### **Inside The Series**

#### **Scouting The Opponent**

- Kentucky enters with a 14-3 overall record and is 7-2 over its last nine games with a series win over TCU and a series sweep of High Point.
- Two of the Wildcats three losses have come in the midweek, with Western Kentucky and Ohio defeating the Wildcats
- After starting the season with a three-game road series, UK has played its last 14 games at home. The Wildcats will play four straight on the road starting on Tuesday at Bart Kaufman Field.
- Chase Estep enters the week hitting .476 with 25 runs, 30 hits and 21 RBIs on the season. He has walked 14 times to just eight strikeouts, and owns a team-best seven home runs and six stolen bases.
- As a team, Kentucky is tied for the national lead in hits (164) and is No. 24 nationally in runs scored (9.3).
- The pitching staff is No. 20 in the NCAA in strikeouts per nine inning (11.2).

#### **Series Notes**

- The midweek contest with the Wildcats will mark the 44th all-time meeting between Indiana and Kentucky.
- It's a series that dates back to the 1903 season, when the two programs split a pair of meetings. They met seven times between 1903 and 1920 and didn't play again until 1974.
- The longest winning streak in the series belongs to Kentucky at six games from April 19, 1977-April 22, 1981. Indiana preceded those six wins with five straight victories in the series from May 11, 1920-April 1, 1975.
- Of the 44 all-time meetings, 10 of them have been played at neutral sites.

# 22 | Jeff Mercer

Fourth Season at Indiana Sixth Season as a Head Coach *Wright State, 2009* 





The first three seasons of Jeff Mercer's tenure have been unprecedented for various reasons. The Indiana native is prepared to get the Hoosiers back into the NCAA Tournament for a second time during his tenure.

Mercer joined IU coaching legend Everett Dean as the only IU coaches to win a Big Ten title in their first year as a head coach in 2019 and headed to the NCAA Louisville Regional. The 2020 season was then cut short due to a global pandemic and 2021 featured the first conference-only slate in Big Ten history.

Mercer brought a winning background to Indiana. In his time as a head coach (2017-18) and an assistant coach (2014-16) at Wright State, he has been a part of three Horizon League regular season and conference tournament titles, three NCAA appearances, and a combined record of 199-92 (.684). The Raiders won four NCAA tournament games over those three appearances, having reached the regional finals twice.

The conference-only slate of 2021 produced just the second 20-plus win Big Ten effort in program history (2014) and a school-record 26 wins against B1G opponents. Twice during the season the Hoosiers won eight of nine games, including eight straight games after dropping the season opener. Grant Richardson was a first-team All-Big Ten pick, while Gabe Bierman (second team), McCade Brown (second team) and Cole Barr (third team) also earned all-conference honors.

In the Major League Baseball Draft, the Hoosiers saw its three weekend starting pitchers, closer and top two RBI producers selected. With four picks in the first 10 rounds, the 2021 edition marked the second time in program history that four Hoosiers were taken in the top 10 rounds (2009).

In the shortened 2020 season, Mercer led the Hoosiers to a 9-6 record overall. Indiana recorded three road victories over ranked teams, beating No. 11 LSU, No. 30 South Alabama and No. 17 East Carolina. IU also defeated in-state rival Purdue, 17-2.

Individually, Richardson posted a .424 batting average with three doubles, two triples, five home runs, 17 RBI and 21 runs scored over 15 games. The sophomore led the Big Ten in runs scored, home runs, slugging percentage and total bases. He finished among the top 20 nationally in runs per game (No. 5), total bases (No. 11), slugging percentage (No. 12) and RBIs (No. 19).

In his first season as head coach, Mercer led the Hoosiers to the 2019 Big Ten regular season title and earned Big Ten Coach of the Year. The conference title was the seventh in program history for IU and the first since 2014.

The Bargersville, Indiana, native became the first Big Ten head coach since 1982 (John Anderson, Minnesota) to win a regular season conference title in their first season as the skipper. He became just the second coach in IU history – any sport, men's or women's – to win an outright Big Ten championship in his or her first year. Everett Dean (1924-25) did it in baseball in his first year at the helm.

