Week 1 of 2024 against North Dakota (8/31) before assuming full-time snapping duties against Arkansas State (9/21) and through the rest of his time in Ames.
- He made his collegiate debut in 2023 against his future team Iowa State (9/2). He did not see any game action from 2021-22 at Northern Iowa.

Two-time national coach of the year Curt Cignetti enters his third season as head football coach at Indiana University after he engineered the two most successful seasons in program history to open his coaching tenure.

Named the 30th head football coach in IU football history on December 3, 2024, his first two calendar years on campus have seen arguably the most noteworthy turnaround in FBS history.

After leading one of the best first-year turnarounds in FBS history in 2024 with a 7 1/2-win improvement over the previous season, he engineered the 16-0 College Football Playoff national championship team.

The 16 wins in 2026 tie the all-time FBS single season mark (Yale, 1894) and set the Big Ten record for victories. He has led Indiana to a nation's-best 27 victories over his first two seasons in Bloomington, the most by an FBS coach in their first two seasons at a school all-time.

The back-to-back double-digit win seasons marked the first two in Indiana's history, while the 17 Big Ten wins set a program-best mark over a two-year stretch and are tied for No. 2 in Big Ten history.

Nationally, Cignetti was the first-ever Division I head coach to start 8-0 or better in consecutive seasons at different institutions and the third ever to begin consecutive seasons at 10-0 (Larry Coker - Miami (Fla.), 2001-02; Urban Meyer - Ohio State, 2012-13). He is also just the third Big Ten head coach to start each of his first two seasons with at least an 8-0 record along with Urban Meyer (Ohio State; 2012-13) and Fielding Yost (Michigan; 1901-02).

He won 14 of the 17 national coach of the year awards he was eligible in his first two seasons at Indiana, which includes being the first back-to-back winner for five of those honors. Along with the national accolades, Cignetti is the first coach to win both the Hayes-Schembechler (coaches vote) and Dave McClain (media vote) Big Ten Coach of the Year awards in consecutive seasons in conference history (1982-91, 2011-present).

INDIANA RESURGENCE

Coaching Accolades and Antidotes

- Cignetti has immediately elevated the Indiana program with a nation's-best 27 victories over his first two seasons at the helm, a pair of College Football Playoff appearances and IU's first national title (2026).
- He has won 14 of the 17 national coach of the year awards he was eligible to win between the 2024 and 2025 seasons.
- Is the first FBS coach to win consecutive national coach of the year awards from the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA), Associated Press, ESPN Home Depot, The Sporting News and Walter Camp Foundation.
- Cignetti is the first-ever Division I head coach to start 10-0 in consecutive seasons at different schools. (James Madison, 2023; Indiana, 2024) and is one of three all-time to begin his Power 4 tenure with consecutive 10-0 starts.
- Set the program record for victories in back-to-back seasons with 11 in 2024 and 16 in 2025. Those two seasons mark the only two double-digit win seasons in program history.
- Cignetti engineered a 7.5-game improvement from Indiana's 2023 to 2024 season, a number that currently sits tied for the second-best improvement by a first-year head coach since at least 1996 (June Jones, Hawai'i; 8.5 games).
- One of six Big Ten coaches that started their Big Ten tenures with 10-0 overall records in the AP Poll Era (since 1936): Cignetti (2024), Ryan Day (Ohio State, 2018-19), Urban Meyer (Ohio State, 2012), Earle Bruce (Ohio State, 1979), Bennie Oosterbaan (Michigan, 1948-49) and Carroll Widdoes (Ohio State, 1944-45).
- He is the only Indiana head coach to begin his head coaching tenure 4-0 or better and his 11 wins set the mark for wins by a first-year IU head coach, previously held by James M. Sheldon (8; 1905).

