#### **Inside The Series**

#### **Scouting The Opponent**

- Clemson posted a 25-27 overall record to mark the first losing season for the Tigers in over 60 years. The last time a Clemson team posted a losing season was 1957 (6-12).
- Players who accounted for 42 percent of the starts in the field during the 2021 season return in 2022.
- · Caden Grice, a Freshman All-American and second-team All-ACC pick, returns after leading the team in RBIs (53), home runs (15) and on-base percentage (.427). The left-handed hitter finished No. 2 on the team with a .317 batting average as a freshman.
- Dylan Brewer also posted a double-digit home run season in 2021 with 10. He drove in 31 RBIs and tied for a teamhigh with six stolen bases.
- Mack Anglin led the Clemson starting pitchers with a 3.99 ERA over 56 1/3 innings of work. He held opponents to a .227 batting average against and struck out 75 to 33 walks.

#### **Series Notes**

- Indiana will meet Clemson for the first time in program history when the two teams meet to open the 2022 season.
- Of the current alignment of the conference, IU has met 10 of the 13 ACC institutions that sponsor baseball, with Clemson marking the 11th member to join IU record books.
- North Carolina and Virginia are the two programs IU has not met on the diamond, while Syracuse dropped baseball in 1972.
- The first meeting against the current alignment of the conference came versus Notre Dame in 1901. The Fighting Irish are also the most common opponent with 99 meetings.
- Louisville is the next most played opponent at 53 games.
- In the last 20 meetings against ACC programs, Indiana holds a 13-7 mark in those contests.

The first three seasons of Jeff Mercer's tenure have been unprecedented for various reasons. The Indiana native is prepared to get the Hoosiers back into the NCAA Tournament for a second time during his tenure.

Mercer joined IU coaching legend Everett Dean as the only IU coaches to win a Big Ten title in their first year as a head coach in 2019 and headed to the NCAA Louisville Regional. The 2020 season was then cut short due to a global pandemic and 2021 featured the first conference-only slate in Big Ten history.

Mercer brought a winning background to Indiana. In his time as a head coach (2017-18) and an assistant coach (2014-16) at Wright State, he has been a part of three Horizon League regular season and conference tournament titles, three NCAA appearances, and a combined record of 199-92 (.684). The Raiders won four NCAA tournament games over those three appearances, having reached the regional finals twice.

The conference-only slate of 2021 produced just the second 20-plus win Big Ten effort in program history (2014) and a school-record 26 wins against B1G opponents. Twice during the season the Hoosiers won eight of nine games, including eight straight games after dropping the season opener. Grant Richardson was a first-team All-Big Ten pick, while Gabe Bierman (second team), McCade Brown (second team) and Cole Barr (third team) also earned all-conference honors.

In the Major League Baseball Draft, the Hoosiers saw its three weekend starting pitchers, closer and top two RBI producers selected. With four picks in the first 10 rounds, the 2021 edition marked the second time in program history that four Hoosiers were taken in the top 10 rounds (2009).

In the shortened 2020 season, Mercer led the Hoosiers to a 9-6 record overall. Indiana recorded three road victories over ranked teams, beating No. 11 LSU, No. 30 South Alabama and No. 17 East Carolina. IU also defeated in-state rival Purdue, 17-2.

Individually, Richardson posted a .424 batting average with three doubles, two triples, five home runs, 17 RBI and 21 runs scored over 15 games. The sophomore led the Big Ten in runs scored, home runs, slugging percentage and total bases. He finished among the top 20 nationally in runs per game (No. 5), total bases (No. 11), slugging percentage (No. 12) and RBIs (No. 19).

In his first season as head coach, Mercer led the Hoosiers to the 2019 Big Ten regular season title and earned Big Ten Coach of the Year. The conference title was the seventh in program history for IU and the first since 2014.

The Bargersville, Indiana, native became the first Big Ten head coach since 1982 (John Anderson, Minnesota) to win a regular season conference title in their first season as the skipper. He became just the second coach in IU history — any sport, men's or women's — to win an outright Big Ten championship in his or her first year. Everett Dean (1924-25) did it in baseball in his first year at the helm.

