AIRD, HOOSIERS EMBARK ON ROAD TRIP TO FACE FAMILIAR FOES

- The Hoosiers are 6-2 on the road this season including a 4-1 mark in conference play
- IU is looking for a fourth-straight win at Maryland and the program's first-ever victory at Penn State

FIRST SERVE

B1G START: Indiana is off to its best **10-game** start to Big Ten play after reaching the halfway point in conference play at **7-3**. It surpasses the 6-4 start from both 1985 and 2023. The first 10 games of league action saw the Hoosiers take down **4** teams away from Bloomington.

DYNAMIC DUO: Indiana's veteran duo of senior outside hitter **Candela Alonso-Corcelles** and senior opposite **Avry Tatum** has helped lead the charge on a great season so far. They are the **only active** Big Ten duo to each record over **1,000** kills during their time in college.

CHASING 20: The Hoosiers will have a chance at a number of records this season. One of those is the search for the **7th 20-win** season in program history - and the second under head coach **Steve Aird**. IU is just **4** wins away from a **20-win** campaign and **3** wins away from a **10-win** Big Ten season.

BALANCE ON THE PINS: Indiana is the **only** Big Ten team who has **3** different players averaging at least **3.30** kills per set this season. On **7** different occasions this year, all **3** of IU's pin hitters have gone for 10+ kills each. Senior outside hitter **Candela Alonso-Corcelles** leads the team with **3.47** kills per set.

CANDE IS A WINNER: Senior outside hitter **Candela Alonso-Corcelles** has been a big winner during her time in Bloomington. The Hoosiers have **68** overall wins and **35** in conference play since she joined the team in 2022. She's just **4** Big Ten wins away from having the most league wins of any player in program history.

AIRD RETURNS HOME: Head coach **Steve Aird** played volleyball at Penn State (1997-2001), helping them to three national semifinals. He later coached under the legendary **Russ Rose** (2007, 2012-13) before becoming the head coach at Maryland (2014-17). Assistant coach **Kevin Hodge** also played volleyball at Penn State.

EXTREMELY EFFICIENT: Indiana is **top-10** nationally this season in hitting percentage (**.295**). IU is one of **3** teams in the Big Ten in the top 10 of the national rankings. Senior opposite **Avry Tatum** is hitting **.358** on the year, **3rd** highest of any right-side attacker in the country.

MORE FROM T: Freshman setter **Teodora Kričković** already has the most single-season assists (**755**) by a freshman during the current scoring era (since 2008). On the year, she has more assists per set (**10.79**) than any other freshman setter in the entire country and is 2nd among all Big Ten players in the category.

SERIES VS. OPPONENTS

MARYLAND: The Terrapins own a slight advantage in the all-time series, 11-8, but IU has won three-straight contests overall and three straight in College Park. Head coach Steve Aird has been on the bench for one of the programs in 16 of the 19 all-time contests.

Aird is 5-3 as the head coach in this matchup when the game is played in College Park. IU has won four of the last five matches in the series. It has swept the last two contests played at the Xfinity Pavilion.

PENN STATE: To no surprise, the eight-time national champions have dominated the all-time series. Penn State is 62-1 all-time against the Hoosiers. It's only loss was a four-set loss in 2010, the same year it went on to win the National Championship.

Much like Maryland, Steve Aird has a lot of experience in this series as well. The head man played at Penn State and spent many years on staff under Russ Rose. He was college roommates with current Penn State coach Katie Schumacher-Cawley. In 2023, IU went to five sets for the first time in program history against Penn State.

LAST TIME OUT VS. OPPONENTS

INDIANA 3, MARYLAND 0

Nov. 2, 2024 | College Park, Md. | Xfinity Pavilion

• Indiana extended its winning streak to three games with a clean sweep of Maryland in College Park. Avry Tatum and Candela Alonso-Corcelles combined on 24 kills in the win.

• The Hoosiers got five blocks from Alonso-Corcelles and Ava Vickers. Camryn Haworth had 29 assists, 7 digs and 5 blocks. It was the second-straight sweep for IU in College Park.

