• Indiana kicks off its 138th season of football when it hosts Illinois to open the 2022 season on Friday, Sept. 2. Kickoff is set for 8 p.m. inside Memorial Stadium (55,250; Field Turf) on FS1.

N-N ON THE ROAD

• With the season opening falling on a Friday night, it will mark the first time IU has played under the Friday night lights of Memorial Stadium since at least 1995. The Hoosiers have played just two prior Friday contests in that span.

• Indiana has won 15-of-18 season openers, including seven straight from 2004-10 and five straight from 2012-16.

O-O AT HOME

- IU will open with a Big Ten foe for the fourth time in **Tom Allen**'s six campaigns and third straight season. Allen has faced No. 2 Ohio State (2017), No. 8 Penn State (2020) and No. 17 Iowa (2021) to open seasons with the Hoosiers.
- Indiana will kick off a campaign against Illinois for the for the fifth time in program history and the first time since 1974.

- Illinois has won three of the four season openers with IU's lone win coming in a 20-0 blanking of the Illini on August 26, 1959. The 1960, 1973 and 1974 meetings went the way of Illinois, with the '73 contest played in Bloomington, as well.
- Indiana and Illinois are meeting for the first time since 2017 and the first time in Bloomington since 2013.
- Since 2002, Indiana has opened the season at home in 13 of the 20 seasons. The Hoosiers own a 12-1 record in those games, with the lone loss to No. 2 Ohio State (2017).

Allen's 26 wins are tied for the most by a Hoosier head coach over the first five seasons with the program's all-time winningest coach, Bill Mallory. Allen is on pace to join some legendary names on IU's list.

SIX EARN PRESEASON ALL-B1G

The national Preseason All-Big Ten lists included eight different Hoosiers entering 2022, as Phil Steele and Pro Football Focus each released their lists in the offseason.

Defensively, linebacker Cam Jones, defensive back Devon Matthews, defensive back Tiawan Mullen and defensive back Jaylin Williams were among the four-team list released by Phil Steele. Specialists Place kicker Charles Campbell and long snapper Sean Wracher were also among Steele's list.

Campbell, Matthews, Mullen and Williams joined offensive lineman Luke Haggard and return specialist D.J. Matthews Jr. on the Pro Football Focus Preseason All-B1G squad.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

Parents, students and fans all remember those Friday nights sitting in the stands at local high schools around the country. However, Tom Allen was once roaming the high school sidelines in the Indiana as a head coach.

For the second time in his tenure as IU's head coach, Allen will walk the sidelines coaching a college game.

The game will mark the fifth time in program history that IU will play on a Friday night in the fall and its first since 2018. Three of the previous four Friday night games have been Big Ten contests.

The 1995 contest was a battle for the Old Oaken Bucket and was the only Friday night game played in Memorial Stadium before this season.

The regular season non-Saturday history with Illinois started on November 26, 1931 in Champaign. That game ended in a 0-0 tie, but the win was awarded to Indiana by virtue of an 8-4 edge in first downs.

The first non-Saturday contest in IU history was against border rival Kentucky on Thursday, November 30, 1893. The two teams played to a 24-24 tie in Lexinaton.

In all, Indiana holds an 8-3-1 mark in non-Saturday games in program history, with its last a setback to Ohio State (49-21) to open the 2017 season at Memorial Stadium.

TWO HOOSIERS ON COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME BALLOT

A pair of Indiana All-Americans in running back **Vaughn Dunbar** (1990-91) and quarterback **Antwaan Randle El** (1998-2001) are both on the ballot for the College Football Hall of Fame in 2022.

Randle El earned All-Big Ten distinction in 1999, 2000 and 2001, and was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 1998. The Big Ten MVP, and first-team All-American in 2001, Randle El finished sixth in the Heisman Trophy balloting that season.

The Riverdale, Illinois, native was the first in NCAA history to score 40 career touchdowns (45) and throw 40 career touchdown passes (42). He was also the first to record over 2,500 total yards in four seasons, and the first to both pass for over 6,000 and rush for over 3,000 career yards.

Dunbar was a first-team All-B1G pick and unanimous first-team All-American in 1991 when he led the nation in rushing (1,805) and finished sixth in Heisman voting.

The Fort Wayne, Indian, native posted consecutive 1,000-yard seasons and finished his career No. 3 on the career rushing charts at IU with 3,029 yards, a total that currently sits No. 7 all-time in program history. He led IU to a pair of bowl appearances and a win in the 1991 Copper Bowl as the game's offensive MVP.

Six Indiana football student-athletes are already among the less than one percent enshrined in the CFB Hall of Fame: **Zora Clevenger** (HB; 1900-03), **Alvin "Bo" McMillin** (Coach; 1934-47), **Pete Pihos** (End/FB' 1942-43, 45-47), **George Taliaferro** (HB; 1945, 47-48), **Anthony Thompson** (RB; 1986-89) and **John Tavener** (1941-44).

