SETTING THE SCENE

- Indiana returns home for a Homecoming matchup with Rutgers on Saturday (Oct. 21) at Memorial Stadium. The game will be televised on Big Ten Network with a noon kick time.
- Saturday will mark the 10th meeting between the two programs, with all of them as members of the Big Ten Conference. The two program's first met in Piscataway, New Jersey, in 2014 - Rutgers first season in the Big Ten - and the first meeting in Bloomington, Indiana, followed in 2015.

2-1 AT HOME

- Rutgers' addition to the Big Ten Conference prompted the Big Ten's East/West Division format and the two teams have played every season since 2014. Overall, Indiana leads the series, 5-4, with each team winning twice in Bloomington.
- It has been a series of streaks, with Rutgers winning the first two meetings, before Indiana reeled off five straight victories from 2016-2020. The Scarlet Knights have won last two meetings, including a 2021 win in Bloomington.
- It marks the 110th Homecoming Game for the Hoosiers. Indiana owns a 45-58-6 record in front of the Homecoming crowd.

NEWS & NOTES

- Per Pro Football Focus, redshirt senior Andre Carter ranks No. 5 in the Big Ten with 22 total pressures (sacks, QB hits or hurries), a total that sits tied for No. 29 in the Power 5 and No. 45 in the FBS.
- With 2.0 tackles for loss in each of the first two games of the season, Carter's 4.0 TFLs were the most by a Hoosier in the first two games of a season since 2004 when *Kyle Killion* posted 5.5 tackles for loss.
- With 50 tackles, redshirt senior Aaron Casey ranks No. 6 in the Big Ten and his 8.3 tackles per game are No. 43 nationally entering Week 8. His 8.0 tackles for loss lead the conference and includes 3.0 sacks.

• Sophomore Jaylin Lucas produced the first multi-touchdown game of his career in Week 2 versus Indiana State with a pair of rushing scores. He has eight career touchdowns (four rush, two receiving, two KR) after a 44-yard receiving score at Michigan in Week 7.

• Senior Louis Moore grabbed his first career interception in the second quarter versus Akron and followed that with his first defensive touchdown in the third quarter on a 22-yard interception return for a score versus the Zips.

- With three interceptions on the season, sophomore Phillip Dunnam continues to sit near the top of the Big Ten leader board and tied for No. 12 in the FBS. One of two true freshman not to redshirt in 2022, Dunnam has takeaways versus No. 3/4 Ohio State, Louisville and Akron.
- The Indiana special teams units blocked its first kick of the 2023 season at Maryland to move its streak to 12 straight seasons with at least one blocked kick. Special teams coordinator Kasey Teegardin's crew has blocked at least one kick in each of his four seasons as the corps leader.

• With its successful onside kick to start the second half versus Louisville at Lucas Oil Stadium, Indiana snapped a streak of eight straight unsuccessful onside kick attempts and recovered its first onside kick since the 2017 game at Purdue.

Indiana has won seven games in professional stadiums and won its 2019 trip to Lucas Oil Stadium with a 34-24 victory over Ball State under head coach **Tom Allen**

ONE-SCORE SQUAD

Over head coach **Tom Allen**'s tenure, Indiana has played 30 games decided by eight-or-fewer points, including two during the 2023 season. His resume features 13 wins, including three wins in each of the 2022, 2019 and 2018 seasons.

In Week 4, Indiana scored won a four overtime contest over Akron in the second one possession game of the season. The first was a comeback attempt that fell just short, 21-14, versus Louisville at Lucas Oil Stadium in Week 3.

In 2022, Indiana played five one possession games to mark its most since it played six during the 2018 season. The Hoosiers finished 3-2 in those games, including a 39-31 double-overtime victory at Michigan State to win the Old Brass Spittoon.

Allen started his tenure at the head of the program with a one possession contest against Utah in the Foster Farms Bowl.

SOUAD GOALS: INDIANA STATE EDITION

Against Indiana State on Sept. 8, the Indiana football program accomplished some things it hadn't done in a while and put some numbers among the program's top 10 in school history.

Defense

- Allowed just 93 yards of total offense, which are the second fewest yards allowed by an Indiana defense since at least 1996.
 The fewest yards of total offense allowed by a Hoosier defense is 75 yards versus Rutgers in 2019.
- The 21 passing yards allowed are the third fewest allowed by Indiana since at least 1996. IU allowed zero passing yards against Charleston Southern in 2017 and one yard to Rutgers in 2019.
- Held Indiana State to just eight first downs in the game, its fewest in a game since it allowed six to Rutgers in 2019. It is the fifth time since at least 1996 that Indiana allowed eight-or-fewer first downs in a game.

Offense:

- The offense gained 33 first downs tied for No. 10 all-time in a single game in program history and were the most since 35 at Western Kentucky in 2021.
- With 558 yards of total offense, it marked the eighth time under head coach **Tom Allen** the offense gained at least 500 yards of total offense and the first since Western Kentucky in 2021.
- The 340 yards (116 rushing; 224 passing) of total offense in the first half are the most in a half since it gained 351 yards (100 rushing; 251 passing) at Rutgers in 2016.
- Five Indiana rushing touchdowns were the most by an IU team since it had six against Maryland in 2016. The five rushing touchdowns are the most by a Allen coached team.
- Indiana converted 12 of the 16 third down attempts in the game, its most in a single game since 2013. Indiana converted 16 of 18 attempts that season against Purdue. IU also converted 12 third down conversions at Cincinnati in 2022.

OVERTIME RECORD

Indiana played its 15th overtime contest all-time during Week 4 against Akron and improved its record to 8-7 in those games. The four overtime contest with the Zips is the longest game in program history.

Of the 15 overtime contests, seven of them have gone multiple

Of the 15 overtime contests, seven of them have gone multiple overtimes. Six of those are double overtime games, while the Week 4 ofur overtime game is the other.

Versus the Zips, Indiana and Akron both scored touchdowns in the first overtime and kicked field goals in the second extra period. Neither team converted the two-point conversion play in the third overtime.

In the fourth overtime, **Tayven Jackson** found **DeQuece Carter** on IU's conversion attempt to start the period. The IU defense then forced an incompletion on Akron's attempt to earn the win.

Head coach **Tom Allen** improved to 5-1 all-time in overtime contests, with those five wins a part of his 13 victories in games decided by eight points or fewer.

#PROIU

Indiana are again well represented in the National Football League as 14 former Hoosiers are part of NFL organizations.

Of the 14 Hoosiers, 12 of those played for head coach Tom Allen, with *Luke Haggard, Cam Jones, Tiawan Mullen* and *Jaylin Williams* all entering their first NFL seasons.

The longest tenured Hoosier in the NFL is Saffold, who will begin his 14th season (missed 2019 due to injury) in 2022. **Dan Feeney** (7th), **Nate Sudfeld** (7th) and **Ian Thomas** (6th) have all spent at least five seasons in the NFL. **Nick Westbrook-Ikhine** begins his fourth season with the Tennessee Titans

Indiana was among the youngest programs nationally in terms of experience on the roster and on the field entering 2023. In a list compiled by the University of Colorado, Indiana ranked third among Power 5 programs and 11th overall in the FBS in total scholarship newcomers with 36 (24 transfer, 12 freshmen).

Indiana was one of eight programs that return single-digit starters and return the fourth fewest starts among offense and defense.

Parents, students and fans all remember those Friday nights sitting in the stands at local high schools around the country and Tom Allen once roamed the high school sidelines in Indiana as a prep head coach.

In 2023, for the third time in his tenure as IU's head coach, Allen walked the sidelines coaching a college game in victory over Indiana State. It marked the sixth time in program history that IU played on a Friday night.

The first Friday night game at Memorial Stadium came in 1995 in a battle for the Old Oaken Bucket and was the only Friday night game on IU's campus until 2022 versus Illinois.

SCHOLARSHIP SURPRISES

Fall camp is usually filled with new experiences, fresh faces and anticipation for a the season. New seasons also bring many new scholarship student-athletes into the fold.

There are also the occasional veteran walk-on that gets surprised in unique ways that they will be added to the list to scholarship players for the uncoming season.

This season, redshirt sophomore Matt Hohlt was the first to earn the distinction. His announcement was made in a team meeting, where his name was added to the Swarm D wall, which represents defensive players that set the expectation for what the Indiana defense represents.

Upon reveal of his name on the wall, Tom Allen said, " We've never had a walk-on make that wall, and you know what, we still haven't because he's been put on scholarship."

Hohlt is the second member of his family to play football at Indiana, as his father, Eric Hohlt, was a walk-on running back in the 80s.

A few days later, following the second scrimmage of the fall, Allen gathered the team at midfield to recap the afternoon and near the end turned everyone's attention to the video board where redshirt senior Trey Walker's face was placed upon Happy Gilmore's body in the infamous batting cage scene.

When the final fastball ricocheted off his forehead, the words "Trey Walker: Former hockey player turned scholarship football player" flashed and he was mobbed at midfield.

