SETTING THE SCENE

- Indiana (2-6, 0-5 B1G East) wraps up its two-game road trip at No. 9/10 Michigan (7-1, 4-1 B1G East) on Saturday, Nov. 6. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. ET at Michigan Stadium (107,601; FieldTurf) on FOX.
- The Hoosiers defeated the Wolverines, 38-21, in Bloomington last season (Nov. 7).
- It marked IU's first victory over U-M since Oct. 24, 1987.
- Indiana is 7-4 over its last 11 road games.
- The Hoosiers have faced five ranked opponents, each of which has entered the Top 10 in 2021, with a combined record of 34-6.
- **Peyton Hendershot** is IU's tight ends receptions (125) and yardage (1,383) leader. His 14 touchdowns only trail Ted Bolser's 15 from 2010-13.
- Linebacker **Micah McFadden** leads the Big Ten and shares second nationally with 14 tackles for loss, and he has at least one TFL in 13-straight games.
- Donaven McCulley threw for 242 yards at Maryland last weekend, an Indiana true freshman record.

THE COACHES

- The 2020 American Football Coaches Association National Coach of the Year, **Tom Allen** is 26-28 in his fifth season as Indiana head football coach. His 24 wins over his first four years are the most for an IU head coach during that span. Allen was also named the 2020 Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year (Big Ten coaches vote) and the Dave McClain Coach of the Year (Big Ten media vote). (full bio on page 15)
- Jim Harbaugh is 56-23 (.709) in his seventh season at Michigan. He owns a 114-50 (.695) overall record with stints at Stanford (2007-10) and San Diego (2004-06). Harbaugh also coached the San Francisco 49ers (2011-14).

NEWS & NOTES

- The team voted WR Ty Fryfogle, TE Peyton Hendershot, LB Cam Jones, DB Marcelino McCrary-Ball, LB Micah McFadden, and QB Michael Penix Jr. season captains.
- Jones, McCrary-Ball, McFadden, and Penix were also 2020 captains.
- The Hoosiers (6-2, 6-1 Big Ten) finished the 2020 season with a No. 12 final rating from the Associated Press, their highest final ranking since 1967 (No. 4).
- IU's 11 B1G wins over 2019-20 tied for the most in school history over a two-year span (1987-88).
- Indiana has played in consecutive January bowl games (2020 TaxSlayer Gator Bowl and 2021 Outback Bowl) for the first time in school history.
- **Tom Allen** reached win No. 25 in his 48th career game to become the third-fastest in program history to 25 victories behind **James M. Sheldon** (40 games) and **James H. Horne** (46 games).

POST-GAME INTERVIEW POLICY

The Indiana locker room is closed at all times. A strategic communications staffer will collect all player requests in the press box midway through the fourth quarter. Requested players will be available in the Team Room of the North End Zone complex immediately following head coach Tom Allen's post-game press conference.

Allen will be available in the Team Room following his post-game radio duties. Post-game interviews on the road will be held in accordance with the host school's procedures.

MICHIGAN NOTES

- Michigan leads the overall series, 59-10. The Hoosiers last downed the Wolverines in Ann Arbor on Oct. 21, 1967 (27-20)
- IU offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Nick Sheridan (2006-09) walked on as a quarterback at U-M before earning a scholarship prior to his junior campaign
- Six Hoosiers hail from the state of Michigan: David Ellis (Clinton Township), David Holloman (Auburn Hills), Will Jontz (Brighton), Christian Love (Detroit), Peter Schulz (Franklin), and Lem Watley-Neely (Harper Woods).
- Redshirt sophomore offensive lineman Zach Carpenter played for the Wolverines in 2019 and 2020.

IN THE POLLS

- Indiana was ranked in the 2021 preseason for the first time since 1969.
- The Hoosiers appeared in both the Associated Press Top 25 and the USA TODAY Sports AFCA Coaches Poll for the 11thstraight week, a program record.

2020 NEWS & NOTES

- Indiana collected its first Top-10 ranking in the Nov. 8, 2020, AP Poll (No. 10) since Sept. 22, 1969 (No. 10).
- The Hoosiers No. 7 rating (Dec. 13 and 20, 2020) was their best in the AP Poll since Nov. 27, 1967 (No. 4).
- IU's three Top-25 victories tied for the third-most in the country and matched the school record (1945).
- Indiana clinched a winning league record in consecutive seasons for the first time since 1987-88 and for the sixth time overall (1967-68, 1944-46, 1936-37).
- The Hoosiers six conference wins tied for the most in program history (1967, 1987).
- IU collected its first win over No. 16 Wisconsin (14-6) since 2001 and 2002, the former coming at Camp Randall Stadium.
- . Indiana recorded its first road victory over a ranked opponent since No. 18 Missouri in 2014, and its first Big Ten road win over a ranked opponent since No. 22 Michigan State in 2001.
- The Hoosiers defeated Michigan State, 24-0, to reclaim the Old Brass Spittoon for the first time since 2016 and earn their first win in East Lansing since 2001
- IU's 38-21 victory over No. 23 Michigan was its first over the Wolverines since 1987.
- Indiana's 36-35, overtime win against No. 8 Penn State in the season opener was the sixth against a Top-10 opponent in program history, with the last coming at No. 9 Ohio State in 1987.
- It marked the Hoosiers first Top-10 victory at Memorial Stadium since 1967 (No. 3 Purdue).
- IU defeated PSU, U-M, MSU, and UW in the same season for the first time in school history and beat the Wolverines and Spartans in the same year for the first time since 1967.

2020 HONORS

- CB Tiawan Mullen (1st team FWAA), LB Micah McFadden (3rd team AP), and WR Ty Fryfogle (3rd team AP) collected All-America status, the first time since 2007 three Hoosiers were named All-Americans
- Mullen became the first cornerback in program history to be named a first-team All-American.
- · A school record 16 Hoosiers earned 2020 All-Big Ten honors, highlighted by Fryfogle, who became the first wideout in Indiana history to be recognized as the Richter-Howard Receiver of the Year.
- · A program record seven Hoosiers, including a school record four first-teamers, garnered defensive accolades.
- Mullen was Indiana's first first-team selection at cornerback since Tracy Porter (2007), while McFadden received first-team honors for the first time in his career.
- CB Jaylin Williams (2nd team) and Devon Matthews (3rd team) also collected defensive recognition.
- QB Michael Penix Jr. picked up second-team accolades, while TE Peyton Hendershot earned third-team honors.
- K Charles Campbell was named second-team All-Big Ten.
- Twenty-nine Hoosiers garnered Academic All-B1G, matching the school record set in 2018 under Tom Allen.
- During Allen's tenure, 95 student-athletes have been named Academic all-conference.

STAFF UPDATE

- . Tom Allen welcomed two members to his coaching staff in the offseason: associate head coach/running backs coach Deland McCullough (bio on page 16) and defensive coordinator/linebackers coach Charlton Warren (bio on page 16).
- McCullough enters his second stint in Bloomington (2011-16) after working the last three campaigns with the Chiefs.
- Warren, a 16-year veteran, spent the last four years in the SEC, including the last two as defensive backs coach at Georgia.
- Brandon Shelby (bio on page 16) was elevated to assistant head coach and will continue to oversee the cornerbacks, while special teams coordinator Kasey Teegardin (bio on page 16) is now coaching the outside linebackers.

OFFENSE

- . Nick Sheridan is in his second season overseeing the Indiana offense
- IU returned 25 letterwinners (10 lost) on offense, including seven starters, from 2020.
- A year ago, senior Ty Fryfogle earned third-team Associated Press All-America honors, became the first wideout in program history to be named the Big Ten's Richter-Howard Receiver of the Year, claimed first-team allconference honors, and was a Biletnikoff semifinalist.
- · Redshirt junior quarterback Michael Penix Jr. carded second-team All-Big Ten honors and was a Davey O'Brien semifinalist, while redshirt senior tight end Peyton Hendershot collected third-team accolades.
- The Hoosiers have reached 30 points 16 times since the start of 2019 (3 times in 2021), which is tied for third (Michigan) in the B1G to Ohio State's 25 and Minnesota's 19.
- In its victory at Western Kentucky (9/25), the offense piled up 507 total yards on 92 snaps, the team's largest output since racking up 522 yards at Purdue on Nov. 30, 2019.
- In 2020, Indiana led the conference in fewest sacks allowed (1.25, T-17th nationally), ranked second in 30-yard passing plays (tied with 13), 60-yarders (4, T-8th nationally), and 50-yarders (6, T-15th), tied for third in 40-yarders (6),

- ranked fourth in scoring (28.9) and interceptions lost (tied with 5, T-32nd), and ranked fifth in passing (250.9, 43rd) and time of possession (31:15, 36th).
- IU threw for 342 yards in its victory over No. 23 Michigan, the program's second-highest passing yardage against U-M in 69 all-time meetings, for 320 in the win at Michigan State, and for 491 at No. 3 Ohio State, the most in 94 all-time meetings, the second-highest total in program history, and the fourth-most ever allowed by OSU.
- 433 against the Spartans, and 490 against the Buckeyes.
- · Sheridan is in his fifth year in Bloomington. He coached the tight ends in 2019 and the quarterbacks in 2017-18.
- assistant at the University of Tennessee from 2014-16.
- coaches under 30 years of age by 247Sports in 2017.
- A guarterback at the University of Michigan (2006-09), he appeared in 12 games and made four starts.
- coaching veteran, currently serving as the defensive line coach at the Air Force Academy.