Indiana earned the No. 2 seed in the NCAA Louisville Regional and finished the season with an overall record of 37-23 and a Big Ten mark of 17-7. A school-record 10 Hoosiers were selected in the 2019 MLB Draft, led by outfield Matt Gorski. The highest drafted Hoosier since Kyle Schwarber (No. 4 overall) in 2014, Gorski was picked in the second round (57th overall) by the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Pitcher Andrew Saalfrank was named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and earned a spot on the All-Big Ten first team along with utility player Matt Lloyd. Scotty Bradley, Cole Barr and Gorski each made the second team. Elijah Dunham rounded out the all-conference honors with a third-team selection.

The first former student-athlete to be named head coach of the baseball program, Mercer led Wright State for two seasons and amassed 77 victories. In his two seasons at the helm, WSU won nearly 70 percent of its games and averaged 38.5 wins per season. The 2018 Horizon League Coach of the Year, the Raidew won the regular season and conference tournament title in the 2018 to earn a spot in the NCAA Stanford Regional. In 2017, Mercer's squad earned the programs first-ever national ranking.

The 2018 Horizon League champions, Wright State won eight of its last 10 games and 15 of its last 19 to close the season. The Raiders grabbed the tournament title with three-straight wins and outscored opponents 32-11 during the run. With a 39-17 overall record and a 22-6 league mark, WSU ranked No. 8 in the country in scoring (7.8 rpg) and stolen bases (110) and was No. 21 in on-base percentage (.394). The Raiders' .979 fielding percentage was No. 10 nationally.

Wright State was led by Horizon League Player of the Year Gabe Snyder, who paced the conference in home runs (15) and RBI (73), and was second in batting average (.359), missing the league's Triple Crown by one batting average point. Snyder was one of 11 Raiders who earned all-league honors, including first team honorees (Snyder, Matt Morrow, Chase Slone, Peyton Burdkick and Ryan Weiss), four second teamers (Seth Gray, JD Orr, Zane Harris and Derek Hendrixson) and two named to the freshman team (Harris and Quincy Hamilton).

Wright State saw three players drafted in the 2018 MLB Draft, each taken in the first 21 rounds, led by Weiss in the fourth round by the Arizona Diamondbacks (129th overall). Caleb Sampen (20th round) was picked by the Los Angeles Dodgers and Snyder (21st round) went to the Minnesota Twins.

Known for his strength as a recruiter, Mercer and his staff helped Wright State compiled its first-ever top 100 ranked recruiting class. The 2018 signing class was ranked 87th nationally.

WSU received its first-ever top 25 ranking in 2017 and finished the year at 38-21 and 21-9 in league action. Mercer's aggressiveness in the run game resulted in Wright State ranking No. 2 nationally with 130 stolen bases.

Weiss was selected as the 2017 Horizon League Freshman of the Year and first-team all-league along with Morrow. Pitcher Danny Sexton was named a second-team All-Horizon League along with Hendrixson and Gray. Both Weiss earned Freshman All-American and second-team ABCA All-Midwest selection.

Mercer, who was a two-time All-Horizon League honoree in 2008 and 2009, returned to the Raiders as an assistant coach in 2013 and promptly helped WSU set a then-school record for wins (43) in 2015. The Raiders followed that up with a program-record 46 victories.

He assisted then-head coach Greg Lovelady, who is now the head coach at UCF, and coached six players that were taken in the MLB Draft, including five in 2016. During Mercer's three years as an assistant, the Raiders had 30 All-Horizon League honorees, two Horizon League regular season and tournament titles and two NCAA appearances.

The program's recruiting coordinator, Mercer brought in a wealth of talent to one of the premier mid-major programs in the country. He also excelled in his role as hitting coach, with 47 home runs in 2016, its most in a season since 2009

Prior to the return to his alma mater, Mercer spent two seasons as a volunteer assistant coach at Western Kentucky University (2012-13). While with the Hilltoppers, he worked with pitchers and outfielders, and was also instrumental in the development and organization of the programs camps.

His first Division I experience came at the University of Michigan as the volunteer assistant coach in 2011. During his time with the Wolverines, he worked with the catchers and outfielders.