STARTS SLIM ON OLINE

Entering the 2023 season, the Indiana offensive line was among the 10 youngest in the FBS, with the 10th fewest combined starts returning from 2022 and were tied for the seventh fewest games played on the line. Indiana had five returning offensive linemen with starting experience

entering 2023 that combined for 77 career starts.

SIX EARN PRESEASON ALL-B1G

The national Preseason All-Big Ten lists included six different Hoosiers entering 2023, as Athlon Sports, Phil Steele and Pro Football Focus each released their lists prior to the season.

Pro Football Focus recognized running back/return specialist **Jaylin Lucas** as its first-team return specialist, wide receiver **Cam Camper** a second-team pick at wide receiver and punter **James Evans** a third-team selection at punter.

Phil Steele had Lucas and long snapper **Sean Wracher** among the publication's first-team picks, while Camper, Evans and linebacker **Aaron Casey** were all selected to the second team.

Athlon Sports placed defensive lineman **Andre Carter** on its third team, while Casey earned second-team honors and Evans was a third-team pick by the publication.

DEFENSIVE DEPTH

Nine defensive starters moved on following the 2023 season, leaving linebacker **Aaron Casey** and defensive back **Noah Pierre** as the only two returning starters in 2023.

That duo brought back 87 career games played, but just 25 of those starts. A handful of other Hoosiers had made spot starts prior to 2023, which brought the returning IU starts total to just 31 on defense.

Of the 927 total tackles made in 2022, just 31% (288 tackles) of those returned to the defense in 2023. Just 33% of the teams tackles for loss (21 of 63) and 27% of the sacks (5.5 of 20) were back on the field to start the season.

However, IU does bring in a host of defensive players with starting experience in **Andre Carter** (Western Michigan), **Jacob Mangum-Farrar** (Stanford), **Jamier Johnson** (Texas), **Joshua Rudolph** (Austin Peay) and **Nic Toomer** each making starts in their careers prior to IU.

STAFF UPDATE

Head coach **Tom Allen** added three assistant coaches during the offseason, with all three bringing elite level experience to Bloomington. The trio of run game coordinator/offensive line coach **Bob Bostad**, codefensive coordinator/safetise coach **Matt Guerrieri** and co-offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach **Anthony Tucker** each bring unique experiences with them to campus.

Of the 11 countable on-field assistant coaches for IU, seven of them are in the first or second year with the program.

TWO HOOSIERS ON COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME BALLOT

A pair of Indiana All-Americans in running back **Vaughn Dunbar** (1990-91) and quarterback **Antwaan Randle EI** (photo below; 1998-2001) are on the ballot for the College Football Hall of Fame in 2023.

Randle El earned All-Big Ten distinction in 1999, 2000 and 2001, and was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 1998. The Big Ten MVP, and first-team All-American in 2001, Randle El finished sixth in the Heisman Trophy balloting that season.

The Riverdale, Illinois, native was the first in NCAA history to score 40 career touchdowns (45) and throw 40 career touchdown passes (42). He was also the first to record over 2,500 total yards in four seasons, and the first to both pass for over 6,000 and rush for over 3,000 career yards.

Dunbar was a first-team All-B1G pick and unanimous first-team All-American in 1991 when he led the nation in rushing (1,805) and finished sixth in Heisman voting.

The Fort Wayne, Indian, native posted consecutive 1,000-yard seasons and finished his career No. 3 on the career rushing charts at IU with 3,029 yards, a total that currently sits No. 7 all-time in program history. He led IU to a pair of bowl appearances and a win in the 1991 Copper Bowl as the game's offensive MVP.

Six Indiana football student-athletes are already among the less than one percent enshrined in the CFB Hall of Fame: Zora Clevenger (HB; 190--3), Alvin "Bo" McMillin (Coach; 1934-47), Pete Pihos (End/Fb' 1942-43, 45-47), George Taliaferro (HB; 1945, 47-48), Anthony Thompson (RB; 1986-89) and John Tavener (1941-44).

FISCHER AMONG ICONIC VOICES IN COLLEGE FOOTBALL

In his 51st season with the Indiana football program, the legendary voice of the Hoosiers, Don Fischer, is among the longest tenured play-by-play voices in the sport.

The 2022 recipient of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame's Chris Schenkel Award and IU Hall of Fame Class of 2022, Fischer is the longest tenured radio play-by-play announcer in college football, tied with Tommy Suggs of Clemson.

- One theme for the 2023 Indiana football team will be the youth that the Hoosiers have at each position. The quarterback position was no exception, as the room had just two collegiate starts entering the year.
- In the Big Ten, Indiana was one of five programs to enter the season with five or fewer career starts in the QB room. Michigan State and Penn State entered the season with zero career starts, followed by Indiana (2) then Minnesota (5) and Purdue (5).
- The two quarterbacks split reps in the first two games, as **Brendan Sorsby** and **Tayven Jackson** each started one of those games. Jackson would start the next four games, with Sorsby playing meaningful series at Maryland and Michigan.
- In Week 2 versus Indiana State, Jackson made his first career start and led five of the team's seven scoring drives, gained 245 yards of total offense and was the highest graded quarterback in the Big Ten per Pro Football Focus (93.2).
- A return to Lucas Oil Stadium, where he won a pair of state tiles, saw Jackson nearly led a second-half comeback against Louisville. He completed 24-of-34 passes for 299 yards with his first career touchdown pass as IU scored 14 unanswered points in the second half and was stopped at the 1-yard line that would have tied the game in the fourth quarter.
- Jackson connected with **Jaylin Lucas** for a 30-yard touchdown pass on the opening drive of the third quarter. Also in the third quarter, Jackson engineered a 97-yard scoring drive, the longest for an IU offense since 2019 versus Rutgers.

- Jackson finished No. 3 on the Indiana single game completion percentage list at .857 after he completed 18-of-21 passes versus Indiana State. His mark finished behind *Peyton Ramsey* (13-of-14 vs. Eastern Illinois; 2019) and *Matt LoVecchio* (15-of-17 at Illinois; 2004).
- He was the second Hoosier quarterback (third occurrence) to finish with a completion percentage of better than .800 with 20-or-more passing attempts in a game. He joined Ramsey, who went 23-of-27 (.852) against UConn in 2019 and 16-of-20 (.800) at Virginia in 2017.
- Jackson was a consensus four-star recruit out of Center Grove High School in 2021. He spent one season at Tennessee before transferring to Indiana, where his brother, Trayce Jackson-Davis was an All-American on the hardwood and is now a part of the Golden State Warriors organization.
- In his lone season at Tennessee, Jackson appeared in three games and went 3-for-4 passing for 37 yards. He also ran four times for 10 yards and one touchdown. Scored his one touchdown against Akron (9/17).
- A consensus top-20 quarterback at CGHS, Jackson led Center Grove to back-to-back undefeated IHSAA Class 6A state championships and 28-straight wins between his junior and senior seasons
- A Nike Elite 11 finalist, he was tabbed Indiana Football Coaches Association all-state as a senior. He set the school record for career passing yardage (4,813), as he completed 329of-547 passes with 47 touchdowns in his career.
- Jackson's brother, *Trayce Jackson-Davis*, was a consensus first-team All-American for the Hoosiers men's basketball program in 2022-23 and finished as the career record holder in rebounds (1,143) and blocked shots (270). He finished No. 3 all-time at IU in scoring (2,258 points) and is one of five players in Big Ten history with 2,000 points and 1,000 rebounds in a career.
- **Brendan Sorsby** started in Week 1 saw five drives as the signal caller versus No. 3/4 Ohio State. Versus Indiana State, he completed 9-of-16 passes for 108 yards.
- In Week 5 versus Maryland, Sorsby completed 7-of-11 passes for 84 yards and two touchdowns. He also rushed for 25 yards on five carries and led IU to touchdowns on two of three drives between the third and fourth quarter.

- The collegiate debut for Sorsby came after an injury to *Jack Tuttle* against No. 16/16 Penn State in the second quarter. He completed 3-of-6 passes for 8 yards.
- Sorsby was the No. 13 rated pocket passer nationally per ESPN at Lake Dallas High School in Corinth, Texas. He threw for 1,271 yards and 14 touchdowns in seven games during an injury-shortened senior season.
- Redshirt junior **Dexter Williams II** saw his first season on the field end due to injury against Purdue. On a first quarter sack, Williams II injured his knee in his second career start.
- His collegiate debut came against No. 16/16 Penn State in the third quarter. He went on to complete 4-of-11 passes for 41 yards. He also rushed for 24 yards and was not sacked.
- The Macon, Georgia, native entered against No. 2/2 Ohio State in the first quarter and led IU on its only two scoring drives of the game. He led the team in rushing (16 for 46 yards) and threw for 107 yards on six completions, two of those touchdowns.
- After two appearances off the bench, Williams II started his first career game at Michigan State and helped lead the 17-point comeback to bring the Old Brass Spittoon back to Bloomington. In the game, he logged 86 rushing yards, which was No. 3 among Power 5 quarterbacks during Week 12.
- The 86 rushing yards were the most by an IU quarterback since **Zander Diamont** ran for 104 yards at Maryland in 2016.
- While the passing game wasn't the feature against the Spartans, one of the biggest plays in the game came on first down in the second overtime period, a 24-yard completions to **AJ Barner** that set up the 1-yard touchdown run by **Shaun Shivers**. He then completed the 2-point conversion pass to Barner.
- Williams was among the top dual-threat quarterbacks in the country as a senior at Mount de Sales Academy in Georgia. 24/7Sports rated him the No. 13 dual-threat quarterback nationally. He redshirted his first season on campus, before an ACL injury ended his 2021 season during spring practice.
- True freshman **Broc Lowry** was a three-time all-state pick at Canfield (Ohio) High School where he was rated the No. 25 pocket passer nationally by ESPN and the top quarterback in Ohio. He helped CHS to the OHSAA Division III state title as a senior.
- He set the Canfield career record for passing yards (4,967), completions (368), and passing touchdowns (40).


