INDIANA BEGINS SEASON WITH TOP-10 TEST

- The Hoosiers return 12 players from last year's team that advanced to the regional semifinal for the first time since 2010
- IU has finished .500 or better in each of the last four seasons - the program has won 77 games since 2022
- Head coach Steve Aird's team will play 22 of its 26 games against power four opponents - eight of those in true road environments
- IU was picked sixth in the Big Ten preseason poll with sophomore outside hitter Jaidyn Jager and setter Teodora Kričković on the All-Big Ten preseason team

FIRST SERVE

EARLY TEST: IU's match at #7 Louisville is the third season opener against a ranked opponent in program history. The Hoosiers also took on #24 Long Beach State (2008) and #5 Nebraska (2020-21) to kick off a new campaign. IU is 2-4 against ranked non-conference opponents under head coach **Steve Aird**.

ACC FAMILIARITY: Although IU and Louisville haven't played since 2008, the Hoosiers have played ACC opponents with great regularity in the last decade. Of the current programs in the league, this will be the sixth team (Miami (Fla.), NC State, Notre Dame, Georgia Tech and SMU) that IU will play under head coach Steve Aird.

STELLAR SOPHOMORES: All six members of IU's second-year class played in at least 24 games last year and return to form a deep core. That includes outside hitter **Jaidyn Jager**, setter **Teodora Kričković** and defensive specialist **Audrey Jackson** who played in each of IU's 33 contests in 2025.

BOERSEMA IS BACK: Head coach Steve Aird is boosted by the return of third-year middle blocker **Ella Boersema**. She suffered a season-ending injury last October after averaging 1.76 kills per set and 1.40 blocks per set in her first 14 games. She can play on the right side as well for the Hoosiers.

LETHAL OFFENSE: IU will look to replicate what was a record-breaking offensive season in 2025. The Hoosiers hit .281 on the year including 15 matches with a hitting percentage better than .300. Second-year setter **Teodora Kričković** dished out 10.73 assists per set last year and will be surrounded by big hitters once again.

BIG GAME J: Second-year outside hitter **Jaidyn Jager** was one of the most prolific scorers in the league last year. She has the sixth most kills (383) of any returning Big Ten player from a year ago. Jager had at least 10 kills in 23 matches last season, including 15 in the second round of the NCAA Tournament against Colorado.

TOUGH SERVING: IU has been one of the best serving teams in the country over the last four years under head coach Steve Aird. The Hoosiers had 192 aces last season including 11 matches of 8-or-more aces. 3 different returning players (Jager, Freeman, Kričković) provided at least 25 aces a year ago.

NEW ADDITIONS: Fifth-year middle blocker **Kiki Granberry** and third-year outside hitter **Izzy Clark** add veteran experience to an already talented roster. The two transfers bring over 1,200 kills and 400 blocks to Bloomington with 6 years of combined experience. They have both played in the NCAA Tournament as well.

ON THE ROAD: Head coach **Steve Aird** has more ranked road wins (6) than any other coach in program history. That includes a trio of conference victories over ranked teams in 2025. He will have the chance to add to that tally with an early top-10 test against Louisville on Friday evening.

TOUGH AND TOGETHER: IU's team has spent most of the calendar year together after playing the full spring season and taking a foreign tour (Istanbul, Madrid, Lisbon) in May. The Hoosiers won all 24 sets they played in 6 matches in Europe. 16 of IU's players were present on the foreign tour.

LAST TIME VS. OPPONENTS

INDIANA 3, LOUISVILLE 2

Sept. 6, 2008 | Assembly Hall | Bloomington, Ind.

• In an early season matchup in Bloomington, IU held off a reverse sweep attempt from Louisville. The Hoosiers won set five, 15-12, behind 21 kills from outside hitter Erica Short.

• Middle blocker Ashley Benson was spectacular. She had 19 kills while hitting .456 with four blocks. Libero Juli Pierce dug 22 balls in the victory over the Cardinals.

A WIN WOULD

LOUISVILLE: Be the sixth top-10 victory in program history and the first against a non-conference opponent. The Hoosiers have knocked off five top-10 teams over the last 50 years, most recently in 2022 against No. 5 Ohio State. IU has never beaten the seventh-ranked team in the country on 13 previous attempts.

SERIES VS. OPPONENTS

LOUISVILLE: Despite being located just two hours away from each other, Indiana and Louisville haven't played in volleyball since 2008. Since then, Louisville has turned into one of the premier programs in the country. Both sides are coming off an appearance in the NCAA regional semifinals.

Between 1990 and 1996, Louisville and IU played every year as part of the Big Four Classic. Kentucky and Notre Dame rounded out the four-team, three-game tournament in the early season.