- Sheridan (33) was named one of the nation's Top 30
- · Sheridan's father, Bill, is a 36-year NFL and collegiate

RUNNING BACK

- Associate head coach and Super Bowl champion Deland McCullough is in his second stint as Indiana's running back coach (2011-16).
- · McCullough spent 2018-20 as the Kansas City Chiefs running backs coach.
- · In his seven years in the collegiate coaching ranks, McCullough has mentored seven 1,000-yard running backs, including five from 2014-17.
- · Two of his backs have earned All-America honors and nine have secured all-conference recognition.
- · All five of his featured rushers Stephen Houston, Tevin Coleman, Jordan Howard, Devine Redding, and Ronald Jones (USC) - have reached the NFL
- . During his first run in Bloomington, the Hoosiers set 19 program rushing records.
- Stephen Carr joined the program as a transfer from USC on May 20, 2021, and notched his first 100-yard game as a Hoosier with 118 yards on 22 carries (5.4 average) with one touchdown in the Idaho win (9/11).
- The Doak Walker Award candidate added his second 100-yarder (3rd of career) with 109 yards on a career-high 25 attempts (4.4) in the victory at Western Kentucky (9/25).
- · Carr reached the end zone twice for the first time since Sept. 2, 2017, a feat he matched for the third time in his career at Maryland last weekend.
- He rushed for a career-high 136 yards on 21 rushes (6.5) with 1- and 66-yard TDs, the Hoosiers first 60-plus yard rushing score since 2015.
- The 6-2, 215-pounder has 588 yards on 152 carries with six touchdowns on the year.
- After setting a career-high with eight receptions for 43 yards against No. 10 Michigan State (10/16), Carr is third on the team with 15 catches for 93 yards and one TD.
- He rushed for 1,329 yards on 264 carries (5.0) with 12 scores in 35 games (6 starts) at Southern Cal.
- The Gardena, Calif, native caught 57 passes for 421 yards with one TD, and he returned 15 kickoffs for 321 yards (21.4).
- · Carr earned his degree in communications in May 2021. · McCullough coached Carr in his only season with the
- Trojans in 2017. • David Ellis (6-1, 214) moved from wide receiver to running back during 2020 spring practice. Ellis had season-
- ending ankle surgery during the bye week (10/9). He played in the final five games of 2020 after he missed the first three with an ankle injury and rushed for 61 yards on 16 attempts

- The junior also brought in 11 passes for 137 yards with his first career receiving score at No. 3 Ohio State, where he hauled in four grabs for a career-best 86 yards.
- Ellis made 16 receptions for 173 yards, rushed nine times for 53 yards with one touchdown, and collected 579 yards on 28 kick returns as a true freshman in 2019.
- Each of the Hoosiers last five featured running backs have reached the NFL - Stevie Scott III (New Orleans, Denver), Redding (Kansas City, Tampa Bay), Howard (Philadelphia, Miami, Chicago), Coleman (New York Jets, San Francisco, Atlanta), and Houston (New England, Pittsburgh, Baltimore).

QUARTERBACK

- Michael Penix Jr. is on watch lists for the Maxwell, Davey O'Brien, Walter Camp Player of the Year, Manning, and Unitas Awards, and he was one of 10 players to earn Big Ten Preseason honors.
- The redshirt junior left the Penn State game (10/2) with a shoulder injury and has not played since.
- Penix owns an 12-5 record as a starter and is 342-of-576 (59.4 percent) for 4,197 yards with 29 touchdowns, 15 interceptions, a 132.0 pass-efficiency rating, and five 300-yard efforts in 20 games. He also has 165 yards on the ground on 64 attempts with six TDs.
- His five 300-yarders share fifth and his completion percentage is sixth in program history.
- Penix threw for 373 yards, the second-highest mark in his career, with career-highs in completions (35 T-5th in program history) and attempts (53 T-9th) in the win at Western Kentucky (9/25).
- A 2020 team captain and co-Most Valuable Player, Penix earned second-team All-Big Ten recognition and was one of 17 O'Brien Award semifinalists.
- The southpaw started all six games in which he appeared before he suffered a season-ending ACL injury.
- Penix completed 124-of-220 for 1,645 yards with 14 scores and four INTs, averaged a Big Ten-leading 274.2 yards per game (18th nationally), and recorded a 136.54 passefficiency rating.
- The 6-3, 218-pounder added a pair of touchdowns on the ground and 25 yards, and totaled 278.3 yards of offense (2nd in the Big Ten, 29th nationally).
- Penix ran for one TD with :22 remaining, threw for a score in overtime, and then converted the ensuing two-point conversions following both to lift Indiana to a 36-35 victory over No. 8 Penn State.
- In the win over No. 23 Michigan, the southpaw completed 30-of-50 for 342 yards, the second-highest yardage for a Hoosier against the Wolverines, with three touchdowns.
- Penix was named the Manning Award Quarterback of the Week and recognized on the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award's Great 8 list.
- He turned in a career day at No. 3 Ohio State and secured his second O'Brien Great 8 honor, throwing for a careerhigh 491 yards (2nd in program history, 1st in Big Ten/6th nationally in 2020) with a career-best five TDs (T-3rd in program history, T-2nd in Big Ten/T-8th nationally in 2020) on 27-of-51.
- The 491 yards are the most against OSU at Ohio Stadium since 1985 (Jim Everett, 497) and the fourth-highest put up against the Buckeyes, including the most by an IU QB.
- Penix became the fourth to throw at least five scores against Ohio State.
- He completed 110-of-160 passes, good for a schoolrecord 68.8 completion percentage (6th in Big Ten history), for 1,394 yards with 10 touchdowns, four picks, and a 157.56 pass-efficiency rating in six starts in 2019. He rushed for 119 yards on 22 attempts (5.4) with two TDs.
- Penix suffered a season-ending right sternoclavicular joint injury in the Northwestern win on Nov. 2.
- In 2019, Penix twice claimed Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors (Ball State, Michigan State).
- The Tampa native joined Antwaan Randle El as the only freshman to surpass 300 passing yards in his first start and is one of just four freshmen to ever reach the benchmark.
- He threw for 61 scores and just six interceptions in his two years as a starter (24 games) at Tampa Bay Technical High School.
- The team captain added 16 touchdowns on the ground.
 He also played center field, jumped 22 feet in the long jump, and tallied a time of 22.8 in the 200-meter dash.
- **Jack Tuttle** relieved Penix against the Terrapins and started the final two games of 2020, including the Outback Bowl, where he played every snap despite suffering a separated shoulder in the first quarter.
- Tuttle went 44-of-72 (61.1 percent) for 362 yards with two touchdowns and one interception and led the Hoosiers to a pair of victories (Maryland, Wisconsin).

- In his first career start, he guided IU to a 14-6 win at No. 16 Wisconsin, the program's first win in Madison since 2001.
- A 6-4, 212-pound right-hander, Tuttle completed 13-of-22 for 130 yards with two TDs and zero INTs.
- The redshirt junior made his first starts of 2021 against No. 10 Michigan State (10/16) and No. 5 Ohio State (10/23), and he has appeared in five games overall (missed last weekend due to injury). Tuttle is 40-of-77 for 397 yards with two scores and three picks.
- Overall in his career, he has played in 13 games (4 starts) and has completed 90-of-160 (56.3) for 793 yards with four touchdowns and four interceptions.
- Tuttle has rushed for 58 yards on 37 attempts.
- He graduated with a supply chain management degree in May 2021 and earned 2020 Academic All-B1G recognition.
- Tuttle transferred from the University of Utah on Dec. 17, 2018, practiced with team, and was ruled eligible for the 2019 campaign in the spring. He did not see action at Utah.
- In five games in 2019, Tuttle went 6-of-11 for 34 yards and had nine rushes for 20 yards.
- A graduate of Mission Hills High School in San Marcos, Calif., Tuttle was a Rivals and 247Sports four-star prospect.
- He was ranked the No. 4 pro-style quarterback nationally by Rivals, the No. 5 pro-style quarterback nationally by 247Sports, and the No. 13 player in California by 247Sports.
- Tuttle's father, Jay, was a walk-on kicker at IU (1986-88)
- True freshman **Donaven McCulley** became the third true freshman (Tre Roberson, 2011; Zander Diamont, 2014) in program history to start at Maryland last weekend.
- He set an IU true freshman record with 242 yards on 14of-25 with a pair of touchdowns.
- In three games, McCulley is 15-of-31 for 272 yards with the two TDs and zero interceptions.
- A Rivals and 247Sports four-star prospect out Lawrence North High School in Indianapolis, McCulley closed his career with 6,211 passing yards, 1,274 rushing yards, 47 touchdowns, and a 128.1 quarterback rating.
- He led Lawrence North to a 7-4 record in 2020, the program's first winning season since 2005, and was also a standout on the hardwood.

WIDE RECEIVER

- Ty Fryfogle earned 2020 third-team Associated Press All-America honors, became the first wideout in program history to be named the Big Ten's Richter-Howard Receiver of the Year, and claimed first-team all-conference honors.
- · One of 11 semifinalists for the 2020 Biletnikoff Award, Fryfogle also became the first receiver in B1G history to record back-to-back 200-yard games, the first Indiana wideout to reach 200 yards twice, and the first Hoosier since Nate Sudfeld (2015) to claim back-to-back Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors.
- The senior opened the season with game-highs in catches (5-tied) and yardage (84) at No. 18 Iowa (9/4), and he reached double digits for the second time in his career with 10 for 98 in the win at Western Kentucky (9/25).
- . He leads the team with 38 grabs (4.8 per game) and is second with 445 yards (55.6 per game) to go along with one touchdown.
- · Fryfogle is seventh on IU's career receptions list (150, 4th among active B1G receivers, T-28th nationally), ninth in yardage (2,164, 5th, 22nd), and 10th in TDs (14, T-6th, T-42nd).
- He became the seventh Hoosier to reach 150 and the 11th to reach 2,000.
- Fryfogle led the team with 721 yards (4th in the Big Ten), 90.1 yards per game (5th, 29th nationally), seven scores (T-3rd, T-30th), and 19.5 yards per grab (3rd, 23rd) in 2020.
- The 6-2, 205-pounder also finished second with 37 receptions (T-9th) and 4.6 receptions per game, and he paced the conference in 30-yard catches (7), shared second in 20-yarders (14) and 60-yarders (2), and tied for third in 40-yarders (3) and 50-yarders (3).
- Fryfogle's three 100-yard games shared ninth in school single-season history, and he owns four career 100-yarders.
- · At No. 3 Ohio State, Fryfogle hauled in seven passes for 218 yards (5th in program history, 1st in the Big Ten/15th nationally in 2020) and three scores (T-2nd in program history, T-1st in Big Ten/T-7th nationally in 2020).
- His 218 yards were the third-highest total ever vs. the Buckeyes, the most by a Hoosier vs. OSU, and the fifthhighest total in school history.
- The senior scored from 63, 56, and 33 yards out and became the first Hoosier since James Hardy on Sept. 1, 2007, vs. Indiana State to bring in a pair of 50-yard TDs.
- · Fryfogle set a career-high with 11 receptions (T-5th in the Big Ten in 2020) for 200 yards (8th in program history/2nd in Big Ten/23rd nationally in 2020), and reached the end zone twice, including a career-long 65-yarder, in the win at Michigan State
- He became the first Hoosier since Cody Latimer (2013) with a touchdown in four-straight games and with threeconsecutive 100-yarders.
- · Fryfogle, whose only Power 5 offers were from Indiana and Ole Miss, made seven grabs for 142 yards with a 24-yard score in the win over No. 23 Michigan to give him 25 for 560 and six TDs over a three-week stretch.
- · His 560 yards were the most over a three-game span in school history and the six scores were the most since Hardy's eight (2006)
- · The Lucedale, Miss., native graduated with a liberal studies degree in May 2021, and is cousin's with IU outside linebacker Jaren "Stone" Handy.