#3 PENN STATE 3, INDIANA 1

Oct. 13, 2025 | Bloomington, Ind. | Wilkinson Hall

• The Hoosiers gave the eventual national champions everything they had in Bloomington. IU won the first set and had five set points to go up 2-1 in the match. Penn State eventually won set three and finished off the match in four games.

• Candela Alonso-Corcelles led the way with 18 kills. Madi Sell had seven blocks and seven kills. IU had 13 blocks as a team. Ramsey Gary had 17 digs in the back row.

A WIN WOULD...

MARYLAND: Be the fourth-straight victory against Maryland in College Park. It would also give IU eight Big Ten wins for the fourth-straight season. The Hoosiers haven't won at least eight conference matches in four-consecutive seasons since 1987-90.

PENN STATE: Be the program's first-ever victory at Penn State in over 30 tries. It would also be the 10th ranked victory on the road in program history. Steve Aird is aiming to win his first match against his alma mater as a head coach.

BOTH: Be massive for the Hoosiers' 2025 campaign. It would push IU's record to 18-4 and 9-3 in the Big Ten. It would extend IU's winning streak to three-straight contests and give it lots of momentum heading into November.

#23 INDIANA 3, NORTHWESTERN 0

• Indiana bounced back in a massive week with an emphatic sweep of Northwestern at Wilkinson Hall. IU hit .361 in the match with senior outside hitter Candela Alonso-Corcelles providing 16 kills.

• Indiana couldn't overcome a fantastic Minnesota offense, dropping its first match of the year at Wilkinson Hall. Senior outside hitter Candela Alonso-Corcelles had 15 kills but Minnesota hit over .400 in the win.

2024 IN REVIEW

STACKING SEASONS

• The Hoosiers have put together a strong run of form over the last three seasons. Since 2022, IU has finished at .500 or better and has won 28 Big Ten matches in that stretch. Those 28 conference victories are the most in a three-year run since the turn of the century.

HOME ENVIRONMENT

• IU has put together a 21-7 record at Wilkinson Hall over the last two years. All but one loss in that stretch was to a ranked opponent. The Hoosiers will have 12 games at home in 2025 and will hope to put together another strong year on home court.

SAYING GOODBYE TO HAWORTH

• For the first time in four years, IU will have a primary setter not named Camryn Haworth. It's expected that Serbian freshman Teodora Kričković gets most of the run at the position for the Hoosiers. Haworth's legendary career featured a program record 213 aces and nearly 4,000 assists.

A DYNAMIC DUO

• Then-juniors Avry Tatum and Candela Alonso-Corcelles were a nightmare for opponents in 2024. When the two of them were on their game, IU was exceptionally lethal. Both players are now back for their senior seasons with reinforcements around them. If healthy, both should have massive years.

GROWING THE GAME

• Record crowds, national television matches and growing support for the game highlighted the 2024 campaign. It's expected to keep going in 2025 with IU set to play a match at Gainbridge Fieldhouse in Indianapolis against Purdue and 12 home matches against quality teams at home.

2025 QUICK FACTS

CHANGE IN THE AIR

• IU lost nine players from last year's roster and replaced them with eight talented newcomers. The likely holdovers in the starting lineup include seniors Candela Alonso-Corcelles (OH), Avry Tatum (OPP) and Madi Sell (MB). Junior Ava Vickers (MB) is recovering from offseason surgery but should be ready to go by the start of the campaign.

EXPECT THE KIDS TO PLAY EARLY

• Head coach Steve Aird hasn't been shy to play the freshmen from the jump. Don't be surprised to see Jaidyn Jager (OH), Charlotte Vinson (OH) and Hannah Leftridge (DS/L) playing right from the jump this season.

BIG TEN DOUBLE CHANGE

• Each team in the conference plays three of the league opponents twice during the course of the 20-match slate. Last year the Hoosiers played Purdue, Ohio State and Illinois twice. This season, that will pivot to include Northwestern, Maryland and Purdue.

PLAYING THE RPI GAME

• While the names won't necessarily jump off the page, IU has built a balanced non-conference schedule in 2025. It features conference champions Western Kentucky, Western Michigan and Loyola (Chicago) from a season ago. IU will also play Miami (Fla.) for the third-straight year.