This is the eighth game against an ACC opponent in the non-conference since 2021. IU is 3-4 in the past five seasons against the ACC, beating Miami (Fla.) twice on the road (2023, 2025) and Notre Dame at home (2024). IU also played SMU (2022) before they joined the conference.

2025 IN REVIEW

BEST SEASON IN PROGRAM HISTORY

• The Hoosiers went 25-8 last year on their way to just the second regional appearance in program history. IU broke single-season records for wins (25) and Big Ten wins (14) in the NCAA era and hosted the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament for the second time ever.

ALL-AMERICAN HOOSIERS

• For the first time ever, IU had two different players named AVCA All-Americans in the same season. Opposite hitter Avry Tatum and setter Teodora Kričković had their names etched into history at Wilkinson Hall after brilliant 2025 campaigns.

PLAYING THE KIDS

• A deep and talented freshman class was one of the big reasons behind a great campaign last year. Outside hitter Jaidyn Jager, setter Teodora Kričković, libero Audrey Jackson and middle blocker Victoria Gray were all 30-match starters during their debut seasons.

BIG WINS

• IU won four matches against AVCA top-25 opponents last year with three of them coming on the road. That included the first ever victory on the road at Penn State and back-to-back wins in Los Angeles against USC and UCLA. IU also knocked off Colorado in the NCAA Tournament.

WILKINSON MAGIC

• It was another big year of winning games inside Wilkinson Hall in Bloomington. The Hoosiers went 12-2 on their main home court with the only defeats coming at the hands of No. 1 Nebraska and No. 20 Minnesota. IU was 7-2 in Bloomington during Big Ten play.

QUICK HITTERS - BROADCAST NOTES

HOMEGROWN TALENT

• 15 of IU's 17 players began their college careers in Bloomington after joining out of the prep or international ranks. Only Kiki Granberry (Tennessee) and Izzy Clark (San Diego) came from another program. 13 are original high school recruits by IU's coaching staff.

TOUGH TESTS

• Of the preseason AVCA top-10 programs, IU is scheduled to play six of them in the regular season. That includes games against No. 7 Louisville (Aug. 28) and No. 8 Texas A&M (Sept. 1) in the opening three contests of the year.

EARLY RETURNS

• First-year outside hitter Sara Snowbarger has been big during the preseason. She had 15 kills in an exhibition win over Notre Dame. It is expected that she will be 18th freshman, or first year, to start on Opening Night under head coach Steve Aird at Indiana.

BIG RESPECT

• The Hoosiers were picked sixth in the preseason Big Ten poll by the respective league coaches. It's a great honor but IU will be looking to back that pick up and earn a high seed for this season's Big Ten Tournament in Fishers, Indiana.

BACK ON THE COURT

• Fifth-year middle blocker Kiki Granberry and third-year middle blocker Ella Boersema are both scheduled to be back on the court after undergoing season-ending injuries last season. Don't be surprised if Boersema plays on the right side with her big arm and versatility.

She was originally committed to play beach volleyball at Texas but decommitted towards the end of the 2024 calendar year. She took her official visit at the end of the season and ended up playing every match of her freshman campaign in 2025.

#6 CALIFORNIA CLARK: Third-year outside hitter **Izzy Clark** joins a recent pipeline of Hoosiers joining the program from California. She was a first team All-WCC selection in both seasons at San Diego after being the 2024 WCC Freshman of the Year. She played her high school ball at powerhouse Mater Dei and was also briefly a club teammate of Sade Ilawole during her younger days.

CHARTING THE AIRD ERA

• Head coach **Steve Aird** was named the head coach of Indiana Volleyball on Dec. 27, 2017 following four seasons rebuilding the Maryland program. Before that, he was prominently known as elite recruiter for legendary head coach Russ Rose at Penn State.

• Aird inherited an IU team that went 1-19 in the Big Ten in 2017 and finished 13 out of 14 programs in the conference. The Hoosiers were swept 14 times in league play the year before he arrived.

• When Aird arrived in Bloomington, the transfer portal wasn't what it was today. The roster stayed mostly in tact from the season before. He led the Hoosiers to a winning record (16-15) and finished on the outside of the NCAA tournament bubble.

• Since taking over the program, the world of college athletics has completely changed. His first full recruiting class was scheduled to arrive for the 2020 season - a season that never fully happened.

• Following a tough 2021 calendar year - where most Big Ten schools had fifth-year seniors, Aird made adjustments to his staff. He hired Rachel Morris and Spencer McLachlin as assistant coaches. He added Kevin Hodge in 2023 to replace McLachlin. Matt Kearns was added in 2024.

• In 2022, the fruits of Aird's work began to take shape. Following a European tour with a roster full of his players, the Hoosiers began to turn into a competitive force in the Big Ten.