Notes & Records

- Tutored Indiana's first-ever Heisman Trophy winner in quarterback Fernando Mendoza, who also claimed the Walter Camp and Maxwell National Player of the Year awards, along with the Davey O'Brien and Manning Awards as the nation's top quarterback.
- Boasts 12 All-America selections over his two seasons at the helm of the Hoosiers, including two-time selections Aiden Fisher and D'Angelo Ponds. That total is the most in a two-year span in program history.
- Seen 23 players (10 offense, 10 defense, three special teams) earn All-Big Ten honors, with 11 more honorable mention selections.
- Four conference specialty award winners in 2025 marked the most in a single season in program history: Graham-George Offensive Player of the Year and Griese-Brees Quarterback of the Year (Mendoza), Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year (Carter Smith) and Bakken-Anderson Kicker of the Year (Nico Radicic).

- Finished No. 2 nationally with a program-record 81 offensive touchdowns scored, which included an FBS-best and IU-record 46 passing touchdowns.
- The 77 points in the Western Illinois in 2024 set the single-game program record for points in a game and the 66 points against Purdue in a 66-0 shutout are the most by an IU team in a Big Ten game. The previous marks were 76 (Franklin College, 1901) and 63 (at Wisconsin, 2001).

Staff Retention

- Quickly built his staff with familiar names, as six assistant coaches followed Cignetti from James Madison to Indiana: Bryant Haines, Mike Shanahan, Grant Cain, Pat Kuntz, John Miller and Tino Sunseri.
- Ten of the 11 full-time staff members hired by Cignetti at Indiana have worked multiple years on his staff, with nine of them entering their third season or longer at Indiana.
- Haines and Shanahan have been with Cignetti for the long haul. Both took jobs at Indiana University of Pennsylvania and were elevated to coordinator for the first time at James Madison under Cignetti.

SUCCESS AT JAMES MADISON

- Prior to becoming Indiana's head coach in December 2023, Cignetti amassed massive success at James Madison in his five-year tenure in Harrisonburg.
- Cignetti's Dukes went 52-9 from 2019-23, including a 19-4 mark in 2022 and 2023, JMU's first two years as an FBS program.
- 2023 was nothing short of magical for James Madison as the team went 11-1, had a 7-1 mark in the Sun Belt while winning the eastern division and spent time in the national rankings.
- Cignetti became the first coach to lead his team into the Top 25 during a program's first year of transition from FCS to FBS.
- In 2023, JMU clinched the school's first bowl bid, back-to-back Sun Belt East titles, and a Top-25 ranking for six-straight weeks.
- In Week Two (9/9), James Madison went on the road and defeated the flagship school of the state, the University of Virginia, in dramatic fashion, 36-35.
- The outstanding season earned Cignetti 2023 Sun Belt Coach of the Year.
- In 2022, JMU went 8-3 overall with a 6-2 mark in conference play to finish tied for first in the Sun Belt East Division. The Dukes opened with a 5-0 record, earning its Top-25 nod for the first time.
- Prior to FBS football, Cignetti led his JMU teams to equal levels of success in the Colonial Athletic Association and the FCS from 2019-21.
- The Dukes clinched three-consecutive CAA championships and playoff appearances, a berth in the 2019 FCS national championship game, and FCS semifinal appearances in 2020 and 2021.
- In his five years at James Madison, Cignetti's teams went 31-4 in conference play.
- Cignetti led James Madison to a 14-2 record and the national title appearance in his first campaign in Harrisonburg in 2019. JMU reeled off 14 consecutive wins, went 8-0 in league play, and notched eight nationally-ranked wins, with three inside the Top 10.
- The Dukes went 7-1 and reached the FCS semifinals in 2020, and finished 12-2 with a conference championship and semifinal appearance in their final FCS season in 2021.
- A 2019 Eddie Robinson Award finalist, Cignetti mentored 27 Dukes to All-America status. At the conference level, he tutored one Player of the Year, three Offensive Players of the Year, two Defensive Players of the Year, and one Special Teams Player of the Year.
- James Madison totaled 72 all-conference honorees, including 2023 Sun Belt Player of the Year quarterback Jordan McCloud and 2023 Defensive Player of the Year defensive lineman Jalen Green. Additionally, 17 Dukes carded spots on the All-Sun Belt team.