TIME TO BREAK THROUGH

• It's been too long since IU has made the NCAA Tournament. The Hoosiers last went in 2010 but will eager to break that streak some 15-years later. With a strong chance at a high RPI and a talented roster, head coach Steve Aird will hope they crack the code on the postseason drought.

ELITE FRESHMAN CLASS IN TOWN

TOP CLASS IN PROGRAM HISTORY

• Head coach Steve Aird and his coaching staff put together one of the best groups of incoming players to ever step foot in Bloomington. Outside hitter Charlotte Vinson (No. 25 nationally) was the focal point of the class and is one of the top-three players to sign for IU in history.

BIG DUO ON THE PINS

• Charlotte Vinson (Yorktown, Ind.) and Jaidyn Jager (Carlsbad, Calif.) are both consensus top-55 recruits in the class of 2025 by Prep Dig and Prep Volleyball. At some point, it's likely that both of them play a pivotal role for the Hoosiers. Each played at a high level in their final club season.

VERSATILE MIDDLE

• Victoria Gray (Temperance, Mich.) quickly rose up the recruiting rankings in the fall of 2023 and became a prospect that IU wanted badly. She was an all-state basketball and volleyball player in Michigan and quickly rose into a top-110 national recruit by both major outlets.

BACK ROW HELP

• The Hoosiers loaded up on defensive talent to help level out the passing in 2025. Avery Freeman, a Bloomington native, was the libero for one of the top clubs in the midwest (Circle City) and grew up going to IU matches as a kid. Hannah Leftridge is considered an under-the-radar prospect at the libero position.

SERBIAN SETTER

• Aird went back overseas to snag his setter in the class. Teodora Kričković has played with the Serbian youth teams at the U19 World Championships in 2023 and was on the U21 roster in 2025. She's expected to play most of the matches this season as the starter.

THE ROSTER WE BUILT

ADDING A TRANSFER

• Jessica Smith joined the program this season as a graduate transfer from UCLA. She spent the last four years playing for its beach volleyball team. She twice made the NCAA All-Tournament team and is known as an elite passer.

• As an indoor player in high school, she was the 2020 Gatorade State Player of the Year in California. She can play as a pin hitter or as a back row passer. Either way, she will impact the Hoosiers in a positive manner.

STRONG TRANSFER SUCCESS

• The Hoosiers have mostly built the roster through the high school model but transfers have been of great value over the last few years. Avry Tatum (Cincinnati), Kaley Rammelsberg (High Point) and Paula Cerame (Florida) are just a few examples of quality players to find new homes in Bloomington.

STARTING AT HOME

• 14 of the 17 players on this year's roster began their collegiate careers in Bloomington. In today's era, that's wildly unusual. Each year, the Hoosiers have added one to two transfers to balance that out. Even with all that, Candela Alonso-Corcelles is currently the only four-year senior on the team.

VERSATILE

• The Hoosiers have three setters, four middle blockers, six pin hitters and four true defensive players on this year's team. There's depth at all positions and throughout the season there will be plenty of people contributing on the court.

She's the first local product to sign with the Hoosiers since All-American Ashley Benson (2007-10). Freeman spent time at volleyball camps at IU dating back to her early years.

#3 SPANISH SENSATION: No one has developed more than **Candela Alonso-Corcelles** since coming to IU. The native of Madrid joined IU during its foreign tour in 2022 and had never visited the United States before coming to campus in August of 2022. Initially thought to be a three-rotation role player, Candela has blossomed into one of the better six-rotation arms in the Big Ten. She's the only member of the senior to class to spend her whole career at IU.

#5 ACTION JACKSON: Freshman utility player **Audrey Jackson** was never supposed to end up at Indiana. She was originally committed to play beach volleyball at Texas but decommitted towards the end of the 2024 calendar year. When IU's coaching staff heard she was available, the mutual interest was there. She took her official visit the same weekend as **Jessica Smith** and both players committed before the new year.

#8 FICKELL + FOOTBALL: Junior setter **Luca Fickell** is the lone daughter - and one of six kids - of Wisconsin head football coach Luke Fickell. Luke will play a game at Memorial Stadium on Nov. 15, 2025, his third game as a head coach in the past five years in Bloomington. Luca took a visit to the IU program on the weekend where Cincinnati football (then coached by Luke) played in Bloomington in 2021

#9 COMEBACK SEASON: No player on IU's roster has been through more than freshman outside hitter **Charlotte Vinson**. She was on life support in the spring of 2024 with toxic shock syndrome and spent over a month in the hospital. Vinson returned to volleyball action in September and led Yorktown to the IHSA 4A title game.