- · Redshirt junior Miles Marshall finished third on the team with 290 yards on 19 receptions with one touchdown in 2020, and he owns 657 yards on 44 catches and a pair of TDs in 27 career games (12 starts).
- · Marshall made a career-high five receptions for a seasonbest 64 yards against the Hilltoppers (9/25) and has 14 for 214 overall in eight games (6 starts) in 2021
- One year ago, the 6-4, 212-pounder started all seven games in which he appeared, averaged 41.4 yards per game, and finished second on IU with 15.3 yards per grab.
- The Lilburn, Ga., native tallied four catches for a careerbest 89 yards, including a career-long 68-yarder, against the
- Marshall led the team in yardage twice and catches once.
- Graduate transfer D.J. Matthews Jr. (Florida State) enrolled in spring classes and participated in practice.
- The 5-11, 160-pounder suffered a season-ending ACL injury at Western Kentucky (9/25).
- Matthews recorded his second career 100-yarder with 120 on five catches in addition to 28 rushing yards, including a 14-yard touchdown, against No. 8 Cincinnati (9/18).
- · He finished the year with 13 receptions for 165 yards (41.2 average) and 276 all-purpose yards (69.0).
- Matthews returned a punt 81 yards for a TD vs. Idaho (9/11) and averaged 20.8 on four returns.
- In 35 games (16 starts) at FSU, he had 84 catches for 809 yards and six scores (1 punt return).

- Twenty-two players on defense brought 275 career starts into 2021, while 17 players added 169 career starts on offense for a total of 444 career starts from 39 players.
- On defense, the secondary is the most experienced unit with 176 career starts among 11 different players.
- The offense's most experienced unit is the wide receivers/tight ends with 129 career starts among eight players.
- Across both lines, IU owns 195 career starts among 14 players, including 108 from seven on defense and 87 from seven on offense.

TIGHT END

- **Peyton Hendershot** (6-4, 254) is a member of the John Mackey Award Watch List for the second-straight season and fresh off his second-straight third-team All-Big Ten recognition.
- The fifth-year senior is Indiana's career tight ends leader (17th overall) with 125 receptions (1st among active B1G tight ends, 3rd nationally) and 1,383 yards (1st, T-5th), and he ranks second with 14 touchdowns (1st, T-7th).
- Ted Bolser (2010-13) is the all-time leader with 15 TDs.
- He became the first tight end in program history with two 100-yard games with 106 yards on six catches and a pair of scores, his second career multi-touchdown game, at Maryland last weekend.
- Hendershot is the team leader with 447 yards (55.9 per game) and four TDs, and he ranks second with 35 receptions (4.4 per game).
- He is first among Big Ten tight ends in yardage (T-10th nationally), tied for first in scores (T-10th), and second in receptions (7th).
- The North Salem, Ind., native also moved into the Top 10 on the school's single-season touchdown (T-3rd), yardage (4th), and catch (T-6th) lists for tight ends.
- Hendershot already holds the top spots with 52 receptions and 622 yards set in 2019.
- He hauled in six balls for 60 yards against No. 8 Cincinnati (9/18) and followed that up with a career-high-tying seven for 100 at Western Kentucky (9/25).
- Hendershot carded five catches for 88 yards at No. 4 Penn State (10/2).
- In 2020, he finished second on the team with 23 grabs for 151 yards with four TDs (2nd) in eight starts.
- The four scores shared second (T-10th overall) and the 23 catches tied for fourth among conference tight ends.
- In 2019, he tied for fourth among tight ends nationally in receptions and 10th in yardage.
- Hendershot finished second among Big Ten tight ends in catches and yardage, and tied for third in touchdowns (4).
- · He graduated with a liberal studies degree in May 2021.

- Senior **Matt Bjorson** (6-3, 241) has played in 41 games (4 starts) with 16 receptions for 124 yards and one score.
- Sophomore **AJ Barner** (6-6, 245) has appeared in all 16 games (1 start) since his arrival in Bloomington.
- In the home-opening win over Idaho (9/11), he reached the end zone for the first time from 76 yards out, with 48 yards coming after the catch, and he owns three catches for 83 yards with the touchdown in 2021.



OFFENSIVE LINE

- Redshirt senior tackle **Caleb Jones** has started 26-straight games (20 right tackle, 6 left tackle) dating back to the start of 2019.
- Jones (6-8, 362), a 2019 honorable-mention All-Big Ten honoree, started the 2021 opener at left tackle before he moved to right tackle in week two.
- · He has appeared in 37 games overall.
- Jones was an all-state standout in 2015 and 2016 at Lawrence North High School in Indianapolis, where he also lettered two seasons in basketball.
- Outland Trophy Watch Lister **Matthew Bedford** (6-6, 310), started all seven games in which he appeared at right tackle one season ago, and opened 2021 there at No. 18 lowa (9/4) before he moved to right guard in week two.
- At Maryland last weekend, he made his first career start at left guard.
- Bedford started eight games and played in nine overall at left tackle as a true freshman in 2019, and he has made eight starts at each tackle position, six at right guard, and one at left guard in his career.
- IU's 2019 Offensive Newcomer of the Year chose the Hoosiers over Mississippi State and South Carolina.
- Luke Haggard (6-7, 305) gained 30 pounds in the offseason after he started and appeared in six games at left tackle in his debut last campaign.
- After missing the season opener at No. 18 lowa (9/4) due to injury, Haggard returned to the lineup at left tackle and has not left since in 2021.
- A senior out of Santa Rosa (Calif.) Junior College, Haggard was a team captain and an All-Bay 6 conference selection during his two years.

- Redshirt sophomore **Mike Katic** (6-4, 312) was named IU's 2020 Offensive Newcomer of the Year.
- The Gibsonia, Pa., native made four starts at left guard and played in six games overall, and he started the first seven games at left guard this year before missing the Terrapins contest due to injury.
- Graduate student **Dylan Powell**, a transfer from Stanford University in 2020, is the Hoosiers center.
- He made his first starts at IU (17 overall) the last six games of 2020 with four at left guard and two at right guard.
- Powell (6-3, 310) graduated with a communications degree in Dec. 2019 and is currently enrolled in the IU Kelley School of Business.
- Darren Hiller is in his fifth season overseeing the offensive line. The 27-year coaching veteran has coached 22 players who have moved on to the NFL, including former Hoosiers Wes Martin (guard), Brandon Knight (tackle), Simon Stepaniak (guard), and Harry Crider (center).
- Crider was a 2021 free-agent signing of Philadelphia, Stepaniak was a sixth-round selection by Green Bay in the 2020 NFL Draft, Martin was a fourth-round selection by Washington in 2019, and Knight was a 2019 free-agent signing of Dallas.
- Tackle **Jason Spriggs** (Atlanta) and guard **Dan Feeney** (New York Jets) were drafted in 2016 and 2017, respectively. Spriggs was taken with pick No. 48 (round 2 by Green Bay), and Feeney was selected with pick No. 71 (round 3 by Los Angeles Chargers).
- **Rodger Saffold**, a 12-year veteran guard with Tennessee, along with Martin, Knight, Spriggs, and Feeney give Indiana five former 0-line standouts currently on NFL rosters.

DEFENSE

- Charlton Warren took over the defensive reins from Kane Wommack, who is in his first season as head coach at South Alabama
- A 16-plus year coaching veteran and the 247Sports No.
 11 recruiter in the nation, Warren spent the previous four seasons in the SEC.
- He led the defensive backs at the University of Georgia (2019-20), the cornerbacks at the University of Florida (2018), and he mentored the defensive backs and served as special teams coordinator at the University of Tennessee (2017).
- Warren oversaw the defensive backs at the University of North Carolina (2015-16) and the University of Nebraska (2014) after he spent 2005-13 at the United States Air Force Academy, his alma mater, including two years as coordinator (2012-13) and four years as co-coordinator (2008-11).
- Head coach **Tom Allen** stresses the importance of takeaways and the team's magic number per game is three.
- The defense has reached that number 16 times since Allen brought the 4-2-5 to Indiana in 2016.
- Since the start of that campaign (66 games), Indiana has five games with four takeaways, 17 with at least three takeaways, and 32 with multiple takeaways, including three this season (at No. 18 lowa, No. 8 Cincinnati, No 10 Michigan State).
- IU has 28 takeaways (21 INTs) since the beginning of the 2020 season (16 games).
- The Hoosiers have at least one takeaway in 41 of their last 47 games, including 20 of their last 24, and they have an interception in 13 of their last 19, including a pair against the Spartans (10/16).
- MSU came into game averaging 36.7 points, 217.2 rushing, 269.7 passing, and 486.8 total yards, and it was held to 20 points, 100 rushing, 141 passing, and 241 total yards.