RAPID TURNAROUND AT ELON

- Prior to his stint at James Madison, Cignetti amassed a 14-9 record in two years at Elon (2017-18), a program that went 12-45 in the previous five campaigns.
- The Phoenix qualified for the FCS Playoffs in both seasons, just the second and third playoff berths in program history (2009).
- Cignetti led Elon to a six-win improvement in 2017, going 8-4 and finishing second in the CAA at 6-2. The Phoenix defeated four ranked opponents and returned to the national rankings for the first time since 2010.
- His squad also went on an eight-game winning streak, the first from an Elon football team since 2009.
- He was named Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year as the Phoenix reached the postseason and finished 20th in the national rankings.
- The great success also put him in line for a fourth-place finish in the voting for the Eddie Robinson Award.
- Elon secured a second-straight playoff appearance in 2018, with the ninth-ranked Phoenix knocking off No. 2 James Madison for the program's first-ever win over an FCS Top-5 opponent. The victory also snapped the Dukes' 22-game conference winning streak.

THE IUP DAYS

- Cignetti's inaugural head-coaching opportunity came at Indiana University of Pennsylvania from 2011-16.
- The IUP job was personally special for Cignetti as that is where his father, Frank Cignetti Sr., patrolled the sidelines for 20 years as head coach and played his college football.
- His father, Frank, is a member of the College Football Hall of Fame after playing at IUP and compiling a coaching record of 199-77-1 at West Virginia (1976-79) and IUP (1986-2005).
- The field at IUP is named in his honor (Frank Cignetti Field @ George P. Miller Stadium).
- Curt Cignetti went 53-17 with three playoff appearances and four Top 25s in six campaigns as the IUP head coach.
- The Crimson Hawks touted a 33-11 ledger in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference after a 4-10 two-year stretch prior to his arrival. Cignetti was 4-3 in the playoffs and had a final ranking as high as 12th (2016).

BEFORE HE WAS A HEAD COACH

- Cignetti's 27-year tenure as an FBS assistant coach featured a spot on Nick Saban's first coaching staff at Alabama. He served as wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator (2007-10).
- Saban coached under Frank Cignetti before later employing Curt at Alabama.
- The Crimson Tide went 12-2 in 2008, the same year Cignetti helped corral the nation's No. 1 recruiting class. Alabama followed with an undefeated national championship season in 2009, and a 10-win campaign in 2010.
- He joined the Crimson Tide after a seven-year stint as recruiting coordinator (2000-06), tight ends coach (2000-02), and quarterbacks coach (2003-04) at North Carolina State.
- The Wolfpack reached five bowl games, including the 2002 Gator Bowl squad that set a program record with 11 victories.
- His first run as a recruiting coordinator came at Pitt from (1993-99), where he also coached tight ends and quarterbacks at various times under College Football Hall of Fame head coach Johnny Majors.
- Cignetti started his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Pitt (1983-84) and was part of its Fiesta Bowl team his first year. • He mentored quarterbacks and receivers at Davidson in 1985, and he oversaw the quarterbacks at Rice (1986-88) and Temple (1989-92).
- Cignetti graduated from West Virginia in 1982, where he lettered as a quarterback and earned his bachelor's degree in business administration.

- Curt and his wife, Manette, have three children, Natalie, Carly and Curtis. Natalie was an honorable mention All-American in volleyball at IUP.
- Cignetti earned his bachelor's degree in business administration from West Virginia in 1982, where he lettered at quarterback (1979-82).
- His father, Frank, is a member of the College Football Hall of Fame after he compiled a coaching record of 199-77-1 at West Virginia (1976-79) and IUP (1986-2005). The field at IUP is named in his honor: Frank Cignetti Field at George P. Miller Stadium.
