- Indiana and Illinois State will meet for the eighth time in program history and for the first time ever in Bloomington. IU holds a slip 4-3 edge in the all-time series.

Inside The Series

Scouting The Opponent

- Illinois State enters with a 19-27 overall record and 6-12 mark in Missouri Valley Conference play after dropping two of three games over the weekend at Missouri State.
- Centerfielder Ryan Cermak leads the MVC and is No. 36 nationally with a .702 slugging percentage, which is bolstered by his team-best 18 home runs. He also leads the team in hits (56), runs scored (43), walks (29) and on-base percentage (.439).
- Jake McCaw paces the program with 40 RBIs and his 55 hits, 37 runs scored and 12 home runs are No. 2 on the team.
- As a pitching staff, the Redbirds own a 4.87 ERA and a .255 opponents' batting average. In 406 innings, the staff has walked just 184 batters to 360 strikeouts.

Series Notes

- Tuesday's meeting with Illinois State will mark the eighth meeting all-time between the two programs, with Indiana owning a 4-3 edge in the all-time series.
- The 2022 series featured games on the two respective institutions campuses in the series' history.
- Illinois State won the initial game in the series, 8-4, in 2000 and Indiana won the second meeting, 17-7, in 2005.
- The two programs have also met in the NCAA postseason, with Illinois State winning an 8-7 decision at the 2019 NCAA Louisville Regional.
- Only three of the seven games have been decided by three-or-fewer runs, including the first meeting of 2022 at Illinois State.

The first three seasons of Jeff Mercer's tenure have been unprecedented for various reasons. The Indiana native is prepared to get the Hoosiers back into the NCAA Tournament for a second time during his tenure.

Mercer joined IU coaching legend Everett Dean as the only IU coaches to win a Big Ten title in their first year as a head coach in 2019 and headed to the NCAA Louisville Regional. The 2020 season was then cut short due to a global pandemic and 2021 featured the first conference-only slate in Big Ten history.

Mercer brought a winning background to Indiana. In his time as a head coach (2017-18) and an assistant coach (2014-16) at Wright State, he has been a part of three Horizon League regular season and conference tournament titles, three NCAA appearances, and a combined record of 199-92 (.684). The Raiders won four NCAA tournament games over those three appearances, having reached the regional finals twice.

The conference-only slate of 2021 produced just the second 20-plus win Big Ten effort in program history (2014) and a school-record 26 wins against B1G opponents. Twice during the season the Hoosiers won eight of nine games, including eight straight games after dropping the season opener. Grant Richardson was a first-team All-Big Ten pick, while Gabe Bierman (second team), McCade Brown (second team) and Cole Barr (third team) also earned all-conference honors.

In the Major League Baseball Draft, the Hoosiers saw its three weekend starting pitchers, closer and top two RBI producers selected. With four picks in the first 10 rounds, the 2021 edition marked the second time in program history that four Hoosiers were taken in the top 10 rounds (2009).

In the shortened 2020 season, Mercer led the Hoosiers to a 9-6 record overall. Indiana recorded three road victories over ranked teams, beating No. 11 LSU, No. 30 South Alabama and No. 17 East Carolina. IU also defeated in-state rival Purdue, 17-2.

Individually, Richardson posted a .424 batting average with three doubles, two triples, five home runs, 17 RBI and 21 runs scored over 15 games. The sophomore led the Big Ten in runs scored, home runs, slugging percentage and total bases. He finished among the top 20 nationally in runs per game (No. 5), total bases (No. 11), slugging percentage (No. 12) and RBIs (No. 19).

In his first season as head coach, Mercer led the Hoosiers to the 2019 Big Ten regular season title and earned Big Ten Coach of the Year. The conference title was the seventh in program history for IU and the first since 2014.

The Bargersville, Indiana, native became the first Big Ten head coach since 1982 (John Anderson, Minnesota) to win a regular season conference title in their first season as the skipper. He became just the second coach in IU history — any sport, men's or women's — to win an outright Big Ten championship in his or her first year. Everett Dean (1924-25) did it in baseball in his first year at the helm.

Indiana earned the No. 2 seed in the NCAA Louisville Regional and finished the season with an overall record of 37-23 and a Big Ten mark of 17-7. A school-record 10 Hoosiers were selected in the 2019 MLB Draft, led by outfield Matt Gorski. The highest drafted Hoosier since Kyle Schwarber (No. 4 overall) in 2014, Gorski was picked in the second round (57th overall) by the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Pitcher Andrew Saalfrank was named the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and earned a spot on the All-Big Ten first team along with utility player Matt Lloyd. Scotty Bradley, Cole Barr and Gorski each made the second team. Elijah Dunham rounded out the all-conference honors with a third-team selection.