STAFF UPDATE

Head coach **Tom Allen** will have two new coordinators and a total of five new coaches on his staff entering the 2022 season.

The offensive will now be led by **Walt Bell** in his sixth season as a collegiate offensive coordinator, to go along with three seasons as the head coach at UMass.

Bell will be joined on the offensive staff by a pair of NFL veteran coaches in associate head coach **Craig Johnson** and co-offensive coordinator **Adam Henry**. Johnson will also coach the running backs, while Henry will work with the wide receivers.

Defensively, **Chad Wilt** joins the staff as the defensive coordinator and will also captain the linebackers. The defensive line will be led by **Paul Randolph**

FISCHER EARNS NFF AWARD, ENTERS 50TH SEASON

Entering his 50th season with the Indiana football program, the legendary "Voice of the Hoosiers" Don Fischer was named the 2022 recipient of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame's Chris Schenkel Award

The award recognizes individuals who have had long, distinguished careers broadcasting college football with direct ties to a specific university. Fischer will be honored during the 64th NFF Annual Awards Dinner Presented by Las Vegas on Dec. 6 alongside the recipients of the other NFF Mainr Awards

Fischer is the second longest tenured radio play-by-play announcer in college football, tied with Tommy Suggs of Clemson.

- Indiana's quarterback room has a pair of experienced quarterbacks that new offensive coordinator and position coach Walt Bell can look at when 2022 gets started in Connor Bazelak and Jack Tuttle.
- Bazelak began his career at Missouri, where he was the 2020 SEC Co-Freshman of the Year after throwing for 2,366 yards and seven touchdowns in eight starts (10 games played).
- The Dayton, Ohio, native followed that up with 2,548 yards passing and 16 touchdowns in 11 starts during the 2021 campaign.
- The four-star recruit out of Archbishop Alter finished his twoyear stay in Columbia, as just the ninth Tiger quarterback to pass for at least 5,000 yards in a career.
- **Jack Tuttle** stepped into a starting role in both the 2020 and 2021 seasons after injuries and has appeared in 14 games with four starts in his Hoosier career.
- Stepping in for the final three games of the 2020 season, Tuttle went 44-of-72 (61.1 percent) for 362 yards with two touchdowns and one interception and led the Hoosiers to a pair of victories and a berth in the Outback Bowl.
- In his first career start, he guided IU to a 14-6 win at No. 16 Wisconsin, the program's first win in Madison since 2001. Tuttle completed 13-of-22 for 130 yards with two TDs and zero INTs.
- The redshirt senior graduated with a supply chain management degree in May 2021 and is a two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree and 2021 semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy.
- Tuttle transferred from the University of Utah on Dec. 17, 2018, practiced with team, and was ruled eligible for the 2019 campaign in the spring. He did not see action at Utah.
- In five games in 2019, Tuttle went 6-of-11 for 34 yards and had nine rushes for 20 yards.

• A graduate of Mission Hills High School in San Marcos, Calif., Tuttle was a Rivals and 247Sports four-star prospect, the No. 4 pro-style quarterback nationally by Rivals, the No. 5 pro-style quarterback nationally by 247Sports, and the No. 13 player in California by 247Sports.

- Tuttle's father, Jay, was a walk-on kicker at IU (1986-88).
- Add into the mix **Grant Gremel**, who started the 2021 season finale at Purdue and was the first walk-on quarterback to start a game for IU since 1995.
- Redshirt-sophomore **Dexter Williams II** is also among the quarterback stable, as he redshirted his first season on campus, before an ACL injury ended his 2021 season during spring practice.
- Williams was among the top dual-threat quarterbacks in the country as a senior at Mount de Sales Academy in Georgia.
 24/7Sports rated him the No. 13 dual-threat quarterback nationally.
- The newcomer to the room is freshman Brendan Sorsby of Lake Dallas High School in Corinth, Texas. He threw for 1,271 yards in seven games during an injury-shortened senior season.
- Sorsby was the No. 13 rated pocket passer nationally per ESPN after he threw for 14 touchdowns in 2021.

- Senior **Matthew Bedford** planted roots on the Indiana offensive line upon his arrival in Bloomington and has started 27 of 28 career games played in the cream and crimson.
- IU's 2019 Offensive Newcomer of the Year, Bedford has made eight starts each at right guard, left tackle, and right tackle. His other three starts came at left guard.

- A senior out of Santa Rosa (Calif.) Junior College, Haggard was a team captain and an All-Bay 6 conference selection during his two years at junior college.
- Redshirt sophomore **Mike Katic** (6-4, 312) was named IU's 2020 Offensive Newcomer of the Year after starting four games at left guard with six appearances overall during his redshirt-freshman season.
- After winning the starting spot at left guard in 2021, Katic owns 13 career starts. He missed three games towards the end of 2021.
- **Zach Carpenter** (6-5, 320) joined the program as a transfer from the University of Michigan and participated in spring ball prior to the 2022 season.
- After appearing in five games with two starts during his two seasons at Michigan, Carpenter made three starts in five appearances during his first season in Bloomington in 2021.