- Associate head coach and 39-year coaching veteran Craig Johnson is in his second season with the Cream and Crimson and his 20th in collegiate football.
- On 2022, Johnson returned to the college sidelines in a coaching capacity for the first time since 1999, as he spent the 20 seasons in the NFL between 1999 and 2019.
- A quarterback during his time at the University of Wyoming, Johnson has tutored five NFL All-Pro selections, including running backs Saquon Barkley and Chris Johnson.
- In Week 2 against Indiana State, the running backs room accounted for four of the five Indiana scores. Sophomore **Jaylin Lucas** logged a pair of 25-yard touchdown runs, senior **Josh Henderson** scored one and redshirt senior **Christian Turner** posted his first rushing score as a Hoosier.
- Lucas didn't see action in Week 1 as a true freshman in 2022, but by Week 8 at Rutgers he had worked his want into the running back rotation and by season's end one of the most dangerous multi-purpose players in the country.

• The first-team All-Big Ten selection at kick returner, Lucas rushed for 141 of his 271 yards over his last three games (at Ohio State, at Michigan State, vs. Purdue) in 2022. His best game from scrimmage came against the Boilermakers with 110 yards rushing on nine carries to go along with five receptions.

- He has picked up where he left off in 2022, as he leads the team with 75 offensive touches and 414 yards from scrimmage (218 rushing, 196 receiving).
- Against Louisville in Week 3, Lucas totaled 127 all-purpose yards with 29 rushing and 98 receiving yards. His 10 receptions were the most by a running back since **Stephen Houston** had 12 catches (95 yards) at Purdue in 2012.
- He led the team in all-purpose yards with 944 (271 rushing, 82 receiving, 591 kick return) IN 2022. His 944 yards gained were boosted by three touchdowns of 70-plus yards on the season.
- His two kickoff returns each went 90-plus yards and he added a 71-yard touchdown run for three scores of 70-plus yards. He was the first Hoosier since *Tevin Coleman* in 2014 with three 70-yard scoring plays in a single season.
- Lucas was rated as the No. 12 all-purpose back in the class of 2022 by Rivals and earned first-team All-Louisiana during his senior season at Edna Carr High School in New Orleans. He played his first three prep seasons at Terrebonne High School prior to Hurricane Ida.
- On the track, Lucas finished No. 6 at the LHSAA state track and field championships as a senior.
- In his first season at IU in 2022, Henderson led IU in receiving touchdowns (4) and added four scores on the ground to account for the most touchdowns on the team (8). His 48 points ranked No. 2 overall on the team last season.
- Henderson scored at least one touchdown in seven of 12 games played in 2022 after not scoring in 23 appearances over three seasons at North Carolina. After a rushing score in Week 2 and Week 3, Henderson has 11 touchdowns in 15 games as a Honsier
- The Pennington, New Jersey, native scored rushing touchdowns in back-to-back games for the first time in his career with scores against Idaho and Western Kentucky in 2022. The score against Idaho was his first collegiate touchdown.
- He nearly doubled his career rushing total with 398 yards in 2022 (90 carries). In three seasons at UNC, Henderson totaled just 209 yards rushing on 41 carries.
- Furthermore, Henderson was a threat in the passing game with 24 catches for 274 yards and the aforementioned four scores. Prior to 2022. he had just three catches for 10 yards.

- Christian Turner joined the Hoosiers after two seasons at Wake Forest (2021-22) and three seasons at Michigan (2018-20). he has amassed 1,288 career yards rushing and 13 touchdowns, with 1,022 of those yards and 12 scores coming in the last two seasons with the Demon Deacons.
- In his first season in Bloomington, Tuner has a pair of rushing scores on 48 carries. His 208 yards on the ground rank No. 2 on the team, while he averages 4.3 yards per carry.
- A four-star recruit per ESPN out of Buford (Ga.) High School, he was a consensus top-25 running back nationally. Tabbed All-Region 8-AAAAA as a senior, Turner logged 115 carries for 801 yards and 10 touchdowns in his final prep season.
- The redshirt sophomore duo of **David Holloman** and **Trent Howland** each look to make an impact in the backfield in 2023.
- Holloman was an all-conference selection and Sports Illustrated All-American candidate as a junior when he rushed for 1,236 yards and 14 touchdowns at Avondale High School in Michigan.
- Howland rushed for 1,401 yards on 178 carries with 14 touchdowns as a junior and earned the Southwest Prairie Conference Most Valuable Player after he helped Joliet (III.)
 West High School to its first conference title in 50 yards.
- Five of the last seven featured running backs at have reached the NFL *Stevie Scott III* (New Orleans, Denver, Arizona), *Devine Redding* (Kansas City, Tampa Bay), *Jordan Howard* (Philadelphia, Miami, Chicago), *Tevin Coleman* (New York Jets, San Francisco, Atlanta), and *Stephen Houston* (New England, Pittsburgh, Baltimore).

- First-year co-offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach
 Anthony Tucker joins the Hoosier staff after two seasons at
 Utah State as the offensive coordinator.
- In his sixth stop as a full-time assistant, Tucker has served as a coordinator for each of the last four seasons. Overall, he has 13 years of collegiate coaching experience.
- Cam Camper, a self-proclaimed late bloomer, spent two seasons at Trinity Valley C.C. before he joined the Hoosiers in 2022. Camper left his mark on the program in just seven week.
- Camper suffered a season-ending injury at Rutgers in Week 8 and when the 2022 season ended he still sat atop the receptions and receiving yards lists for Indiana.
- In his return to the field against No. 3/4 Ohio State in Week 1 of the 2023 season, Camper led the team with three catches (6 targets) for 35 yards. His long reception went for 24 yards.
- Against Akron in Week 4, Camper posted his third career 100yard receiving game with 103 yards on eight catches. He added his first touchdown grab of the season on a 12-yard scoring strike from **Tayven Jackson** in the first overtime.

- Through four games in 2022, Camper had logged a pair of double-digit catch games and owned the most receptions for an IU wideout over the first four games of a season this century (33).
- Camper's two double-digit reception games finished one shy of the program record for a single season. He is the eighth wideout (10th occurrence) in IU history with multiple games of 10-plus catches in a single season.

- With his 156 yards receiving versus Illinois, Camper totaled the highest yardage total in an Indiana debut in program history. He then caught his first collegiate touchdown pass to set up the game-tying two-point conversion versus Western Kentucky in the fourth quarter of the overtime win.
- Camper was a football walk-on at Sam Houston State for one season before he spent two years at Trinity Valley C.C. in Texas where he caught 50 passes for 858 yards and four touchdowns.
- From his senior year of high school to this season, Camper grew five inches and gained 40 pounds thanks to a late growth spurt.
- After staring four games at quarterback in 2021, **Donaven McCulley** made the move to wide receiver during spring practice in 2022.
- In his first season at wide receiver, McCulley caught 16 passes for 169 yards and one touchdown. His 13th career catch went for his first career touchdown reception on a 19-yard pass from **Dexter Williams II** at Ohio State in Week 11.
- McCulley enjoyed his best night at the position with six catches for 79 yards at Maryland in Week 5. One of those catches was an 11-yard touchdown grab in the fourth quarter.
- In Week 7 at Michigan, McCulley threw his third career touchdown pass to Jaylin Lucas for a 44-yard score. He also caught two passes for 16 yards.