Indiana earned the No. 2 seed in the NCAA Louisville Regional and finished the season with an overall record of 37-23 and a Big Ten mark of 17-7. A school-record 10 Hoosiers were selected in the 2019 MLB Draft, led by outfield Matt Gorski. The highest drafted Hoosier since Kyle Schwarber (No. 4 overall) in 2014, Gorski was picked in the second round (57th overall) by the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Pitcher Andrew Saalfrank was named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and earned a spot on the All-Big Ten first team along with utility player Matt Lloyd. Scotty Bradley, Cole Barr and Gorski each made the second team. Elijah Dunham rounded out the all-conference honors with a third-team selection.

The first former student-athlete to be named head coach of the baseball program, Mercer led Wright State for two seasons and amassed 77 victories. In his two seasons at the helm, WSU won nearly 70 percent of its games and averaged 38.5 wins per season. The 2018 Horizon League Coach of the Year, the Raidew won the regular season and conference tournament title in the 2018 to earn a spot in the NCAA Stanford Regional. In 2017, Mercer's squad earned the programs first-ever national ranking.

The 2018 Horizon League champions, Wright State won eight of its last 10 games and 15 of its last 19 to close the season. The Raiders grabbed the tournament title with three-straight wins and outscored opponents 32-11 during the run. With a 39-17 overall record and a 22-6 league mark, WSU ranked No. 8 in the country in scoring (7.8 rpg) and stolen bases (110) and was No. 21 in on-base percentage (.394). The Raiders' .979 fielding percentage was No. 10 nationally.

Wright State was led by Horizon League Player of the Year Gabe Snyder, who paced the conference in home runs (15) and RBI (73), and was second in batting average (.359), missing the league's Triple Crown by one batting average point. Snyder was one of 11 Raiders who earned all-league honors, including first team honorees (Snyder, Matt Morrow, Chase Slone, Peyton Burdkick and Ryan Weiss), four second teamers (Seth Gray, JD Orr, Zane Harris and Derek Hendrixson) and two named to the freshman team (Harris and Quincy Hamilton).

Wright State saw three players drafted in the 2018 MLB Draft, each taken in the first 21 rounds, led by Weiss in the fourth round by the Arizona Diamondbacks (129th overall). Caleb Sampen (20th round) was picked by the Los Angeles Dodgers and Snyder (21st round) went to the Minnesota Twins.

Known for his strength as a recruiter, Mercer and his staff helped Wright State compiled its first-ever top 100 ranked recruiting class. The 2018 signing class was ranked 87th nationally.

WSU received its first-ever top 25 ranking in 2017 and finished the year at 38-21 and 21-9 in league action. Mercer's aggressiveness in the run game resulted in Wright State ranking No. 2 nationally with 130 stolen bases.

Weiss was selected as the 2017 Horizon League Freshman of the Year and first-team all-league along with Morrow. Pitcher Danny Sexton was named a second-team All-Horizon League along with Hendrixson and Gray. Both Weiss earned Freshman All-American and second-team ABCA All-Midwest selection.

Mercer, who was a two-time All-Horizon League honoree in 2008 and 2009, returned to the Raiders as an assistant coach in 2013 and promptly helped WSU set a then-school record for wins (43) in 2015. The Raiders followed that up with a program-record 46 victories.

He assisted then-head coach Greg Lovelady, who is now the head coach at UCF, and coached six players that were taken in the MLB Draft, including five in 2016. During Mercer's three years as an assistant, the Raiders had 30 All-Horizon League honorees, two Horizon League regular season and tournament titles and two NCAA appearances.

The program's recruiting coordinator, Mercer brought in a wealth of talent to one of the premier mid-major programs in the country. He also excelled in his role as hitting coach, with 47 home runs in 2016, its most in a season since 2009

Prior to the return to his alma mater, Mercer spent two seasons as a volunteer assistant coach at Western Kentucky University (2012-13). While with the Hilltoppers, he worked with pitchers and outfielders, and was also instrumental in the development and organization of the programs camps.

His first Division I experience came at the University of Michigan as the volunteer assistant coach in 2011. During his time with the Wolverines, he worked with the catchers and outfielders.

Before his arrival in Ann Arbor, Mercer spent the 2010 season as the graduate assistant coach at Ohio Northern University where he was in charge of the infielders and hitters and was the recruiting coordinator.

As a student-athlete, Mercer began his career at the University of Dayton before transferring to Wright State. He was a two-time first team All-Horizon League honoree at first base and was named to third-team All-America in 2009 after hitting 357 with 26 doubles and 74 RBI. The Horizon League Player of the Year in 2009, he tied the WSU single-season record for RBIs, doubles, games played and games started to help the Raiders to the NCAA Fort Worth Regional.