#10 INTERNATIONAL FLARE: Freshman setter **Teodora Kričковиć** was sought after by head coach Steve Aird for the majority of the spring of 2025. Aird hasn't been shy to add international pieces to his teams at Indiana. In fact, she's the seventh "true" international player to play for IU. Five of those have come since Aird became the head coach. Kričковиć has captained the youth national team at Serbia for multiple years.

#11 SWISS ARMY KNIFE: Junior middle blocker **Ava Vickers** is more than just a volleyball player. She spends her free time doing modeling and fashion gigs while also cutting her teeth in the art of making clothes out of items that she thrifted. In addition to those hobbies, she studies interior design and is well set up for her future after graduating from IU. Last year, she started all 20 Big Ten matches while dealing with a shoulder injury.

#12 BEACH BALLIN': Graduate student **Jessica Smith** will continue the lineage of beach volleyball players heading to play in Bloomington. Former defensive specialist **Delanyne Maple** (2024) was an integral part of last year's campaign. Now, Smith joins the roster and will hope to have the same impact. She's also pursuing her Master's Degree in Management.

#13 CALIFORNIA KID: Senior opposite hitter **Avry Tatum** played high school volleyball for associate coach Rachel Morris and club volleyball for Morris and assistant coach **Kevin Hodge**. In the spring of 2023, IU held on to its last scholarship. Eventually, Tatum entered the portal after one year of Cincinnati. Things aligned perfectly and Tatum ended up in Bloomington with some familiar faces as her coaches.

#14 SEGAL'S SPRING: Over the last couple of years, IU has chosen to play a spring match at a high school in Indiana - usually one that a current player on its roster attended. This year, IU went to Frontier High School in Brookston, Ind., the alma mater of **Emma Segal**. The match was well attended by the local community to see one of the few division one athletes to ever come out of the small 1A school.

#15 HEART OVER HEIGHT: Standing at 5-3, sophomore setter **Sade Ilawole** has defied all odds to play division one volleyball as a setter. She started last year's match vs. No. 8 Wisconsin and is believed to be the shortest setter to ever start a game for the Hoosiers. Not only that, she became a reliable back row option and has played every role that IU has asked of her.

#18 BUSINESS AS USUAL: No one has taken advantage of the academic opportunities at IU more than sophomore opposite hitter **Avery Daum**. She is studying in the prestigious Kelley School of Business and has plans to enter the business world after her graduation in Bloomington.

#23 DUAL THREAT: Freshman middle blocker **Victoria Gray** is one of the best dual-sport athletes to come out of the state of Michigan in recent memory. She was a finalist for both Miss Volleyball and Miss Basketball in the state and scored over 1,000 points and provided over 1,000 kills in her prep career.

#24 LA COSTA CONNECTION: Freshman outside hitter **Jaidyn Jager** played just two seasons of high school of volleyball before focusing solely on club. In her freshman season of high school (2021), she was coached by associate head coach **Rachel Morris** at La Costa Canyon High School in California. One of her teammates was none other than senior opposite hitter **Avry Tatum**.

#27 SISTERLY LOVE: Sophomore middle blocker **Ela Boersema** is the oldest of five girls in the Boersema family. She has the second-most siblings (4) on the team and is close to every member of her family. The Boersema crew can often be found at Wilkinson Hall, cheering on the oldest sister. Her parents, Joe and Brandy, do an admirable job of handling the duties of raising all five girls.

SEASON NOTES AND TRENDS

• The Hoosiers came out to California (Oct. 3 & 4, 2025) and added massive wins to their growing postseason resume. IU already has three wins over teams that have spent time in the top-25 this year including victories over UCLA and USC. It has only pushed forward IU's amazing start to the year.

