Inside The Series

Scouting The Opponent

- Miami (Ohio) took one of three games last weekend against Rider at home and is now 3-3 on the season.
- The RedHawks offense has been potent early in the season, as it has produced 26 extra base hits, which includes six home runs.
- Along with the extra base hits, MU has 36 walks and five hit-by-pitch to account for a .418 on-base percentage. On the base paths, Miami has stolen 13-of-16 bases through six games.
- The pitching staff is limiting the opposition to a .265 batting average and 6.8 runs per game through six games.
- Cole Andrews leads the team with eight runs scored and eight RBIs. Of his 11 hits, eight have gone for extra bases, which includes two home runs.
- On the early season, Miami (Ohio) has used 12 pitchers, with nine of them giving up multiple runs on the season.
 Only Luke Leverton, Nick Demonica and Ryan Starr are unscored upon.

Series Notes

- Indiana and Miami (Ohio) will meet for the 79th time in program history. IU owns a 41-37 edge in the all-time series which began in 1931.
- The two teams last met during the 2014 season, when IU claimed its fourth straight win in the series, 16-1, in Oxford.
- The last four meetings and six of the last eight have come at McKie Field at Hayden Park on the Miami University campus.
- Over the last 25 meetings, Indiana owns a slim13-12 edge against Miami (Ohio).
- The longest winning streak in the series belongs to Indiana at 11 games from 1955-69. Ten of those 11 games were played in Bloomington.
- The RedHawks own the most recent winning spurt, as they won seven straight games from 2008-2012.

The first three seasons of Jeff Mercer's tenure have been unprecedented for various reasons. The Indiana native is prepared to get the Hoosiers back into the NCAA Tournament for a second time during his tenure.

Mercer joined IU coaching legend Everett Dean as the only IU coaches to win a Big Ten title in their first year as a head coach in 2019 and headed to the NCAA Louisville Regional. The 2020 season was then cut short due to a global pandemic and 2021 featured the first conference-only slate in Big Ten history.

Mercer brought a winning background to Indiana. In his time as a head coach (2017-18) and an assistant coach (2014-16) at Wright State, he has been a part of three Horizon League regular season and conference tournament titles, three NCAA appearances, and a combined record of 199-92 (.684). The Raiders won four NCAA tournament games over those three appearances, having reached the regional finals twice.

The conference-only slate of 2021 produced just the second 20-plus win Big Ten effort in program history (2014) and a school-record 26 wins against B1G opponents. Twice during the season the Hoosiers won eight of nine games, including eight straight games after dropping the season opener. Grant Richardson was a first-team All-Big Ten pick, while Gabe Bierman (second team), McCade Brown (second team) and Cole Barr (third team) also earned all-conference honors.

In the Major League Baseball Draft, the Hoosiers saw its three weekend starting pitchers, closer and top two RBI producers selected. With four picks in the first 10 rounds, the 2021 edition marked the second time in program history that four Hoosiers were taken in the top 10 rounds (2009).

In the shortened 2020 season, Mercer led the Hoosiers to a 9-6 record overall. Indiana recorded three road victories over ranked teams, beating No. 11 LSU, No. 30 South Alabama and No. 17 East Carolina. IU also defeated in-state rival Purdue, 17-2.

Individually, Richardson posted a .424 batting average with three doubles, two triples, five home runs, 17 RBI and 21 runs scored over 15 games. The sophomore led the Big Ten in runs scored, home runs, slugging percentage and total bases. He finished among the top 20 nationally in runs per game (No. 5), total bases (No. 11), slugging percentage (No. 12) and RBIs (No. 19).

In his first season as head coach, Mercer led the Hoosiers to the 2019 Big Ten regular season title and earned Big Ten Coach of the Year. The conference title was the seventh in program history for IU and the first since 2014.

The Bargersville, Indiana, native became the first Big Ten head coach since 1982 (John Anderson, Minnesota) to win a regular season conference title in their first season as the skipper. He became just the second coach in IU history — any sport, men's or women's — to win an outright Big Ten championship in his or her first year. Everett Dean (1924-25) did it in baseball in his first year at the helm.