#### **News and Notes**

#### **Pyne Setting Roots**

- Josh Pyne started the first game of the season and his collegiate career - at third base in the season opener at Clemson.
- Through his first 10 games, Pyne had eight hits, one going for extra bases, and seven RBIs.
- Since March 8, Pyne has started to set roots in the lineup as he is hitting .500 (10-for-20) with three extra base hits and nine RBIs.
- In that stretch, Pyne hit his first two career home runs against Cincinnati (3/8) and Purdue Fort Wayne (3/9).

#### Ellis Providing the Power

- Redshirt-junior Matthew Ellis came from Walters State Community College where he 17 homer runs with 4 multi-home run games as a sophomore.
- Ellis has brought that power with him to Bloomington, as he is tied for the Big Ten lead at seven home runs after four weekends.
- The left-handed hitting catcher also has two multihomer games, coming at Missouri State and versus Purdue Fort Wayne.
- From March 1-6, Ellis hit .438 with 12 RBIs, six runs scored and seven hits over four games. He had five extra base hit, walked twice and was hit-by-pitch once.

#### **Doanes Doing Work**

- On the surface, Tyler Doanes' batting average is not what you would expect out of a leadoff hitter, but dig deeper and he has been a catalyst for IU this season.
- He has been on base in 12 of 15 games, and has been on base multiple times in 11 of those contests.
- His .164 average (9-of-55) is bolstered by 16 walks and one hit-by-pitch for a .361 on-base percentage.
- Assuming a 56-game season, Doanes is on pace for nearly 40 runs scored, 40 hits and 60 walks.

#### Tibbitts Takes Two Out

- In the season-opening win over Miami (Ohio), freshman Brock Tibbitts hit the first two home runs of his career.
- In all, Tibbitts drove in five RBIs and was on base three times in a start at first base.
- He is the first freshman since Grant Richardson in 2019 to hit multiple home runs in a game. Richardson hit three home runs at Maryland on March 30, 2019.

#### Perkins a Steady Hand

- Redshirt-sophomore Jack Perkins has made three starts in 2022 and each of them has built off the last
- After a season-opening start at Clemson (2/19) went just 3 2/3 innings, Perkins has given the Cream and Crimson at least five innings in his last three starts.
- The right-handed pitcher has won two of his last three starts and posted back-to-back quality starts at Missouri State (3/5) and Troy (3/11).
- He has fanned at least six batters in each of his four starts and allowed three-or-fewer runs in each of those outings.

#### **Staff Rounding Into Form**

- The pitching staff gave up 33 runs in a seasonopening series at Clemson, but over the last three weeks has started putting it together.
- On the opening weekend, IU's staff owned a 10.17 ERA, but in the 12 games since, Hoosier pitchers are sitting at a 4.90 ERA.
- In that span, a two-hit shutout of Cincinnati is the highlight. Against a Bearcat team that had hit 20 home runs in its first 11 games, IU allowed just two singles and didn't walk a batter.

#### **Schedule Notes**

- Indiana added three new opponents to the all-time ledger in each of the first three weekends of 2022.
   IU meet Clemson, Louisiana-Lafayette and Missouri State for its initial contest.
- Getting back into non-conference play after a conference-only slate in 2021, Indiana will have one lengthy home stand (11 straight) and one long stretch of consecutive road games (nine straight).
- Moreover, the two stretches come back-to-back as IU hosts 11 straight games from March 15-April 3 and then hits the road for nine straight from April 5-20.
- In the last seven Big Ten seasons, Indiana has opened on the road five times (2015-18, 21), with the 2019 and 2022 conference seasons starting at home. IU will host Northwester April 1-3, 2022.

#### Six Hoosiers Drafted in 2021

- As the Major League Baseball Draft moved to 20 rounds in 2021, the Hoosiers' profile with professional baseball continued to steamroll ahead with six student-athletes drafted.
- The first four were all taken in the first 10 rounds, marking the second time in program history IU saw four players go in before the start of the 11th round.
- All three weekend starters McCade Brown (3rd round), Gabe Bierman (7th round) and Tommy Sommer (10th round) were taken, while closer Matt Litwicki (10th round) was also selected.
- Positionally, third baseman Cole Barr (15th round) and center fielder Grant Richardson (17th round) were also selected.
- Catcher Collin Hopkins (Minnesota) and Braden Scott (Toronto) were each signed as undrafted free agents, as well.