- The defense limited Kenneth Walker III to 84 yards on 23 carries (3.7 average) and kept him out of the end zone.
- In 2020, Indiana led the B1G in interceptions (17, 2nd nationally), opponent red zone scores (64.0, 1st), takeaways (20, T-13th), and sacks (3.13, 14th), finished fourth in scoring defense (20.3, T-19th), and fifth in rushing defense (137.1, 34th), total defense (378.1, 43rd), and opponent third-down conversions (37.5, 39th).
- A program record seven Hoosier defenders earned 2020
 All-Big Ten honors, including a school record four first-teamers, and five of those seven return in 2021: senior linebacker Micah McFadden (1st), junior cornerback Tiawan Mullen (1st), senior cornerback Jaylin Williams (2nd), senior safety Devon Matthews (3rd), and senior linebacker Cam Jones (honorable mention).
- Mullen became the first corner in program history to be named a first-team All-American (FWAA), while McFadden earned third-team All-America honors (AP).
- The Hoosiers led the B1G in sacks for the first time ever and their 17 picks tied for the third-most in school history (19 in 1998 and 2007).
- IU had a pair of picks in a program-record seven-straight games and became the first team since Oklahoma State in 2011 with at least two interceptions in six-consecutive games in the same year, also a school record.
- Indiana's five shutouts since the start of 2017 share third nationally with Alabama, Virginia Tech, and UAB. Georgia leads the country with seven followed by Wisconsin's six.
- Since the start of 2019, the Hoosiers have held six opponents, including four conference foes, to six points or fewer, the most in the league. Wisconsin (5) ranks second.

DEFENSIVE LINE

- Ole Miss graduate transfer end **Ryder Anderson** (6-6, 266) and Northern Illinois graduate transfer tackle **Weston Kramer** (6-2, 290) bolster a line that helped Indiana lead the Big Ten in sacks for the first time in program history.
- The duo made an immediate impact in the season opener at No. 18 lowa, sharing the team lead with seven tackles.
- Anderson added a sack and a career-high-tying two stops for loss, while Kramer delivered one TFL.
- Against No. 8 Cincinnati (9/18), Anderson once again tallied seven tackles with a career-high two sacks and a career-best 2.5 TFLs (his sixth career multi-TFL game), his second career forced fumble, and one quarterback hurry.
- He added a season-high eight-stop effort, one for loss, at No. 4 Penn State (10/2), and he is fifth on the Hoosiers with 35 tackles with 21 solos, 3.5 sacks (2nd), and eight tackles for loss (2nd) in eight starts.
- In 37 games (14 starts) for the Rebels, Anderson collected 99 tackles, 38 solo, 6.5 sacks, 15 for loss, 17 QBHs, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery, one pass breakup, and one blocked punt.
- The Katy, Texas, native earned his degree in integrated marketing communications in May 2020.
- Kramer, a Naperville, III., product, earned his degree in general studies in June 2021.
- He added his first career fumble recovery against Idaho
 (9/11) and is second to Anderson among the D-linemen with
 23 tackles, three for loss, including his first sack as a Hoosier
 at Maryland last weekend, in eight starts.
- A 2020 second-team All-MAC selection, Kramer played in 45 games at tackle with 30 starts from 2017-20.
- He made 97 stops, 38 solo, 3.5 sacks, 12.5 for loss, and two PBUs.

- Joining Kramer in the interior is senior **Demarcus Elliott** (6-3, 307), an honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection in 2019, who has started 26 of the 28 games in which he has appeared since his arrival in Bloomington.
- Elliott made 35 tackles, 27 solo, with three sacks, five for loss, one forced fumble, and one quarterback hurry in 13 games (12 starts) during the 2019 season.
- He added 14 stops, nine solo, with one breakup, and one hurry last year, and he has 15 tackles, one for loss, and two PBUs in eight starts this season.
- The Garden City, Kan., native played the 2018 campaign at Garden City Community College.
- Junior **Sio Nofoagatoto'a** (6-3, 315) and redshirt sophomore **C.J. Person** (6-3, 292) fill out the interior.
- Nofoagatoto'a made two starts and played in all eight games last season, where he made 12 tackles, one for loss, with one pass breakup.
- The Ili'ili, American Samoa, native appeared in 10 games as a true freshman and tallied nine stops.
- He is the first Hoosier from American Samoa since offensive lineman Pita Elisara (1998-99).
- Nofoagatoto'a was born in New Zealand and lived there until 2008, when he moved to American Samoa.
- He moved to Australia in 2015 and played two years at Clearwater (Fla.) Academy International with IU outside linebacker **D.K. Bonhomme**.
- Person was named Indiana's 2020 Defensive Newcomer of the Year following a redshirt season that saw him play in four games.
- The Montgomery, Ala., native made eight tackles, five solo, a half for loss, and one pass breakup in eight contests, including a start at end in the win at No. 16 Wisconsin.

LINEBACKER

- In the middle, **Micah McFadden** (6-2, 232) earned 2020 third-team Associated Press All-America and first-team All-Rin Ten honors
- A two-time team captain (2020-21), he shared Indiana's 2020 Anthony Thompson Most Valuable Player honors with **Michael Penix Jr.**
- McFadden is on four preseason watch lists: Bednarik, Nagurski, Butkus, and Lombardi.
- The senior is the team leader with 13 sacks and 35.5 tackles for loss (7th in program history), while he shares second with four interceptions. He owns 189 tackles, 130 solo, three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, two breakups, and 13 hurries in 41 games (27 starts).
- Through eight games in the 2021 campaign, McFadden leads the team with 50 tackles, 14 for loss (1st in the Big Ten, T-2nd nationally), 5.5 sacks (T-5th in the Big Ten), two forced fumbles, and four QBHs, with 30 solos (2nd on the team), the fumble recovery (T-1st on the team), and two PBUs.
- McFadden extended his TFL streak to 13-straight games with a pair, including a sack, and eight tackles at Maryland last weekend.
- He shares the top spot on IU with eight career takeaways, and he has 10 multi-TFL games (5 in 2021) and three-multi-sack games (career-high 2).
- McFadden recorded 1.5 for loss at No. 4 Penn State (10/2) to go along with eight stops and a career-high-tying three hurries; 2.5 for loss with 1.5 sacks and a team-high nine tackles against No. 10 Michigan State (10/16); and a career-high-tying three for loss (2nd time) with one sack against No. 5 Ohio State (10/23).
- In the victory at Western Kentucky (9/25), McFadden tallied a career-high 12 stops (4th game in double digits), eight solo, with one sack, and one pass breakup.
- Over the last five contests, he has 43 tackles (8.6 per game), 26 solo, 4.5 sacks, 10 for loss, two PBUs, and three hurries.
- McFadden paced the Hoosiers with 58 stops, 44 solos, six sacks, and 10.5 for loss, shared second with three hurries, and finished fourth with two INTs one year ago.
- He led the conference in sacks, tied for second in solos, shared third in tackles for loss, and tied for eighth in picks. McFadden became the first Hoosier standout to lead the B1G in sacks since **Greg Middleton** (2007).
- His only Power 5 offers were from Indiana and Boston College.
- In the victory at No. 16 Wisconsin, McFadden finished with a team-best nine stops, and he delivered a pair of sacks en route to Walter Camp Foundation National Defensive Player of the Week honors and his first Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week accolade.
- IU's 2019 Most Outstanding Defensive Player of the Year led the team with 61 tackles, 42 solos, 10 for loss, and two picks (tied).
- The Tampa Plant grad tallied a program-record 211 stops, 124 solo, 39 for loss, seven sacks, two interceptions, and two fumble recoveries as a senior.
- Senior **Cam Jones** (6-3, 224), a 2020 honorable-mention All-Big Ten pick, team captain, and Academic All-Big Ten selection, shifted over from the husky position to stinger in 2019. He has played in all 27 games since the move with 15 starts in 16 contests, including all eight in 2021.
- In the 2021 opener at No. 18 lowa (9/4), Jones forced a fumble (4th of his career) and made the recovery (2nd).
- Jones, a 2021 team captain, set a career-high with eight tackles against No. 10 Michigan State (10/16) and is second on the team with 45, including a team-high 31 solos.
- He also has two for loss, the sack, force, recovery, and two pass breakups.

- Jones delivered 35 tackles, 24 solo, with three sacks, four for loss, four quarterback hurries (team-high), and three PBUs in eight games last campaign.
- He made his first start in the 2020 opener and win over No. 8 Penn State, where he made a career-best seven stops, one for loss, and matched a career-high with six solos.
- His eight career takeaways share the team lead with McFadden and junior cornerback **Tiawan Mullen**.
- The Memphis, Tenn., native was recognized as the team's 2018 defensive newcomer of the year after he tied for the team lead with two forced fumbles (T-1st among Big Ten true freshmen, T-2nd among freshmen nationally, T-7th in the Big Ten overall) in 11 games.
- Playing behind McFadden, **Thomas Allen** (6-3, 240) is back after he suffered a season-ending hip injury, the same one sustained by Tua Tagovailoa, in game four at Michigan State last season.
- He has carded 56 tackles, 36 solo, one sack, 3.5 for loss, one forced fumble, and one INT in 32 games.
- A three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection and a 2020 Big Ten Distinguished Scholar, Allen graduated with a SPEA management degree in Aug. 2020, and he is currently enrolled in the Kelley School of Business MBA program.
- The redshirt senior is the son of head coach **Tom Allen** and was a teammate of McFadden's at Plant.
- Tom is one of eight FBS coaches to coach his son: Luke Fickell (Landon), Todd Graham (Michael), Mike Gundy (Gunnar), Butch Jones (Adam), Phillip Montgomery (Cannon), Dabo Swinney (Will, Drew), Willie Taggart (Willie Jr.).
- James Miller (6-2, 223) tallied 24 tackles, 16 solo, with one fumble recovery and one QBH in eight games (1 start) last year.
- The redshirt junior has appeared in 32 games (4 starts) and has 70 stops, 48 solo, a half-sack, 4.5 for loss, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, and two breakups.
- A Tampa native (Armwood H.S.), Miller chose the Hoosiers over Florida State.