- Darren Hiller is in his fifth season overseeing the offensive line. The 28-year coaching veteran has coached 23 players who have moved on to the NFL, including former Hoosiers Caleb Jones (tackle), Wes Martin (guard), Brandon Knight (tackle), Simon Stepaniak (guard), and Harry Crider (center).
- Crider was a 2021 free-agent signing of Philadelphia, Stepaniak was a sixth-round selection by Green Bay in the 2020 NFL Draft, Martin was a fourth-round selection by Washington in 2019, and Knight was a 2019 free-agent signing of Dallas.
- Tackle **Jason Spriggs** and guard **Dan Feeney** (New York Jets) were drafted in 2016 and 2017, respectively. Spriggs was taken in the second round by Green Bay and Feeney was selected a third-round pick by the Los Angeles Chargers.

- The New Jersey native compiled 209 yards rushing during his career with the Tar Heels.
- Indiana's Mr. Football in 2019, **Charlie Spegal** entered the season as the most experienced running back at IU, as he rushed for 62 yards on 19 carries during his redshirt-freshman season in 2021.
- Both **David Hollowman** and **Trent Howland** saw time during their true freshmen seasons in 2021, with each receiving a redshirt season.

- In four games, Matthews Jr. caught 13 passes for 165 yards and returned four punts for 83 yards and one touchdown. He took a punt 81 yards for a score against Idaho in week two.
- In 35 games (16 starts) at FSU, Matthews had 84 receptions for 809 yards and five touchdowns to go along with one punt return TD.
- The Jacksonville, Florida, native finished his FSU career No. 10 on the program's career punt return yards (582) and returns (56). He also holds two of the top-4 single-game marks.
- Matthews did not play in 2020 while finishing his interdisciplinary social science degree.

- One of the most followed storylines during fall camp was the move of sophomore **Donaven McCulley** from quarterback to wide receiver after one season on campus.
- After staring four games and quarterback in 2021, McCulley made the move to wide receiver during spring practice.
- McCulley threw a number of his touchdown passes to freshman **Omar Cooper Jr.** while the duo played together at Lawrence North High School in Indianapolis.
- Cooper Jr. was rated as the No. 155 prospect nationally and the No. 22 wide receiver nationally entering his first season on campus in 2022.
- A pair of transfers will also look to make an impact in 2022 as **Cam Camper** (Trinity Valley C.C.) and **Emery Simmons** (North Carolina) each had solid fall camps.
- Simmons committed to Indiana out of high school, before ultimately choosing North Carolina and spending three seasons in Chapel Hill.
- He caught 30 passes for 516 yards and three touchdowns over 30 games played, with one scoring grab in each of his three seasons.
- Camper was a football walk-on at Sam Houston State for one season before he spent two years at Trinity Valley C.C. in Texas where he caught 50 passes for 858 yards and four touchdowns.
- From his senior year of high school to this season, Camper great five inches and gained 40 pounds thanks to a late growth spurt.

- Barner was his conference defensive player of the year as a senior in high school.
- Behind Barner are a pair of redshirt freshmen in James Bomba and Aaron Steinfeldt, while true freshmen Brody Foley and Ryan Miller enter as heralded recruits.
- Bomba is an Indiana legacy, as his father, Matt (1990-92), and grandfathers, Brad (1954-56) and Bob Van Pelt (1964-66), all lettered in football at IU. His mother, Kelly, an executive associate athletic director for the Hoosiers.
- Bomba went to Bloomington South High School and was a two-time all-state pick.
- Steindeldt is a Bloomington North product and earned allstate honors twice as a prep standout. He was the Indiana Football Coaches Association Mr. Football positional winner as a senior.
- A three-sport all-conference performer that also earned honorable mention all-state honors in basketball.
- He appeared in one game during his true freshman season, the series finale at Purdue.

• A pair of Ohio products crossed the border for college, as Foley (Cincinnati) and Miller (Chagrin Falls) were each among the top-30 national tight end prospects.

- Special teams coordinator **Kasey Teegardin** enters his third season and has helped turn the unit into one of the more consistent in the Big Ten.
- His 2020 unit ranked No. 5 in ESPN's special teams efficiency rankings.
- Place kicker Charles Campbell was Phil Steele's first-team All-Big Ten kicker in 2020 after he won the starting role during camp and connected on 10-of-11 field goals (90.9 percent) and all 25 extra points.
- The Jackson, Tennessee, native led the conference in field goal percentage (No. 9 nationally), finished third in field goals made and scoring per game among kickers (6.9), tied for third in field goals made per game (1.3, T-28th), finished fourth in PATs made, and tied for sixth in scoring per game among all players.
- Campbell made all three of his attempts from 50-plus yards in 2020 to become the second Hoosier to record three 50-yarders in one season (*Pete Stoyanovich*, 1988).
- The redshirt senior is one of four IU kickers with three 50-yarders in his career (Stoyanovich, 6; *Frank Stavroff*, 3; *Griffin Oakes*, 3) and the second Hoosier (*Chris Gartner* at Kentucky Sept. 30, 1972) with a pair of 50-yarders in a single game with makes from 50 and 53 yards in the Outback Bowl vs. Ole Miss.
- The 53-yarder set an Indiana and Outback Bowl record and shares third in school history.
- Campbell a two-time Groza Star of the Week: a three field goal performance versus Rutgers (2020) and a program-record-tying four made field goals at Western Kentucky (2021).
- Campbell was a U.S. Army All-American and kicked in the 2018 U.S. Army All-American Bowl out of University School of Jackson