Indiana earned the No. 2 seed in the NCAA Louisville Regional and finished the season with an overall record of 37-23 and a Big Ten mark of 17-7. A school-record 10 Hoosiers were selected in the 2019 MLB Draft, led by outfield Matt Gorski. The highest drafted Hoosier since Kyle Schwarber (No. 4 overall) in 2014, Gorski was picked in the second round (57th overall) by the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Pitcher Andrew Saalfrank was named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and earned a spot on the All-Big Ten first team along with utility player Matt Lloyd. Scotty Bradley, Cole Barr and Gorski each made the second team. Elijah Dunham rounded out the all-conference honors with a third-team selection.

The first former student-athlete to be named head coach of the baseball program, Mercer led Wright State for two seasons and amassed 77 victories. In his two seasons at the helm, WSU won nearly 70 percent of its games and averaged 38.5 wins per season. The 2018 Horizon League Coach of the Year, the Raidew won the regular season and conference tournament title in the 2018 to earn a spot in the NCAA Stanford Regional. In 2017, Mercer's squad earned the programs first-ever national ranking.

The 2018 Horizon League champions, Wright State won eight of its last 10 games and 15 of its last 19 to close the season. The Raiders grabbed the tournament title with three-straight wins and outscored opponents 32-11 during the run. With a 39-17 overall record and a 22-6 league mark, WSU ranked No. 8 in the country in scoring (7.8 rpg) and stolen bases (110) and was No. 21 in on-base percentage (.394). The Raiders' .979 fielding percentage was No. 10 nationally.

Wright State was led by Horizon League Player of the Year Gabe Snyder, who paced the conference in home runs (15) and RBI (73), and was second in batting average (.359), missing the league's Triple Crown by one batting average point. Snyder was one of 11 Raiders who earned all-league honors, including first team honorees (Snyder, Matt Morrow, Chase Slone, Peyton Burdkick and Ryan Weiss), four second teamers (Seth Gray, JD Orr, Zane Harris and Derek Hendrixson) and two named to the freshman team (Harris and Quincy Hamilton).

Wright State saw three players drafted in the 2018 MLB Draft, each taken in the first 21 rounds, led by Weiss in the fourth round by the Arizona Diamondbacks (129th overall). Caleb Sampen (20th round) was picked by the Los Angeles Dodgers and Snyder (21st round) went to the Minnesota Twins.

Known for his strength as a recruiter, Mercer and his staff helped Wright State compiled its first-ever top 100 ranked recruiting class. The 2018 signing class was ranked 87th nationally.

WSU received its first-ever top 25 ranking in 2017 and finished the year at 38-21 and 21-9 in league action. Mercer's aggressiveness in the run game resulted in Wright State ranking No. 2 nationally with 130 stolen bases.

Weiss was selected as the 2017 Horizon League Freshman of the Year and first-team all-league along with Morrow. Pitcher Danny Sexton was named a second-team All-Horizon League along with Hendrixson and Gray. Both Weiss earned Freshman All-American and second-team ABCA All-Midwest selection.

Mercer, who was a two-time All-Horizon League honoree in 2008 and 2009, returned to the Raiders as an assistant coach in 2013 and promptly helped WSU set a then-school record for wins (43) in 2015. The Raiders followed that up with a program-record 46 victories.

He assisted then-head coach Greg Lovelady, who is now the head coach at UCF, and coached six players that were taken in the MLB Draft, including five in 2016. During Mercer's three years as an assistant, the Raiders had 30 All-Horizon League honorees, two Horizon League regular season and tournament titles and two NCAA appearances.

The program's recruiting coordinator, Mercer brought in a wealth of talent to one of the premier mid-major programs in the country. He also excelled in his role as hitting coach, with 47 home runs in 2016, its most in a season since 2009

Prior to the return to his alma mater, Mercer spent two seasons as a volunteer assistant coach at Western Kentucky University (2012-13). While with the Hilltoppers, he worked with pitchers and outfielders, and was also instrumental in the development and organization of the programs camps.

His first Division I experience came at the University of Michigan as the volunteer assistant coach in 2011. During his time with the Wolverines, he worked with the catchers and outfielders.

Before his arrival in Ann Arbor, Mercer spent the 2010 season as the graduate assistant coach at Ohio Northern University where he was in charge of the infielders and hitters and was the recruiting coordinator.