- Redshirt senior **Alfred Bryant** (6-2, 250) has started all eight games in 2021.
- The Fresno, Texas, native owns 58 tackles, 34 solo, 7.5 for loss, two fumble recoveries, two forced fumbles, and two pass breakups in 36 games (15 starts).
- Junior Jaren "Stone" Handy (6-6, 255), senior Michael Ziemba (6-3, 260), and junior D.K. Bonhomme (6-3, 235) round out the depth chart.
- Handy joined the program as a transfer from Auburn University on May 17, 2021.
- He made a career-high seven tackles, one for loss, at Maryland last weekend, and he has 17 overall, one for loss, and one hurry in eight games.
- Handy appeared in 14 contests with the Tigers after he was a consensus four-star prospect and the No. 100 prospect nationally by 247Sports out of Hattiesburg (Miss.) H.S.

- Handy was nicknamed "Stone" by his late grandmother, in reference to wrestler Stone Cold Steve Austin, because he was a rambunctious kid.
- Indiana All-American wideout **Ty Fryfogle** is his cousin.
- Ziemba graduated with a criminal justice degree in May 2021, and he is a candidate for the Wuerffel Trophy.
- He has played in 49 games (10 starts) and has 59 stops, 37 solo, one sack, 9.5 TFLs, and two fumble recoveries.
- Bonhomme started three times and played in eight games one season ago after he appeared in 11 as a true freshman.
- He carded 15 tackles, 11 solo, one sack, and two for loss, including a safety, in 2020.
- Bonhomme attended Clearwater (Fla.) Academy International with IU defensive tackle **Sio Nofoagatoto'a**.
- He was born in Haiti, moved to Montreal at five years old and Ottawa at 15, and he is the first Canadian to join the Hoosiers since offensive lineman **Paul Hearn** (2003-06).
- Bonhomme's primary language is French.

HUSKY

- After he suffered a season-ending ACL injury during practice last September, Marcelino McCrary-Ball has returned for his sixth campaign.
- He is the team leader in career tackles (226) and solo stops (156) with 43 starts at husky in 49 games.
- McCrary-Ball ranks second on the team with 15.5 tackles for loss, 15 pass breakups, and four interceptions (tied), and fourth with 4.5 sacks, to go along with one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.
- He picked off his first pass of 2021 against No. 8 Cincinnati (9/18), and he has 22 tackles, 12 solos, and one PBU in seven games (5 starts).
- The Roswell, Ga., native started 12 times and was a 247Sports True Freshman All-American in 2016, when **Tom Allen** arrived in Bloomington in his lone year as defensive coordinator.
- A two-time honorable-mention All-Big Ten recipient, Marcelino is the younger brother of Marcus, a former NFL defensive back who played at the University of Memphis (2009-10), Reggie Jr., a quarterback at Georgia Tech University (2003-06) and Raeshon, a defensive back at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga (2006-08).
- McCrary-Ball graduated with a liberal studies degree in May 2020.
- **Bryant Fitzgerald** replaced Ball one season ago after he moved from safety to husky during 2020 spring practice.
- The redshirt senior started eight games at free safety and played in 25 overall in 2018 and 2019. He did start one game at husky in 2018 at Rutgers.
- In his career, Fitzgerald owns 95 tackles, 78 solo, seven for loss, three interceptions, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, and five pass breakups in 41 games (19 starts).
- Fitzgerald topped the team with three picks (T-8th in the Big Ten), two forced fumbles (tied, T-7th in the Big Ten), and six takeaways as a redshirt freshman in 2018.

- The Indianapolis product out of Avon High School shared first in the Big Ten among freshmen in INTs (T-7th nationally) and forced fumbles (T-4th nationally).
- Fitzgerald's six career takeaways share fourth on the team with McCrary-Ball and senior cornerback **Jaylin Williams**.

CORNERBACK

- Tiawan Mullen (1st team) and Jaylin Williams (2nd team) became the first cornerback duo in Indiana history to earn All-Big Ten honors in the same season last year.
- Mullen also earned first-team All-America accolades from the Football Writers Association of America, the first corner in school history to collect first-team recognition and just the second (Tim Wilbur, 2nd team in 1980) to achieve All-America status.
- The Fort Lauderdale, Fla., native was the program's first cornerback to secure first-team all-conference honors since Tracy Porter in 2007.
- He is a member of Bednarik (2nd-straight year), Thorpe, and Nagurski Watch Lists.
- Mullen shares the team lead with eight career takeaways (3 interceptions, 3 forced fumbles, and 2 fumble recoveries).
- He posted a career-high nine tackles and seven solos in the Idaho win (9/11), and he has 18 stops and 15 solos overall this season in four starts (missed the last 4 injury).
- Mullen broke up his first three passes of 2021 and tallied his fifth career multi-PBU effort, in the victory at Western Kentucky (9/25).
- In 2020, Mullen, made 38 tackles, 27 solo, with 3.5 sacks, 4.5 for loss, three INTs, one forced fumble, four pass breakups, and one quarterback hurry.
- The junior led B1G defensive backs in sacks (T-12th overall) and TFLs, and he shared sixth in the league in picks.
- Mullen finished tied for first on the team in forced fumbles, second in sacks, third in solos stops, tackles for loss, and interceptions, tied for third in PBUs, and fourth in total stops.
- In the victory at Michigan State, he recorded the first two INTs of his career, the first Hoosier with a multi-pick game since Jonathan Crawford vs. Purdue on Nov. 26, 2016.
- IU's 2019 Defensive Newcomer of the Year was also a 247Sports True Freshman All-American, The Athletic Freshman All-American, and honorable-mention All-Big Ten.
- Mullen not only paced the conference, but he finished second among freshmen nationally and shared 11th in the country with 13 breakups.
- He also shared the team lead with two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries (T-4th in the Big Ten, T-27th nationally) to go along with 29 stops, 25 solo, and 3.5 for loss in 13 games (8 starts).
- Mullen was a Rivals four-star prospect and played in the 2019 All-American Bowl after he picked off 14 career passes and returned three for scores at Coconut Creek High School.
- His brother, Trayvon, played cornerback at Clemson University (2016-18) and is a member of the Las Vegas Raiders, and his cousin (mother's side), Lamar Jackson, played at Louisville (2015-17) and is the Baltimore Ravens quarterback.
- Williams, a senior out of Memphis, Tenn., shares fourth in the Big Ten (T-33rd nationally) with six career interceptions.
- In 2021, after his first multi-PBU game (2), along with a team-high eight stops against No. 5 Ohio State (10/23), he leads the team with five pass breakups to go along with 31 tackles, 21 solo, in seven games (5 starts).
- Williams opened 2020 with INTs in three-consecutive games and finished with four overall, which tied for the team lead, ranked third in the B1G, and shared eighth nationally.
- In eight games (5 starts), he tallied 30 tackles, 26 solo, one sack, two for loss, 93 interception yards, one PBU, and two quarterback hurries.
- Williams started seven of the final eight games and played in all 13 contests in 2019, and he has made 39 appearances with 16 starts in his career.

- In addition to his six picks, Williams owns 101 stops, 79 solo, two sacks, three for loss, and 12 PBUs.
- Reese Taylor enjoyed a successful transition to corner in 2019 after spending the 2018 campaign on offense. He switched to defense during 2019 spring practice.
- Taylor's talent was on full display in 2020 as he topped the team and finished fourth in the conference with seven pass breakups, and he was named third-team All-Big Ten at punt returner by Phil Steele.
- Overall, Taylor posted 29 tackles, 25 solo, one sack, four for loss, one interception (53 yards), one forced fumble, the seven PBUs, and one quarterback hurry with an 8.1 punt return average in eight games (3 starts).
- The senior recorded his first career multi-takeaway game with his second career INT and his first career forced fumble against the Spartans, in addition to one TFL.
- In the 2021 season opener at No. 18 lowa (9/4), Taylor recorded his second career sack and second career game with a pair of stops for loss.
- He also has 14 stops and one breakup this year in six games (4 starts) missed the last two due to injury.
- Taylor recorded the first interception of his career with 1:00 left to seal the Hoosiers 34-28 win at Maryland in 2019, where he played in 11 games (1 start) and netted 13 tackles, one for loss, the pick, and two breakups.
- In 2018, he hauled in 27 receptions for 166 yards, 15 rushes for 83 yards (5.5 average), three kick returns for 66 yards, and seven tackles, and he was the team's back-up quarterback, the position where he earned Indiana's 2017 Mr. Football honors.
- Taylor led Indianapolis Ben Davis High School to the 2017 state championship.
- The two-time all-stater broke the Ben Davis career marks with 7,631 passing yards and 79 passing scores on 568-of-828 (68.6 percent), and he rushed for 2,077 yards on 374 attempts (5.5 average) with 45 touchdowns.

- . The senior has started 20 games since the start of 2019 and appeared in 37 over his career.
- · He returned to action in the win at Western Kentucky (9/25) after he missed the previous two weeks (injury), and he finished second on the Hoosiers with eight tackles, one for loss, with one pass breakup.
- Matthews added an eight-stop performance, one for loss, against No. 10 Michigan State (10/16), and set career-highs with 12 tackles and 10 solos with one for loss at Maryland last weekend.
- He has 37 stops overall, tied for third on the team, with three for loss and two pass breakups in six starts.

- · Taking over as starter one year ago, Campbell connected
- on 10-of-11 field goals (90.9 percent) and all 25 extra points.
- . The Jackson, Tenn., native led the B1G in field goal percentage (T-9th nationally), finished third in field goals made and scoring per game among kickers (6.9), tied for third in field goals made per game (1.3, T-28th), and finished fourth in PATs made.
- · Campbell made all three of his attempts from 50plus yards to become the second Hoosier to record three 50-yarders in one season (Pete Stoyanovich, 1988).
- An Academic All-Big Ten selection, he became the second Hoosier (Chris Gartner at Kentucky - Sept. 30, 1972) with a pair of 50-yarders in a single game with makes from 50 and 53 yards in the Outback Bowl vs. Ole Miss.

- A 2020 third-team All-Big Ten return specialist, Reese Taylor has filled in for Matthews.
- · Taylor is averaging 8.0 yards on four returns this year after he returned nine for 73 yards a season ago.
- . Jacolby Hewitt has handled kickoff return duties in 2021. He is averaging 23.1 yards on nine returns.
- · The redshirt junior wide receiver entered the year with four returns for 59 yards in 2020.