- Sophomore **James Evans** took over the reins at punter in 2021 after he enrolled in 2021 spring classes and participated in practice after committing to Indiana sight unseen in person.
- He trained under Nathan Chapman and John Smith at Prokick Australia and hadn't played a down of American football or visited the United States prior to his arrival in Bloomington.
- Sean Wracher earned third-team All-Big Ten honors from Phil Steele in each of his three seasons on campus and is a Patrick Mannelly Award watch list member entering 2022.
- He has started all 33 games since stepping foot on campus and has snapped for all-league kickers *Logan Justus* (2019) and Campbell (2020), and a Ray Guy Award semifinalist in Whitehead (2020).
- The Akron, Ohio, native was a Kohl'sKicking.com five-star prospect and ranked the No. 1 long snapper nationally by Kornblue Kicking.

- Along with three-year letterwinner and 2019 honorable mention All-Big Ten pick **Demarcus Elliott, Sio Nofoagatoto'a** (three letters) and **James Head Jr.** (four letters) have played their fair share of football.
- Elliott has started 30 of the 32 games in which he has appeared since his arrival in Bloomington from Garden City (Kan.) Community College in 2019.
- He has piled up 78 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss and three sacks from his spot on the interior line.
- With his media degree in hand, Head Jr. has appeared in 39 games tied for No. 7 on the team entering the season with 20 starts.
- Limited to just seven games due to injury in 2021, Head has produced 58 tackles in his 39 appearances with 10.0 tackles for loss.

• Even some of the new faces on the line enter the 2022 season with extensive experience in the college game, with transfer student-athletes **LeDarrius Cox** (Ole Miss), **Patrick Lucas Jr.** (Ole Miss) and **JH Tevis** (Cal) all appearing in double-digit games prior to arriving on campus.

- Don't expect a drop off at linebacker due to the departure of *Micah McFadden*, as **Cam Jones** is back for his final collegiate season as the anchor of the IU defense.
- An honorable-mention All-Big Ten pick in 2020, a two-time team captain, and Academic All-Big Ten selection, started his career at the husky position, but has appeared in 31 games at linebacker since moving in 2019.
- He made his first career start in the 2020 opener and win over No. 8 Penn State, where he made a then-career-best seven stops, one for loss, and matched a career-high with six solos.
- In 2021, Jones nearly doubled his career high in single season tackles with 64 after back-to-back 35-stops seasons in 2019 and 2020.
- His 154 career tackles are the most on the team entering the 2022 season, just ahead of **Devon Matthews** (151).
- Jones' eight takeaways are tied for the most among returning IU defenders (Tiawan Mullen). His takeaway ledger includes four forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and two interceptions.
- Aaron Casey will don the iconic No. 44 this season in honor of IU legend *George Taliaferro*, who was the first African American drafted by an NFL team.
- With his public financial management degree already complete, Casey is primed to earn the second starting linebacker spot after 33 appearances and no starts entering the season.
- Even with no starts, Casey still owns 45 tackles and 5.5 for loss in his career, playing in every game during his three seasons on the field.

- Transfers **Jared Casey** and **Bradley Jennings Jr.** will add depth to an otherwise young corps.
- Casey played three seasons at Kentucky before arriving in Bloomington, where he appeared in 27 games with 30 tackles.
- Jennings Jr. will enter his fifth season of college football with 35 games played and 68 tackles in a career that began at the University of Miami.
- The highest rated prospect to sign with Indiana, Dasan McCullough looks to make an impact during his true freshman season on campus after staring as a senior at Bloomington South High School.
- A consensus four-star recruit, McCullough was rated as the 40th prospect and No. 4 outside linebacker nationally, and the No. 1 prospect in Indiana by ESPN.
- He played his first three prep seasons at Blue Valley High School in Kansas, while his father, Deland, was a part of the Kansas City Chiefs coaching staff.