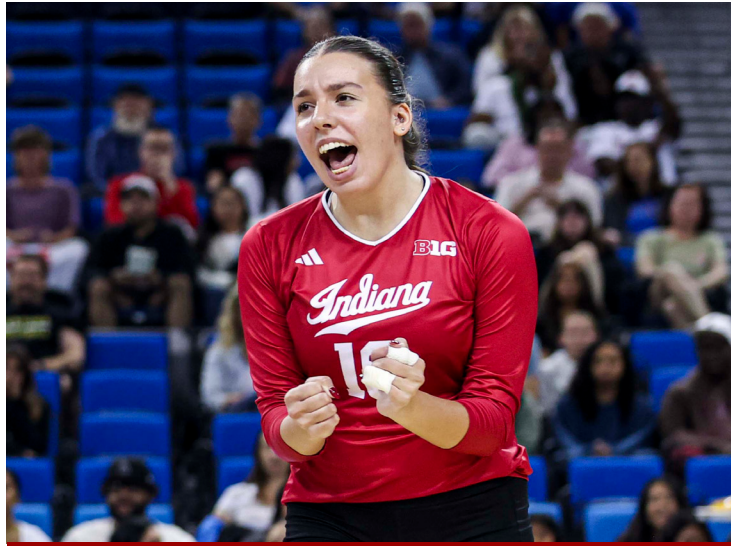

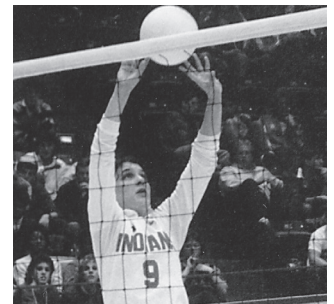

An exciting chapter began for Indiana University Athletics in the 2018-19 school year as IU unveiled a new, state-of-the-art, 3,000-seat facility - Wilkinson Hall.

Wilkinson Hall is a multi-use training and performance center that is the new home venue for the Indiana Volleyball and Wrestling programs. One of the earliest volleyball specific arenas in the country, athletes and coaches have unlimited access to practice time and resources few schools in the country can provide.

Consistent with the university's master plan, the facility brings these two programs' home competitions back onto the IU Athletics campus from their former University Gymnasium home at the intersection of 10th Street and the 45/46 bypass.

In addition, Wilkinson Hall will provide the entire Indiana University Athletic Department and its programs with a new top-flight facility for year-round training, and will serve as a venue to host department and university events.

Wilkinson Hall is named after IU alumnus Jay Wilkinson and his family, who have an incredible history of support for IU Athletics and its student-athletes.

Indiana Volleyball played its first official matches in Wilkinson Hall during the 2019 campaign and has played there every year since. In 2019, the opening year of Wilkinson Hall, the Hoosiers were 15th in the NCAA in attendance, the highest the team has ever been in program history.

Following a condensed COVID-19 season in 2020-21, fan support for IU volleyball has continued to grow in the three seasons following the pandemic.

The Hoosiers averaged over 1,300+ fans per season in 2022 and 2023. Matches against Purdue and Nebraska in 2023 were completely sold-out. The match with the Boilermakers, broadcasted on Big Ten Network, saw 2,725 fans in attendance.

IU has rebroken the Wilkinson Hall attendance program record in each of the past three seasons in matches against Purdue. Four of the biggest five crowds in its new home have come over the past three campaigns.

2,857 people packed the gym to watch IU play Purdue in November of 2024. As the program continues to get better, so do the crowds and the support that comes along with it.

ASSOCIATE COACH • RACHEL MORRIS

4th Season • Oregon ('10)

Rachel Morris completed her third season with the Indiana Volleyball program in 2024. She was elevated to associate head coach and recruiting coordinator on July 1, 2023.

Programmed with a desire to develop student-athletes on and off the court, Morris helped implement daily meditation, conversations about mental health and group-bonding activities upon arrival to Bloomington in 2022. Morris was also named to Volleyball Magazine's Under 40 College Coaching Hotshots list in 2023.

Morris, handed the keys to the team's offensive gameplan when she arrived at IU, has helped orchestrate a successful three-year run with the setters and attackers. Under her guidance, Camryn Haworth was a three-time All-Big Ten selection. She broke the rally-era assists record (3,923) and the all-time aces record (213).