IU UNVEILS GEORGE TALIAFERRO STATUE IN GEORGE TALIAFERRO PLAZA

Former Indiana University President Michael A. McRobbie presided over the dedication of the George Taliaferro Plaza on Friday, Nov. 1, 2019, unveiling a bronze statue of Taliaferro, one of the most important and influential individuals in the history of Indiana University and IU Athletics.

McRobbie led the dedication ceremony, which took place on the newly-dedicated plaza located on the ground level of Memorial Stadium outside of the North End Zone facility. Other speakers at the event included IU Board of Trustee member Quinn Buckner, former Indiana University Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Fred Glass, head football coach Tom Allen, Senior Associate Athletic Director Anthony Thompson and fifth-year senior linebacker Reakwon Jones.

"Throughout his life, not only did George Taliaferro excel as an athlete, but he also overcame the real-world struggles of racism and prejudice, of segregation and oppression," McRobbie said. "And in the process, he demonstrated courage, determination and perseverance, and earned a special place in the annals of our state and its flagship public university.

"In George Taliaferro Plaza and its centerpiece statue, every visitor to Indiana Memorial Stadium will be reminded of the enormous contributions George made to IU and to this community, as an outstanding athlete, as a champion of racial equality, as a dedicated educator and administrator, as a tireless community activist, and as a friend and mentor to many."

"It is fitting that during our Bicentennial year, we are dedicating this plaza and statue in honor of one of the most important figures in the history not only of Indiana University Athletics, but of Indiana University as a whole," said Glass. "I am particularly grateful to President McRobbie and Trustee Buckner for their support in permanently and prominently recognizing this Hoosier pioneer at the entryway of IU Football where he will be seen every day by IU players, coaches, and recruits."

Taliaferro, who passed away Oct. 8, 2018, at the age of 91, was a legendary Indiana University football player during the 1940s who shattered racial barriers on campus and in the sport. In doing so, he left an indelible mark on both.

The Gary, Ind., native was a three-time All-American at IU who led the Hoosiers' unbeaten 1945 Big Ten Championship team in rushing. He'd go on to lead the program in rushing twice and passing once, and following the 1948 season he became the first African-American drafted by an NFL team when the Chicago Bears selected him in the 13th round.

Taliaferro would eventually spend seven years in the NFL, earning Pro Bowl honors three times. He totaled 2,255 rushing yards, 1,300 receiving yards, 1,633 passing yards, and accounted for 37 touchdowns while playing for franchises in New York, Dallas, Baltimore, and Philadelphia. He also became the only player in league history to play seven positions — running back, quarterback, wide receiver, cornerback, punter, punt returner, and kickoff returner.

While those feats make him one of the most accomplished players in IU and Big Ten history, his contributions extended well beyond the collegiate and professional playing fields.

During the 1940s, Taliaferro and IU President Herman B Wells played a pivotal role in desegregating the IU campus and the City of Bloomington. During the era, Taliaferro was not allowed to eat at many local restaurants. When Wells found out that Taliaferro had to return home between classes because no nearby restaurants would serve him, Wells arranged for the two to have lunch at a nearby campus establishment. Wells and Taliaferro had lunch, and IU and the Bloomington community took a giant step toward desegregation.

Taliaferro's contributions did not end at the conclusion of his playing career. A 1951 IU graduate who later earned a Master's Degree from Howard University, Taliaferro returned to IU in 1972 and served as special assistant to IU President John Ryan. In that role and other roles on campus during the next two decades, he was a valuable and outspoken voice on social justice issues.

Taliaferro's lifetime of accomplishments are chronicled on the statue, which is the work of Brian Hanlon, owner of Hanlon Studios. Hanlon has produced more than 300 works in both public and private collections, including the five granite monuments commemorating IU Basketball's five national championships.





TERRY TALLEN INDIANA FOOTBALL COMPLEX OPENS

The Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex officially opened on Aug. 13, 2019. Former Indiana University Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Fred Glass announced a major gift by alumnus and former IU Football captain Terry Tallen to the Indiana University Bicentennial Campaign for Athletics on April 20, 2018. This \$2 million commitment helped provide funding for the renovation of the football team area in Memorial Stadium. In recognition of his gift, the area is permanently named the Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex.

The Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex fills 25,000+ square feet underneath the west stands of Memorial Stadium. The complex includes the Trent and Julie Green Locker Room (named in 2003), coaches' locker room, team lounge, recruiting area, equipment room and Dr. John M. Miller Training Room (named in 1994).

Tallen graduated from the Indiana University Kelley School of Business in 1982, and while earning his degree, was also a three-year letterman. Terry was elected team co-captain in 1979 and 1980. The 1979 team was nationally ranked and won the Holiday Bowl, the Hoosiers first bowl victory. Terry was named the United Press International's Defensive Player of the Week following Indiana's Homecoming victory over Wisconsin in 1980.

In 2001, Terry founded Tallen Capital Partners, LLC, and remains the company's Chairman and CEO. Tallen Capital Partners, LLC is a privately held, vertically integrated retail and mixed-use real estate investment and development organization with offices in San Diego and San Francisco. Prior to founding Tallen Capital Partners and becoming an entrepreneur, Terry enjoyed a corporate career as a senior executive with some of our country's largest public as well as private companies. He is considered one of the leading shopping center investors and developers in the Western U.S.

- His 24 wins over his first four years are the most for an IU head coach during that span.
- Named the 2020 Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year (Big Ten coaches vote) and the Dave McClain Coach of the Year (Big Ten media vote)
- Joined Bill Mallory (1986, 1987) as the only Hoosier head coaches to earn the honor.
- Received the 2020 Grant Teaff Coach of the Year from the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.
- Became the third Indiana head coach to be named AFCA National Coach of the Year along with Bo McMillin (1945) and John Pont (1967).
- Allen was also a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award, the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award, the Dodd Trophy, and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.
- A 29-year coaching veteran, Allen was named the program's 29th head football coach on Dec. 1, 2016.
- Made his head coaching debut in the 2016 Foster Farms Bowl.
- The New Castle, Ind., native joined Indiana's staff as associate head coach/defense on Jan. 15, 2016, and he promptly went on to become a Broyles Award nominee.
- Allen has strong ties to the Hoosier state as he served as head coach at Ben Davis High School (2004-06), defensive coordinator at Ben Davis (1998-03) and Marion High School (1997), and earned his master's degree from IU (2002).
- Over the past 26-plus seasons, the teams for which Allen has been a member of the coaching staff have posted a combined record of 248-96 (.721).

MAKING HISTORY (2020)

- Indiana (6-2, 6-1 Big Ten) finished the year ranked for a program record 10-consecutive weeks, including a No. 12 final rating from the Associated Press, its highest final ranking since 1967 (No. 4).
- IU played in consecutive January bowl games for the first time in school history with its invitation to the 2021 Outback Bowl.
- The Hoosiers were ranked in the Top 10 six times, the second-most in program history behind the 1945 team (9 weeks).
- Indiana collected its first Top-10 ranking in the Nov. 8 AP Poll (No. 10) since Sept. 22, 1969 (No. 10).
- IU's No. 7 rating (Dec. 13, 20) was its best in the AP Poll since Nov. 27, 1967 (No. 4).
- The Hoosiers three Top-25 victories tied for the third-most in the country and matched the school record (1945).
- Indiana clinched a winning league record in consecutive seasons for the first time since 1987-88 and for the sixth time overall (1967-68, 1944-46, 1936-37).
- IU's six conference wins tied for the most in program history (1967, 1987).
- The Hoosiers 11 Big Ten victories over the 2019-20 seasons are tied for the most in school history over a two-year span (1987-88).
- Indiana collected its first win over No. 16 Wisconsin (14-6) since defeating the Badgers in 2001 and 2002, the former coming at Camp Randall Stadium.
- IU recorded its first road victory over a ranked opponent since No. 18 Missouri in 2014, and its first B1G road win over a ranked opponent since No. 22 Michigan State in 2001.
- The Hoosiers matched a program record with five-straight league victories (1967) before losing at No. 3 Ohio State and have won 11 of their last 14, their most successful stretch in conference games in school history.
- Indiana defeated Michigan State, 24-0, to reclaim the Old Brass Spittoon for the first time since 2016 and earn its first win in East Lansing since 2001.
- IU's 38-21 victory over No. 23 Michigan was its first over the Wolverines since 1987.
- The Hoosiers 36-35, overtime win against No. 8 Penn State in the season opener was the sixth against a Top-10 opponent in program history, with the last coming at No. 9 Ohio State in 1987.
- It marked Indiana's first Top-10 victory at Memorial Stadium since 1967 (No. 3 Purdue).
- IU defeated PSU, U-M, MSU, and UW in the same season for the first time in school history and beat the Wolverines and Spartans in the same year for the first time since 1967.

BREAKTHROUGH SEASON (2019)

- Guided the Hoosiers to the 2020 TaxSlayer Bowl, the program's first bowl game in the state of Florida.
- Indiana finished with an 8-5 record and a 5-4 Big Ten mark.
- IU reached eight wins for just the eighth time in school history and the first time since 1993, and it finished one win shy of matching the program record set in 1945 and 1967.
- The Hoosiers five-conference wins tied for the fourth-most in school history, one off the program record of six (1967, 1987, 2020)
- Indiana posted a winning conference mark for the first time since 1993 (5-3) and its first winning season overall since 2007 (7-6)
- On Nov. 10, IU entered the Associated Press Poll (No. 24) for the first time since Sept. 20, 1994, and moved into the Coaches Poll (No. 25) for the first time since Oct. 17, 1994.