- No unit is more decorated entering the 2022 season than the men patrolling the boundaries for IU, as **Tiawan Mullen** (1st team) and **Jaylin Williams** (2nd team) became the first cornerback duo in Indiana history to earn All-Big Ten honors in the same season in 2020.
- Mullen, who allowed just 14 completions in 2020, earned first-team All-America accolades from the Football Writers Association of America, the first cornerback in school history to collect first-team recognition and just the second (Tim Wilbur, 2nd team in 1980) to achieve All-America status.
- The Fort Lauderdale, Fla., native was the program's first cornerback to secure first-team all-conference honors since *Tracy Porter* in 2007.
- For the third straight season, Mullen finds himself on the preseason watch list for the Bednarik Award, as he is tied as the team's active leader (**Cam Jones**) with eight career takeaways (3 interceptions, 3 forced fumbles, and 2 fumble recoveries).
- In the 2020 victory at Michigan State, Mullen recorded the first two interceptions of his career to mark the first multi-pick game at IU since *Jonathan Crawford* vs. Purdue in 2016.
- Along with his 2020 All-America honors, Mullen wsa a Freshman All-American (247Sports, The Athletic) and honorable-mention All-Big Ten in 2019.
- His older brother, Trayvon, played cornerback at Clemson University (2016-18) and is a member of the Las Vegas Raiders, and his cousin (mother's side), Lamar Jackson, played at Louisville (2015-17) and is the Baltimore Ravens quarterback.
- Trevell Mullen joins his older brother on the Indiana roster this season after a standout prep career that earned him a top-200 national ranking from ESPN and Rivals while at Coconut Creek High School in Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

- Williams, a senior out of Memphis, is the team's active leader in interceptions (6) and ranks No. 2 on the team in career games played (44) entering the 2022 campaign.
- His six career takeaways are tied for No. 3 on the team (Bryant Fitzgerald), behind Cam Jones and Mullen with eight takeaways.
- He opened 2020 with INTs in three-consecutive games and finished with four overall, which tied for the team lead, ranked third in the Big Ten, and shared eighth nationally.
- Redshirt sophomore **Lem Whatley-Neely** and Alabama transfer **Brylan Lanier**, along with newcomers **James Monds III** and **Jamari Sharpe**, will add needed depth to a position that was ravaged with injury in 2021.
- Watley-Neely has two career appearances under his belt as he enters his third season on campus. An all-state pick from Harper Woods (Mich.) High School, he played nine different positions in his senior season and hauled in three interceptions.
- It doesn't get more Alabama than Lanier, who attended Paul W. Bryant High School in Tuscaloosa and then walked on for the Crimson Tide in 2021. He received his redshirt season prior to transferring to Indiana.
- Monds III comes from a football family, as his cousin, Mario Monds; and uncle, Wonder Monds; both played college football.
 A first-team all-state pick out of Vero Beach (Fla.) High School, Monds III enrolled early and participated in spring practice.
- A native of Miami, Florida, Sharpe helped Northwestern High School to the FHSAA 6A state title as a sophomore. He played three years at wideout before moving to cornerback as a senior.

IU UNVEILS GEORGE TALIAFERRO STATUE IN GEORGE TALIAFERRO PLAZA

Former Indiana University President Michael A. McRobbie presided over the dedication of the George Taliaferro Plaza on Friday, Nov. 1, 2019, unveiling a bronze statue of Taliaferro, one of the most important and influential individuals in the history of Indiana University and IU Athletics.

McRobbie led the dedication ceremony, which took place on the newly-dedicated plaza located on the ground level of Memorial Stadium outside of the North End Zone facility. Other speakers at the event included IU Board of Trustee member Quinn Buckner, former Indiana University Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Fred Glass, head football coach Tom Allen, Senior Associate Athletic Director Anthony Thompson and fifth-year senior linebacker Reakwon Jones.

"Throughout his life, not only did George Taliaferro excel as an athlete, but he also overcame the real-world struggles of racism and prejudice, of segregation and oppression," McRobbie said. "And in the process, he demonstrated courage, determination and perseverance, and earned a special place in the annals of our state and its flagship public university.

"In George Taliaferro Plaza and its centerpiece statue, every visitor to Indiana Memorial Stadium will be reminded of the enormous contributions George made to IU and to this community, as an outstanding athlete, as a champion of racial equality, as a dedicated educator and administrator, as a tireless community activist, and as a friend and mentor to many."

"It is fitting that during our Bicentennial year, we are dedicating this plaza and statue in honor of one of the most important figures in the history not only of Indiana University Athletics, but of Indiana University as a whole," said Glass. "I am particularly grateful to President McRobbie and Trustee Buckner for their support in permanently and prominently recognizing this Hoosier pioneer at the entryway of IU Football where he will be seen every day by IU players, coaches, and recruits."

Taliaferro, who passed away Oct. 8, 2018, at the age of 91, was a legendary Indiana University football player during the 1940s who shattered racial barriers on campus and in the sport. In doing so, he left an indelible mark on both.

The Gary, Ind., native was a three-time All-American at IU who led the Hoosiers' unbeaten 1945 Big Ten Championship team in rushing. He'd go on to lead the program in rushing twice and passing once, and following the 1948 season he became the first African-American drafted by an NFL team when the Chicago Bears selected him in the 13th round.