The first former student-athlete to be named head coach of the baseball program, Mercer led Wright State for two seasons and amassed 77 victories. In his two seasons at the helm, WSU won nearly 70 percent of its games and averaged 38.5 wins per season. The 2018 Horizon League Coach of the Year, the Raiders won the regular season and conference tournament title in the 2018 to earn a spot in the NCAA Stanford Regional. In 2017, Mercer's squad earned the programs first-ever national ranking.

The 2018 Horizon League champions, Wright State won eight of its last 10 games and 15 of its last 19 to close the season. The Raiders grabbed the tournament title with three-straight wins and outscored opponents 32-11 during the run. With a 39-17 overall record and a 22-6 league mark, WSU ranked No. 8 in the country in scoring (7.8 rpg) and stolen bases (110) and was No. 21 in on-base percentage (.394). The Raiders' .979 fielding percentage was No. 10 nationally.

Wright State was led by Horizon League Player of the Year Gabe Snyder, who paced the conference in home runs (15) and RBI (73), and was second in batting average (.359), missing the league's Triple Crown by one batting average point. Snyder was one of 11 Raiders who earned all-league honors, including five first team honorees (Snyder, Matt Morrow, Chase Slone, Peyton Burdick and Ryan Weiss), four second teamers (Seth Gray, JD Orr, Zane Harris and Derek Hendrixson) and two named to the freshman team (Harris and Quincy Hamilton).

Wright State saw three players drafted in the 2018 MLB Draft, each taken in the first 21 rounds, led by Weiss in the fourth round by the Arizona Diamondbacks (129th overall). Caleb Sampan (20th round) was picked by the Los Angeles Dodgers and Snyder (21st round) went to the Minnesota Twins.

Known for his strength as a recruiter, Mercer and his staff helped Wright State compiled its first-ever top 100 ranked recruiting class. The 2018 signing class was ranked 87th nationally.

WSU received its first-ever top 25 ranking in 2017 and finished the year at 38-21 and 21-9 in league action. Mercer's aggressiveness in the run game resulted in Wright State ranking No. 2 nationally with 130 stolen bases.

Weiss was selected as the 2017 Horizon League Freshman of the Year and first-team all-league along with Morrow. Pitcher Danny Sexton was named a second-team All-Horizon League along with Hendrixson and Gray. Both Weiss earned Freshman All-American and second-team ABCA All-Midwest selection.

Mercer, who was a two-time All-Horizon League honoree in 2008 and 2009, returned to the Raiders as an assistant coach in 2013 and promptly helped WSU set a then-school record for wins (43) in 2015. The Raiders followed that up with a program-record 46 victories.

He assisted then-head coach Greg Lovelady, who is now the head coach at UCF, and coached six players that were taken in the MLB Draft, including five in 2016. During Mercer's three years as an assistant, the Raiders had 30 All-Horizon League honorees, two Horizon League regular season and tournament titles and two NCAA appearances.

The program's recruiting coordinator, Mercer brought in a wealth of talent to one of the premier mid-major programs in the country. He also excelled in his role as hitting coach, with 47 home runs in 2016, its most in a season since 2009.

Prior to the return to his alma mater, Mercer spent two seasons as a volunteer assistant coach at Western Kentucky University (2012-13). While with the Hilltoppers, he worked with pitchers and outfielders, and was also instrumental in the development and organization of the programs camps.

His first Division I experience came at the University of Michigan as the volunteer assistant coach in 2011. During his time with the Wolverines, he worked with the catchers and outfielders.

Before his arrival in Ann Arbor, Mercer spent the 2010 season as the graduate assistant coach at Ohio Northern University where he was in charge of the infielders and hitters and was the recruiting coordinator.

As a student-athlete, Mercer began his career at the University of Dayton before transferring to Wright State. He was a two-time first team All-Horizon League honoree at first base and was named to third-team All-America in 2009 after hitting .357 with 26 doubles and 74 RBI. The Horizon League Player of the Year in 2009, he tied the WSU single-season record for RBIs, doubles, games played and games started to help the Raiders to the NCAA Fort Worth Regional.

- When situations get tight on the mound, Indiana has turned to freshman **Grant Holderfield**.
- The rookie ranks tied for No. 9 among Division I freshmen in pitching appearances this season (24), which sits No. 4 among all pitchers in the Big Ten.
- Holderfield is 2-4 with two saves on the season and has amassed 41 innings over his 24 appearances.
- In 200 batters faced, he has issued 22 walks and hit six batters to go along with 52 punchouts.
- The left-hander has stranded all 18 base runners on the year, including the bases loaded four times (Kentucky, 3/15; Evansville, 3/20; at Purdue-1, 4/10 and Minnesota-2, 5/15).