Over the three seasons that Morris has served as a coach in Bloomington, IU has won 52 games overall and 28 matches in the Big Ten. The 28 conference wins over a three-year span are the most by the program since 1998-2000. As well, IU has had back-to-back 10+ win home seasons for the first time since 1999-2000.

In 2024, Morris helped Haworth run a fast-paced offense in the Big Ten Conference. Haworth finished with 1,061 assists and helped set juniors Candela Alonso-Corcelles (409 kills) and Avry Tatum (348 kills) to career years. Both Alonso-Corcelles and Tatum ended the regular season in the top-15 in kills, points, kills per set and points per set.

Morris lives in Bloomington with her dog, Kona.



ASSISTANT COACH • KEVIN HODGE

3rd Season • Penn State

Kevin Hodge completed his second season as an assistant coach in Bloomington in 2024. A longtime friend, teammate and co-worker of head coach Steve Aird, he was named an assistant coach for Indiana volleyball on July 6, 2023.

Hodge spends time working with the team's defensive game plan and in-game serving strategy. Over his two seasons in Bloomington, the Hoosiers have racked up 426 aces including 122 from All-American Camryn Haworth. The Fishers, Ind. native went on to break the program's all-time aces record (213) as a senior in 2024.

Libero Ramsey Gary worked closely with Hodge in both of their two seasons at IU. She was a two-time All-Big Ten selection and racked up 968 digs in just 63 matches. She broke both IU's freshman and all-time single season digs record (530) and was a unanimous All-Big Ten Freshman team choice.

The Hoosiers totaled 215 aces in 2023, becoming the first Big Ten program since 2001-02 with consecutive seasons of 200+ aces. IU's defense was vastly improved in 2023, totaling 1,647 digs and 303 blocks. IU matched a program record with 21 regular season wins in 2023 and beat Purdue for the first time since 2012.

In the two seasons that Hodge has been at IU, it has racked up 36 wins overall and 19 conference wins. The Hoosiers have gone 21-7 (.750) at Wilkinson Hall during that span, winning 10+ home matches in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1999-2000.

ASSISTANT COACH • MATT KEARNS

2nd Season • Xavier ('17)

Matt Kearns was named as the third assistant coach for the Indiana volleyball program on July 29, 2024. He joins the staff after spending time with three different division one programs, including two in the Midwest. Kearns completed his first season with IU in 2024.

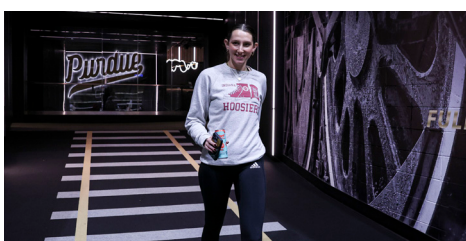
Kearns, known for his work in volleyball analytics and game preparation, comes to Bloomington after spending the 2023 season as the head coach at Louisiana-Monroe. Before his time with the Warhawks, Kearns spent six years at Northern Kentucky as a graduate assistant (2017-18) and an assistant coach (2019-22).

The first season for Kearns in Bloomington saw the Hoosiers pick up 15 wins overall and end the season winning three of four matches in the Big Ten. Kearns worked closely with the team's scouting report and helped IU's players with in-game blocking and defensive adjustments.

Sophomore middle blocker Ava Vickers benefited greatly from the addition of Kearns. She was asked to start all 20 Big Ten matches. Despite being undersized, she racked up a career high 67 blocks. Junior middle blocker Madi Sell also picked up a career high with 94 total blocks.

In his time at Northern Kentucky, he helped lead the program to a combined 108-69 record with an overall season mark above .500 in the final five of six seasons on staff. The Norse won the 2019 Horizon League Championship and finished with an RPI in the top-50 in the nation before advancing to the NCAA Tournament to face top-25 foe Michigan.

Kearns is a graduate of Xavier University and resides in Bloomington.

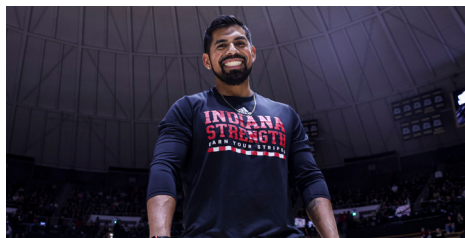