Taliaferro would eventually spend seven years in the NFL, earning Pro Bowl honors three times. He totaled 2,255 rushing yards, 1,300 receiving yards, 1,633 passing yards, and accounted for 37 touchdowns while playing for franchises in New York, Dallas, Baltimore, and Philadelphia. He also became the only player in league history to play seven positions — running back, quarterback, wide receiver, cornerback, punter, punt returner, and kickoff returner.

While those feats make him one of the most accomplished players in IU and Big Ten history, his contributions extended well beyond the collegiate and professional playing fields.

During the 1940s, Taliaferro and IU President Herman B Wells played a pivotal role in desegregating the IU campus and the City of Bloomington. During the era, Taliaferro was not allowed to eat at many local restaurants. When Wells found out that Taliaferro had to return home between classes because no nearby restaurants would serve him, Wells arranged for the two to have lunch at a nearby campus establishment. Wells and Taliaferro had lunch, and IU and the Bloomington community took a giant step toward desegregation.

Taliaferro's contributions did not end at the conclusion of his playing career. A 1951 IU graduate who later earned a Master's Degree from Howard University, Taliaferro returned to IU in 1972 and served as special assistant to IU President John Ryan. In that role and other roles on campus during the next two decades, he was a valuable and outspoken voice on social justice issues.

Taliaferro's lifetime of accomplishments are chronicled on the statue, which is the work of Brian Hanlon, owner of Hanlon Studios. Hanlon has produced more than 300 works in both public and private collections, including the five granite monuments commemorating IU Basketball's five national championships.





TERRY TALLEN INDIANA FOOTBALL COMPLEX

The Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex officially opened on Aug. 13, 2019. Former Indiana University Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Fred Glass announced a major gift by alumnus and former IU Football captain Terry Tallen to the Indiana University Bicentennial Campaign for Athletics on April 20, 2018. This \$2 million commitment helped provide funding for the renovation of the football team area in Memorial Stadium. In recognition of his gift, the area is permanently named the Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex.

The Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex fills 25,000+ square feet underneath the west stands of Memorial Stadium. The complex includes the Trent and Julie Green Locker Room (named in 2003), coaches' locker room, team lounge, recruiting area, equipment room and Dr. John M. Miller Training Room (named in 1994).

Tallen graduated from the Indiana University Kelley School of Business in 1982, and while earning his degree, was also a three-year letterman. Terry was elected team co-captain in 1979 and 1980. The 1979 team was nationally ranked and won the Holiday Bowl, the Hoosiers first bowl victory. Terry was named the United Press International's Defensive Player of the Week following Indiana's Homecoming victory over Wisconsin in 1980.

In 2001, Terry founded Tallen Capital Partners, LLC, and remains the company's Chairman and CEO. Tallen Capital Partners, LLC is a privately held, vertically integrated retail and mixed-use real estate investment and development organization with offices in San Diego and San Francisco. Prior to founding Tallen Capital Partners and becoming an entrepreneur, Terry enjoyed a corporate career as a senior executive with some of our country's largest public as well as private companies. He is considered one of the leading shopping center investors and developers in the Western U.S.

- The 2020 American Football Coaches Association National Coach of the Year, Tom Allen's 26 wins are tied for the most for an Indiana head football coach over his first six seasons with the program's all-time winningest coach Bill Mallory.

- A 30-year coaching veteran, Allen was named the program's 29th head football coach on Dec. 1, 2016.
- Made his head coaching debut in the 2016 Foster Farms Bowl.
- The New Castle, Ind., native joined Indiana's staff as associate head coach/defense on Jan. 15, 2016, and he promptly went on to become a Broyles Award nominee.
- Allen has strong ties to the Hoosier state as he served as head coach at Ben Davis High School (2004-06), defensive coordinator at Ben Davis (1998-03) and Marion High School (1997), and earned his master's degree from IU (2002).
- Over the past 27 seasons, the teams for which Allen has been a member of the coaching staff have posted a combined record of 248-1000 (.713).

MAKING HISTORY (2020)