- The only receiver under 6-foot on the roster, 5-foot-9 **Kamryn Perry** made an impression in spring practice and again in fall camp. He appeared in one game as a true freshman.
- His first collegiate reception came as part of a three-catch afternoon at Maryland. He totaled 22 yards on the three grabs.
- Perry was a first-team all-region selection as a senior at Marietta (Ga.) High School with 63 passes for 1,116 yards and 20 touchdowns.
- Omar Cooper Jr. was one of two Big Ten receivers to log a 100-yard receiving game in Week 2 and is one of five B1G pass catchers with a 100-yard game in 2023. Against the Sycamores, he hauled in seven catches (10 targets) for 101 yards.
- The Lawrence North High School product was a four-star prospect per Rivals and was a two-time all-state pick as one of the top athletes in Indianapolis.
- A pair of transfer pass catchers add to the depth of the IU wide receivers room in Fordham transfer **DeQuece** (duh-key-ss) **Carter** and Clemson transfer **E.J. Williams Jr.** Both grabbed their first catches in an IU uniform in the season opener versus Ohio State.
- Carter started 38 games at Fordham and finished No. 3 in career receiving yardage (3,035), No. 4 in career touchdown receptions (31), and No. 8 in career receptions (176) at Fordham.
- He tied a Fordham single-game record with 14 receptions to become one of eight Fordham pass catchers to post a 200-yard receiving game (218 yards) against Colgate (11/19/22).
- Carter was the Virginia Prep School Player of the Year as a senior and a three-time all-state honoree at Woodberry Forest School. He finished his career as central Virginia's all-time leading receiver, boasted by 1,067 yards and 11 touchdowns as a senior.
- Williams made 32 appearances with six starts in his career at Clemson. His best games came against Ohio State (1/1/21) in the 2021 Sugar Bowl and College Football Playoff Semifinal with a career-best five catches. His career long for yardage is 80 versus Notre Dame (12/19/20) in the ACC Championship Game.
- The consensus four-start recruit out of Central (Ala.) High School was a top-130 recruit and top-20 wide receiver by all three services. He was selected to the Under Armour All-America Game and earned MVP honors in the Alabama-Mississippi All-Star Game.

- In his fourth season coaching the tight ends, **Kevin Wright** has coached the tight ends each season in Bloomington after a successful high school head coachig stints, including five seasons at IMG Academy in Florida.
- A pair of redshirt sophomores headline the room in **James Bomba** and **Aaron Steinfeldt**, while transfer and redshirt senior **Bradley Archer** adds experience to the unit.
- Bomba is an Indiana legacy, as his father, *Matt Bomba* (1990-92), and grandfathers, *Brad Bomba* (1954-56) and *Bob Van Pelt* (1964-66), all lettered in football at IU. His mother, Kelly, is an executive associate athletic director for the Hoosiers.
- Bomba went to Bloomington South High School and was a two-time all-state pick who joined the team as a walk-on in 2021 and earned a scholarship in 2022 and made his first career start at Ohio State in Week 10 in 2022.
- Steinfeldt is a Bloomington North product and earned all-state honors twice as a prep standout. He was the Indiana Football Coaches Association Mr. Football positional winner as a senior.
- The 6-foot-5, 245-pounder made his first career start against Michigan on Homecoming in 2022 and followed that up with his first career touchdown catch versus Maryland.
- A three-sport all-conference performer that also earned honorable mention all-state honors in basketball.
- Bomba and Steinfeldt each made their first career catches versus Western Kentucky in Week 3 of the 2022 season.
- Archer appeared in 27 games over four seasons at Stanford with four receptions (32 yards). He played 10 games in 2021 and 11 games in 2022.

- He is one of three Stanford transfers on the 2023 roster, as he joins linebacker Jacob Mangum-Farrar and defensive back Nic Toomer.
- Archer made his first reception as a Hoosier, a 12-yard grab, versus Indiana State in Week 2. In Week 3, he caught two passes for 38 yards, with a 24-yard reception during IU's 97-yard scoring drive in the third quarter versus Louisville.
- Redshirt senior **Trey Walker** joined the program after a successful walk-on tryout performance in 2019 and was added to scholarship prior to the 2023 season.
- Walker made his first career start versus Akron in Week 4 and pulled down his first career reception in the second quarter, a 20-yard catch to set up IU's first touchdown of the game.
- After two catchers versus Akron, Walker followed that with three catches for 14 yards in a start at Maryland.
- The three-year hockey letterwinner at New Trier High School in Illinois, Walker had not played football in high school. He has appeared in seven career games for the Hoosiers.
- Redshirt freshman **Brody Foley** was a top-30 tight end nationally out of Anderson (Ohio) High School and made his collegiate debut on special teams against No. 3/4 Ohio State (9/2) in the 2023 season opener.
- The No. 26 tight end nationally per 247Sports, Foley was know as much for his defense as his abilities on the offensive side of the ball. A first-team All-Ohio selection on defense as a senior, he also hauled in five touchdowns in just nine games.
- Anthony Miller Jr. brings a 6-foot-5 frame from Georgia and was a consensus three-star prospect out of Duluth High School. He was first-team All-Region 7A as a senior after he logged 20 receptions for 305 yards and six touchdowns.

- A successful offensive line coach in the NFL and college ranks during a 33-year coaching career, **Bob Bostad** arrives in Bloomington to coach the offensive line.
- Bostad tutored 11 All-Americans over two stints at Wisconsin. That included eight on the offensive line, one tight end and two linebackers to earn All-America honors.
- Redshirt senior **Matthew Bedford** planted roots on the Indiana offensive line upon his arrival in Bloomington and started 33 of 35 career games played for the Cream and Crimson.
- Bedford started the 2022 season opener, but missed the remainder of the season due to injury. He rehabbed throughout spring practice and was back in the starting lineup versus Ohio State in the 2023 season opener.
- IU's 2019 Offensive Newcomer of the Year, Bedford has made nine starts each at right tackle and right guard, eight at left tackle, and three at left guard.
- An honorable-mention All-Big Ten pick as a junior, Bedford saw 475 snaps in pass protection during the 2021 season and allowed just 20 total pressures for a 97.6% pass blocking efficiency rating from *Pro Football Focus*.
- Freshman **Carter Smith** made his collegiate debut in his home state and played 61 snaps at right tackle against No. 2/2 Ohio State in Week 11.
- Smith made his first career start in the season opener versus Ohio State at left tackle and has started all six games in 2023.
- Redshirt sophomore Mike Katic (6-4, 312) was named IU's 2020 Offensive Newcomer of the Year after starting four games at left guard in his redshirt freshman season and has started 30 of his 32 career appearances.
- Of his 30 starts, 21 have come at right guard, four at center and five at left guard. He made his first career start at center at Nebraska (10/1) in 2020 due to an injury to **Zach Carpenter**.

- Katic appeared in six games as a redshirt freshman, nine games in 2021 missing three due to injury and started every game of the 2022 and 2023 campaign.
- **Zach Carpenter** has started 18 of 20 appearances during his three seasons at Indiana after transferring from Michigan. He played in five games as a sophomore behind two-year starter at center **Dylan Powell**.
- He started the first two games of 2022 at center, injured his hand prior to the Western Kentucky game and returned at left guard at Nebraska. He started four straight at that spot on the line and moved back to center against Penn State.
- An ACL injury in fall camp in 2020 was followed by a redshirt season in 2021, but **Kahlil Benson** appeared in all 12 games on the offensive line in 2022 with five starts, his first coming at Rutgers at right guard.
- Transfers a plenty dot the offensive line room, as **Noah Bolticoff** (TCU), **Drew Evans** (Wisconsin) and **Max Longman** (UMass) each add experience and depth to the room.
- Longman has appeared in 28 games (24 starts) and made his IU debut versus Indiana State in Week 2.
- He started his first game at Indiana at right guard in Week 3 versus Louisville, but left in the first half due to injury.
- Bolticoff was a part of the TCU team that advanced to the College Football Playoff National Championship Game in 2022.
 Evans took a redshirt season for the Badgers under current IU offensive line coach Bostad.

- With the departure of *Micah McFadden* (New York Giants) and *Cam Jones* (Kansas City Chiefs) off to the NFL, it will be up to **Aaron Casey** to lead the unit.
- Aaron Casey dons the iconic No. 44 for the second straight season in honor of IU legend *George Taliaferro*, who was the first African American drafted by an NFL team.
- With his public financial management degree already complete, Casey earned the starting spot in 2022 and started 11 of the 12 games. He missed the season finale versus Purdue due to injury
- Back in the middle of the defense to start 2023, Casey racked up his fifth career double-digit tackle game against No. 3/4 Ohio State with a career-high-tying 11 stops. One of those was a solo tackle for loss in the third quarter.
- At Lucas Oil Stadium, Casey piled up 10 tackles five solowith a career-high-tying 3.0 tackles for loss and a career-high 2.0 sacks. Two of his three tackles for loss came in a second half shutout of the Cardinals offense.
- Casey posted his third double-digit tackle effort of the season on Week 4 against Akron with 13 tackles. Of those, 10 were solo stops with 1.0 tackle for loss, which came in the second overtime on a quarterback rush.
- Through seven weeks of the season, Casey leads the Big Ten in tackles for loss (8.0). According to Pro Football Focus, he has nine TFL+NG (tackles of loss or no gain), which ranks tied for No. 7 in the Power 5 and leads the conference.
- The 2022 season saw Casey nearly doubled his career tackles total with 86 (had 45 over his first three seasons). He amassed 10.5 tackles for loss, after just 5.5 total his first three seasons.
- His first double-digit tackle game at Cincinnati (9/24/22; 10 tackles) in Week 4 pushed his season total to 31. The four-game total in 2022 surpassed his single-season career high of 25 in 2021.
- Week 6 in 2022 saw Casey step into the middle linebacker spot vacated by an injury to *Cam Jones*. In six starts calling the defense, he piled up 48 tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss, 1.0 sack and forced his first two fumbles both against Maryland.