Mathison Mashes

- The first home run of **Carter Mathison's** career came in the third weekend at Missouri State, but the freshman is now closing in on a rookie record.
- His 16 home runs rank tied for No. 42 nationally and are tied for No. 3 among NCAA Division I freshmen.
- After becoming just the fourth IU freshman to reach the 10-home run mark in a season, Mathison hit three more versus Illinois and two at Michigan to set the IU freshman record.

- Nine of the 16 home runs for the left-handed hitter have come in Big Ten play, which ranks tied for No. 5 on IU's B1G-only leader board.

The Power of Pyne

- Josh Pyne** has enjoyed ample success during his first season on campus and his 50 RBIs are tied for No. 7 nationally among freshmen.
- He carried a 15-game hitting streak earlier in the season, which is the longest streak for an IU hitter since 2014.
- Since 2005, Pyne's streak is tied for the ninth longest, in a single season just behind 16-game streaks from **Dustin DeMuth** and **Brad Hartong** in 2014.
- During the streak, the right-handed hitter batted .397 with 13 runs scored and 20 RBIs. He hit his first three career home runs and added six doubles.
- Pyne then ran his reached base streak for the next three weeks. It ended versus Butler at 29 games, the longest by a true freshman since at least 2005.
- Overall, the streak ranks as the third longest single-season streak since 2005 and the longest since **Sam Travis'** 30-game streak in 2012.

- **Josh Pyne** sits atop the Big Ten freshman charts in RBIs and is tied for No. 7 among rookies nationally with 50 runs batted in.
- Teammate **Carter Mathison** is tied for No. 10 nationally among freshmen 49 RBIs, while **Brock Tibbitts** 41 runs batted in are among the top-10 rookies in the conference.
- The trio can become the first in IU history to drive in 40-plus RBIs as freshmen in the same season. Only the 2008 and 1985 squads have two drive in 40 in the same season.

Jessee Takes His Walks

- English poet William Langland penned the line, "patience is a virtue," but he wasn't exactly thinking of baseball or **Hunter Jessee** when doing so.
- Jessee has been one of the most patient hitters at the plate for IU with 28 walks in 45 appearances (36 starts), including 19 in 18 Big Ten appearances.
- The junior's 19 walks are closing in on IU's Big Ten-only top 10 list. He currently trails **Jason Cotton** (1994) and **Mickey Morandini** (1988) for the No. 10 spot at 20 walks.

Perkins a Steady Hand

- Redshirt-sophomore **Jack Perkins** has made 12 starts in 2022 and has found some consistency as the year has progressed.
- After a season-opening start at Clemson (2/19) went just 3 2/3 innings, Perkins has given the Cream and Crimson at least six innings in eight of his last 11 outings.
- On the year, he has fanned at least six batters in eight of his 13 starts and allowed three-or-fewer runs in nine outings.
- At Rutgers (April 16), Perkins tossed a career-best seven innings to hold the Big Ten's top offense to just one run on three hits. He fanned eight on a career-high 120 pitches.

Ellis Providing the Power

- Redshirt-junior **Matthew Ellis** came from Walters State Community College where he hit 17 home runs with 4 multi-home run games as a sophomore.
- Ellis has brought that power with him to B-Town, as he is tied for No. 3 in the Big Ten in home runs (16).
- The left-handed hitting catcher has three multi-homer games on his resume, in 2022 (*at Missouri State and versus Purdue Fort Wayne and Kentucky*).
- From March 1-6, Ellis hit .438 with 12 RBIs, six runs scored and seven hits over four games. He had five extra base hit, walked twice and was hit-by-pitch once.

MLB Opening Day

- Three former Indiana student-athletes are among MLB active rosters as Opening Day kicked off the 2022 season on April 7.
- **Alex Dickerson** (Atlanta Braves), **Scott Effross** (Chicago Cubs) and **Kyle Schwarber** (Philadelphia Phillies) all started the year on big league rosters.
- Minor League Baseball (MiLB) will also be full of Hoosiers once rosters are finalized, including a fresh crop from the 2021 draft.
- Of the six drafted IU student-athletes in 2021, four were taken in the first 10 rounds. It marked the second time in program history IU saw four players go in before the start of the 11th round.
- All three weekend starters - **McCade Brown** (3rd round), **Gabe Bierman** (7th round) and **Tommy Sommer** (10th round) were taken, while closer **Matt Litwicki** (10th round) was also selected.
- Positionally, third baseman **Cole Barr** (15th round) and center fielder **Grant Richardson** (17th round) were also picked up.