HOOSIER HONORS

- Three coaches on Allen's staffs have been candidates for the Broyles Award, including 2020 finalist Kane Wommack and 2019 semifinalist Kalen DeBoer.
- Wommack is currently the South Alabama head coach and DeBoer is the Fresno State head coach.
- In his four seasons as head coach, 48 Hoosiers have earned All-Big Ten honors.
- Tiawan Mullen became the first cornerback in program history to garner first-team All-America recognition in 2020.
- Wide receiver Ty Fryfogle and linebacker Micah McFadden collected third-team All-America accolades, giving Indiana three All-Americans in the same campaign for the first time since 2007.
- A school record 16 IU standouts received All-Big Ten honors.
- Fryfogle became the first wideout in Indiana history to be named the Big Ten Richter-Howard Receiver of the Year.
- He also was one of 11 Biletnikoff Award semifinalists, and Michael Penix Jr. was one of 17 Davey O'Brien Award semifinalists.
- A program record seven Hoosiers, including a school record four first-teamers, earned defensive recognition.
- Thirteen IU players secured 2017 all-conference honors, including six defenders, which matched 2016's mark.
- Mullen was named a 2019 True Freshman All-American.
- Twenty-three Hoosiers have been drafted or invited to NFL camps over the last four seasons, including a school-record 11 in 2018
- Twelve have worked out over the last four NFL Combines, highlighted by a program-record five in 2018.
- Safety Jamar Johnson (5th round, Denver-2021), guard Simon Stepaniak (6th round, Green Bay-2020), guard Wes Martin (4th round, Washington-2019), tight end lan Thomas (4th round, Carolina-2018), and linebacker Chris Covington (6th round, Dallas-2018) have been selected in the NFL Draft.
- · Coached 13 Hoosiers currently on NFL rosters.
- Wide receiver Simmie Cobbs Jr., kicker Griffin Oakes, and linebacker Tegray Scales garnered 2017 first-team all-league recognition. Oakes was named the Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the
- Harry Crider became the 10th Hoosier to receive Academic All-America honors in 2021.
- A school-record 29 student-athletes collected Academic All-Big Ten in 2018 and 2020, and Allen's four-year mark stands at 95.
- Achieved unparalleled recruiting success. IU's 2019 signing class was the highest rated in program history, besting the previous top-ranked class of 2018, and included a record five fourstar prospects.
- The 2021 class locked in five of the Top 11 prospects in the state of Indiana.

Indiana University's football program receives some of the most extensive media coverage in the country. Learfield IMG College holds the exclusive rights as IU's official radio outlet.



DON FISCHER

Don Fischer is in his 49th year as the "Radio Voice" of Indiana University football and basketball games. The past 35 years, Fischer has worked as an independent contractor, and is currently serving the IU Radio Network, owned by Learfield IMG College. In

addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches talk shows for both football and basketball.

Fischer also offers stations a weekly talk show about IU football and basketball that airs in several markets around the state during the school year.

During his years of work in Indiana, Fischer has been named the state's Sportscaster of the Year 31 times by two different organizations. The National Sports Media Association has awarded him 27 times, including the recently announced 2019 award, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him their honoree four times. In June of 2018 at the NSMA Awards program, Fischer was named the first recipient of the Woody Durham Voice of College Sports Award.

Fischer was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association Hall of Fame in 2004. He was inducted into the Indiana Broadcasters Association Hall of Fame in October 2010. Fischer has won several awards for best play by play, and has been honored by Indiana University with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University. This past year IU presented Fischer with the Bicentennial Medal in recognition of distinguished and distinctive service in support of the mission of Indiana University. He was also named an Honorary "I" Man in 1991.

Fischer has broadcast over 2,000 Indiana University games that include 12 bowl games, five NCAA basketball Final Fours, including four NCAA Championship games, and two NIT Championship games.

From 1973-87, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC, and several other major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis, as their source for reports during the month of May coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that 14-year period, he also served Indianapolis radio station WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their sports director.

As an independent contractor, Fischer served the Indianapolis Colts as their pre-season television anchor for 23 years from 1995-2017.

In addition, the City of Indianapolis, and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service and abilities as a play-by-play broadcaster.

A native of Rochelle, III., Fischer has been in the radio business for 54 years with stops in Butte, Mont.; Ottawa, III.; Springfield, III.; and Terre Haute, Ind

Fischer has four sons, 12 grandchildren and one great grandchild. He and his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood, Ind.



BUCK SUHR

Buck Suhr is entering his 17th season as the color commentator and analyst for Indiana University football.

Suhr was a member of the Hoosier football program for 18 years as a running backs coach and administrator. He spent 12 seasons (1984-95)

as running backs coach under IU's all-time winningest coach, Bill Mallory.

After his stint as a coach, where he tutored All-America selections Anthony Thompson and Vaughn Dunbar, Suhr was named administrative assistant to the head coach and athletic director from 1996-2001.

As running backs coach, Suhr helped direct one of the nation's most productive rushing attacks. From 1984-95, the Hoosiers had three different 1,000-yard rushers who topped that mark on six separate occasions. In 1988, the IU offense rushed for a then-school record 2,963 yards.

During his tenure, Suhr coached Thompson, the 1989 Heisman Trophy runner-up, along with Dunbar and Alex Smith, the 1994 UPI National Freshman of the Year. Suhr and his wife, Jane, are the parents of one son, Errek, and the deceased Jenny Suhr. Errek played in 74 games and earned four letters as a guard for the IU men's basketball program from 2004-07.

They have four grandchildren: Addy, Hayden, Taylor and Mack.



JOE SMITH

Joe Smith is in his 38th year with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pre-game, halftime, and post-game duties for Indiana football and men's basketball since 1983.

Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in Bloomington, is in his 52nd

year of radio broadcasting in Bloomington. He began his broadcasting career in 1969 at WAIK Radio in Galesburg, III. From 1973-89, Smith worked on "RFD-4 Agri-Business Show" on WTTV-4 with the late Bob Cook

In 1998, Smith was named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year; in April 2003, he was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters/Sportscasters Hall of Fame; and in Aug. 2021, he was welcomed into the Monroe County Sports Hall of Fame. Smith handled the IU TV Warmup Shows from 1978-82 and hosted several IU Coaches Shows from 1983-96 and again from 2002-04

He received the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University in June 2004.

In March 2020, Smith was given the IU Bicentennial Medal by President Michael A. McRobbie, awarded to organizations and individuals who, through their personal, professional, artistic or philanthropic efforts, have broadened the reach of Indiana University around the state, nation and world.

He has two children, both of whom are Indiana University graduates. Jeff, currently resides in Brownsburg, Ind., with his wife, Kristen, and their sons, Jayden, Kaleb and Logan. Joe's daughter, Jamie, and her husband, Eric, currently reside in Bloomington with their son, Ethan and two daughters, Emerson and Carolina.

POST-GAME NOTES

TEAM

- The Hoosiers and Vandals met for the first time and was IU's first meeting against the Big Sky
- Indiana has won seven of its last eight home games, including an unblemished 3-0 mark in 2020, and are 8-2 at Memorial Stadium since the start of 2019.
- The Hoosiers are 44-18 in Memorial Stadium openers with wins in 18 of their last 20 and 35 of their last 40.
- IU is 15-8 since the start of the 2019 season.
- Indiana head coach **Tom Allen** reached career-win No. 25 in his 48th career game. He is the thirdquickest coach in program history to 25 wins, trailing only James M. Sheldon (40 games) and James H. Horne (46 games).
- The Hoosiers scored 56 points, tied for the 10th-most points scored in a single game in program history. IU last posted 56 points in a 56-36 victory over Purdue on Nov. 30, 2013.
- The 42-point margin of victory is the largest for an Indiana team since the Hoosiers shut out Eastern Illinois, 56-0, on Sept. 7, 2019. The win is the third under Allen of 40-plus points.
- Sophomore **Javon Swinton** recorded a receiving and blocked punt return touchdown, the first Hoosier since *Mitchell Paige* (punt return, receiving) against Western Kentucky on Sept. 19, 2015, to reach the end zone on special teams and offense.
- Idaho won the coin toss and elected to receive.

OFFENSE

- Graduate transfer **Stephen Carr** posted his first 100-yard rushing game as a Hoosier and the second of his career with 118 yards on a career-high 22 carries (5.4 average) and one touchdown.
- Carr posted Indiana's first touchdown of the season on a 2-yard rush in the first quarter. It marked Carr's first TD as a Hoosier and the 13th of his career.
- IU's first touchdown drive covered 18 plays, the team's longest since a 19-play drive against Murray State on Sept. 6, 2008.
- Redshirt junior **Michael Penix Jr.** went 11-of-16 for 68 yards with a pair of passing scores and a 1-yard rushing touchdown, the fifth of his career. He moved into a tie for 10th on the school's career passing TD list with 27.
- Penix improved to 11-3 as a starter, recorded his eighth career multi-passing score game, and his
 fourth with at least one passing and one rushing touchdown.
- Sophomore AJ Barner hauled in his first career touchdown on a 76-yard catch-and-run in the fourth quarter. The scoring play was the first 70-yard receiving touchdown for the Hoosiers since Nick Westbrook had a 75-yard touchdown on Aug. 31, 2019 against Ball State.
- Senior **Ty Fryfogle** hauled in his first TD of the year with a 9-yarder in the second stanza. Fryfogle made five receptions for 29 yards and now shares No. 10 on the program's career receiving scores list with 14.
- Sophomore **Javon Swinton** recorded his first career touchdown, a 9-yarder, in the opening quarter. He finished with three receptions for 33 yards.
- Redshirt junior Davion Ervin-Poindexter totaled three carries for 17 yards and his first career rushing TD.
- Graduate transfer Camron Buckley made his first career start at Indiana and fifth overall.