- Stanford transfer **Jacob Mangum-Farrar** appeared in 25 games with 11 starts over five seasons at Stanford. He totaled 87 tackles in that span with 4.5 tackles for loss and 1.0 sack.
- After he missed the 2020 season due to injury, Mangum-Farrar played in 20 games over his final two seasons on The Farm. He totaled 40-plus tackles in each of those campaigns and added a career-high 3.0 tackles for loss in 2021.
- His career-high for tackles came in 2021 at Oregon State (11/13/21) when he piled up 12 stops in his first career double-digit tackle game. He added a second double-digit tackle effort with 10 stops versus Notre Dame (10/15/22) in 2022.
- Mangum-Farrar opened his Indiana career with five tackles and two pass breakups versus No. 3/4 Ohio State. One of the pass breakups came in the end zone on third down in the fourth quarter for hold the Buckeyes to a field goal.
- The first tackle for loss as a Hoosier for Mangum-Farrar came as part of an eight-tackle night versus Akron in the four overtime win. The TFL came on a swing pass in the third quarter.
- In two seasons at Austin Peay, **Joshua Rudolph** appeared in 18 games with 11 starts at linebacker for the Governors.
- In 11 starts last season at APSU, Rudolph had 73 tackles and 7.5 tackles for loss. That total was boosted by a pair of 10-tackle games against Alabama A&M (9/17) and Jacksonville State (10/29).
- Redshirt sophomore Matt Hohlt got his feet wet in college football with two appearances as a true freshman, but the walkon made an impact during the 2022 season 10 games played and one start at linebacker.
- Over his 10 appearances in 2022, Hohlt made 19 tackles with 1.5 tackles for loss. His first TFL was a solo stop behind the line of scrimmage at Cincinnati (9/24).
- Head coach **Tom Allen** removed the walk-on tag from Hohlt during a team meeting in fall camp.



- In his second season, defensive line coach **Paul Randolph** will have a veteran group, but most of those pieces are in their first season of Big Ten football.
- Of the 14 defensive linemen on the roster, only four had played a down of football against a Big Ten opponent prior to 2023. However, four more had seen action at the FBS level.
- It didn't take long for **Andre Carter** to make an impact in the cream and crimson with four tackles that included 2.0 tackles for loss in the season opener. All four of his tackles went for zero or negative yardage in the game and he added a pass breakup on third down to force a Buckeyes punt in the third quarter.
- In Week 2, Carter added his second game with multiple TFLs as he posted 2.0 tackles behind the line of scrimmage, which included his first sack in the cream and crimson.
- His 4.0 tackles for loss over the first two games of the season are the most by an IU defender since 2004 Kyle Killion posted 5.5 tackles for loss against Central Michigan (4.5 TFL) and at Oregon (1.0 TFL).
- His 6.0 total tackles are tied for No. 7 in the Big Ten and Pro Football Focus ranks his 22 total pressures No. 5 in the Big Ten through seven weeks.
- Carter joined IU from Western Michigan and was tabbed one of the Top 100 transfer portal additions (No. 59) by The Athletic and second-team All-Big Ten preseason by Athlon Sports.
- In 46 games played at WMU, Carter amassed 135 career tackles (68 solo) with 27.5 tackles for loss and 13.0 sacks. He had five forced fumbles and two interceptions at WMU.
- His best season came in 2022 when he totaled 70 tackles, 13.5 tackles for loss and 7.0 sacks on his way to second-team All-Mid-American Conference honors.
- His 81.2 overall grade by Pro Football Focus in 2022 ranked No. 15 among edge rushers in the FBS and his 90.2 pass rush grade finished tied for No. 8 nationally among defenders with at least 500 defensive snaps.

- A transfer from Texas Tech, **Philip Blidi** (blee-dee) reunites with Randolph, who coached Blidi for two seasons at TTU.
- During Week 4, Blidi ranked No. 2 in the Big Ten with six total pressures per Pro Football Focus. He had a career-high-tying six tackles and combined with **Phillip Dunnam** on a tackle for loss in the first overtime.
- In three seasons in Lubbock, Texas, Blidi totaled 40 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks.
- The fourth-year college player and his wife, Emma, have two children. Amara (2), who was born while he was at Texas Tech, and Brooks (1), who was born in Bloomington.
- Marcus Burris Jr. redshirted his initial year at Texas A&M and appeared in eight games as a redshirt freshman. Robby Harrison appeared in three games during his true freshman season at Arizona State.
- Burris Jr. debuted for IU against No. 3/4 Ohio State and made one stop. He collected his first career tackle for loss on a third-quarter sack versus Indiana State.
- He then got a hand on a Maryland field goal attempt in Week 5 for his first career blocked kick.
- LeDarrius Cox and Patrick Lucas Jr. enter their second seasons on campus and look to add depth on the inside. Both transfers from Ole Miss appeared in all 12 games during the 2022 season.
- Cox made his first career start in the season opener versus No. 3/4 Ohio State. He logged his first career solo tackle for loss against Akron in the fourth quarter.
- Redshirt freshmen **Nick James** and **Venson Sneed Jr.** both enrolled early in 2022, saw the field as true freshmen and have been part of the defensive line rotation in 2023.
- James debuted against Illinois in the season opener and owns three tackles in four games played in 2022. He was among the top recruits nationally with a No. 229 ranking nationally per ESPN out of IMG Academy.
- Sneed made his collegiate debut against No. 16/16 Penn State and made his first career tackle. The four-star prospect was among the top-30 defensive end prospects nationally, while he also participated in basketball and weight lifting at Winter Park (Fla.) High School.





- No group lost more after the 2022 season than the cornerbacks room, with the departure of All-Big Ten performers *Tiawan Mullen* and *Jaylin Williams*, but assistant head coach/conerbacks coach **Brandon Shelby** has a mix of youth and transfers to blend together.
- Most of the experience on the outside comes from Texas transfer Jamier Johnson, Texas Tech transfer Kobee Minor and Stanford transfer Nic Toomer.
- Toomer broke up one pass against No. 3/4 Ohio State in his IU debut and followed that with his first career interception against Indiana State.
- Per PFF, Toomer had taken 315 career coverage snap prior to his first career interception.
- His first game as a Hoosier, Toomer chipped in five tackles and aforementioned one pass breakup against No. 3/4 Ohio State.
- Toomer owned 21 appearances over four seasons at Stanford. He missed the 2020 season due to injury (knee) and owned 29 tackles, 1.0 tackles for loss and five pass breakups while on The Farm.
- In two seasons at Texas, Johnson appeared in 17 games, including 10 games during his freshman season in 2021. He made seven appearances in 2022, with his first career start against UTSA (9/17/22).
- The consensus four-star recruit out of John Muir High School in California, he was a top 25 defensive back nationally after hauling in eight career interceptions, with two returned for touchdowns.
- Minor appeared in 23 games over three seasons at Texas Tech and posted 12 of his 13 tackles at TTU during the 2022 season.
- He opened the 2023 campaign with a career-high-tying six tackles and one pass breakup versus No. 3/4 Ohio State in his Hoosier debut.
- His bother, **Darryl Minor Jr.**, is a linebacker for the Hoosiers. Darryl transferred from UTEP and is in his first year with the program, as well.

- Among the returning cornerbacks, just four of them have seen time on the field for IU, with Jamari Sharpe's three games the most of any returner. James Monds III (2 games), Mitchell Evans (1 game) and Connor Hole (1 game) are the only other returning student-athletes with game experience.
- Sharpe appeared in the first three games of the 2022 season, but preserved his redshirt season. A Northwestern Senior High School in Miami, Florida, Sharpe began his career as a wide receiver. It wasn't until his senior year he switched to defense.
- Sharpe made three tackles in Indiana's Week 3 contest versus Louisville at Lucas Oil Stadium and Week 4 game against Akron.
- Monds III comes from a football family, as his cousin, Mario Monds; and uncle, Wonder Monds; both played college football.
 A first-team all-state pick out of Vero Beach (Fla.) High School, Monds III enrolled early and participated in spring practice.
- From the junior college ranks, **JoJo Johnson** joins the fold, while the lone scholarship true freshman in the group is California product **Jordan Shaw**.
- JoJo Johnson began his career at Notre Dame, but redshirted his first season on campus due to injury (knee). The all-state out of Merrillville (Ind.) High School then played one season at lowa Western C.C. with 16 stops and three interceptions in nine games.
- Shaw was rated as a top 75 cornerback nationally by three of the four major recruiting services out of St. Pius X St. Matthias Academy in California. Selected to play in the All-America Bowl, he was the Del Ray League Player of the Year as a senior after 83 tackles and seven interceptions.