- Indiana (6-2, 6-1 B1G) finished the year ranked for a program record 10-consecutive weeks, including a No. 12 final rating from the Associated Press, its highest final ranking since 1967 (No. 4).
- IU played in consecutive January bowl games for the first time in school history with its invitation to the 2021 Outback Bowl.
- The Hoosiers were ranked in the Top 10 six times, the secondmost in program history behind the 1945 team (9 weeks).
- Indiana collected its first Top-10 ranking in the Nov. 8 AP Poll (No. 10) since Sept. 22, 1969 (No. 10).
- IU's No. 7 rating (Dec. 13, 20) was its best in the AP Poll since Nov. 27, 1967 (No. 4).
- The Hoosiers three Top-25 victories tied for the third-most in the country and matched the school record (1945).
- Indiana clinched a winning league record in consecutive seasons for the first time since 1987-88 and for the sixth time overall (1967-68, 1944-46, 1936-37).
- IU's six conference wins tied for the most in program history (1967, 1987).
- The Hoosiers 11 Big Ten victories over the 2019-20 seasons tied for the most in a two-year span in school history (1987-88).
- Indiana collected its first win over No. 16 Wisconsin (14-6) since defeating the Badgers in 2001 and 2002, the former coming at Camp Randall Stadium.
- IU recorded its first road victory over a ranked opponent since No. 18 Missouri in 2014, and its first B1G road win over a ranked opponent since No. 22 Michigan State in 2001.
- The Hoosiers matched a program record with five-straight league victories (1967) before losing at No. 3 Ohio State and have won 11 of their last 14, their most successful stretch in conference games in school history.
- Indiana defeated Michigan State, 24-0, to reclaim the Old Brass Spittoon for the first time since 2016 and earn its first win in East Lansing since 2001.
- IU's 38-21 victory over No. 23 Michigan was its first over the Wolverines since 1987.
- The Hoosiers 36-35, overtime win against No. 8 Penn State in the season opener was the sixth against a Top-10 opponent in program history, with the last coming at No. 9 Ohio State in 1987.
- It marked Indiana's first Top-10 victory at Memorial Stadium since 1967 (No. 3 Purdue).
- IU defeated PSU, U-M, MSU, and UW in the same season for the first time in school history and beat the Wolverines and Spartans in the same year for the first time since 1967.

BREAKTHROUGH SEASON (2019)

- · Guided the Hoosiers to the 2020 TaxSlayer Bowl, the program's first bowl game in the state of Florida.
- Indiana finished with an 8-5 record and a 5-4 Big Ten mark.
- IU reached eight wins for just the eighth time in school history and the first time since 1993, and it finished one win shy of matching the program record set in 1945 and 1967.
- The Hoosiers five-conference wins tied for the fourth-most in school history, one off the program record of six (1967, 1987, 2020).
- Indiana posted a winning conference mark for the first time since 1993 (5-3) and its first winning season overall since 2007 (7-6).
- . On Nov. 10, IU entered the Associated Press Poll (No. 24) for the first time since Sept. 20, 1994, and moved into the Coaches Poll (No. 25) for the first time since Oct. 17, 1994.


- · Achieved unparalleled recruiting success. IU's 2022 signing class was the highest rated in program history and finished in the Top 25 nationally, besting the previous top-ranked classes of 2018 and 2019, and included a record eight four-star prospects.
- The 2021 class locked in five of the Top 11 prospects in the state of Indiana
- · Three coaches on Allen's staffs have been candidates for the Broyles Award, including 2020 finalist Kane Wommack and 2019 semifinalist Kalen DeBoer.
- · Wommack is currently the South Alabama head coach and DeBoer is the Washington head coach.
- In his four seasons as head coach, 54 Hoosiers have earned All-Big Ten honors.
- Tiawan Mullen became the first cornerback in program history to garner first-team All-America recognition in 2020.
- Wide receiver Ty Fryfogle and linebacker Micah McFadden collected third-team All-America accolades, giving Indiana three All-Americans in the same campaign for the first time since 2007.
- A school record 16 IU standouts received All-Big Ten honors in 2021 and Fryfogle became the first wideout in Indiana history to be named the Big Ten Richter-Howard Receiver of the Year.
- Fryfogle also was one of 11 Biletnikoff Award semifinalists, and Michael Penix Jr. was one of 17 Davey O'Brien Award semifinalists.
- · A program record seven Hoosiers, including a school record four first-teamers, earned defensive recognition in 2021.
- Thirteen IU players secured 2017 all-conference honors, including six defenders, which matched 2016's mark.
- Mullen was named a 2019 True Freshman All-American.
- Thirty Hoosiers have been drafted or invited to NFL camps over the last five seasons, including a school-record 11 in 2018.
- · Fifteen have worked out over the last four NFL Combines, highlighted by a program-record five in 2018.
- Linebacker Micah McFadden (5th round, New York Giants-2022), safety Jamar Johnson (5th round, Denver-2021), guard Simon Stepaniak (6th round, Green Bay-2020), guard Wes Martin (4th round, Washington-2019), tight end Ian Thomas (4th round, Carolina-2018), and linebacker Chris Covington (6th round, Dallas-2018) have been selected in the NFL Draft.
- Wide receiver Simmie Cobbs Jr., kicker Griffin Oakes, and linebacker Tegray Scales garnered 2017 first-team all-league recognition. Oakes was named the Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year.
- Harry Crider became the 10th Hoosier to receive Academic All-America honors in 2021.
- A school-record 39 student-athletes collected Academic All-Big Ten in 2021, and Allen's five-year mark stands at 134.





IN THE BOOTH

Indiana University's football program receives some of the most extensive media coverage in the country. Learfield IMG College holds the exclusive rights as IU's official radio outlet.