• Over the last four years, IU has gone 77-51 overall and 40-15 at Wilkinson Hall. It has won 42 Big Ten games during that stretch, the most in a four-year span in program history. With top-15 recruiting classes on the way in 2026 and 2027, Aird has the program on the right track.

• Aird signed a contract extension through the 2031 season after guiding IU to a 25-win campaign in 2025 and a trip to the NCAA regional semifinals. The Hoosiers had two All-Americans and four All-Big Ten selections during his eighth season at the helm of the program.

• Prior to Aird arriving as head coach, the program was in a bad spot. The Hoosiers played off campus and had very little student support. Below is a list of things that Aird has flipped during his time in Bloomington.

IMPORTANT WINS IN THE AIRD ERA

Indiana has picked up some fantastic wins over the last eight seasons. All of them have had an impact in getting the program back to the NCAA Tournament during the 2025 season.

Below, we take a look back at some of the best wins of the Steve Aird era. Most of them have come in the last four seasons as the program has taken a jump to the next level.

W, 3-0: vs. #24 Colorado - Dec. 5, 2025

- In front of a fantastic crowd at Wilkinson Hall, IU swept fifth-seeded Colorado to advance to the Sweet 16 for the second time in program history. Senior outside hitter Candela Alonso-Corcelles had 16 kills in the win.

W, 3-0: at #19 Penn State - Nov. 2, 2025

- For the first time in program history, the Hoosiers beat Penn State on the road in State College. For Steve Aird, it was the first time beating his alma mater as a head coach. IU was ranked No. 18 after the weekend.

W, 3-1: vs. #15 Purdue - Oct. 11, 2023

- IU broke a long losing streak to in-state foe rival with a 3-1 victory on the Big Ten Network in front of a sold-out Wilkinson Hall. It was Aird's first win over the Boilermakers as IU head coach and kickstarted a 21-win season.

W, 3-2: at #5 Ohio State - Nov. 20, 2022

- At the time, IU picked up its biggest road win in program history. The Hoosiers beat No. 5 Ohio State in Columbus behind a fantastic performance from setter Camryn Haworth. The victory helped recruiting momentum that summer in Bloomington.

W, 3-2: at #15 Kentucky - Sept. 14, 2019

- The Hoosiers went down to Lexington to pick up the first ranked win of his IU career. Breana Edwards had 20 kills in the victory while the team picked up 17 blocks. It was the statement win that Aird needed.

On top of success in Bloomington, **13** different players have graduated from IU and gone on to play at least one season of professional volleyball. That list includes former outside hitter Candela Alonso-Corcelles, IU's first ever draft pick in Major League Volleyball.

• A deliberate use of the transfer portal and strong prep recruiting has been the key to getting IU's program back among the national ranks. Head coach Steve Aird is about the development and relationships in the program but has used the transfer portal to fill big areas of need during each season.

• More often than not, those transfers end up developing to a whole new level during their time in Bloomington. That includes the likes of All-Big Ten talents Avry Tatum and Kaley Rammelsberg.

An exciting chapter began for Indiana University Athletics in the 2018-19 school year as IU unveiled a new, state-of-the-art, 3,000-seat facility - Wilkinson Hall.

Wilkinson Hall is a multi-use training and performance center that is the new home venue for the Indiana Volleyball and Wrestling programs. One of the earliest volleyball specific arenas in the country, athletes and coaches have unlimited access to practice time and resources few schools in the country can provide.

Consistent with the university's master plan, the facility brings these two programs' home competitions back onto the IU Athletics campus from their former University Gymnasium home at the intersection of 10th Street and the 45/46 bypass.

In addition, Wilkinson Hall will provide the entire Indiana University Athletic Department and its programs with a new top-flight facility for year-round training, and will serve as a venue to host department and university events.

Wilkinson Hall is named after IU alumnus Jay Wilkinson and his family, who have an incredible history of support for IU Athletics and its student-athletes.

Indiana Volleyball played its first official matches in Wilkinson Hall during the 2019 campaign and has played there every year since. In 2019, the opening year of Wilkinson Hall, the Hoosiers were 15th in the NCAA in attendance, the highest the team has ever been in program history.

Following a condensed COVID-19 season in 2020-21, fan support for IU volleyball has continued to grow in the years following the pandemic.

The Hoosiers averaged over 1,300+ fans per season in 2022 and 2023. Matches against Purdue and Nebraska in 2023 were completely sold-out. The match with the Boilermakers, broadcasted on Big Ten Network, saw 2,725 fans in attendance.

IU has rebroken the Wilkinson Hall attendance program record in each of the past three seasons in matches against Purdue. The top four biggest crowds in the gym's history have come in the past three campaigns.