- Big Ten football is nothing new for first-year co-defensive coordinator/safeties coach **Matt Guerrieri**, who spent the 2022 season as an analyst for Ohio State's College Football Playoff team.
- Prior to joining the OSU staff last season, Guerrieri capped a 10-year stay at Duke with four seasons as defensive coordinator for the Blue Devils (2018-21).
- Guerrieri inherited arguably the most experienced group in the program, with six letterwinners returning to combine for 135 games played in the cream and crimson entering the year. The rest of the defense returned just 103 total games played at IU.
- First-time team captain **Noah Pierre** was one of the unsung heroes on the back end of the defense in 2021 and 2022. Over the last three seasons, Pierre appeared in all 30 games with all 17 of his career starts in that span.
- A redshirt season in 2018 (1 games played) was followed by 18 appearances from 2019-20 mostly on special teams with seven total tackles. He then made 35 in 2021 and 39 in 2022.
- Pierre came up with one of the bigger defensive plays against Western Kentucky (9/17) in 2022 with a solo sack and forced fumble to force a third-and-long in overtime prior to the blocked field goal and an eventual walk-off win for IU.
- Pierre logged his first career sack in 2022 and ended with 3.0 sacks on the year and more than doubled his career total for tackles for loss with 4.0 in 2022.
- Louis Moore came to Indiana from the junior college ranks and was an immediate addition to the backend rotation. He appeared in all 12 games with nine tackles in 2022.
- Over his first three games in 2023, Moore doubled his career tackles total from 2022. He totaled nine stops last season and has 32 through six games in 2023, including a career-best nine stops versus Louisville in Week 3.
- Moore logged his first career sack and forced a fumble, which was recovered in the end zone for a touchdown at Nebraska. He popped the ball loose in the end zone as he and *Cam Jones* met at the quarterback for the sack.

- Moore's first career interception came as part of a multiinterception game versus Akron. His first career pick was a second-quarter grab, while his second pick came in the third quarter and he took it back 22 yards for a touchdown.
- **Josh Sanguinetti** owns 33 career appearances with 53 career tackles, two interceptions and eight pass deflections.
- Sanguinetti pulled in his second career interception in the 2022 season opener with a diving interception to stop an Illinois scoring threat inside the IU 30-yard line.
- **Phillip Dunnam** was one of two true freshmen not to redshirt in 2022 (**Jaylin Lucas**) and played in all 12 games with five tackles
- Dunnam pulled in his first career interception against No. 3/4 Ohio State when he stepped in front of a Kyle McCord pass in the second quarter, which set up an Indiana field goal.
- Week 3 saw Dunnam's second career interception inside Lucas Oil Stadium to thwart a Louisville drive and set up the Hoosiers 97-yard touchdown drive in the third quarter.
- A first-quarter interception with Akron in Week 4 came at the IU 14-yard line on the Zips opening drive.
- Athleticism runs in the family for Dunnam, as cousins E.J.
 Biggers (cornerback) and Louis Delmas (safety) both played in the
 NFL and uncle, Udonis Haslem, played 19 seasons in the NBA.
- Freshman **Amare Ferrell** impressed during his first fall camp and made his first career tackle against No. 3/4 Ohio State in the season opener, a fourth quarter tackle for loss.
- A four-star recruit by Rivals, he earned All-First Coast honors as a junior and helped the Tigers to the 2022 Florida High School Athletic Association Class 3A state semifinals.
- Junior college product **Tyrik McDaniel** joined the program from Independence (Kan.) C.C. where he was rated the No. 1 junior college safety and No. 17 overall prospect by 247Sports.
- He appeared in five of nine games (missing four due to injury), but still logged 25 tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss, and 2.0 sacks. He also broke up four passes and blocked one kick.

- After two seasons at UCLA, redshirt junior Myles Jackson has shown flashes of his play making abilities over his two seasons in Bloomington.
- At Michigan in Week 7, Jackson forced his first career fumble on a third-quarter sack that eventually forced a Wolverine field goal after the Wolverines took over inside the IU red zone.
- In 2022, Jackson grabbed his first career interception in the end zone in the third quarter to thwart a Western Kentucky in 2022 on drive and later recovered a fourth-quarter fumble versus the Hilltoppers.
- His nose for the football showed again at Nebraska in 2022, as he recovered a fumble in the end zone for a touchdown in the second quarter.
- Senior **Lanell Carr Jr.** came to Indiana after 29 appearances at West Virginia and is a big part of the revamped defensive front four
- Carr Jr. posted his first three tackles at Indiana in the season opener against No. 3/4 Ohio State and followed with a four-tackle, 1.5 tackles for loss and 1.0 sack in Week 2 versus Indiana State.
- At Michigan in Week 7, Carr Jr. had a pair of first quarter sacks and added two more tackles in just the first half.
- The St. Louis, Missouri, native posted his best season in 2022 with 21 tackles. His total included all 4.5 career tackles for loss and his first career sack came in the season finale at Oklahoma State (11/26).

- After taking a redshirt season at Oregon, Anthony Jones enters his second collegiate season and has continued to see more time on the field as the season has progressed.
- After appearing in each of the first four games, Jones earned starts in Week 5 at Maryland and Week 7 at Michigan. In both games, Jones has two tackles.
- The Las Vegas native appeared in two games for the Ducks, including the San Diego County Credit Union Holiday Bowl versus North Carolina.
- A prep standout at Liberty High School, he ranked as the top athlete in Nevada, was a top-10 prospect in the state and top-40 athlete nationally by Rivals and 247Sports.
- As a senior, he was a first-team Las Vegas Review-Journal All-Southern Nevada pick at outside linebacker after 39 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss, and 3.5 sacks.

- Special teams coordinator **Kasey Teegardin** is in his fourth season at the helm of the unit and has turned it into one of the more consistent in the Big Ten.
- Teegardin's units have blocked at least one kick in each of his four seasons as the corps leader. The ledger includes 10 total blocked kicks: five field goals, four punts and one extra point.
- Indiana has blocked at least one kick each season since 2012, with 28 total blocked kicks over the 12-year span.
- At Maryland in 2023, Marcus Burris Jr. got a hand on a field goal attempt in the fourth quarter for his first career blocked kick.
- Three of those came during the 2022 season, all field goals. The Hoosiers got a hand on an overtime kick versus Western Kentucky (*Jaylin Williams*), blocked a Michigan kick (*James Head Jr.*) and forced overtime with a block at Michigan State (Head Jr.).
- The most dangerous return man in the Big Ten, sophomore Jaylin Lucas capped his true freshman season with first-team All-America honors from CBS Sports, Pro Football Focus, Walter Camp and USA Today as the country's best kick returner.

- The only returner in the FBS with multiple kickoff returns for a touchdown, Lucas was named Big Ten Rodgers-Dwight Return Specialist of the Year first Hoosier to earn the award and earned first-team All-Big Ten at return specialist from the conference coaches and media panels.
- With two kickoff returns for a score in 2022, Lucas finished No. 2 in program history on the single season charts, just one behind *Marcus Thigpen* (3) in 2006.
- With his 93-yard kickoff return touchdown on the opening kickoff at Rutgers, Lucas became the first Hoosier to return a kickoff for a score since **Tevin Coleman** in 2012 (at Northwestern) and the first to return the opening kickoff since **Ray Fisher** in 2009 (at Akron).
- With 124 return yards at Rutgers, Lucas led the FBS in kickoff return yardage during Week 8 and his 190 all-purpose yards paced all Big Ten student-athletes for the week.
- Lucas nearly duplicated the effort at Michigan State in Week 12 with a Big Ten-best 168 return yards which ranks No. 4 on IU's single game list and was No. 2 in the conference with 192 all-purpose yards (270; Ibrahim, Minnesota).
- His 804 career kickoff return yards are No. 15 all-time on Indiana's career charts. He passed *Marvin Woodson* (778; 1961-63) against Michigan in Week 7 and trails *Trent Walters* (825; 1963-65) for the No. 14 spot on the list.
- Sophomore **James Evans** took over the reins at punter in 2021 after he enrolled in spring classes and participated in practice after committing to Indiana sight unseen in-person.
- He currently sits atop the Indiana career punting charts with a 43.4 yards per punt average. His average is nearly one yard better than **Alan Sutkowski**'s (1995-97) mark of 42.5.
- After averaging 54.2 yards per punt on six boots versus No.
 3/4 Ohio State, Evans was named to the Ray Guy Award's Ray's
 8 list. The 54.2 yards per punt ranks No.
 3 on the program's single game charts.
- In 2022, Evans ranked No. 5 in the B1G and No. 20 nationally in punting average at 44.3 yards per punt. That total finished No. 2 on the single season charts, just behind the 44.8 ypp by **Drew Hagan** in 1999.
- Against No. 16/16 Penn State, Evans had five punts downed inside the 20-yard line, with three of those landing inside the 10-yard line of the Nittany Lions. Both totals were career highs.