DON FISCHER

Don Fischer is in his 50th year as the "Radio Voice" of Indiana University football and basketball games. The past 36 years, Fischer has worked as an independent contractor, and is currently serving the IU Radio Network, owned by Learfield. In addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the

weekly coaches talk shows for both football and basketball. Fischer also offers stations a weekly talk show about IU football and basketball that airs in several markets around the state during the school year.

During his years of work in Indiana, Fischer has been named the state's Sportscaster of the Year 31 times by two different organizations. The National Sports Media Association has awarded him 27 times, including the 2019 award, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him their honoree four times. In June of 2018 at the NSMA Awards program, Fischer was named the first recipient of the Woody Durham Voice of College Sports Award.

Fischer was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association Hall of Fame in 2004. He was inducted into the Indiana Broadcasters Association Hall of Fame in October 2010. Fischer has won several awards for best play by play, and has been honored by Indiana University with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University. In 2020, IU presented Fischer with the Bicentennial Medal in recognition of distinguished and distinctive service in support of the mission of Indiana University. He was also named an Honorary "I" Man in 1991.

Fischer has broadcast over 2,100 Indiana University games that include 12 bowl games, five NCAA basketball Final Fours, including four NCAA Championship games, and two NIT Championship games.

From 1973-87, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC, and several other major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis, as their source for reports during the month of May coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that 14-year period, he also served Indianapolis radio station WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their sports director.

As an independent contractor, Fischer served the Indianapolis Colts as their pre-season television anchor for 23 years from 1995-2017.

In addition, the City of Indianapolis, and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service and abilities as a play-by-play broadcaster.

A native of Rochelle, Illinois, Fischer has been in the radio business for 56 years with stops in Butte, Montana; Ottawa, Illinois; Springfield, Illinois; and Terre Haute, Indiana

Fischer his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood, Indiana, and have four sons, 12 grandchildren and one great grandchild.



RHETT LEWIS

Former Indiana wide receiver and current NFL Network broadcaster, Rhett Lewis is in his first season as Indiana's football radio analyst.

Lewis played at IU from 2001-05 and graduated with a B.S. in sports broadcasting (2005) and an M.S. in sports administration (2006).

Lewis is a host across several NFL Network programs, including NFL Now, NFL Total Access, and Path to the Draft. He also hosts various SiriusXM shows, including regular appearances on SiriusXM Big Ten Radio.

In 2014, Lewis spent five years as an anchor and reporter at WHDH in Boston, where he began using his middle name of Lewis as his last name professionally. He covered all four major pro championships (Super Bowl, NBA Finals, World Series, Stanley Cup Finals), and five championships total.

Before joining WHDH in May of 2009, Lewis spent eight months at WVUE, the FOX affiliate in his hometown of New Orleans. He also spent two years as the sports director at the CBS affiliate (KLBK) in Lubbock, Texas. Lewis also interned with WISH-TV in Indianapolis.

His father, Dean Kleinschmidt, served as Indiana's head football trainer from 2004-06. Dean was a head trainer in the NFL for 41 seasons — 31 with the New Orleans Saints, two with the Washington Redskins, and eight with the Detroit Lions.

A 1970 IU graduate, Dean is in the National Athletic Trainers Association Hall of Fame and the New Orleans Saints Hall of Fame.

Rhett's wife, Kayna - an honorary Hoosier, is also in television as a national correspondent for ABC News. They have two future Hoosier wide receivers, Conway (4) and Wylder (3).



JOE SMITH

Joe Smith is celebrating his 40th season with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pregame, halftime, and post-game duties for Indiana football and men's basketball since 1983, and he will host the football post-game, call-in show in 2022.

Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in Bloomington, is in his 53rd year of radio broadcasting in Bloomington. He began his broadcasting career in 1969 at WAIK Radio in Galesburg, Illinois. From 1973-89, Smith worked on "RFD-4 Agri-Business Show" on WTTV-4 with the late Bob Cook.

In 1998, Smith was named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year; in April 2003, he was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters/Sportscasters Hall of Fame; and in Aug. 2021, he was welcomed into the Monroe County Sports Hall of Fame. Smith handled the IU TV Warmup Shows from 1978-82, and he hosted several IU Coaches Shows from 1983-96 and again from 2002-04.

He received the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal that goes to non-IU alumni for distinguished service to the University in June 2004

In March 2020, Smith was given the IU Bicentennial Medal by President Michael A. McRobbie, awarded to organizations and individuals who, through their personal, professional, artistic or philanthropic efforts, have broadened the reach of Indiana University around the state, nation, and world.

He has two children, both of whom are Indiana University graduates. Jeff, resides in Brownsburg, Indiana, with his wife, Kristen, and their sons, Jayden, Kaleb, and Logan. Joe's daughter, Jamie, and her husband, Eric, reside in Bloomington with their son, Ethan, and two daughters, Emerson and Carolina.