The Hoosiers have beaten two ranked opponents since opening the doors to Wilkinson Hall in 2019. In 2025, IU hosted the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament on its home floor. Nearly 2,000 fans watched IU dominate Colorado to advance to the regional semifinals for the first time since 2010.

Rachel Morris completed her fourth season with the Indiana Volleyball program in 2025. She has served as the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator since July 1, 2023.

Programmed with a desire to develop student-athletes on and off the court, Morris helped implement daily meditation, conversations about mental health and group-bonding activities upon arrival to Bloomington in 2022. Morris was also named to Volleyball Magazine's Under 40 College Coaching Hotshots list in 2023.

Morris, handed the keys to the team's offensive gameplan when she arrived at IU, has turned IU into one of the most effective offensives in the country. The Hoosiers finished with a top-20 national hitting percentage in 2025 (.281) - a mark that smashed a single-season program record.

In the four seasons that Morris has served as a coach in Bloomington, IU has won 77 games overall and 42 matches in the Big Ten. Both of those marks are program records in a four-year span. She has coached two All-American setters - Camryn Haworth (2023) and Teodora Kričković (2025 - over the last three years.

In 2025, Morris helped IU run the fastest pace in the entire country. All six players that played in a primary attacking role achieved career highs in hitting percentage. Middle blocker Victoria Gray (.378) finished second in a single season in program history in hitting efficiency.

Morris and assistant coach Kevin Hodge are engaged to be married. The couple lives in Bloomington with her dog, Kona.

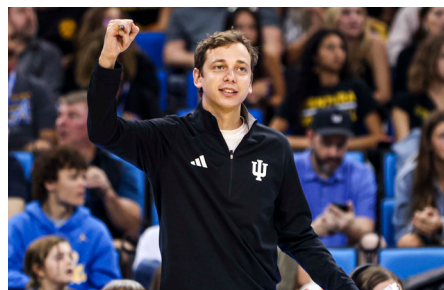
Kevin Hodge completed his third season as an assistant coach in Bloomington in 2025. A longtime friend, teammate and co-worker of head coach Steve Aird, he was named an assistant coach for Indiana volleyball on July 6, 2023.

Hodge spends time working with the team's defensive gameplan and in-game serving strategy. Over his three seasons in Bloomington, the Hoosiers have racked up 618 aces including 122 from All-American Camryn Haworth. The Fishers, Indiana native went on to break the program's all-time aces record (213) as a senior in 2024.

The Hoosiers were extremely efficient from the end line in 2025. Five different players had at least 20 aces, led by freshman Teodora Kričković with 38. IU finished with 192 aces in 2025 and only 233 service errors. On five occasions, IU had double-digit aces in a contest.

IU welcomed in a completely new cohort of back row players in 2025. Three freshmen helped anchor the libero jersey including Audrey Jackson. She became the team's primary ball handler in the libero jersey and racked up 193 digs while passing above a 2.10 on the season. Freshman outside hitter Jaidyn Jager led the team with 249 digs and passed at an elite level. Avery Freeman (119 digs) and Hannah Leftridge (67) each spent time in the jersey as well.

In the three seasons that Hodge has been at IU, it has racked up 61 wins overall and 33 conference wins. The Hoosiers have gone 33-9 (.786) at Wilkinson Hall during that span, winning 10+ home matches in three-straight years for the first time since 1998-2000.



ASSISTANT COACH • MATT KEARNS

3rd Season • Xavier ("17)

Matt Kearns was named as the third assistant coach for the Indiana volleyball program on July 29, 2024. He joins the staff after spending time with three different division one programs, including two in the Midwest. Kearns completed his second season with IU in 2025.

Kearns, known for his work in volleyball analytics and game preparation, comes to Bloomington after spending the 2023 season as the head coach at Louisiana-Monroe. Before his time with the Warhawks, Kearns spent six years at Northern Kentucky as a graduate assistant (2017-18) and an assistant coach (2019-22).

In his second year with the program, IU developed an impressive trio of middle blockers. Freshman middle blocker Victoria Gray became the fourth first-year player in program history to record 100 blocks in a season. Sophomore Ella Boersema was the Big Ten's leading blocker (1.40 per set) before sustaining a season-ending injury in October.

Kearns remained in charge of IU's scouting report for a record-setting 2025 season. The Hoosiers picked up 16 sweeps as part of a single-season record 25 wins. IU advanced to the regional semifinals for the first time since 2010 and had four All-Big Ten selections and two AVCA All-Americans.

The first season for Kearns in Bloomington in 2024 saw the Hoosiers pick up 15 wins overall and end the season winning three of four matches in the Big Ten. Kearns worked closely with the team's scouting report and helped IU's players with in-game blocking and defensive adjustments.