- He trained under Nathan Chapman and John Smith at Prokick Australia and hadn't played a down of American football or visited the United States prior to his arrival in Bloomington.
- Long snapper **Sean Wracher** earned All-Big Ten honors from Phil Steele in each of his four seasons on campus was named a semifinalist for the Patrick Mannelly Award in 2022.
- He has started all 51 games since stepping foot on campus and has snapped for all-league kickers *Logan Justus* (2019) and *Charles Campbell* (2020), and Ray Guy Award semifinalist in *Haydon Whitehead* (2020).
- The Akron, Ohio, native was a Kohl'sKicking.com five-star prospect and the No. 1 long snapper nationally by Kornblue Kicking.
- Place kicker was a competition throughout fall camp with redshirt sophomore **Chris Freeman** and true freshman **Nicolas Radicic** each putting a stamp on the competition, but Freeman eventually won the job.
- Freeman connected on his first career field goal against No. 3/4 Ohio State in the season opener with a 42-yard conversion in the second quarter.
- With IU down 21-0 coming out of the locker room from halftime, Freeman hit a perfect onside kick and **Louis Moore** recovered the kick and the offense took just three plays to get on the scoreboard.
- The successful onside kick was the first successful onside kick for Indiana since 2017 at Purdue. IU had been unsuccessful on its previous eight attempts between Purdue and Louisville.
- A five-star prospect per Kohl's Kicking, Radicic was rated the No. 3 kicker nationally by 247Sports and the No. 4 kicking prospect by ESPN . He was selected to participate in the 2023 Army All-American Bowl, as well.
- Radicic was an all-district performer for Coppell (Texas) High School, after moving to America from Croatia in 2016.
- Against Indiana State, Radicic connected on a pair of extra points and his first career field goal, a 21 yarder in the fourth quarter.

- • The 2020 American Football Coaches Association National Coach of the Year, Tom Allen is entering his seventh season as Indiana head football coach in 2023.
- Named the 2020 Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year (Big Ten coaches vote) and the Dave McClain Coach of the Year (Big Ten media vote).
- Joined Bill Mallory (1986, 1987) as the only Hoosier head coaches to earn the honor.
- Received the 2020 Grant Teaff Coach of the Year from the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.
- Became the third IU head coach to be named AFCA National Coach of the Year along with Bo McMillin (1945) and John Pont (1967).
- Allen was also a finalist for the 2020 Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award, the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award, the Dodd Trophy, and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award
- A 31-year coaching veteran, Allen was named the program's 29th head football coach on Dec. 1, 2016.
- His 31 wins rank tied for No. 6 in school history (John Pont; 1965-72).
- Made his head coaching debut in the 2016 Foster Farms Bowl.
- The New Castle, Ind., native joined Indiana's staff as associate head coach/defense on Jan. 15, 2016, and he promptly went on to become a Broyles Award nominee.
- Allen has strong ties to the Hoosier state as he served as head coach at Ben Davis High School (2004-06), defensive coordinator at Ben Davis (1998-03) and Marion High School (1997), and earned his master's degree from IU (2002).
- Over the past 28 seasons, the teams for which Allen has been a member of the coaching staff have posted a combined record of 254-112 (.694).

MAKING HISTORY (2020)

- Indiana (6-2, 6-1 B1G) finished the year ranked for a program record 10-consecutive weeks, including a No. 12 final rating from the Associated Press, its highest final ranking since 1967 (No. 4).
- IU played in consecutive January bowl games for the first time in school history with its invitation to the 2021 Outback Bowl.
- The Hoosiers were ranked in the Top 10 six times, the secondmost in program history behind the 1945 team (9 weeks).
- Indiana collected its first Top-10 ranking in the Nov. 8 AP Poll (No. 10) since Sept. 22, 1969 (No. 10).
- IU's No. 7 rating (Dec. 13, 20) was its best in the AP Poll since Nov. 27, 1967 (No. 4).
- The Hoosiers three Top-25 victories tied for the third-most in the country and matched the school record (1945).
- Indiana clinched a winning league record in consecutive seasons for the first time since 1987-88 and for the sixth time overall (1967-68, 1944-46, 1936-37).
- IU's six conference wins tied for the most in program history (1967, 1987).
- The Hoosiers 11 Big Ten victories over the 2019-20 seasons tied for the most in a two-year span in school history (1987-88).
- Indiana collected its first win over No. 16 Wisconsin (14-6) since defeating the Badgers in 2001 and 2002, the former coming at Camp Randall Stadium.
- IU recorded its first road victory over a ranked opponent since No. 18 Missouri in 2014, and its first B1G road win over a ranked opponent since No. 22 Michigan State in 2001.
- The Hoosiers matched a program record with five-straight league victories (1967) before losing at No. 3 Ohio State and have won 11 of their last 14, their most successful stretch in conference games in school history.
- Indiana defeated Michigan State, 24-0, to reclaim the Old Brass Spittoon for the first time since 2016 and earn its first win in East Lansing since 2001.
- IU's 38-21 victory over No. 23 Michigan was its first over the Wolverines since 1987
- The Hoosiers 36-35, overtime win against No. 8 Penn State in the season opener was the sixth against a Top-10 opponent in program history, with the last coming at No. 9 Ohio State in 1987.
- It marked Indiana's first Top-10 victory at Memorial Stadium since 1967 (No. 3 Purdue).
- IU defeated PSU, U-M, MSU, and UW in the same season for the first time in school history and beat the Wolverines and

Spartans in the same year for the first time since 1967 BREAKTHROUGH SEASON (2019)

- Guided the Hoosiers to the 2020 TaxSlayer Bowl, the program's first bowl game in the state of Florida.
- Indiana finished with an 8-5 record and a 5-4 Big Ten mark.
- IU reached eight wins for just the eighth time in school history and the first time since 1993, and it finished one win shy of matching the program record set in 1945 and 1967.
- The Hoosiers five-conference wins tied for the fourth-most in school history, one off the program record of six (1967, 1987, 2020).
- Indiana posted a winning conference mark for the first time since 1993 (5-3) and its first winning season overall since 2007 (7-6).
- On Nov. 10, IU entered the Associated Press Poll (No. 24) for the first time since Sept. 20, 1994, and moved into the Coaches Poll (No. 25) for the first time since Oct. 17, 1994.

HOOSIER HONORS

- Three coaches on Allen's staffs have been candidates for the Broyles Award, including 2020 finalist Kane Wommack and 2019 semifinalist Kalen DeBoer.
- Wommack is currently the South Alabama head coach and DeBoer is the Washington head coach.
- In his six seasons as head coach, 61 Hoosiers have earned All-Bia Ten honors.
- Kick return specialist Jaylin Lucas earned All-America accolades from six outlets in 2022, including four first-team honors.
- Lucas became the first Hoosier and the first conference true freshman to be named the Big Ten Rodgers-Dwight Return Specialist of the Year.
- Tiawan Mullen became the first cornerback in program history to garner first-team All-America recognition in 2020.
- Wide receiver Ty Fryfogle and linebacker Micah McFadden collected third-team All-America accolades, giving Indiana three All-Americans in the same campaign for the first time since 2007.
- A school record 16 IU standouts received All-Big Ten honors.
- Fryfogle became the first wideout in Indiana history to be named the Big Ten Richter-Howard Receiver of the Year.
- He also was one of 11 Biletnikoff Award semifinalists, and Michael Penix Jr. was one of 17 Davey O'Brien Award semifinalists.
- A program record seven Hoosiers, including a school record four first-teamers, earned defensive recognition.
- Thirteen IU players secured 2017 all-conference honors, including six defenders, which matched 2016's mark.
- Mullen was named a 2019 True Freshman All-American.
- Thirty-four Hoosiers have been drafted or invited to NFL camps over the last six seasons, including a school-record 11 in 2018.
- Sixteen have worked out over the last six NFL Combines, highlighted by a program-record five in 2018.
- Linebacker Micah McFadden (New York Giants-2022), safety Jamar Johnson (Denver-2021), guard Simon Stepaniak (Green Bay-2020), guard Wes Martin (Washington-2019), tight end lan Thomas (Carolina-2018), and linebacker Chris Covington (Dallas-2018) have been selected in the NFL Draft.
- Coached 15 Hoosiers currently on NFL rosters.
- Wide receiver Simmie Cobbs Jr., kicker Griffin Oakes, and linebacker Tegray Scales garnered 2017 first-team all-league recognition. Oakes was named the Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year.
- Harry Crider became the 10th Hoosier to receive Academic All-America honors in 2021.
- A school-record 40 student-athletes collected Academic All-Big Ten in 2022, besting the previous mark of 39 from 2021, and Allen's six-year mark stands at 174.