Before his arrival in Ann Arbor, Mercer spent the 2010 season as the graduate assistant coach at Ohio Northern University where he was in charge of the infielders and hitters and was the recruiting coordinator.

As a student-athlete, Mercer began his career at the University of Dayton before transferring to Wright State. He was a two-time first team All-Horizon League honoree at first base and was named to third-team All-America in 2009 after hitting 357 with 26 doubles and 74 RBI. The Horizon League Player of the Year in 2009, he tied the WSU single-season record for RBIs, doubles, games played and games started to help the Raiders to the NCAA Fort Worth Regional.

#### **News and Notes**

#### **Opening Day Notes**

- Indiana will open the 128th year of baseball against its 341st all-time opponent. Overall, IU owns a 77-49-1 record on Opening Day.
- The latest season opener came on June 7, 1922 against Purdue, while the earliest IU opened a season was on February 6, 1998 versus Kansas State in Phoenix, Arizona.
- The longest winning streak was a 12-game stretch from 1939-50, which was part of a 20-game unbeaten streak that spanned from 1931-50. IU won seven straight, before tying DePauw in 1938.
- Since site data for games became available in 1965,
   IU's record in those 57 games break down like this:

Home 12-3 Away 9-15 Neutral Site 8-10

 IU has won four of its last five true road openers, with the only loss coming at No. 11 LSU to start the 2020 campaign.

#### **New Faces Around the Diamond**

- Of the nine Hoosiers that started 50 percent of the games in the field last season (22 or 44 games), just two return for the 2022 campaign.
- Morgan Colopy (33 starts) leads all returners, while Kip Fougerousse (28 starts) also reached the threshold.
- Outside of Colopy and Fougerousse, Indiana returns just 30 starts in the field, with **Hunter Jessee** (11) and **Samuel Murrison** (10) the only with doublefigure starts.

#### Transfer Time

- While Indiana has a nice blend of true freshmen and transfer student-athletes, it looks as if the transfer's experience will help IU early in the season.
- Of the eight transfers, six are contending for starting spots on opening weekend.
- The duo of Matthew Ellis (Walters State C.C.) and Peter Serruto (Rutgers) have proved to be steady behind the plate, while Jack Perkins (Louisville) and Bradley Brehmer (Wright State) are each poised to help in a big way on the mound.
- The middle infield tandem of Tyler Doanes (West Virginia) and Phillip Glasser (Youngstown State) have each settled in during the offseason and will look to create one of the top double play tandems in the Big Ten.

#### Freshman Poised to Make an Impact

- Of the 18 newcomers to the Indiana roster this season, 10 of those join from the high school ranks.
- The quartet of Ryan Gilbert, Luke Hayden, Carter Mathison and Brock Tibbitts have each earned preseason honors from various publications entering the year.

#### **Schedule Notes**

- Indiana will add three new opponents to the all-time ledger this season. Each of the first three weekends will add a new opponent, as IU will meet Clemson, Louisiana-Lafayette and Missouri State for the initial meeting.
- Getting back into non-conference play after a conference-only slate in 2021, Indiana will have one lengthy home stand (11 straight) and one long stretch of consecutive road games (nine straight).
- Moreover, the two stretches come back-to-back as IU hosts 11 straight games from march 15-April 3 and then hits the road for nine straight from April 5-20.
- In the last seven Big Ten seasons, Indiana has opened on the road five times (2015-18, 21), with the 2019 and 2022 conference seasons starting at home. IU will host Northwester April 1-3, 2022.

#### Six Hoosiers Drafted in 2021

- As the Major League Baseball Draft moved to 20 rounds in 2021, the Hoosiers' profile with professional baseball continued to steamroll ahead with six student-athletes drafted.
- The first four were all taken in the first 10 rounds, marking the second time in program history IU saw four players go in before the start of the 11th round.
- All three weekend starters McCade Brown (3rd round), Gabe Bierman (7th round) and Tommy Sommer (10th round) were taken, while closer Matt Litwicki (10th round) was also selected.
- Positionally, third baseman Cole Barr (15th round) and center fielder Grant Richardson (17th round) were also selected.
- Catcher Collin Hopkins (Minnesota) and Braden Scott (Toronto) were each signed as undrafted free agents, as well.