DEFENSE

- Senior **Micah McFadden** forced a fumble on his first sack of the season (8.5 career) and graduate transfer **Weston Kramer** recovered it in the first quarter to give Indiana a takeaway in 38 of their last 41 games, and 17 of their last 18.
- Kramer's recovery was the first of his career.
- Senior **Cam Jones** added the Hoosiers second sack of the night, his first of 2021 and the sixth of his career. He finished the night with five stops.
- Junior **Tiawan Mullen** led the Hoosiers with a career-best nine total tackles. The Fort Lauderdale, Florida, native also set a career-high with seven solo stops.
- Redshirt senior husky Marcelino McCrary-Ball recorded five tackles, while graduate transfer Ryder Anderson tallied four stops and a TFL, the third of his Hoosier career and 18th of his collegiate career.
- Redshirt sophomore **Josh Sanguinetti** made his first career start. He made three tackles and broke up one pass in his debut start.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Indiana recorded a blocked punt return and a punt return for a score, marking the first time the Hoosiers scored a pair of special teams touchdowns in a game since Sept. 20, 1969, at Kentucky (2 punt returns).
- Redshirt junior **Noah Pierre** blocked a punt and sophomore **Javon Swinton** picked it up and scored from four yards out to put the Hoosiers up 21-0 in the first quarter.
- IU's last blocked punt came from *Jerome Johnson* in the 2021 Outback Bowl on Jan. 2, 2021.
- It marked the program's first blocked punt return for a touchdown since **Buster Larkins** (37 yards) at Michigan on Sept. 27, 2003.
- Sophomore AJ Barner added a the second blocked punt of the game in the fourth quarter, which redshirt junior Davion Ervin-Poindexter recovered.
- Graduate transfer **D.J. Matthews Jr.** collected his first punt return touchdown as a Hoosier and the second of his career, from 81 yards, to cap the team's scoring in the first half. The 81-yarder is the 10th-longest in program history.
- Redshirt junior Charles Campbell converted all six of his PAT attempts.
- Redshirt freshman Chris Freeman scored his first collegiate point with a made PAT in the fourth quarter.

- Western Kentucky won the coin toss and elected to defer.

OFFENSE

- Indiana marched 79 yards on 11 plays in 4:45 on the ballgame's opening drive, the second time it has scored on its first drive this season.
- The Hoosier offense piled up 507 total yards of offense on 92 snaps, the largest offensive output since it racked up 522 yards at Purdue on Nov. 30, 2019.
- Fifth-year senior tight end **Peyton Hendershot** became the 22nd Hoosier with 100 career catches (105) and 1,000 career yards (1,122) after he pulled in seven balls for 100 yards.
- Hendershot is the third tight end in IU history to amass 100 career receptions and 1,000 career yards, joining *Ted Bolser* (117/1,337; 2010-13) and *Bob Stephenson* (115/1,252; 1978-81).
- Hendershot's 100-yard receiving effort marks the fifth by a Hoosier tight end in program history and first since 1985. *Dave Lilja* gained 149 yards on 10 receptions vs. Navy on Sept. 21, 1985.
- Graduate transfer **Stephen Carr** collected his second 100-yard game of the season and the third of his career with 109 yards on 25 carries (4.4 ypc) and two rushing scores.
- Carr's multi-score effort marked his first since Aug. 31, 2019 against Fresno State (one rushing, one receiving). The game was also the first time he tallied two rushing touchdowns in a contest since Sept. 2, 2017 against Western Michigan.
- Redshirt-junior Michael Penix Jr. recorded the fifth 300-yard game of his career to move into a tie for No. 5 all-time at Indiana. He is tied with *Richard Lagow* (5; 2016-17) and just one behind *Peyton Ramsey* (6; 2017-19) for the No. 4 spot.
- In the process, Penix posted his ninth 200-yard passing game to take sole possession of No. 10 on the Indiana career record books.
- His 373 yards came on 35-of-53 passing, both career-high figures. He also reached the end zone on a 1-yard rush, his second of the year and the sixth of his career.
- Penix last recorded 300-plus passing yards at Ohio State (491) on Nov. 21, 2020.
- The 35 pass completions from Penix are tied for No. 5 in program history for a single game, matching the total set by Lagow on Oct. 22, 2016 at Northwestern.
- Senior **Ty Fryfogle** had team-highs in receptions (10) and targets (17). He hauled in double-digit receptions for the second time in his career (11, at Michigan State; Nov. 14, 2020).
- Redshirt-junior Miles Marshall made a career-high five catches for 64 yards.
- Redshirt-junior Jacolby Hewitt tallied career-highs with four receptions for 41 yards.

DEFENSE

- Senior **Micah McFadden** led the Hoosiers with a career-high 12 tackles (8 solos), the fourth doubledigit outing of his career. He added his second sack of the year and now has 9.5 in his career.
- McFadden surpassed the 150-tackle mark and sits at 158 in his career.
- Senior Raheem Layne moved past the 100-tackle mark with five stops and now has 104 in his career.
- Senior **Devon Matthews** locked up eight tackles in his return to go along with one pass breakup and one tackle for loss, the fourth of his career.
- The Jacksonville, Florida, native has recorded at least eight tackles three times in his career.
- Senior Cam Jones contributed six tackles (4 solos) and one tackle for loss to give him 2.0 on the season and 10.5 for his career.
- Junior **Tiawan Mullen** made the 20th start of his career and broke up a team-high three passes.
- Senior Reese Taylor, sixth-year senior Marcelino McCrary-Ball and senior Jaylin Williams each added five tackles for the Hoosiers.
- Ball and Williams each added one PBU.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Redshirt-junior **Charles Campbell** matched a program single-game record and set a career-high with four field goals on four attempts. Campbell connected on kicks from 46, 37, 25, and 48 yards to improve to 7-of-7 on the season and 19-of-20 (95.0 percent) in his career.
- Campbell's 4-for-4 effort marks the 10th by a Hoosier kicker connected on four field goals, with the last coming from against Ball State on August 31, 2019.
- The Jackson, Tennessee, native is 11-of-12 (91.7) in his career from 40-plus yards, including 4-of-4 this season. He owns five multi-field goal games in his career, with two coming in 2021.
- Campbell also hit all three extra points to set a career-high with 15 total points.
- Freshman **James Evans** averaged 45.0 yards on two punts and knocked one inside the 20-yard line.

- The Hoosiers have faced four teams currently ranked inside the Top-10 nationally through the first six games of the 2021 season.

OFFENSE

- Graduate transfer **Stephen Carr** combined for 96 yards of offense on 27 total touches. He pulled down a career-high and game-high eight receptions on eight targets for 43 yards.
- Carr also provided Indiana's lone touchdown of the game on a fourth-quarter plunge from one yard out. The score is his fourth rushing score of year and 16th of his career.
- Fifth-year senior **Peyton Hendershot** made three receptions for 32 yards. The North Salem, Indiana, native ranks third in program history among all tight ends with 114 career receptions for 1,236 yards. He trails only **Ted Bolser** (1,337 and 117 from 2010-13) and **Bob Stephenson** (1,252 and 115 from 1978-81) in the two categories.
- Fifth-year senior **Ty Fryfogle** was targeted a team-high 12 times and managed to pull down seven receptions for 65 yards. He currently stands at 2,056 career yards on 145 total receptions.
- The Lucedale, Mississippi, native is the 11th Hoosier to reach 2,000 yards. His receiving yardage ranks 10th all-time at IU after he passed **Cody Latimer** (2011-13) with today's receiving total. He also ranks eighth in career receptions after passing **Simmie Cobbs Jr.** (204-17), **Terrance Turner** (2007-10), and **Nick Westbrook** (2015-19) on the all-time IU list.
- Redshirt junior Jack Tuttle made his first start of the season and went 28-of-52 for 188 yards.

DEFENSE

- MSU came into game averaging 36.7 points, 217.2 rushing yards, 269.7 passing yards, and 486.8 total
 yards. The Hoosier defense held the Spartan attack to 20 points, 100 rushing yards, 141 passing yards,
 and 241 total yards.
- Junior running back Kenneth Walker III entered the contest with 913 rushing yards (152.2 per game). IU held the nation's leading rusher to 84 yards on 23 carries (3.7 yards per carry) and kept him out of the end zone. - Redshirt junior cornerback **Noah Pierre** made a career-high nine tackles including a team-best eight solo stops in his first career start. The Hialeah, Florida, native also intercepted his first career pass in the fourth quarter and contributed his first career TFL and pass breakup.
- IU has an interception in 13 of its last 17 contest and owns eight takeaways in 2021. The defense has collected 21 interceptions since the beginning of the 2020 season.
- The Hoosiers have 13 multi-INT games since the start of 2019.

 106 yards on six receptions and a pair of scores. He surpassed Ted Bolser's total of 1,337 from 2010-13.
- The North Salem, Indiana, native set the tight ends receptions mark last week and now has 125, which sits 17th all-time on the program's list. His 14 touchdowns are second to Bolser's 15 among tight ends in program history.
- Hendershot became the first tight end in IU history with multiple 100-yard receiving games, both coming this season.
- He also moved into the top 10 on the program's single-seasons receptions and yardage list for tight ends. He is No. 4 with 447 yards and tied for No. 6 with 35 catches. Hendershot already holds the top spots with 52 receptions. and 622 yards in 2019.

- Senior Ty Frytogle ranks No. 9 on the Hoosiers receiving yardage list with 2,164 career yards. Shane Wynn (2011-14) sits No. 8 with 2,198.
- The Lucedale, Mississippi, native secured four catches for 78 yards to become the seventh pass catcher in program history with 150 receptions.
- True freshman Donaven McCulley went 14-for-25 with 242 yards and a pair of touchdowns in his first career start.
- McCulley became the third IU true freshman quarterback to start (*Tre Roberson*, 2011; *Zander Diamont*, 2014) and the sixth to see game action (*Tim Clifford*, 1977; Roberson; *Nate Sudfeld*, 2012; Diamont; *Michael Penix Jr.*, 2018).
- Junior Matthew Bedford made the first start of his career at left guard and has now started at left tackle (8), right tackles (8), and right guard (6) in his career.
- Redshirt sophomore **Zach Carpenter** made his first start as a Hoosier and his first career start at right quard. He started twice at center in 2020 with the Wolverines.

DEFENSE

- Senior **Devon Matthews** added career-highs in tackles (12) and solos (10), both game-highs, in his 20th career start. He had 1.0 tackle for loss.
- Senior **Micah McFadden** recorded a sack in the second quarter to give him 5.5 this season and 13.0 in his career. McFadden now has a tackle for loss in 13 straight games.
- McFadden moved into No. 7 on the career tackles for loss ledger with 35.5. He closed the game with eight tackles (5 solo), two tackles for loss, and one sack.