IU UNVEILS GEORGE TALIAFERRO STATUE IN GEORGE TALIAFERRO PLAZA

Former Indiana University President Michael A. McRobbie presided over the dedication of the George Taliaferro Plaza on Friday, Nov. 1, 2019, unveiling a bronze statue of Taliaferro, one of the most important and influential individuals in the history of Indiana University and IU Athletics.

McRobbie led the dedication ceremony, which took place on the newly-dedicated plaza located on the ground level of Memorial Stadium outside of the North End Zone facility. Other speakers at the event included IU Board of Trustee member Quinn Buckner, former Indiana University Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Fred Glass, head football coach Tom Allen, Senior Associate Athletic Director Anthony Thompson and fifth-year senior linebacker Reakwon Jones.

"Throughout his life, not only did George Taliaferro excel as an athlete, but he also overcame the real-world struggles of racism and prejudice, of segregation and oppression," McRobbie said. "And in the process, he demonstrated courage, determination and perseverance, and earned a special place in the annals of our state and its flagship public university.

"In George Taliaferro Plaza and its centerpiece statue, every visitor to Indiana Memorial Stadium will be reminded of the enormous contributions George made to IU and to this community, as an outstanding athlete, as a champion of racial equality, as a dedicated educator and administrator, as a tireless community activist, and as a friend and mentor to many."

"It is fitting that during our Bicentennial year, we are dedicating this plaza and statue in honor of one of the most important figures in the history not only of Indiana University Athletics, but of Indiana University as a whole," said Glass. "I am particularly grateful to President McRobbie and Trustee Buckner for their support in permanently and prominently recognizing this Hoosier pioneer at the entryway of IU Football where he will be seen every day by IU players, coaches, and recruits."

Taliaferro, who passed away Oct. 8, 2018, at the age of 91, was a legendary Indiana University football player during the 1940s who shattered racial barriers on campus and in the sport. In doing so, he left an indelible mark on both.

The Gary, Ind., native was a three-time All-American at IU who led the Hoosiers' unbeaten 1945 Big Ten Championship team in rushing. He'd go on to lead the program in rushing twice and passing once, and following the 1948 season he became the first African-American drafted by an NFL team when the Chicago Bears selected him in the 13th round.

Taliaferro would eventually spend seven years in the NFL, earning Pro Bowl honors three times. He totaled 2,255 rushing yards, 1,300 receiving yards, 1,633 passing yards, and accounted for 37 touchdowns while playing for franchises in New York, Dallas, Baltimore, and Philadelphia. He also became the only player in league history to play seven positions — running back, quarterback, wide receiver, cornerback, punter, punt returner, and kickoff returner.

While those feats make him one of the most accomplished players in IU and Big Ten history, his contributions extended well beyond the collegiate and professional playing fields.

During the 1940s, Taliaferro and IU President Herman B Wells played a pivotal role in desegregating the IU campus and the City of Bloomington. During the era, Taliaferro was not allowed to eat at many local restaurants. When Wells found out that Taliaferro had to return home between classes because no nearby restaurants would serve him, Wells arranged for the two to have lunch at a nearby campus establishment. Wells and Taliaferro had lunch, and IU and the Bloomington community took a giant step toward desegregation.

Taliaferro's contributions did not end at the conclusion of his playing career. A 1951 IU graduate who later earned a Master's Degree from Howard University, Taliaferro returned to IU in 1972 and served as special assistant to IU President John Ryan. In that role and other roles on campus during the next two decades, he was a valuable and outspoken voice on social justice issues.

Taliaferro's lifetime of accomplishments are chronicled on the statue, which is the work of Brian Hanlon, owner of Hanlon Studios. Hanlon has produced more than 300 works in both public and private collections, including the five granite monuments commemorating IU Basketball's five national championships.





TERRY TALLEN INDIANA FOOTBALL COMPLEX

The Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex officially opened on Aug. 13, 2019. Former Indiana University Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Fred Glass announced a major gift by alumnus and former IU Football captain Terry Tallen to the Indiana University Bicentennial Campaign for Athletics on April 20, 2018. This \$2 million commitment helped provide funding for the renovation of the football team area in Memorial Stadium. In recognition of his gift, the area is permanently named the Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex.

The Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex fills 25,000+ square feet underneath the west stands of Memorial Stadium. The complex includes the Trent and Julie Green Locker Room (named in 2003), coaches' locker room, team lounge, recruiting area, equipment room and Dr. John M. Miller Training Room (named in 1994).

Tallen graduated from the Indiana University Kelley School of Business in 1982, and while earning his degree, was also a three-year letterman. Terry was elected team co-captain in 1979 and 1980. The 1979 team was nationally ranked and won the Holiday Bowl, the Hoosiers first bowl victory. Terry was named the United Press International's Defensive Player of the Week following Indiana's Homecoming victory over Wisconsin in 1980.

In 2001, Terry founded Tallen Capital Partners, LLC, and remains the company's Chairman and CEO. Tallen Capital Partners, LLC is a privately held, vertically integrated retail and mixed-use real estate investment and development organization with offices in San Diego and San Francisco. Prior to founding Tallen Capital Partners and becoming an entrepreneur, Terry enjoyed a corporate career as a senior executive with some of our country's largest public as well as private companies. He is considered one of the leading shopping center investors and developers in the Western U.S.

ON FISCHE

Don Fischer is in his 51st year as the radio voice of Indiana University football and basketball games. The past 37 years, Fischer has worked as an independent contractor, and is currently serving the IU Radio Network, owned by Learfield. In addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches talk shows for

both football and basketball.

Fischer also offers stations a weekly talk show about IU football and basketball that airs in several markets around the state during the school year.

During his years of work in Indiana, Fischer has been named the state's Sportscaster of the Year 31 times by two different organizations. The National Sports Media Association has awarded him 27 times, including the 2019 award, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him their honoree four times. In June of 2018 at the NSMA Awards program, Fischer was named the first recipient of the Woody Durham Voice of College Sports Award. In 2022, Fischer received the prestigious Chris Schenkel Award from the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame.

Fischer was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association Hall of Fame in 2004. He was inducted into the Indiana Broadcasters Association Hall of Fame in October 2010. Fischer has won several awards for best play-by-play, and has been honored by Indiana University with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University. In 2020, IU presented Fischer with the Bicentennial Medal in recognition of distinguished and distinctive service in support of the mission of Indiana University. He was also named an Honorary "I" Man in 1991.

Fischer has broadcast over 2,100 Indiana University games that include 12 bowl games, five NCAA basketball Final Fours, including four NCAA Championship games, and two NIT Championship games.

From 1973-87, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC, and several other major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis, as their source for reports during the month of May coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that 14-year period, he also served Indianapolis radio station WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their sports director.

As an independent contractor, Fischer served the Indianapolis Colts as their preseason television anchor for 23 years from 1995-2017.

In addition, the City of Indianapolis, and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service and abilities as a play-by-play broadcaster.

A native of Rochelle, Illinois, Fischer has been in the radio business for 56 years with stops in Butte, Montana; Ottawa, Illinois; Springfield, Illinois; and Terre Haute, Indiana.

Fischer his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood, Indiana, and have four sons, 12 grandchildren and two great grandchild.

RHETT LEWIS Former and cur



Lewis played at IU from 2001-05 and graduated with a B.S. in sports broadcasting (2005) and an M.S. in sports administration (2006).

Lewis is a host across several NFL Network programs, including NFL Now, NFL Total Access, and Path to the Draft. He also hosts various SiriusXM shows, including regular appearances on SiriusXM Big Ten Radio.

In 2014, Lewis spent five years as an anchor and reporter at WHDH in Boston, where he began using his middle name of Lewis as his last name professionally. He covered all four major pro championships (Super Bowl, NBA Finals, World Series, Stanley Cup Finals), and five championships total.

Before joining WHDH in May of 2009, Lewis spent eight months at WVUE, the FOX affiliate in his hometown of New Orleans. He also spent two years as the sports director at the CBS affiliate (KLBK) in Lubbock, Texas. Lewis also interned with WISH-TV in Indianapolis.

His father, Dean Kleinschmidt, served as Indiana's head football trainer from 2004-06. Dean was a head trainer in the NFL for 41 seasons – 31 with the New Orleans Saints, two with the Washington Redskins, and eight with the Detroit Lions.

A 1970 IU graduate, Dean is in the National Athletic Trainers Association Hall of Fame and the New Orleans Saints Hall of Fame.

Rhett's wife, Kayna - an honorary Hoosier, is also in television as a national correspondent for ABC News. They have two future Hoosier wide receivers, Conway (5) and Wylder (3).

JOHN HERRICK

John Herrick enters his second season with the IU Radio Network. He will handle pre-game, halftime, and postgame duties.

Herrick is currently a news anchor at 93.1 WIBC and Network Indiana in Indianapolis.

A seasoned sportscaster and news reporter, he joined Emmis Communications in 2017.

Herrick broadcasts football, basketball, baseball, volleyball, and softball games for the IHSAA Champions Radio and TV Network, the ISC Sports Network, ESPN+, and Ninestar TV. He has also filled in as the host of Indiana Sports Talk.