As a student-athlete, Mercer began his career at the University of Dayton before transferring to Wright State. He was a two-time first team All-Horizon League honoree at first base and was named to third-team All-America in 2009 after hitting 357 with 26 doubles and 74 RBI. The Horizon League Player of the Year in 2009, he tied the WSU single-season record for RBIs, doubles, games played and games started to help the Raiders to the NCAA Fort Worth Regional.

Bobby's World

- Redshirt-sophomore Bobby Whalen hit .429 (6-for-14) with one run scored and one RBI in the opening weekend at Clemson.
- He followed that with three more hits on the weekend at the Karbach Round Rock Classic and enters the week with a .391 average to lead the team.
- Hitting in the three spot in the lineup, Whalen is 5-for-5 in stolen bases and leads the team in doubles (3) and RBIs (4).
- He also robbed Clemson designated hitter Billy Amick of a home run in the second inning of the series finale.

New Faces Around the Diamond

- Of the nine Hoosiers that started 50 percent of the games in the field last season (22 or 44 games), just two return for the 2022 campaign.
- Morgan Colopy (33 starts) leads all returners, while Kip Fougerousse (28 starts) also reached the threshold.
- Outside of Colopy and Fougerousse, Indiana returned just 30 starts in the field, with **Hunter Jessee** (11) and **Samuel Murrison** (10) the only with doublefigure starts.

Transfer Time

- While Indiana has a nice blend of true freshmen and transfer student-athletes, the experience of the transfers was on full display opening weekend.
- Of the eight transfers, seven made appearances with five earning at least one start.
- The duo of Matthew Ellis and Peter Serruto split time behind the plage, with Ellis hitting his first home run in the cream and crimson in the middle game of the series at Clemson.
- Jack Perkins struck out eight over 3 2/3 innings of work in a start of the middle game in the series.
 Allowed three runs on four hits and walked two.
- The middle infield tandem of Tyler Doanes and Phillip Glasser provided the 1-2 punch in the lineup, as the duo held down the top two spots in the order and each hit their first home runs at IU.

Freshman Make an Impact

- Of the 18 newcomers to the Indiana roster this season, 10 of those join from the high school ranks.
- The quartet of Ryan Gilbert, Luke Hayden, Carter Mathison and Brock Tibbitts have each earned preseason honors from various publications entering the year.

- On the opening weekend of the season, seven freshmen saw the field and all contributed in different ways
- A trio of pitchers saw time, with Hayden, Grant Holderfield and Ryan Kraft each making relief appearances.
- At the plate, Evan Goforth, Mathison, Josh Pyne and Tlbbitts each saw time, with the final three earning starts in the season-opening series.

Schedule Notes

- Indiana will add three new opponents to the all-time ledger this season. Each of the first three weekends will add a new opponent, as IU will meet Clemson, Louisiana-Lafayette and Missouri State for the initial contest.
- Getting back into non-conference play after a conference-only slate in 2021, Indiana will have one lengthy home stand (11 straight) and one long stretch of consecutive road games (nine straight).
- Moreover, the two stretches come back-to-back as IU hosts 11 straight games from March 15-April 3 and then hits the road for nine straight from April 5-20.
- In the last seven Big Ten seasons, Indiana has opened on the road five times (2015-18, 21), with the 2019 and 2022 conference seasons starting at home. IU will host Northwester April 1-3, 2022.

Six Hoosiers Drafted in 2021

- As the Major League Baseball Draft moved to 20 rounds in 2021, the Hoosiers' profile with professional baseball continued to steamroll ahead with six student-athletes drafted.
- The first four were all taken in the first 10 rounds, marking the second time in program history IU saw four players go in before the start of the 11th round.
- All three weekend starters McCade Brown (3rd round), Gabe Bierman (7th round) and Tommy Sommer (10th round) were taken, while closer Matt Litwicki (10th round) was also selected.
- Positionally, third baseman Cole Barr (15th round) and center fielder Grant Richardson (17th round) were also selected.
- Catcher Collin Hopkins (Minnesota) and Braden Scott (Toronto) were each signed as undrafted free agents, as well.
